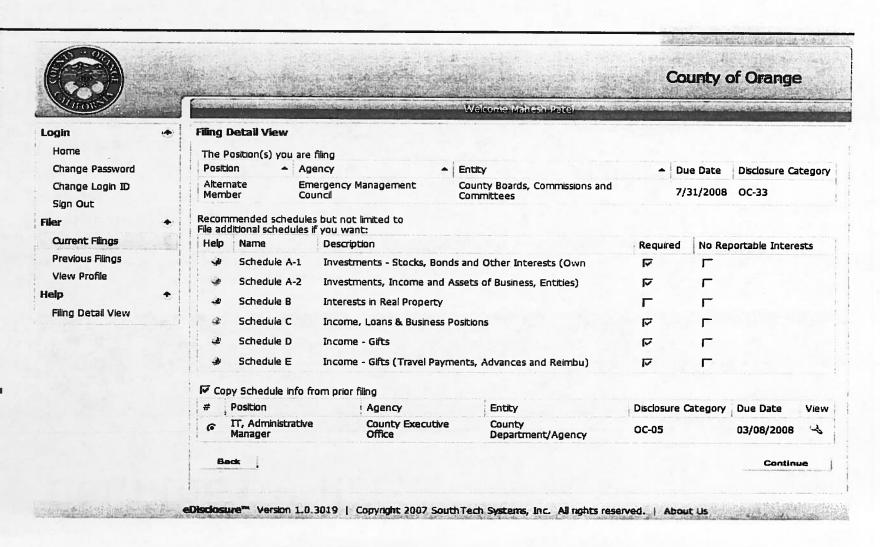

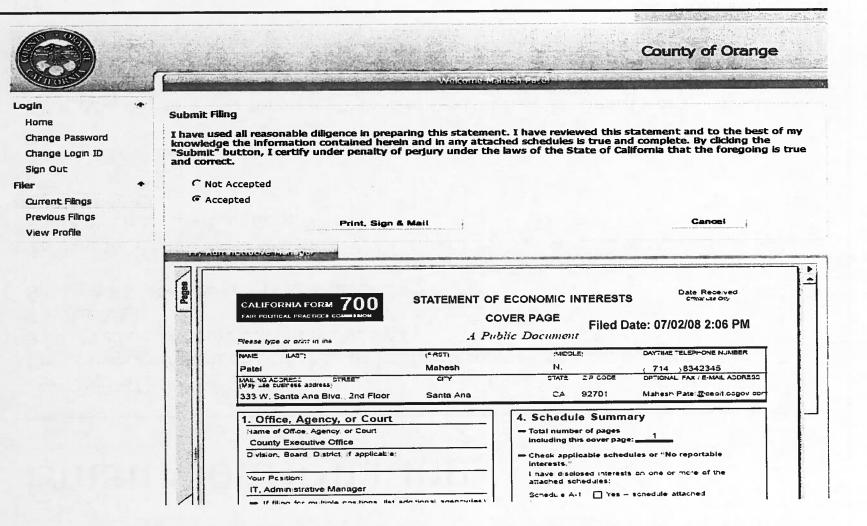

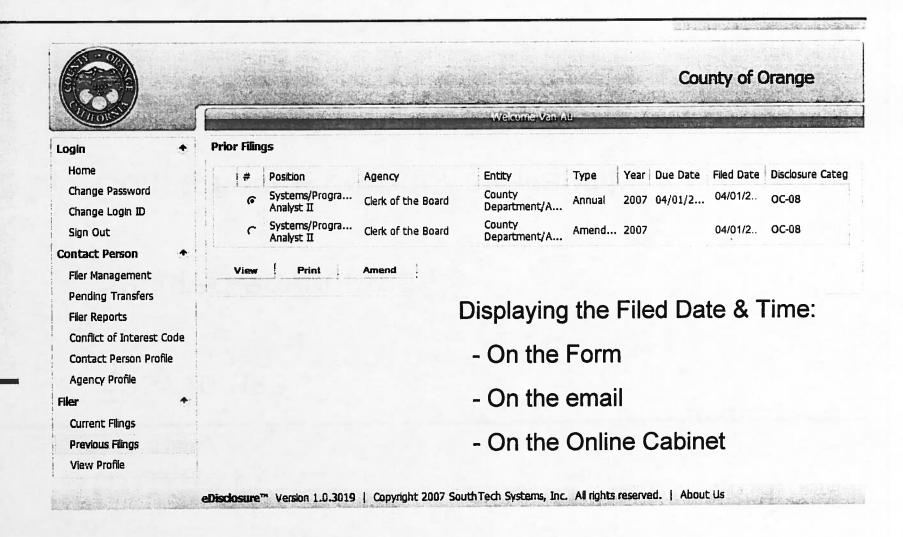

1.0 PROCEDURAL MATTERS

1.1 Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 4:31 p.m. by Mr. Larry Labrado. Other members present were Dr. David Chapel, Mr. Brian Conley, Mr. John Hanna, Ms. Gloria Holguin, Mr. Mark McLoughlin, Ms. Lisa Woolery, and Mr. Phillip Yarbrough.

Administrators present during the regular meeting were Mr. John Didion, Mr. Peter Hardash, Dr. Edward Hernandez, Jr., Dr. Erlinda Martinez, and Mr. Juan Vázquez. Ms. Anita Lucarelli was present as record keeper.

1.2 Pledge of Allegiance to the United States Flag

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Ms. Tricia Evans, Dean of Instructional Services & Career Education at Santiago Canyon College.

1.3 Public Comment

Dr. Jeff McMillan spoke regarding Item 2.6 (RSCCD Budget & Planning Process and Budget Allocation Model).

2.0 BOARD PLANNING SESSION

2.1 Presentation of 2009-2010 Vision and Goals

The board reviewed its 2009-2010 vision and goals approved in July 2009. Mr. Didion explained that today's board planning session was scheduled to synchronize with the annual budget development process.

Dr. Chapel asked if the 2009-2010 goals are district goals and/or board goals. Mr. Didion explained that the goals are board goals which the district and colleges use as a platform to build its goals.

2.2 Presentation of Accountability Reporting for the Community Colleges (ARCC)

The Accountability Review for Community Colleges (ARCC) was presented to the board as information by Mr. John Didion and Ms. Nga Pham. It was explained that ARCC, as mandated by AB1417, requires California community colleges to provide

2.2 <u>Presentation of Accountability Reporting for the Community Colleges (ARCC)</u> – (cont.)

a framework for system performance evaluation. A report is produced by the State Chancellor's Office based upon data submitted by each college. ARCC provides an annual report to the legislators, sets standards for accountability and results for California community colleges, and reports outcomes for each college and systemwide. Each college is required to present the data to its board as information and for discussion. The ARCC report does not rank colleges against each other and is not attached to any funding mechanism.

Mr. Didion presented 2009 reports for Santa Ana College (SAC), Santiago Canyon College (SCC), and Rancho Santiago CCD (non-credit program) that included college performance indicators, college profiles, college peer groupings, and staff response summaries. Mr. Didion cautioned that SAC should not be compared to SCC since the formula for each performance measure is complicated and differs from other accountability reports. Because student progress is difficult to measure in community colleges and is measured differently in each research section, staff acknowledged the value of the report systemwide, however, asked that locally-produced research also be considered in identifying overall trends and evaluating meaningfulness.

Mr. Yarbrough asked for possible reasons of low percentages of students who earned at least 30 units, specifically at SCC. Mr. Vázquez and Mr. Didion discussed the variety of course offerings, such as SCC's large apprenticeship program, and/or the large number of students enrolled in the vocational programs that may have caused the rate to be lower than other colleges. These students are not likely to continue their education other than what is required to obtain their state license. Another performance indicator discussed was the fluctuation of students involved in English as a Second Language programs. Mr. Didion explained the recoding of courses may have resulted in this fluctuation; Mr. Conley indicated another possible factor may be the economic crisis.

Dr. Hernandez stated that the Department of Finance will continue to use these types of report to determine funding for the community colleges. The district is concerned how the data may be interpreted.

2.3 Presentation of 12 Measures of Success

Mr. Didion presented The 12 Measures of Success as information. Discussion ensued.

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2.3 Presentation of 12 Measures of Success – (cont.)

Board members and staff discussed possible reasons for a decrease in the number of students who matriculate to credit coursework from continuing education programs. It is hopeful the implementation of Datatel will improve accuracy in future reports.

Mr. Didion reviewed potential implications of the 12 Measures of Success.

Ms. Woolery asked for the number of students in an average class and if changes had occurred regarding class size. Mr. Jose Vargas indicated ESL continuing education classes began with 35-45 students and had 22-23 students at the end of the semester. Ms. Mary Halvorson and Mr. Norm Fujimoto indicated that credit classes began with 36 students and currently have 33 students. Ms. Halvorson sees this as an improvement since the count usually drops to 28 students per class.

2.4 Presentation of Fall 2005-Fall 2009 Enrollment Trends and Student Characteristics

Ms. Nga Pham presented the Fall 2005-Fall 2009 enrollment trends and student characteristics report.

2.5 Results of 2009 Accreditation Visits

Mr. Didion reported the college presidents were notified today that both colleges have been removed from warning status and granted full accreditation.

Mr. Labrado called a recess at 5:29 p.m.

The board reconvened at 5:56 p.m.

2.6 RSCCD Budget & Planning Process and Budget Allocation Model (BAM)

Mr. Hardash presented the district's budget planning process and budget allocation model. Mr. Hardash reported the budget allocation model is a revenue distribution model, and college staff decide the amount of fixed costs from the monies allotted to each college. As fixed costs increase, he explained, discretionary funds decrease. The largest portion of fixed costs is salaries but also include electricity, water, health costs, etc. If one college reduces spending, the amount saved is placed in the discretionary fund and distributed according to FTES generated by each college. The district's portion of discretionary funds is 16.48%.

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2.6 RSCCD Budget & Planning Process and Budget Allocation Model (BAM) – (cont.)

Mr. Yarbrough asked if college staff are able to modify fixed costs allotted to the colleges. Mr. Hardash answered in the affirmative and indicated the district distributes revenue; it does not tell the colleges how to spend it.

Mr. Hardash explained that recent budget reductions have created abnormal percentages in the BAM for this year.

Mr. Hanna asked Mr. Hardash to address Dr. McMillan's concerns indicating the district's current BAM makes it difficult to link budget and planning. Mr. Hardash disagreed. He explained the district has used the planning process and BAM for years and is currently establishing a timeline for each of those processes. Mr. Hardash stated the district has been consistent in its use of the model and has not seen variations take place outside the model.

Dr. Hernandez explained the district developed the BAM at the same time it developed the plan-to-plan process. Once the board approves its vision statement and goals, they are given to the chancellor and college departments to develop a vision statement and goals based upon the board's. The board and district staff strongly support the governance process. Planning and budget committees meet regularly regarding their budgets. College staff is responsible to review and link budget and planning. Dr. Hernandez indicated that linking budget and planning has taken place at the district office and believes it has occurred at each college.

