Who We Are

District Safety Officers

All Campus Public Safety Officers are trained and certified by the California State Bureau of Consumer Affairs as licensed Security Officers. With most officers are armed, many have years of experience in law enforcement / security operations.

It is important to note that we are not police, and our primary mission is *not* law enforcement. Our primary goal is to ensure a safe environment for faculty, staff, students, and visitors.

Our Officers provide visible and continuous patrols on the campus, so we are available for students, staff, and guests.

Campus Safety v. Police

Police Departments are more concerned with enforcement and prosecution or the so-called "Warrior Mentality."

Generally speaking, when it comes to the enforcement of campus rules and regulations, our officers are guided by the "spirit" of the law, rather than the "letter" of the law.

We use a Community Based Policing model, so we are here to provide service.

Most of our role is to be Guardians, not Warriors and we focus on ensuring a safe environment.

Procedural Justice

Fairness - Treat others neutrally and without bias and apply rules consistently.

Respect - Treat people with dignity.

Voice - Allow people an opportunity to be heard, to "tell their side of the story."

Trustworthiness - People react favorably when they believe officers are benevolent, caring, and sincerely trying to do what is best.



Parking Enforcement

- > A big function of campus safety is handling parking.
- This is where we are more letter of the law and vehicles that don't display proper passes or credentials or park in violation of the campus rules are subject to citations.
- The District does not have a grace period for parking permits at any time during the year. Parking permits are required to park on campus at all times.
- Virtual Parking Permits
 - > Employees need to purchase annually
 - > Students purchase by semester
- > Parking rules are found on the campus web sites.
- Daily permits are available for purchase at kiosks or online.

Active Assailant Situations

In the event of an active shooter, we follow the guidelines of **run**, **hide**, **fight**.


Running away from the danger is our first and best option. It's important to always be aware of your nearest exits.


If you can't run, then hide.
Remove any device on the classroom door (U-Bolt/magnet), lock the door and find a good hiding spot, away from windows.

Fight. Look for any object that could be used as a last resort to fight.

- Volume 3 includes specific hazards like Earthquake, Flood, Fire, Bomb Threats etc.








