History: In 1985, Santiago Canyon College (then called the Rancho Santiago Orange campus) opened its doors to about 2,500 students. The college became independently accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges in January 2000.

In November 2002, voters in the college district approved the passage of bond Measure E, which provided \$337 million for renovation and new construction at both Santiago Canyon College and Santa Ana College. Facilities built at Santiago Canyon College with Measure E dollars include a new library building, student services/classroom building, softball field and science center (currently under construction).