Dr. Hernandez indicated the budget allocation model is flexible enough to allow modifications requested by the board, campus, or district.

Mr. Hanna expressed concern over the colleges' decisions involving fixed costs as related to the BAM. He asked if trustees are able to prevent fixed costs from increasing every year; thereby, slowing the process of decreasing discretionary funds.

Dr. Hernandez indicated the board has the final decision on recommendations made by staff.

Mr. Hanna asked if the distribution process for monies had ever been reconsidered. Dr. Hernandez indicated when the district receives revenue, the whole district benefits and when the district reduces monies, the whole district is affected. The board adopted the BAM when it transitioned from a single campus district to a multicampus district.

Mr. Didion explained the district must abide by collective bargaining, and the impact of reductions in personnel affect the whole district.

It was moved by Mr. Yarbrough, seconded by Mr. Conley, and carried unanimously to approve the district's planning process/timeline and budget allocation model.

2.7 <u>Progress toward 2009-2010 Vision Statement and Goals</u>

Mr. Didion presented the progress toward the board's 2009-2010 vision statement and goals from leadership at the colleges and district as information. Due to the short amount of time permitted, Dr. Hernandez indicated the information provided was incomplete.

Mr. Yarbrough asked how the impact of state-mandated budget reductions may affect the board's goals. Dr. Hernandez indicated the colleges are ready to meet the challenges the state has mandated and may propose. He stated the board's goals provide flexibility for college presidents to make necessary changes to the budget.

Mr. Yarbrough asked if the ESL programs at the colleges have experienced demographic changes. Ms. Nga Pham indicated the district anticipates using the 2010 census to record demographic changes.

Mr. Yarbrough asked if there is a change in enrollment that reflects more demand for certain classes. Dr. Martinez indicated more students are enrolling in workforce programs in preparation for jobs. Mr. Vázquez indicated enrollment for students has increased in vocational education programs.

In reviewing the goals, Ms. Woolery stated that goal #9 was too specific and requested it be modified.

2.8 Approval of 2010-2011 Vision and Goals

Mr. Didion indicated that staff recommend reaffirming the board's vision statement and goals, with the exception of combining goal 9 with goal 3, and adding the word "update."

Upon reviewing the board's vision statement and goals, board members discussed Item 2.4 (Presentation of Fall 2005-Fall 2009 Enrollment Trends and Student Characteristics) as related to the board's goals. Mr. McLoughlin asked how the data is verified for the report.

Mr. Vázquez indicated staff discovered students completed programs to enhance their level of expertise yet had not applied for certificates in their respective fields. As the state requires the college to report the number of certificates earned, it appeared the college's numbers were low. Staff encouraged students to apply for certificates and several students responded as reflected in the increase of certificates earned from 2007-08 (226) to 2008-09 (344). The district is in the process of developing an automated method of transcript auditing in the Datatel software program to track students eligible to apply for certificates. Mr. Labrado asked that this explanation be included in future reports.

2.8 Approval of 2010-2011 Vision and Goals – (cont.)

Mr. McLoughlin asked that statistics be linked to the board's goals to evaluate implementation of the goals and this information be provided on a quarterly basis. Dr. Hernandez agreed with Mr. McLoughlin's recommendation and indicated current information had been collected during the past six months.

Ms. Woolery requested statistics be provided on an annual basis.

In concern for staff time, Mr. Yarbrough asked that current information be provided at either the next board meeting or the one thereafter, and significant changes be provided as necessary.

Mr. Hanna thanked those involved in providing feedback to the board on its goals as it assisted the board in reviewing its vision statement and goals for 2010-2011. He asked the student trustee if there was additional input from the students' perspective on goals being met or suggestions of new goals.

Due to the economic crisis, Ms. Holguin indicated students are pursuing business and science degrees instead of educational degrees. She reported students are not able to enroll in classes that enable them to transfer to a university, and if they are able to meet transfer requirements, it is difficult to transfer to a university since universities are not accepting applications at this time.

Mr. Hanna asked the academic senate presidents for suggestions relating to the board's goals. Mr. Zarske indicated SAC has a committee to explore methods of going green without spending.

Mr. Hanna indicated he did not object to merging goals 3 and 9. He agreed with Mr. McLoughlin's request for data related to accomplishing board goals and agreed with Mr. Yarbrough's concern of staff's time in providing data. He recommended data include comparisons such as how RSCCD is going green compared to neighboring districts.

In reference to goal 5, Mr. Hanna indicated the information provided was helpful but requested more detail in order to establish benchmarks to evaluate implementation of the goal. He assumes staff understands the board would like greater emphasis on staff pursuing alternative public and private funding sources.

Mr. Hanna asked that staff provide the following information in the annual report: the amount of people giving donations to the foundations and the comparison of what was given the previous year, income projections from the private sector, the amount of grants the district has received compared to other districts, any problems the community has experienced related to use of facilities, and a pathway to restoration for eliminated programs and classes.

2.8 Approval of 2010-2011 Vision and Goals – (cont.)

Mr. Hanna asked if the board's goals assisted staff in recommending to the board a plan to protect students from exterior political threats such as fee increases or students weathering the economic storm.

Dr. Hernandez indicated the board's vision statement and goals have the flexibility to handle current political situations.

Dr. Hernandez stated he has not directed staff to plan a pathway for restoration of programs or classes. He is currently focusing staff on retaining current programs and classes unless otherwise directed by the board.

Dr. Chapel asked that "when possible" and "where possible" be removed from goals 2, 3, 4, 7, and 8. Dr. Hernandez indicated staff supported removing the phrases from the five goals.

Mr. Yarbrough asked Dr. Hernandez to consider a fee for service program whereby students would pay fees associated with a program.

Mr. McLoughlin expressed concern over students unable to enroll in courses to complete their degrees. He asked if certain degrees were more at risk and if the district has implemented a plan to meet this demand.

Dr. Hernandez indicated the Department of Finance (DOF) has been researching athletic and recreational physical education classes as a possible means of additional reductions to the state budget. In anticipation of these programs becoming part of future budget reductions, the college presidents have begun planning for the effect this may have on the colleges and focusing on offering basic skills courses.

Dr. Hernandez has asked the college presidents to consider Mr. Yarbrough's recommendation of a fee for service program.

Mr. Vázquez reported there is not a major at SAC or SCC that a student is unable to attain; however, majors have been affected by a reduction of personnel and elective classes. He indicated staff met with faculty when SCC reduced personnel and classes and it is expected that the same plan will occur when the college receives funding to restore them. He reported the college has reduced discretionary costs immensely and is planning for the next round of reductions.

Mr. Hanna commented that Dr. Hernandez' points were well taken in response to his concerns. His question of whether the board needed to add a goal toward planning for the future had been answered. Mr. Hanna is glad to hear staff is discussing a restoration plan. Mr. Hanna indicated that if both colleges are unable to restore classes, perhaps one college would be able to.

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2.8 Approval of 2010-2011 Vision and Goals – (cont.)

Mr. Barembaum reminded the board that the district has had a full-time faculty and classified staff hiring freeze in effect and suggested the pathway to restoration include rehiring faculty and classified staff.

It was moved by Mr. Yarbrough and seconded by Ms. Woolery to approve the 2009-2010 vision and goals as the 2010-2011 vision and goals with the following revision: Consolidate Goals 3 and 9 to read:

"Update and implement facilities master plans, maximize college and community use of facilities, and incorporate "green" efforts into facilities development and other efforts where possible and cost-effective."

Mr. McLoughlin asked that Dr. Chapel's earlier concerns be incorporated by removing "when possible" and "where possible" from Goals 2, 3, 4, 7, and 8. Discussion ensued.

Mr. Yarbrough and Ms. Woolery accepted Mr. McLoughlin's revisions as a friendly amendment.

The motion carried unanimously to approve the 2010-2011 vision and goals as follows:

Vision Statement 2010-2011

Rancho Santiago Community College District is a learning community. The college district and its colleges are committed to ensuring access and equity, and to planning comprehensive educational opportunities throughout our communities. We will be global leaders in many fields, delivering cost-effective, innovative programs and services that are responsive to the diverse needs and interests of all students. We will be exceptionally sensitive and responsive to the economic and educational needs of our students and communities. The environment will be collegial and supportive for students, staff, and the communities we serve.

We will promote and extensively participate in partnerships with other educational providers, business, industry, and community groups. We will enhance our communities' cultural, educational, and economic well-being.

We will be a leader in the state in student learning outcomes. Students who complete programs will be prepared for success in business, industry, careers, and all future educational endeavors. We will prepare students to embrace and engage the diversity of our global community and to assume leadership roles in their work and public lives.

2.8 Approval of 2010-2011 Vision and Goals – (cont.)

2010-2011 Goals

- 1. Promote a learning community environment that is innovative, student-centered, and celebrates student achievement.
- 2. Provide access and retention for completion programs, including transfer, vocational, and high school diploma programs; and prepare students for success in their academic, career, and personal life endeavors.
- 3. Update and implement facilities master plans, maximize college and community use of facilities, and incorporate "green" efforts into facilities development and other efforts when cost-effective.
- 4. Promote flexible, cost-effective educational programs and services including the use of cutting-edge technology and educational program delivery via technology.
- 5. Pursue alternative public and private funding sources to increase the district's fiscal sustainability and to implement the district's vision and goals, and encourage the foundations and district to create plans for capital and program campaigns and alumni association development.
- 6. Maintain a positive, productive working environment for employees, recognizing and embracing diversity and enhancing staff development opportunities that address innovation and technology.
- 7. Expand partnerships with business, labor, community groups, universities, schools, and other public and private agencies in order to enhance the district's resource development; ensure student access and success; ensure robust economic development programs; and be responsive to workforce development needs and high demand career fields.
- 8. Assess the educational needs of the communities we serve, and enhance awareness of the colleges and community involvement through outreach and advocacy among community constituencies and leaders.

3.0 GENERAL

3.1 Resolution #10-03 in Honor of Congressman Ed Royce

It was moved by Mr. Hanna and seconded by Ms. Woolery to adopt Resolution #10-03 in honor of Congressman Ed Royce. Discussion ensued. The motion carried unanimously.

3.2 Board Member Comments

Ms. Holguin thanked the board for its concern regarding students not meeting their educational goals and the possibility of a tuition increase during this difficult economic time.

Dr. Chapel, Mr. Conley, Mr. Hanna, Mr. McLoughlin, Ms. Woolery, and Mr. Yarbrough thanked staff for the information provided to assist the board in reviewing and approving its vision statement and goals for the 2010-2011 academic year.

Ms. Woolery congratulated staff for its hard work toward the removal of warning status related to the accreditation report.

Mr. Hanna, Mr. Labrado, Mr. McLoughlin, and Ms. Woolery gave brief reports on the recent legislative visit to Sacramento. Ms. Woolery indicated Ms. Laurie Weidner would be presenting a full report at the next board meeting.

Mr. Yarbrough commented on the effectiveness of shared governance in the district's planning and budget process.

Regarding goal 3, Mr. Yarbrough expressed appreciation that the district's green efforts be cost-effective.

