



# **External Reports**




- Data entered directly by campus departments/programs, then





# Using Data in Program Review




- How does your goal/purpose align with district's/college's
- Request for data...start with the goal/purpose
- Data supports your goal/purpose
- Use broad, general data provided by us as a starting point
- Consider the team approach
- Invite "outsiders" to the table
- Set aside special time to review data

# Using Data in Program Review



- Use data with caution
- Compare carefully
- One number/percentage isn't meaningful
- Make it simple...own/understand the data
- One set of data doesn't speak for entire issue/problem
- Data doesn't speak for itself
- Ask for additional data, if needed


# How You Can Help Yourself
