

- Offered more than 220 face-to-face sections in Fire, Police, EMT, Pharm Tech, Nursing, Manuf. & Tech., Auto, Diesel and Welding (hard-to-covert)

 - F2f included 12 outdoor conditioning classes

Outreach Efforts

- ♦ Phone call campaign to outreach to more than 4,500 students who:
 - ♦ were enrolled at the end of first week (fall 2020) and now are not enrolled (no units)
 - enrolled but for fewer units than had during first week and not full time
 - ♦ dropped courses, for many different reasons, at SAC
 - were Early Decision High School students who applied, registered, yet didn't attend
- ♦ Campaign started with referring students to GR8 weeks courses and now assisting students with enrolling in either intersession or spring term
- ♦ Less than 1,000 phone class left to make







Intersession and Spring

- ONLINE (O) classes are time-flexible distance education classes with no scheduled meeting days. Students will log in to Canvas and complete work regularly throughout the week. Other technologies may be required to complete coursework.
- HYBRID (H) classes that combine online learning with required live scheduled meetings. These meetings will be scheduled as Web or on-campus meetings. Location, dates, time and instructor contact information can be found on WebAdvisor sac.edu/webadvisor. Canvas and other technologies will be required to complete coursework.
- **REMOTE LIVE (RL)** classes are distance education classes with scheduled virtual meeting days and times. Students will attend class virtually during the published course times. Canvas and other technologies will be required to complete coursework.
- REMOTE BLENDED (RB) classes are distance education classes with both scheduled virtual meeting dates and times and scheduled on-campus meeting days and times. Canvas and other technologies will be required to complete coursework.
- FACE TO FACE (F2F) classes are in person and on-campus with weekly scheduled meeting days and times. Students will complete the semester on campus unless the college is ordered to discontinue face to face classes. If face to face courses are discontinued, and the course cannot be completed through distance education, it will be cancelled.
- ♦ Intersession (SI2021) 212 sections being offered; 44 sections offered face-to-face or hybrid (21%)
 - ♦ 353 FTES currently; 558 FTES in SI2020
- ♦ Spring 1,754 sections being offered; 344 sections offered face-to-face or hybrid (20%)
 - ♦ 840 FTES currently; 6,017 FTES in S2020

FREE COVID Testing

- ♦ In partnership with the City of Santa Ana, Medica Testing Group provides drive-thru and in person testing at Santa Ana College.
- \diamond On average we test between 60 200 per day
- ♦ The past week a total of 2,003 community members, employees and students were tested
 - \Rightarrow Friday = 625
 - \diamond Saturday = 724
 - \Rightarrow Sunday = 654
- ♦ Nursing students provided with clinical rotation opportunities during testing







- Drive-Thru Food Distribution held one to two times per month on Wednesdays between
 9am to Noon
 - ♦ October we served 425 students/families
- This past Wednesday, November 25th we distributed over 750 food bags to students/families.
- ♦ Digital Dons has distributed more than 675 laptops to students.
- Academic Computing Center remains open for access to quite space and access to technology



Fall 2020 – Enrollment and Retention Efforts



- Sent a mailer to 166,000 homes and businesses within SCC's service area
- Entered into a \$26,400 Digital Marketing campaign with Interact Communications for the noncredit program
- Conducted a text and email campaign to all SCC students
- Loaned out 216 laptops to students and another 73 to faculty
 and staff

Spring 2021 Intersession (SI2021)

- Enrollment is now taking place
- 1 class scheduled to meet in a F2F format.
- 200 FTES Currently; 294 FTES in SI2019

Spring 2021 (SP 2020)

- Registration is currently taking place for continuing students:
- Registration for new students begins Tuesday, December 8
- There are currently 63 class sections, not including athletics, that will meet in some form of F2F.
- 44 class sections are scheduled to meet in a 100% F2F format.
 - 760 FTES Currently; 2,718 FTES in SP2020



COVID-19 Update

Since Transitioning to the Purple Tier:

- 4 F2F classes transitioned to RL
- In- person services minimal and by appointment only
- Library remains open M-Th, 8am-4:30pm, for connectivity and printing services
- Outdoor Sports Conditioning classes will continue
 - F2F Indoor Classes for IHL not allowed, except:
 - Classes that support the critical workforce
 - Classes that require hands-on lab-work



FREE, SAFE, PAINLESS COVID-19 TESTING FOR ALL!

In partnership with the Orange County Healthcare Agency and 360 Clinic, Santiago Canyon College is proud to announce that it is the first, permanent physical location to offer those who work, live and learn in Orange County free access to COVID-19 testing. Walk-up services are available with an appointment and will be taking place under the awning/overhang at the SCC gym. Tests are self administered nasal swabs. All tests are performed under the supervision of medical professionals and insurance is not necessary to be eligible.