Mr. Hanna announced plans for a farewell dinner for Dr. Hernandez which includes a fundraiser for college programs to be held on April 29. He encouraged board members to participate in fundraising efforts for this event.

Mr. Labrado appointed Mr. Yarbrough as the board's representative to China, and appointed Mr. McLoughlin as the board's representative to the Orange County Business Council.

4.0 ADJOURNMENT

The next regular meeting of the Board of Trustees will be held on February 22, 2010, at the District Office, 2323 N. Broadway, Santa Ana, California.

There being no further business, Mr. Labrado declared this meeting adjourned at 7:50 p.m.

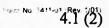

STUDENT AFFILIATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN CEDARS-SINAI MEDICAL CENTER AND RANCHO SANTIAGO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT

THIS STUDENT AFFILIATION AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is entered into effective March 1, 2008 by and between Rancho Santiago Community College District on behalf of Santa Ana College ("District"), and Cedars-Sinai Medical Center, a California nonprofit public benefit corporation ("Medical Center").

RECITALS

- A. Medical Center owns and operates an acute care hospital and related medical center facilities with offices located principally at 8700 Beverly Boulevard, Los Angeles, California 90048-1865;
- B. District is located at 1530 West 17th Street, Santa Ana, California 92706-3398:
- C. District has an approved Occupational Therapy Program (the "Program"), accredited by the appropriate State Board, and is desirous that its students obtain clinical experience at Medical Center;
- D. Medical Center is willing, subject to the terms and conditions set forth below, to permit District to utilize its facilities for the clinical training of students enrolled in the Program and for furnishing such clinical experience; and
- E. It is to the mutual benefit of the parties to this Agreement that designated students of Program ("Student" or "Students", hereinafter as appropriate) obtain clinical experience at Medical Center's facilities.

NOW THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration, the parties hereto hereby agree as follows:

1. GENERAL INFORMATION.

- (a) The period of time for each Student's clinical experiences shall be mutually agreed upon by the parties before the training period begins.
- (b) The maximum number of Students to receive clinical training shall be mutually agreed upon by the parties based upon the availability of space and other considerations.

2. TERM OF AGREEMENT.

The term of this Agreement shall commence on the date stated above ("Commencement Date") and shall remain in effect for a period of one (1) year, subject to renewal for additional one (1) year term(s) based on the written agreement of the parties unless sooner terminated in the manner set forth below. This Agreement may be terminated by either party (a) immediately, with cause, for breach of any material term of this Agreement, upon delivery to the other party of written notice of its intention to so terminate; or (b) without cause, by delivery to the other party of thirty (30) days' advance written notice, unless sooner provided for pursuant to the terms of this Agreement. This Agreement may also be terminated at any time in the event of any occurrence beyond the control of either party which makes it impractical or unreasonable for either party to continue to abide by the terms and conditions of this Agreement. If such event occurs, the party wishing to terminate this Agreement shall do so by giving written notice to the other party of its election and such termination shall be immediately effective.

3. RESPONSIBILITIES OF SCHOOL.

- (a) District shall submit to Medical Center a written Program plan which includes a description of Program courses and written objectives. Medical Center will be given a copy of the written Program plan in advance of the Commencement Date for its approval. District shall not modify Program objectives or the Program plan without the prior written consent of Medical Center.
- (b) District shall send the name and biographical data, of each Student to Medical Center at least two (2) weeks before the beginning date of each Student at the Medical Center. District shall be responsible for supplying any additional information required by Medical Center prior to the beginning date of each Program. District shall ensure that each Student has current health screening, immunizations, CPR certificate and professional liability insurance.
- (c) District shall verify that the Student has completed all prerequisite coursework before beginning clinical training at the Medical Center.
- (d) District shall provide any forms and instructions necessary for documentation and evaluation of the Student's field work or clinical experience.
- (e) District shall designate a faculty member ("Academic Coordinator") who shall implement Program at Medical Center with a designated Medical Center employee.
- (f) District shall inform its Students of their need to obtain a criminal background check, and provide the Medical Center with the results of such criminal background check. In addition, District shall maintain the results of a criminal background check for the Academic Coordinator. In the event any Student or Academic Coordinator has been convicted of any criminal offense including, without limitation, a criminal offense related to health care or is listed as debarred, excluded or otherwise ineligible for participation in federal health care programs (as defined in U.S.C. Section 1320a-7b(f)), District agrees, upon the request of Medical Center, to withdraw such Student or Academic Coordinator from Medical Center. District shall indemnify and hold Medical Center harmless and shall defend Medical Center from and against any and all loss, cost or expense (including costs

and attorneys' fees) arising from the withdrawal of any Student's or Academic Coordinator's participation at Medical Center.

- (g) District shall maintain all personnel and academic records of its Students.
- (h) District shall enforce rules and regulations governing the activities of Students at Medical Center which are mutually agreed upon by District and Medical Center in advance of the Commencement Date.
- (i) Notwithstanding District's supervision of Student's clinical experience under the Program at Medical Center, Medical Center retains full authority regarding patient treatment and management and District agrees to follow, and obligates Students to follow, all policies and procedures established by Medical Center regarding patient treatment and management.
- (j) District acknowledges that all patient records maintained at or by Medical Center shall remain the sole property of Medical Center.
- (k) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary set forth in this Agreement, District agrees, upon the request of Medical Center, to withdraw any Student from Medical Center upon a finding of reasonable cause for such withdrawal. "Reasonable Cause" shall include, without limitation, material violation by a Student of any policy, procedure, rule or regulation of District or Medical Center. A Student who is so withdrawn shall be notified by District and shall have the right to administrative redress under District's internal rules and regulations. District shall indemnify and hold Medical Center harmless and shall defend Medical Center from and against any and all loss, cost or expense (including costs and attorneys' fees) arising from the withdrawal of any Student's participation at Medical Center.
- (I) District shall notify Medical Center of cancellation of a Student's clinical experience under the Program or of inability to use an available time slot at least three (3) months prior to the scheduled commencement of the Student's experience, or as soon as possible.
 - (m) District shall notify Students that they are responsible for:
 - i. Following the internal protocols, policies, procedures, rules and regulations established by Medical Center; and all requirements of the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations ("Joint Commission" or "JCAHO"), as may be revised from time to time.
 - ii. Providing the necessary and appropriate uniforms which shall be designated, but not provided, by Medical Center and wearing appropriate Medical Center identification while on Medical Center's premises;
 - iii. Arranging for their own transportation and living accommodations:
 - iv. Reporting to Medical Center at all designated times;

- v. Procuring and maintaining in full force and effect professional liability insurance covering their activities hereunder, at levels of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000) annual aggregate;
 - vi. Arranging for their own health insurance when not provided by District;
- vii. Assuming responsibility for maintaining a current (within a year) certificate of health clearance, including verification of a titre test proving immunity to rubella and measles or proof of immunization, PPD test or chest x-ray showing no active tuberculosis, verbal screening for clinical history of varicella-zoster virus infection (chicken pox), and proof of immunization against hepatitis B (heptavac). District shall ensure compliance with this Paragraph and shall maintain files of all health examinations of Students assigned to Medical Center;
 - viii Respecting and maintaining the confidentiality of all Health Information with respect to all patients of the Medical Center, including without limitation, all Health Information regarding a patient's: (1) Medical treatment and condition; (2) Psychiatric and Mental Health; and (3) Substance abuse and Chemical dependency, which the Student may receive pursuant to this Agreement. The Student agrees to comply with the terms and conditions of the: (i) Confidentiality of Medical Information Act of 1981, California Civil Code Section 56 et seg. (General Patient Medical Records); (ii) California Welfare & Institutions Code §5328.6 and §5328.7 (Mental Health Records); and (iii) 42 U.S.C. §§290dd-2; 42 C.F.R., Part 2, §2.31 (Alcohol and Drug Abuse Records); and (iv) Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 ("HIPAA") and the Regulations promulgated thereunder (42 U.S.C. Sections 1320d-2 and 1320d-4; 45 C.F.R. Subtitle A. Subchapter C, Parts 160 - 164), as amended from time to time.
 - (b) For purposes of this Section, Health Information shall include without limitation, the following patient identifiable information: 1) Name; (2) Address, including street address, city, county, zip code and equivalent geocodes; (3) Names of relatives; (4) Names of employers; (5) Date of birth; (6) Telephone numbers: (7) Facsimile number; (8) Electronic mail address; (9) Social security number; (10) Medical record number; (11) Health plan beneficiary number; (12) Account number; (13) Certificate/license number; (14) Any vehicle or other device serial number; (15) Web Universal Resource Number (WURL); (16) Internet Protocol (IP) address number; (17) Finger or Voice prints; and (18) Photographic images; and (19) Any other unique identifying number, characteristic, or code that may be available to the Student which could be used, alone or in combination with other information, to identify an individual; and
- ix. Obtaining written permission from Medical Center prior to publication of any material based solely or in part on Students' clinical experience.

4. RESPONSIBILITIES OF MEDICAL CENTER.

- (a) Medical Center shall accept from District the mutually agreed upon number of Students and shall provide Students and faculty of District the appropriate Medical Center facilities, when available, at Medical Center's reasonable discretion, provided that the presence of Students shall not be allowed to interfere with the regular activities of Medical Center.
- (b) Medical Center shall designate a member of its staff to participate with Academic Coordinator in planning, implementing and coordinating the Program.
- (c) Medical Center shall, on any day when a Student is receiving clinical experience at its facilities, provide to Student necessary emergency health care or first aid for accidents occurring in its facilities. Except as provided herein or at law, Medical Center shall have no obligation to furnish medical, hospital or surgical care to any Student.
- (d) Medical Center may suspend or terminate any Student whose health or performance is a detriment to patient well-being or to achievement of the stated objectives of the clinical experience, after conferring with the Academic Coordinator.
- (e) Medical Center shall provide formal evaluations of Student performance at specified intervals as agreed upon between Medical Center and District.
- (f) Medical Center shall provide initial first aid, initial administration of testing, initial prophylactic therapy, and other emergency treatment on-site, including, but not limited to, immediate evaluation for risk of infection of Student in the event of a needlestick injury to or other exposure of Student to blood or body fluids or airborne contaminants. District shall provide appropriate follow-up care of Student. In the case of suspected or confirmed exposure to the human immuno-deficiency virus (HIV) or hepatitis, such initial first aid, initial administration of testing, initial prophylactic therapy, and emergency care by Medical Center, and appropriate follow-up care by District, shall be consistent with the current guidelines of the Centers for Disease Control ("CDC") and the community's standard of care. Information regarding the CDC may be obtained by calling (800) 342-2437. The initial first aid, initial administration of testing, initial prophylactic therapy, and other emergency care provided by Medical Center shall be paid for by Medical Center. All subsequent administration of testing, prophylactic therapy, and other required care and treatment shall be paid for by District.

