



Santa Ana College Former Student Survey

December 2005

Introduction

Prompted by recent slowing trends in enrollments, the RSCCD Research Department surveyed 1,367 students who were enrolled in classes at Santa Ana College (SAC) in Fall 2004 and/or Spring 2005, have completed at least 12 units of transfer-level classes, have not graduated, have not transferred to the universities, but did not return to SAC in the Fall 2005 semester. This group of students is considered “serious” and/or “committed,” those who have made a conscious choice about a college education. In other words, they would be expected to return to SAC/SCC, yet did not. The purpose of the survey was to identify these students’ reasons for not returning. Completed questionnaires were returned by 84 respondents, or 6% of those surveyed.

Summary of Findings

Overall respondents were very positive in their assessment of SAC. Respondents were generally pleased with their overall impression of SAC student life and the social and campus environment and extremely satisfied with their experience with SAC.

The majority of respondents did not return to SAC because of work schedule conflict (25%), family or personal problem (25%), transfer to another community college (24%), or financial conflict (23%). Several respondents even offered assurances that they would be returning next semester!

- 81% of respondents were “very pleased” or “pleased” with their overall impression of SAC student life and the social and campus environment.
- “Friendliness/courtesy/helpfulness of faculty/staff” received the highest rating in excellent and good (88%).
- 88% of respondents reported the “effectiveness of classroom learning experiences” and the “appearance and maintenance of grounds/facilities” were “excellent” or “good.”
- 69% of respondents reported there was nothing SAC could have done differently that would have encouraged them to remain enrolled.
- Although 31% of respondents stated that SAC could have done something differently to retain them, those possibilities varied widely, including: desired sections were full, available sections did not fit their schedules, waiting for space in chosen program, needing better career guidance from counselors, missing registration deadlines, and expenses.
- 99% of respondents would recommend SAC to their family and/or friends.

Characteristics of Respondents

Respondent characteristics are comparable to those of the SAC population. The majority of respondents were under the age of 30 (84%), enrolled in courses full time (62%), and took classes during the day (56%). Most respondents worked at least part time (81%) and were attending school to obtain an AA/AS degree and/or transfer (77%). In their free time, respondents reported that they enjoy physical activities, spending time with family and friends and reading books for leisure.

Is there anything SAC could have done differently that would have encouraged you to remain enrolled?

 - I will come back, whenever space becomes available in the Nursing Program.
 - Get back life drawing with **Craigh** and cartooning; they're missed and lots can be learned.
 - Give me another chance to register; I didn't enroll because I didn't make the deadlines.
 - Easier to complete my general education classes.
 - Make classes a little more interesting, for example, English classes.

- The Biology Department particularly philosophy staff at SAC was not helpful. Teaching methods were ineffective in learning the material. I dropped out and enrolled at SCC and got a B. The class was challenging, enjoyable and the professor was very helpful and seems to enjoy his job.
- Please provide more real estate classes at SAC.
- More programs regarding what to study or to help us develop and choose a career.
- Change the costs of the classes because it's too expensive for me.
- Have one of the teacher's "staff", not employed because he stated at one time "not enough students" enrolled. When I asked to decline my enrollment, you guys didn't do it.

- Need a different, more effective way to get better qualified people into the Fire Academy (i.e., past experience in fire or GPA), not a lottery!

- Shorten the waiting time to get into Santa Ana College's Fire Academy.
