



# Santiago Canyon College Former Student Survey

December 2005

## Introduction

Prompted by recent slowing trends in enrollments, the RSCCD Research Department surveyed 704 students who were enrolled in classes at Santiago Canyon College (SCC) in Fall 2004 and/or Spring 2005, have completed at least 12 units of transfer-level classes, have not graduated, have not transferred to the universities, but did not return to SCC in the Fall 2005 semester. This group of students is considered “serious” and/or “committed,” those who have made a conscious choice about a college education. In other words, they would be expected to return to SCC/SAC, yet did not. The purpose of the survey was to identify these students’ reasons for not returning. Completed questionnaires were returned by 39 respondents, or 6% of those surveyed.

## Summary of Findings

Overall respondents were very positive in their assessment of SCC. Respondents were generally pleased with their overall impression of SCC student life and the social and campus environment and extremely satisfied with their experience with SCC.

The majority of respondents did not return to SCC because they were either attending another community college (36%), family or personal problem (15%), work schedule conflict (15%) or completed their objective (13%). Several respondents even assured us they would be returning next semester!

- 82% of respondents were very pleased or pleased with their overall impression of SCC student life and the social and campus environment.
- “Appearance and maintenance of grounds/facilities” received the highest rating in excellent and good (98%).
- “Friendliness/courtesy/helpfulness of faculty/staff” was rated “excellent” or “good” by 92% of respondents.
- 88% of respondents reported “ability to register for classes you want/need” and “campus safety/security” were excellent or good.
- 71% of respondents reported there was nothing SCC could have done differently that would have encouraged them to remain enrolled.
- Although 29% of respondents stated that SCC could have done something differently to retain them, those possibilities varied widely, including: desired sections were full, wanting more online and weekend courses, and not liking the classes they had enrolled in.
- 97% of respondents would recommend SCC to their family and/or friends.

## Characteristics of Respondents

Respondent characteristics were comparable to those of the SCC population. The majority of respondents were under the age of 30 (73%), enrolled in courses full time (59%), and took classes during the day (45%). Most respondents worked at least part-time (87%) and were attending school to obtain an AA/AS degree and/or transfer (72%). In their free time, respondents like to spend time with family or friends, studying, read, or exercising.