5. STATUS OF SCHOOL AND MEDICAL CENTER.

It is expressly understood and agreed that this Agreement is not intended, and shall not be construed, to create the relationship of agent, servant, employee, partnership, joint venture or association between District, Medical Center, and Student, but is rather an agreement by and between independent contractors, these being District and Medical Center. District and its Students shall not be entitled to reimbursement of any kind or nature for any services provided to patients of Medical Center.

6. STATUS OF STUDENTS.

It is expressly agreed and understood by District and Medical Center that the Students under this Program are present at Medical Center for educational purposes only, and such Students shall not be considered employees of Medical Center for any purpose including, but not limited to, compensation for services, employees' welfare and pension benefits, fringe benefits of employment or workers' compensation insurance. District shall ensure that each Student understand his or her status hereunder.

7. INDEMNIFICATION.

Each party hereby agrees to indemnify, hold harmless and defend the other party and the other party's officers, directors, employees, independent contractors, agents, Students and representatives insofar as it may legally do so, from and against all liability. damages, costs, (including attorneys' fees), expenses or payment of any sum or sums of money due to any person whomsoever on account of claims, suits, liens, garnishments. attachments, costs, attorneys' fees, costs of investigation and of defense (collectively "Claims") growing out of or allegedly growing out of injuries to persons, including death, or damage to property arising from any act, omission or negligence of the indemnifying party or its officers, directors, employees, independent contractors, agents, Students or representatives, and for any Claims in any way attributable to employment practices or conduct or Student discipline (including, but not limited to, any practices or conduct which are or are alleged to be in violation of any statute, common law, regulation, policy, or administrative interpretation or guide concerning wage and hour practices, health and safety, workers' compensation, employment discrimination, payroll taxes, labor relations, wrongful discharge, tortious conduct, breach of the employment relationship, whether based on oral, written, or implied contract including breach of any collective bargaining contract to which such party is bound or any other aspect of employment whatsoever) or the performance of this Agreement.

8. <u>INSURANCE</u>.

- (a) District shall maintain in full force and effect insurance coverage written by outside carrier(s), self-insurance [[under the self-insurance program administered by the Office of the California Attorney General]] or a combination thereof to cover comprehensive general liability for District's employees, agents and Students, while at Medical Center. In the event such coverage is written by an outside carrier, it shall be maintained at levels of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000) annual aggregate.
- (b) District shall at all times carry Workers' Compensation insurance on behalf of its employees, including its faculty, and shall indemnify and hold Medical Center harmless from and against any and all Workers' Compensation claims filed by any District employee from any incident occurring or arising from participation in Program.
- (c) Prior to the commencement of the term of this Agreement, District shall submit to Medical Center Certificate(s) of Insurance [or evidence of a funded self-insurance program], in a form acceptable to Medical Center, indicating that District has adequate liability coverage and Workers' Compensation insurance. Each such insurance policy shall

provide that the insurance company will not cancel nor materially modify District's insurance policy without giving Medical Center thirty (30) days' advance written notice. The Certificate of Insurance [or evidence of a funded self-insurance program] and any renewal or replacement thereof shall be sent to:

- (d) District either shall provide directly or shall ensure that each Student secures and maintains professional liability coverage throughout the term of such Student's participation in the Program at Medical Center in an amount of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000) annual aggregate.
- (e) In the event any insurance provided pursuant to Paragraphs 8(a)-(d) is in a "claims made" form as opposed to an "occurrence" form (as such terms are used in the insurance industry). District agrees to maintain coverage for claims occurring during the term of this Agreement and for the longer of: (i) three (3) calendar years after the termination of this Agreement; or (ii) three (3) calendar years after the cancellation, non-renewal or expiration of the claims made policy. In the event a claims made policy is canceled, non-renewed or expires, an endorsement will be provided to Medical Center stating coverage is afforded for the later of: (i) a discovery period of three (3) calendar years following the termination of this Agreement; or (ii) the cancellation, non-renewal or expiration of the claims made policy.

9. AFFIRMATIVE ACTION AND NONDISCRIMINATION.

The parties agree that all Students receiving clinical training pursuant to this Agreement shall be selected without discrimination on account of race, religious creed, sex, sexual orientation, color, national origin, ancestry, age, physical handicap or mental condition, marital or veteran's status.

10. MEDICARE RECORD DISCLOSURE REQUIREMENT.

- (a) For the purpose of implementing Paragraph 1861(v)(1)(l) of the Social Security Act, as amended, and any regulations promulgated pursuant thereto, District agrees to comply with the following statutory requirements governing the maintenance of documentation to verify the cost of services rendered under this Agreement:
 - (i) until the expiration of four (4) years after the furnishing of any such services pursuant to such contract, District shall make available, upon written request, by the Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services, or upon request by the Comptroller General of the United States, or any of their duly authorized representatives, the contract, the books, documents and records of District that are necessary to certify the nature and extent of such costs, and

- (ii) if District carries out any duties of the contract through a subcontract with a value or cost of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) or more over a twelve (12) month period, with a related organization [as that term is defined with regard to a provider in 42 CFR §413.17(b)], such subcontract shall contain a clause to the effect that until the expiration of four (4) years after the furnishing of such services pursuant to such subcontract, the related organization shall make available upon written request by the Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services, or upon request by the Comptroller General of the United States, or any of their duly authorized representatives, the subcontract, and books, documents and records of such organization that are necessary to verify the nature and extent of the cost of services rendered under the subcontract.
- (b) If District is requested to disclose books, documents or records pursuant to Social Security Act Paragraph 1861(v)(1)(I) and 42 CFR §420.300 et seq., District shall promptly notify Medical Center of the nature and scope of such request and District shall make such books, documents or records disclosed available to Medical Center and Medical Center may copy same at Medical Center's expense.

11. MISCELLANEOUS.

(a) Notice. Any notice or other communication hereunder must be given in writing to the address set forth below and either: (i) delivered in person; (ii) sent by telefax provided that any notice so given is also mailed as provided in subsection (iv) herein; (iii) delivered by Federal Express® or similar commercial delivery service; or (iv) mailed by certified mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested, to the party to which such notice or communication is to be given at the address set forth below. Each such notice or other communication shall be effective: (i) if given by telecommunication, when transmitted; (ii) if given by mail, three (3) days after such communication is deposited in the mail and addressed as aforesaid; (iii) if given by Federal Express® or similar commercial delivery service, three (3) business days after such communication is deposited with such service and addressed as aforesaid; and (iv) if given by any other means, when actually delivered at such address:

- (b) <u>Assignment</u>. Nothing contained in this Agreement shall be construed to permit assignment by the parties of any right or obligation under this Agreement and such assignment is expressly prohibited. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Medical Center may assign this Agreement to an affiliate organization or for the purposes of obtaining its bond financing.
- Compliance with Law. District and its Students agree to comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws, regulations, ordinances and orders with respect to the performance of the services hereunder. District and its Students acknowledge that Medical Center maintains a compliance program and that a copy of the compliance program policies has been made available to District and its Students for review. By executing this Agreement, District and its Students represent and warrant that neither District and its Students, nor any of its employees or agents: (i) has, in the past ten (10) years, been debarred, excluded or otherwise made ineligible by any Federal governmental agency from participating in Federally reimbursed health care programs; (ii) has, in the past ten (10) years, been sanctioned or convicted by any Federal governmental agency; or (iii) is listed in any Federal governmental agency's list of sanctioned, debarred, excluded or ineligible contractors. District and its Students hereby covenants that it will notify Medical Center within two (2) business days of any conviction, citation, judgment or settlement affecting the representations and warranties contained in this Section. District and its Students agree that any debarment, exclusion, ineligibility, sanction or listing as described in items (i), (ii) or (iii) above is grounds for immediate termination of this Agreement by Medical Center.
- (d) <u>Governing Law</u>. The validity, interpretation and performance of this Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California. Venue shall be in Los Angeles County.
- (e) <u>No Waiver</u>. Any waiver of any terms and conditions hereof must be in writing, and signed by the parties hereto. A waiver of any of the terms and conditions hereof is not to be construed as a waiver of any other terms and conditions hereof.
- (f) <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement contains a full and complete expression of the rights and obligations of the parties and it shall supersede all other agreements, written or oral, heretofore made by the parties. This Agreement may be modified only in writing, signed by the parties hereto.
- (g) Interpretation. Ambiguities, if any, in this Agreement shall be reasonably construed in accordance with all relevant circumstances including, without limitation, prevailing practices in the industry of the parties in the place where the contract is to be performed and shall not be construed against either party, irrespective of which party may be deemed to have authored the ambiguous provision.

(h) Force Majeure.

- (i) Neither party hereto shall be liable for any delay or failure in the performance of any obligation under the Agreement or for any loss or damage (including indirect or consequential damage) to the extent that such nonperformance, delay, loss or damage results from any contingency which is beyond the control of such party, provided such contingency is not caused by the fault or negligence of such party. A contingency for the purposes of this Agreement shall be Acts of God, fire, explosions, storms, wars, hostilities, blockades, public disorders, quarantine restrictions, embargoes, strikes or other labor disturbances, and compliance with any law, order or control of, or insistence by any governmental or military authority.
- (ii) The party claiming to be affected by such contingency shall give immediate notice to the other party, giving full particulars thereof, and all such contingencies shall, as far as is reasonably possible, to be remedied with all reasonable efforts and dispatch. The existence of such contingencies shall justify the suspension of performance hereunder by either party and shall extend the time for such performance for a period of delay; provided, however, that if such period of delay shall exceed sixty (60) days from the date of such notice, either party shall have the right to cancel this Agreement.
- (i) <u>Third Party Beneficiaries</u>. Medical Center's system entities and corporate affiliates are intended third party beneficiaries of this Agreement.
- (j) <u>Cumulative Remedies</u>. The remedies herein reserved shall be cumulative, and additional to any other or further remedies provided in law or in equity. No waiver of a breach of any provision of this contract shall constitute a waiver of any other breach, or of such provision.
- (k) <u>Severability</u>. If any part of this Agreement is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void or unenforceable the remaining provisions will nevertheless continue in full force and effect.
- (I) <u>Authority</u>. Each party executing this Agreement hereby represents and warrants that he or she has full authority to enter into this Agreement and to bind the party upon whose behalf such individual has executed this Agreement.

AFFILIATION AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into between LOMA LINDA UNIVERSITY
MEDICAL CENTER, a nonprofit religious corporation having its principal place of
business at 11234 Anderson Street, Loma Linda, San Bernardino County, California,
92354 (hereinafter referred to as "LLUMC"), and Rancho Santiago Community
College District, on behalf of Santa Ana College having its principal place of business
at 2323 N. Broadway, Santa Ana, CA 92706 (hereinafter referred to as "School").
LLUMC and School may be referred to herein cumulatively as "The Parties."

