2. Meeting Notes of March 15, 2023

4. Review of Draft Biennial Report Covering FY21-23

Ms. Matsumoto noted the draft biennial Sustainability Report was attached to the meeting materials for the committee to review. Mr. Curiel asked the committee to provide comments and edits for the report by July 31, 2023 to him, Mr. Kim or Ms. Imai. Ms. Matsumoto noted the final report will be presented at the first SRC committee meeting in the Fall for the committee to take action to approve it.

5. Future Update to Sustainability Plan 2025

Ms. Matsumoto noted the sub workgroup's first meeting occurred on May 2, 2023. Mr. Curiel noted the meeting went really well and distinguished what the workgroup's purpose is and the difference between the sustainability plan and the biennial report. The upcoming meetings will discuss the plan's goals in detail. Mr. Leeds from Santa Ana College volunteered to be a part of the sub workgroup.

6. Earth Day Events

Ms. Matsumoto noted the committee participated in both events at the colleges and it looked like everyone enjoyed taking the recycling challenge at the booth. Mr. Cantoran noted there were 108 students at SAC's Sustain-A-Palooza event and 13 local environmentally conscious companies, community members and non-profit tables. The vendors included Geology and Earth Sciences. Sustainable RSCCD Committee, Excess Telecom, SAC School of Continuing Education, OCHCA Environmental Health, Fridays for Future Orange County, Reform&Sustain, Citizens Climate Lobby, Climate action campaign, OC Environmental Justice, SAC Environmental Club, and Fullerton Ford. Ford brought out their new Ford F-150 Lightning Electric Truck. Food was served from Green Tomato Grill. Their sustainability program includes low waste culinary practices, recycling, organic cleaning supplies, biodegradable sugar fiber paper goods and corn plastic cups. Their chefs personally source their beef and poultry from the southwest region. Mr. Lopez noted Earth Day at SCC was a blast and his favorite activity was thrifting where students were able to get a bag of clothes. There were food trucks, a radio station, the Police Department, Fire Department, Home Depot and Tesla. Ms. Nakagami noted the vendors included Honeywell, Irvine Ranch, Outdoor Education Center, OC Parks, OCTA, and Orange Public Works. Ms. Matsumoto thanked the colleges and students and noted the events were very successful and the events improve, grow and get better each year. Ms. Matsumoto asked the committee if they wanted to continue the recycling challenge each year at the Earth Day events and the committee agreed. Ms. Matsumoto asked if there are any other thoughts or feedback from the committee

about things that are important from the student's perspective that you would like to see focused on further.