RECITALS

WHEREAS, LLUMC is a licensed and accredited acute care teaching hospital engaged in providing professional medical services to the community;

WHEREAS, School has established clinical education programs as listed in Exhibit "A" which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference (hereinafter "Program") that require the School's students to receive special on site, hands on clinical training;

WHEREAS, the Program depends upon clinical education facilities where student(s) can obtain hands on clinical learning experience and training required by the Program's curriculum in order to assure the students are prepared for their respective profession;

WHEREAS, LLUMC has the clinical education facilities and setting to assist the School's student(s) to fulfill the clinical education requirements of the Program;

WHEREAS, the Parties hereto wish to cooperate for the purpose of improving the educational experience and teaching of the School's student(s) enrolled in the Program in order to ultimately provide a continuity and supply of qualified personnel for the future that will benefit the Parties and the community;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the above recitals, and the mutual covenants herein contained, the Parties hereto agree as follows:

ARTICLE I. TERM OF AGREEMENT

- A. <u>Recitals.</u> The foregoing Recitals are hereby incorporated by this reference as though fully set forth at length herein.
- B. <u>Term of Agreement</u>. This Agreement will be effective from February 15, 2010 and shall continue in effect until February 15, 2011; provided, however, that either Party may terminate this Agreement at any time upon giving the other Party ninety (90) days' written notice of its intention to terminate. Should notice of termination be given, students assigned to LLUMC shall be permitted to complete their previously scheduled assignments then in progress at LLUMC, subject to the business necessity of LLUMC.

ARTICLE II. RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE SCHOOL

- A. <u>Selection of Students</u>. The School will select only student(s) for assignment to LLUMC who have completed all academic requirements necessary to competently fulfill the clinical education assignments and responsibilities involved in the applicable Program. LLUMC shall, in its sole discretion, have the right to decline to accept any student(s) selected by the School.
- B. <u>Student List.</u> The School will provide LLUMC with the names of the student(s) selected to participate in the Program's clinical education experience at LLUMC. Information on the student's level of experience and competency, and such other educational data as may be required by LLUMC for evaluation should be made available to LLUMC upon request. Such information, and student selection list, shall be provided to the LLUMC Staff Development office no later than thirty (30) days prior to the arrival of the student(s) at LLUMC.
- C. <u>Authorized Activities</u>. The School shall prepare a description of the Program's clinical education requirements and a list of the types of clinical education assignments and/or professional activities that the student(s) is authorized by School to perform during the Program's clinical experience at LLUMC. This description of the program and list of authorized activities shall be referred to as the Program Plan, which is attached to this Agreement as Exhibit "B" and incorporated herein by reference.

- D. Supervising Faculty Member. The School will designate a supervising faculty member to coordinate with a clinical coordinator of LLUMC, each of whose names and titles shall appear as the persons to "notify" under this Agreement. The supervising faculty member coordinating assignment of student(s) to the LLUMC will instruct each of the students in the responsibilities incumbent on the student(s) during assignment to the Program at LLUMC and will advise such student(s) of activities prohibited by School, by LLUMC or by law. Each student(s) will be provided this information in writing and will be required to acknowledge, in writing, that he/she understands the same. The supervising faculty member and the LLUMC clinical coordinator shall together coordinate the clinical or practicum schedule of each student participating in the Program at LLUMC and shall confer with each other while the student participates in the Program's clinical education experience. In addition, the supervising faculty member, in concert with the LLUMC clinical coordinator, is responsible for counseling and/or advising student(s) regarding the clinical, practicum or fieldwork responsibilities during the period of assignment.
- E. <u>Evaluation Notification</u>. School will provide the LLUMC clinical coordinator with an evaluation tool at the beginning of the Program's clinical education experience for each student(s) assigned to LLUMC. Moreover, the LLUMC clinical coordinator will be notified thirty (30) days in advance of the date the evaluation is due to the supervising faculty member at School.
- F. <u>Student Conduct.</u> The supervising faculty member will provide the LLUMC clinical coordinator with a copy of the School's Student Information Booklet or Student Handbook. Student(s) will be governed by the policies delineated in this Booklet or Handbook and by all relevant LLUMC policies and procedures. Furthermore, while at LLUMC, student(s) are expected to conduct themselves in a professional manner. Student(s) attire, as well as their appearance, must conform to and abide by the accepted standards and policies of LLUMC, and student(s) must wear their School ID, visible on their person(s) at all times while at LLUMC during their clinical training.
- G. <u>Student Health Certification</u>. The School will require that its student(s) present medical certification to LLUMC that they are immune from measles, mumps, rubella, varicella, have completed the Hepatitis B vaccination series, have had a timely negative TB/PPD test (or written chest x-ray physician report), have received a one-time dose of Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis), and have undergone a physical examination within the year immediately prior to beginning their program rotation at LLUMC.

Moreover, the School shall also provide evidence of each student's ability to perform the essential functions of the clinical education experience/practicum to which the student(s) is assigned. If a student does not meet the requirements of this paragraph he or she will not be permitted to commence or continue their program rotation at LLUMC.

- H. Student Insurance. The School shall assume full responsibility for requiring each student to arrange for their own health insurance for injuries or illnesses suffered by student(s) when not provided by the School for the period of time the student(s) is at LLUMC. It is understood and agreed that LLUMC shall not be responsible for providing any type of insurance coverage, including worker's compensation coverage, for any and/or all student(s) who choose to participate in the Program's clinical education experience at LLUMC. If a student does not meet the requirements of this paragraph he or she will not be permitted to commence or continue their program rotation at LLUMC.
- I. <u>Insurance</u>. The School shall at its sole cost and expense, provide coverage for its activities in connection with this Agreement by maintaining in full force and effect programs of insurance and/or self-insurance as follows:
 - Professional Liability And
 General Liability coverage with limits of One Million Dollars
 (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and an aggregate of Three Million Dollars
 (\$3,000,000).
 - 2. Workers' Compensation coverage covering School's full liability as required under state law.
 - 3. Such other insurance in such amounts which from time to time may be reasonably required by the mutual consent of the Parties, against other insurable risks relating to this Agreement.

It should be expressly understood, however, that the coverage required under this Section shall not in any way limit the liability of School.

The School, upon the execution of this Agreement, shall furnish LLUMC with certificates evidencing compliance with these insurance requirements. Certificates shall further provide for thirty (30) days advance written notice to LLUMC of any cancellation of the above coverage.

- J. <u>Indemnification</u>. The School hereby agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless LLUMC from any liability or damages LLUMC may suffer as a result of claims, demands, costs, or judgments against it resulting from the operation of program covered by this Agreement resulting from the negligence of the School, its employees, students, or authorized agents. LLUMC agrees to give the School notice in writing within thirty (30) days of any claim made against it on the obligations covered hereby. School agrees to assume full responsibility for cost or replacement of equipment and/or property that is damaged due to negligence on the part of the School students or faculty.
- **K.** <u>Accreditation.</u> School warrants that it is accredited and will maintain accreditation in good standing with the State agency of applicable jurisdiction over School and/or the higher education accreditation association for the region where School is located.
- L. Background Checks. All students who are assigned to LLUMC shall have had a background check performed under the direction, and at the sole cost, of the School in accordance with applicable State caregiver background check law and LLUMC policy. The results of the background check must contain clearance for the past 7 years, cover all names, all counties, Office of Inspector General (OIG), Social Security Number, and Sex Offender Database. The School will evaluate and determine if an individual is barred from performing clinical assignments and responsibilities at or in the clinical education site(s). The School will use the following list of prohibited, unacceptable offenses to make this determination: murder, sexual offenses, felonies involving weapons and/or violence, felony assault, felony possession and furnishing (without certificate of rehab both drugs and alcohol), misdemeanors reflecting conduct that would make one unacceptable for employment by LLUMC including, but not limited to, crimes of theft or fraud, physical violence or sexual misconduct.

ARTICLE III.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF LLUMC

A. <u>Number of Students</u>. LLUMC agrees to accept qualified student(s) in both a minimum and maximum number as set forth in Exhibit "A" which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

- B. <u>Clinical Coordinator</u>. LLUMC will provide the School with the name and, if requested, the professional and academic credentials of the individual(s) who will serve as the clinical coordinator(s) of the Program's clinical education experience.
- C. <u>Program Requirements</u>. The Program Plan, which is a description of the Program's clinical education requirements as defined by the School, is attached to this Agreement as Exhibit "B" and incorporated herein by reference. LLUMC agrees to work with the student(s) to assure that such requirements are followed and documented during the period the student(s) is assigned to LLUMC. LLUMC shall endeavor to provide clinical education experiences and opportunities in accordance with the requirements of the Program as presented in the Program Plan. LLUMC will also provide the facilities and supplies required by the student(s) to participate in the Program's clinical education experience. In the event of a conflict between the terms of this Agreement and the terms of any appendix to this Agreement, the provisions of this Agreement shall prevail.
- D. <u>Program Schedule/Rotation</u>. The clinical internship schedule or rotation for the student(s) will be mutually agreed upon by the School and LLUMC to assure that the requirements of the School will be met. Therapeutic, diagnostic or other procedures prohibited by applicable laws or statutes of the State of California are precluded.
- E. <u>Evaluation</u>. At specified intervals and at the conclusion of each student's clinical education experience, the LLUMC clinical coordinator will provide the supervising faculty member(s) with an evaluation of each student's performance in a form satisfactory to the School.
- F. <u>Student Status.</u> Students assigned to LLUMC shall not be considered as employees of LLUMC. LLUMC will not provide the student(s) with any salary or benefits during the Program's clinical education experience at LLUMC. LLUMC will provide no financial reimbursement to School nor to the student(s). LLUMC shall not be responsible for any medical, travel, housing, meals or other expenses of the student(s). Student(s) shall have no right or claim against LLUMC for any social security benefits, workers' compensation benefits, disability benefits, unemployment insurance benefits, health benefits, vacation pay, sick leave or any other employee type benefit of any kind. In addition, this Agreement is not a third-party beneficiary contract and confers no rights upon any student or employee of the Parties.
- G. <u>Student Withdrawal</u>. LLUMC will recommend to the School the withdrawal of a student from the Program if the achievement, progress, adjustment or

health of the student does not warrant a continuation at LLUMC, or the behavior of the student fails to conform to the applicable rules, policies or procedures of LLUMC. LLUMC reserves the right, exercised in its sole discretion after consultation with the School, to discontinue a specific student(s) participation in the Program and to exclude such student(s) from its premises in the event such student's conduct or health is deemed objectionable or detrimental for any reason. Any unacceptable conduct of the student(s) should be reported to the supervising faculty member(s) immediately. Any corrective action or discipline taken by LLUMC toward the student(s) will be governed by LLUMC policies and procedures. Since the student(s) is neither an employee nor a staff member, it is understood and agreed that the student(s) approval to obtain clinical education experiences at LLUMC shall not entitle the student(s) to any hearing or appeal process at LLUMC other then as stated herein.

- H. <u>Insurance</u>. LLUMC shall at its sole cost and expense, provide coverage for its activities in connection with this Agreement by maintaining in full force and effect programs of insurance and/or self-insurance as follows:
 - 1. Professional Liability coverage with limits of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and an aggregate of Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000).
 - 2. General Liability coverage with limits of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and an aggregate of Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000).
 - 3. Workers' Compensation coverage covering LLUMC's full liability as required under state law.
 - 4. Such other insurance in such amounts which from time to time may be reasonably required by the mutual consent of the Parties, against other insurable risks relating to this Agreement.

It should be expressly understood, however, that the coverage required under this section shall not in any way limit the liability of LLUMC. LLUMC, upon the execution of this Agreement, shall furnish School with certificates evidencing compliance with these insurance requirements upon request. Certificates shall further provide for thirty (30) days advance written notice to School of any cancellation of the above coverage.

I. <u>Indemnification</u>. LLUMC hereby agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold School, its officers, agents and employees and its students harmless from and against any

and all liability, loss, expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees and court costs), lawsuits, judgments, awards or claims for injuries to persons, including death, and damage to property, resulting from the performance of this Agreement, but only in proportion to, and to the extent, that any and all such liability, loss, expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees and court costs), lawsuits, judgments, awards or claims are caused by or result from the negligence or intentional acts or omissions of LLUMC, its employees, or agents. School agrees to give LLUMC notice in writing within thirty (30) days of any claim made against it on the obligations covered hereby.

ARTICLE IV. GENERAL PROVISIONS

- A. <u>Non-Discrimination</u>. The School and LLUMC agree that neither will discriminate unlawfully against a beneficiary of services in the performance of this Agreement on the basis of gender, race, color, national origin, creed, religion, veteran's status or disability. The School understands that LLUMC is a religious nonprofit corporation operated as an entity of the Seventh-day Adventist Church and holds various rights and exemptions as a religion organization under federal and state laws and the Religion Clauses of the federal and California Constitutions.
- B. Removal from LLUMC Clinical Education Experience. Student(s) not complying with the academic requirements of the School or the requirements and policies of LLUMC will be removed from the Program's clinical education experience after notification of the supervising faculty member(s) and after discussion with the LLUMC clinical coordinator(s). Student(s) will be provided an opportunity for an informal appeal of any such decision. The mechanism for such appeal shall be via a written document signed and dated by the student(s) explaining the facts and proposed resolution which shall be submitted no later than three (3) days after the student(s) is notified of the decision to remove the student(s) from the Program. The original document shall be forwarded to the LLUMC clinical coordinator with copies to the supervising faculty member at School. The LLUMC clinical coordinator and the School's supervising faculty member shall confer regarding the documentation. The final decision regarding the appropriateness of the removal or reinstatement and/or any other requirements shall rest with the LLUMC clinical coordinator and shall be final and binding.

- C. **HIPAA Compliance**. School agrees to comply with the applicable provisions of the Administrative Simplification section of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996, as codified at 42 U.S.C. § 1320 through d-8 ("HIPAA"), and the requirements of any regulations promulgated thereunder, including, without limitation, the federal privacy regulations as contained in 45 C.F.R. Part 164, and the federal security standards as contained in 45 C.F.R. Part 142 (collectively, the "Regulations"). School shall not use or further disclose any protected health information, as defined in 42 U.S.C. § 1320d (collectively, the "Protected Health Information"), other than as permitted by this Agreement and the requirements of HIPAA or the Regulations. School will implement appropriate safeguards to prevent the use or disclosure of Protected Health Information other than as contemplated by this Agreement. School will promptly report to Hospital any use or disclosures, of which School becomes aware, of Protected Health Information in violation of HIPAA or the Regulations. In the event that School contracts with any agents to whom School provides Protected Health Information, School shall include provisions in such agreements pursuant to which School and such agents agree to the same restrictions and conditions that apply to School with respect to Protected Health Information. School will make its internal practices, books and records relating to the use and disclosure of Protected Health Information available to the Secretary of the United States Department of Health and Human Services to the extent required for determining compliance with HIPAA and the Regulations. No attorneyclient, accountant-client or other legal or equitable privilege shall be deemed to have been waived by School or Hospital by virtue of this Subsection.
- D. <u>Student Relationship</u>. The relationship of any participating student(s) and LLUMC is that of a student of the School, and nothing contained herein shall be construed as creating any other relationship of any nature, including, but not limited to, an employment relationship of any nature, between any student(s) and LLUMC.
- E. <u>Assigned Program Experience</u>. The School and LLUMC agree that participating student(s) may engage only in those School authorized activities that are listed in the Program Plan, which is attached to this Agreement as Exhibit "B" and incorporated herein by reference, which are permitted by applicable law and are of a type approved by LLUMC.
- **F.** Assignment. Other than as previously stated herein, neither this Agreement nor any duties or obligations under this Agreement may be assigned or

transferred without the prior written consent of the other Party. Furthermore, student(s) also may not assign or transfer their clinical education experience obligations and/or rotation(s) to anyone without the prior written consent of the LLUMC clinical coordinator.

- G. <u>Cooperation of Parties</u>. The Parties agree to comply with all reasonable requests of the other and to provide access to all documents reasonably necessary to the performance of each Parties' respective obligations under the terms and conditions of this Agreement.
- M. Notices. Any notices to be given hereunder by either Party to the other may be effected in writing either by personal delivery, by mail, registered or certified postage prepaid with return receipt requested, or by Federal Express or similar/like courier service. Mailed notices shall be addressed to the Parties as listed below but each Party may change their address by written notice in accordance with this Section.

 Notices delivered personally will be deemed communicated as of actual receipt; mailed notices will be deemed communicated as of two (2) days after deposit thereof in the United States mail as shown on the addressee's registry or certificate of receipt; and notices sent by Federal Express or similar/like courier service will be deemed communicated one day after deposited with Federal Express or similar/like courier or one of its agents.

I. Entire Agreement of Parties. This Agreement supersedes any and all agreements, either oral or written, between the Parties hereto with respect to the content of this Agreement and contains all the covenants and agreements between the Parties Page 10 of 15

with respect thereto in any manner whatsoever. Each Party to this Agreement acknowledges that no representations, inducements, promises, or agreements, orally or otherwise, have been made by any Party, or anyone acting on behalf of any Party, which are not embodied herein, and that no other agreement, statement, or promise, not contained in this Agreement shall be valid or binding. Any modification of this Agreement will be effective only if it is in writing signed by the Party to be charged.

- J. <u>Partial Invalidity.</u> If any provision of this Agreement is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void, or unenforceable, the remaining provisions will nevertheless continue in full force and effect without being impaired or invalidated in any way. The Parties shall abide by all federal and state laws, regulations, rules and ordinances relating to the subject matter described herein.
- K. <u>Drug-Free Workplace</u>. School agrees to comply with the Drug Free Workplace Policy of LLUMC. School's signature affixed to this Agreement certifies that School shall require that the School's faculty, agents and student(s) shall not engage in the unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensation, possession, sale or use of controlled substances while engaged in clinical education experiences at LLUMC or while this Agreement is in force.
- 1. Copy of Drug-Free Workplace Policy. School acknowledges receipt of a copy of the "Drug-Free Workplace Policy" (hereinafter "Policy") of LLUMC concurrent with signing of this Agreement.
- 2. <u>Compliance with Policy</u>. School's signature affirms that School has read, understands, and agrees to abide by and to require its faculty, agents and student(s) to abide by the Policy as a condition of this Agreement.
- 3. <u>Criminal Drug Violation Notice</u>. School's signature affirms the understanding and agreement that any conviction of student(s) or any agent(s) of School of a criminal drug statute for a violation occurring on the premises of LLUMC must be reported to LLUMC's Administrative Director of Human Resources within five (5) days of any conviction and, in turn, the LLUMC's Administrative Director of Human Resources shall notify the appropriate Federal agency(ies) within ten (10) days after learning of the conviction.

By such signature, School also agrees to require School's faculty, agents and student(s) to abide by the five (5) day notice requirement and to notify School's faculty, agents and student(s) of the requirement of LLUMC to notify the appropriate Federal agency(ies) within ten (10) days after learning of any such conviction.

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- L. <u>Governing Law.</u> This Agreement will be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California.

- O. <u>Captions</u>. Captions herein are used solely for reference and as a matter of convenience, and in no way bind, limit, or describe the scope or intent of any provision.
- P. <u>Counterparts.</u> This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which if so executed shall be deemed to be an original; the counterparts shall together constitute a single Agreement.
- Q. <u>Status of Parties.</u> LLUMC and School shall not, by virtue of this Agreement, in any way be deemed to or construed to create a single employer, a joint venture or a joint employer relationship,
- R. <u>Survival of Termination or Expiration of Agreement</u>. The Parties agree that the obligations, covenants, agreements and rights of the Parties as set forth in Article II, Paragraphs (I)-(I) and (I)-(K); Article III, Paragraphs (H) and (I); and Article IV, Sections, (C), (D), (G), (L) and (M) shall survive any termination or expiration of this Agreement.
- S. <u>Force Majeure</u>. If either LLUMC or School is unable to perform its duties under this Agreement due to strikes, lock-outs, labor disputes, inability to obtain labor, governmental restrictions, regulations or controls, civil commotion, fire or other casualty, emergency, or any other cause beyond the reasonable control of either LLUMC or School, such non-performing Party shall be excused the performance of the other Party, and shall not be in breach of this Agreement, for a period equal to any such prevention, delay or stoppage.
- T. <u>Mission Statement</u>. LLUMC is committed to its Mission to continue the healing and teaching ministry of Jesus Christ -- "To Make Man Whole," Such commitment is embodied in all LLUMC agreements. As such, School understands and agrees that all students are to behave in accordance with the standards of conduct and

ethics which are not in conflict with the ethics, principles, and philosophy of the Seventhday Adventist Church. School also acknowledges receipt of a copy of the LLUMC Mission Statement concurrent with signing this Agreement.

AGREEMENT

Occupational Therapy Assistant Program

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into 22nd of February 2010 by and between Progressus Therapy, hereinafter called the Agency, and Rancho Santiago Community College District on behalf of Santa Ana College, hereinafter called the District.

PART I. BASIS AND PURPOSE OF AGREEMENT

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the District and Agency acknowledge a public obligation to contribute to Occupational Therapy Assistant Program education for the benefit for students and to meet community needs.

WHEREAS, the District provides programs in Occupational Therapy Assistant Program education, which require clinical experience for students, enrolled in these programs.

WHEREAS, the Agency has facilities suitable for the clinical needs of the District programs in the Occupational Therapy Assistant Program.

WHEREAS, it is to the benefit of both District and Agency that Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students have opportunities for clinical experience to enhance their capabilities as practitioners.

NOW, THEREFORE, the District and Agency do covenant and agree as follows:

PART II. GENERAL RESPONSIBILITIES AND PRIVILEGES OF THE COLLEGE

- A. For the Program in General
 - 1. The District will assume full responsibility for offering Occupational Therapy Assistant Program education programs eligible for accreditation by the appropriate State Board.
 - 2. District faculty members may be invited to serve as voluntary resource persons to the Agency staff by serving on Occupational Therapy Assistant Program care committees, by sharing knowledge as clinical experts, and by participation in other matters dealing with the quality of patient care.
 - 3. For Background clearance
 The District shall inform The Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students of
 the Background Check requirement and their responsibility of payment.
 - 4. For Student Workmen's Compensation
 The District shall carry Workmen's Compensation Insurance on students of the

District during clinical assignment, and keep records of clinical attendance for audit by the State Workmen's Compensation Insurance Fund.

B. For Program Planning

- 1. The District will initiate the development of mutually acceptable clinical instruction plans for using the Agency's clinical areas to meet the educational goals of Occupational Therapy Assistant Program curricula. These plans will be made available to the Agency at a mutually agreed upon time prior to the beginning of the school term and subject to revision in instances of conflicts with agency patient care responsibilities and/or District interests.
- The District has the privilege of regularly scheduled meetings with Agency staff, including both selected Agency personnel and administrative level representatives for the purpose of interpreting, discussing, and evaluating the educational program in occupational therapy.

C. For Occupational Therapy Assistant Program Students

1. The District will be responsible for assuring that Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students assigned to the Agency for clinical instruction meet both District and Agency standards of health and physical fitness, and shall provide certification that the Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students have been immunized against the common communicable diseases.

PART III. GENERAL RESPONSIBILITIES AND PRIVILEGES OF THE AGENCY

A. For the Program in General

- 1. The Agency will maintain the standards, which make it eligible for approval as a clinical area for instruction in accredited Occupational Therapy Assistant Program programs. To further this, the Agency agrees to provide and maintain personnel who are in its opinion, capable and qualified in those divisions in which students are placed.
- 2. The administration of the service and patient care at the Agency shall be the responsibility of and under the control and supervision of the Agency and shall be administered through the Agency and shall be administered through the Agency staff.
- 3. The Agency will designate a staff member who will function as Education Coordinator for Occupational Therapy Assistant Program education uses of the Agency facilities, including joint planning and representatives of all involved Occupational Therapy Assistant Program programs.
- 4. The Agency will provide orientation for students and faculty to familiarize them with Agency policies and facilities before assigning them to duties at the Agency.

- 5. The Agency will permit its employees to participate in the educational program as resource persons and clinical experts provided such participation does not interfere with assigned duties.
- 6. The Agency will permit the faculty and students of the District to use its patient care and patient service facilities for clinical education according to approved curricula.
- 7. The Agency will confer with the District prior to making a commitment for new or expanded use of its clinical facilities by any other Occupational Therapy Assistant Program that interfere with current student placement.

B. For Services and Facilities

- 1. The Agency will permit the educational use of such supplies and equipment as are commonly available for patient care.
- 2. The Agency will permit use of the following facilities and services by District Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students and faculty at such times and to the degrees considered feasible by the agency.
 - a. Parking areas.
 - b. Locker, storage and dressing facilities.
 - c. Same food services as are available for Agency staff.
 - d. First aid treatment with written consent required for minors.
 - e. Access to sources of information for education purposes such as:
 - 1. Patient's chart.
 - 2. Procedure guides policy manuals.
 - 3. Medical dictionaries, pharmacology references, and other references suitable to the clinical area.
 - 4. Books and periodicals in the Medical library.

C. For the Control of District Personnel

1. The Agency may refuse access to its clinical areas to Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students or district faculty who do not meet its employee standards for safety, health, cooperation, or ethical behavior pending investigation and resolution of the matter by the Agency and the District.

PART IV. **JOINT RESPONSIBILITIES AND PRIVILEGES**

A. For publications

1. Publication by District faculty, or Agency staff members of any material relative to their clinical experience, that has not been approved for release by the District and Agency signers of this agreement, is prohibited.

B. Insurance:

Without limiting the indemnification obligations stated below, each party to the Agreement shall maintain and secure at its own expense comprehensive general liability, property damage insurance, and professional liability of not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and three million dollars (\$3,000,000) in the aggregate, and said policy shall remain in full force and effect during the term hereof. Thirty (30) days written notice shall be provided to the other party prior to cancellation, or reduction in said insurance. Upon request, the requesting party shall be provided a copy of said policy.

C. Indemnification

All parties to this Agreement shall agree to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the other part, its officers, agents, employees, students and volunteers, from and against all loss, cost, and expense arising out of any liability or claim of liability, sustained or claimed to have been sustained, arising out of the activities, or the performance or nonperformance of obligations under this Agreement, of the indemnifying party, or those of any of its officers, agents, employees, students or volunteers. The provisions of this Article do not apply to any damage or losses caused solely by the negligence or intentional acts of the non-indemnifying party or any of its agents or employees.

PART V. STATUS OF OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY ASSISTANT STUDENTS

- A. Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students shall have the status as learners and shall not be considered to be Agency employees nor shall they replace Agency staff. Any service rendered by the student during the experience is to be considered in addition to planned patient care in that area. Clinical experience will be conducted as a laboratory learning experience. The Agency will provide regular staffing for patient care in areas where students are obtaining clinical experience.
- B. Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students are subject to the authority, policies, and regulations of the district. They are also subject, during clinical assignment, to applicable agency regulations and must conform to the same standards as are for Agency employees in matters relating to the welfare of patients and general Agency operations.
- C. Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students shall be responsible for proper coverage in regard to malpractice insurance, or any other liability insurance that might be required by either the District or the Agency.
- D. The District will be responsible for assuring that health care students assigned to the Agency for clinical instruction meet both District and Agency standards of health and physical fitness.

PART VI. PERIOD OF AGREEMENT, TERMINATION

A. This agreement shall be effective as of the date signed, and shall continue in effect for five years, unless terminated earlier by written notice of either party. Either party to this Agreement may, in its sole discretion, terminate this Agreement with or without cause by

giving the other party at least 30 days' prior written notice. In the event the Agreement is terminated for cause, all of the obligations of the terminating party shall be waived immediately upon written notice of termination. In the event of termination without cause, the parties agree to fulfill their respective obligations associated with the current term or semester, prior to such termination becoming effective.

STANDARD CLINICAL AFFILIATION AGREEMENT PHARMACY TECHNICIAN

This standard Clinical Affiliation Agreement (the "Agreement") is made and entered into this <u>23rd</u> day of <u>February</u> 2010 by and between the Rancho Santiago Community College District, a public educational agency ("District") located at 2323 N. Broadway, Santa Ana, CA 92706-1640 and Ramsay Rexall Drugs ("Clinical Facility"), located at 2246 Newport Blvd. Costa Mesa, CA 92627.

WHEREAS, District and Clinical Facility desire to contribute to community health education;

WHEREAS, District operates Santa Ana College ("College") and College is a duly accredited educational institution that conducts the program(s) described and identified in this Agreement (the "Program");

WHEREAS, District has obtained all necessary licenses, consents and/or approvals to conduct the Program from the State of California and any other applicable government agency;

WHEREAS, Clinical Facility operates a duly licensed health care agency at the address listed above and has obtained all necessary licenses, consents, and approvals;

WHEREAS, as part of the Program, students are required to participate in a clinical experience rotation;

WHEREAS, District desires to affiliate with the Clinical Facility in order that students may participate in a clinical experience rotation at the Clinical Facility; and

WHEREAS, District and Clinical Facility desire to enter into this Agreement to memorialize their respective rights, duties, and obligations with respect to the clinical experience rotation of students of the College's Program.

For purposes of this Agreement, the following definitions shall apply:

"District" shall refer to the Rancho Santiago Community College District, its member Colleges, the District's Governing Board, and each of their trustees, employees, agents, representatives, successors and assigns;

"College" shall refer to Santa Ana College, and each of it employees, agents, representatives and assigns;

"Clinical Facility" shall refer to its parents, subsidies, related companies, and each of their officers, directors, employees, agents representatives, successors, and assigns;

The "Program" shall refer to the Clinical training in health science programs as identified and described in this Agreement; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the following covenants, conditions and agreements, the parties hereto agree as follows:

TERMS

- 1. <u>Clinical Experience Rotation</u>. Clinical Facility agrees to provide students of the Program who are specified by College with a clinical experience rotation ("Rotation"), in accordance with standards established by governmental agencies and recognized professional accrediting agencies, and subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement.
- 2. <u>Development of Curriculum</u>. College shall be fully responsible for the development, planning, and administration of the program, including, without limitation, programming, administration, matriculation, promotion and graduation. College acknowledges and agrees that the Rotation is intended to meet certain educational performance objectives, and College shall provide a copy of such performance objectives to Clinical Facility on or before student placement. Clinical Facility shall be fully responsible for the availability and appropriateness of the learning environment in relation to the program's written objectives.
- 3. Exposure to Bloodborne Pathogens. Program students and college faculty will comply with the final regulations issued by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration governing employee exposure to bloodborne pathogens in the workplace under Section VI(b) of the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970, which regulations became effective March 6, 1992 (the "Regulations"), including but not limited to responsibility as the employer to provide all program students with (a) information and training about the hazards associated with blood and other potentially infectious materials, (b) information and training about the protective measures to be taken to minimize the risk of occupational exposure to bloodborne pathogens, (c) training in the appropriate actions to take in an emergency involving exposure to blood and other potentially infectious materials, and (d) information as to the reasons the program student should participate in hepatitis B vaccination and post-exposure evaluation and follow-up.
- 4. <u>Applicable Procedure: Acceptance.</u> College agrees to provide Clinical Facility with a list of the name(s) of students who will be participating in a rotation.
- 5. <u>Nondiscrimination</u>. The parties agree not to discriminate in the selection, placement or evaluation of any student or faculty member because of race, creed, national origin, religion, sex, marital status, age, handicap, and/or medical condition.
- 6. <u>Academic Year</u>. The academic year consists of Fall and Spring semesters, Summer session and Winter break intersession.

- 7. Rotation Schedule. The rotation schedule shall be determined by College and Clinical Facility and may be amended from time to time by agreement of the parties. The number of students in each rotation shall be limited to a number mutually agreed upon by both parties, not to exceed the number specified by the accrediting agency(s).
- 8. <u>Orientation</u>. Clinical Facility and College shall provide an orientation for assigned students participating in each rotation.
- 9. <u>Compliance With Clinical Facility Rules</u>. Clinical Facility shall make available all applicable governing instruments, policies and procedures, rules and regulations of Clinical Facility to each student participating in a rotation, and student shall comply with these rules.
 - In providing the students with the clinical rotation that is the subject of this Agreement, Clinical Facility shall comply with all applicable laws, rules, regulations, statutes, polices, procedures, and ordinances and shall be consistent with the professional standards of a health care agency.
- 10. <u>Confidentiality of Patient Records</u>. Students and faculty understand and agree that Clinical Facility's patient files are confidential.
- 11. <u>Clinical Instructor (College)</u>. College agrees to designate a coordinator for each program. The coordinator, who may be an academic instructor, shall be responsible for all teaching activities.
- 12. <u>Clinical Advisor (Clinical Facility)</u>. Although the Instructor assigns the grade for the student, Clinical Facility via a Clinical Advisor may provide input to the clinical performance and evaluation of student(s), be a resource person for College's faculty and students, and shall communicate with the clinical coordinator designated by College regarding the clinical rotation and shall arrange formal orientation to the facility for the faculty and students.
- 13. <u>Supervision of Students</u>. The supervision, evaluation and direction of students while on site at Clinical Facility shall be the responsibility of the Clinical Advisor (Clinical Facility) or designee as guided by the instructional objectives. No direct, hands-on patient care shall be provided by participating students at Clinical Facility, except in accordance with all applicable laws, Clinical Facility rules, regulation, policies and procedures. District recognizes the patients' rights to refuse care provided by a student at Clinical Facility.
- 14. Removal of Students. Clinical Facility retains the right to exclude any student at any time from any clinical area. Any student who is asked to leave by Clinical Facility shall do so promptly and without protest. Clinical Facility shall also have the right, at any time, to request College to remove a student permanently from the rotation. Except as otherwise provided under any approachable policies, procedures, rules regulations, and/or under any law, any such removal shall not require compliance with any notice, hearing or other procedural requirements.

- 15. Patient Care. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as conferring any right or duty upon College, its students or faculty members, to control or direct patient care or operations at Clinical Facility. Clinical Facility shall maintain sole responsibility and accountability for patient care and shall provide adequate staffing in number and competency to ensure safe and continuous health care during the term of this Agreement.
- Instructor (College), he/she shall be responsible for student(s) evaluation. Unless otherwise mutually agreed between the Clinical Instructor (College) and the Clinical Advisor (Clinical Facility), Clinical Facility may be responsible for submitting input to the Clinical Instructor evaluating and appropriately documenting the performance of each student in the clinical rotation. The appropriate forms shall be provided by the Clinical Instructor. Nothing herein shall be construed as a guarantee by or obligation of Clinical Facility regarding the performance of any student during the rotation. College shall keep records on the progress and evaluation of each student's clinical experience during a rotation for a period of three (3) years following the end of the specific rotation in which the student is involved.
- 17. Ongoing Communication. College has the privilege of regularly scheduled meetings with Clinical Facility staff, including both selected unit personnel and administrative level representatives for the purpose of interpreting, discussing, and evaluating College's health care programs at a mutually agreed upon time.
- 18. <u>Materials</u>. College agrees to provide students with all educational material required during the clinical program.
- 19. <u>Access to Clinical Facility's Services/Facilities</u>. Clinical Facility agrees to provide students with access to the medical library, parking, lockers, food services and first aid where the Clinical Facility has those types of services/facilities available during its normal business hours.
- 20. No Payments or Other Remuneration. College agrees that no fees or monetary payments of any kind shall be exchanged between Clinical Facility, its agents and employees, and College, its agents, employees and students under the terms of this Agreement. Further, neither College, its staff members nor other representatives, shall attempt to bill or collect from any patient or from any other source fees for services provided to patients by said student.

The only exception shall be when Clinical Facility and College mutually agree to pay a Clinical Advisor a stipend for duties directly related to College's program.

21. No Right To Employment. The parties agree that the students of College shall not be considered employees, agents or volunteers of Clinical Facility, nor shall any student be entitled to any right, compensation, or other benefits normally afforded to employees of Clinical Facility, including but not limited to, Social Security, unemployment and workers' compensation insurance.

- 22. <u>Insurance Carried by the District</u>. District shall assure coverage of professional liability insurance for each student participating in the Rotation of not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and three million dollars (\$3,000,000) in the aggregate, and said policy shall remain in full force and effect during the term hereof. District shall provide workers' compensation coverage for students participating in the rotation. These coverages are in effect while the student is on-site at Clinical Facility.
- 23. <u>Insurance Carried By Clinical Facility</u>. Clinical Facility shall secure and maintain comprehensive general liability insurance covering personal injury, property damage, and general liability claims in the amount of at least one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and three million dollars (\$3,000,000) in the aggregate with coverage for incidental contracts. A certificate of insurance must be provided that includes thirty (30) days notice of cancellation, modification, or reduction in said insurance. Clinical Facility shall deliver certificate(s) of insurance under Clinical Facility's comprehensive general liability insurance policy on or before the date of execution of this agreement. Upon request, District shall be provided a copy of said policy.

Clinical Facility shall carry professional liability insurance for itself and each of its employee(s), partners, and/or representatives providing professional services at Clinical Facility, except for District's students and College faculty, in the amount of at least one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and three million dollars (\$3,000,000) in the aggregate. Clinical Facility shall provide District with thirty (30) days written notice prior to cancellation, or reduction in said insurance. Upon request, District shall be provided a copy of said policy.

Clinical Facility shall provide workers' compensation coverage for each of its employees.

- 24. <u>Student Health Records</u>. Any student participating in a rotation shall provide verification of annual T.B. screening. This record shall be maintained in the Department of Pharmacy Technology at the College.
- 25. <u>Student Medical Care</u>. To the extent that any first aid or emergency care is required in connection with an injury or illness incurred by a student during performance of his/her clinical training during a rotation, the student shall be treated by Clinical Facility as appropriate.
- 26. Confidentiality of Student Records. Clinical Facility shall adopt and enforce whatever policies and procedures are necessary to protect the confidentiality of student records as defined herein.

- 27. <u>Verification</u>. College warrants and represents that it has obtained all necessary approvals and consents from any and all agencies to enable Clinical Facility to offer the rotation to College's students participating in the Program. If requested by Clinical Facility, College will provide Clinical Facility with verification that the Program is duly licensed, duly accredited and/or certified, as applicable, by appropriate agencies. District covenants and agrees that at all times during the term hereof it shall retain such licensure, accreditation and/or certification, and its Program and faculty members shall continue to meet any and all federal, state and local requirements.
- 28. <u>Indemnification</u>. All parties to this Agreement shall agree to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the other party, its officers, agents, employees, and volunteers, from and against all loss, cost and expense arising out of any liability or claim of liability, sustained or claimed to have been sustained, arising out of the activities or the performance or nonperformance of obligations under this Agreement, of the indemnifying party, or those of any of its officers, agents, employees or volunteers. The provisions of this Article do not apply to any damage or losses caused solely by the negligence or intentional acts of the non-indemnifying party or any of its agents or employees.
- 29. Governing Law. This Agreement shall be governed by and constructed in accordance with the laws of the State of California.
- 30. <u>Assignment</u>. Neither party hereto may assign this Agreement or delegate its duties hereunder without the prior written consent of the other party which can and may be withheld by either party in its sole and absolute discretion.
- 31. <u>Effective Date Termination</u>. This Agreement shall become effective February 23, 2010 until February 24, 2015, unless sooner terminated by either party in accordance with this section. Either party may terminate this Agreement without cause by giving ninety (90) days prior written notice to the other party of its intention to terminate. In the event a rotation is in progress, any written notice to terminate with or without cause shall become effective at the expiration of the rotation. Notwithstanding the foregoing, in the event the Program is discontinued by College during its Term, this Agreement shall immediately terminate without further action by the parties hereto.
- 32. Notices. Any notices to be given hereunder by either party to the other may be effectuated only in writing and delivered either by personal delivery, or by U.S. mail. Mailed notices shall be addressed to the persons at the addresses set forth below, but each party may change the address by written notice in accordance with this paragraph. Notices delivered personally will be deemed communicated as of actual receipt; mailed notices will be deemed communicated as of ten (10) days after mailing.

BACKGROUND

In 2005 the W.K. Kellogg Foundation entered into an agreement with Santa Ana College to serve as lead agency for a statewide educational reform initiative entitled California ENLACE, to raise educational achievement among Latino students in the region and the state. The project was awarded a \$1 million grant beginning August 1, 2005 and concluding July 31, 2008. Permission to carry the project work forward through July 31, 2010 was granted by the W.K. Kellogg Foundation and approved by the RSCCD Board of Trustees on September 22, 2008.

The purpose of this request is to move remaining funds from the project for a final set of activities that will be carried out in conjunction with the strategic plan and fundraising goals of the SAC Foundation.

ANALYSIS

The model student success initiatives that are supported through this effort include underwriting SAC student microloans, supporting student success Promotores or peer mentors, and other innovative programs that will help students enter and succeed at SAC during a time when access is threatened and support services have been reduced. These activities are further outlined in Attachment A and are fully aligned with the SAC Foundation's strategic plan and fundraising priorities as updated at their January 29, 2010 retreat.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN RANCHO SANTIAGO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT AND THE SANTA ANA COLLEGE FOUNDATION

This agreement ("Agreement") is entered into this <u>23rd day of February</u>, <u>2010</u> by and between THE SANTA ANA COLLEGE FOUNDATION (SACF) and Rancho Santiago Community College District ("Sponsor"), "SACF" and "Sponsor" will collectively be referred to as the Parties and agree as follows:

The *Sponsor* shall make payment to SACF upon receipt of SACF's properly completed and annotated invoice. The *Sponsor* will not be obligated to pay any invoice where total payments would result in a cumulative payment in excess of the limitations imposed by Article 3.

STANDARD CLINICAL AFFILIATION AGREEMENT

This standard Clinical Affiliation Agreement (the "Agreement") is made and entered into between the Rancho Santiago Community College District, a public educational agency ("District") located at 2323 North Broadway, Santa Ana, California and French Park Care ("Clinical Facility"), located at 600 E. Washington, Santa Ana, California, 92701.

WHEREAS, District and Clinical Facility desire to contribute to community health education,

WHEREAS, District operates Santa Ana College ("College") and College is a duly accredited educational institution that conducts Nursing/Health Sciences program(s) (the "Program");

WHEREAS, District has obtained all necessary licenses, consents and/or approvals to conduct the Program from the State of California and any other applicable government agency.

WHEREAS, Clinical Facility operates a duly licensed health care agency at the address listed above and has obtained all necessary licenses, consents, and approvals;

WHEREAS, as part of the Program, students are required to participate in a clinical experience rotation.

WHEREAS, District desires to affiliate with the Clinical Facility in order that students may participate in a clinical experience rotation at the Clinical Facility; and

WHEREAS, District and Clinical Facility desire to enter into this Agreement to memorialize their respective rights, duties, and obligations with respect to the clinical experience rotation of students of the College's Program.

For purposes of this Agreement, the following definitions shall apply:

"District" shall refer to the Rancho Santiago Community College District, its member Colleges, the District's Governing Board, and each of their trustees, employees, agents, representatives, successors and assigns;

"College" shall refer to Santa Ana College, and each of its employees, agents, representatives and assigns;

"Clinical Facility" shall refer to French Park Care Center, its parents, subsidies, related companies, and each of their officers, directors, employees, agents, representatives, successors, and assigns,

The "Program" shall refer to the Clinical training in health science programs, and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the following covenants, conditions and agreements, the parties hereto agree as follows:

TERMS

- Clinical Experience Rotation. Clinical Facility agrees to provide students of the Program
 who are specified by College with a clinical experience rotation ("Rotation"), in
 accordance with standards established by governmental agencies and recognized
 professional accrediting agencies, and subject to the terms and conditions of this
 Agreement.
- 2. <u>Development of Curriculum.</u> College shall be fully responsible for the development, planning, and administration of the program, including, without limitation, programming, administration, matriculation, promotion and graduation. College acknowledges and agrees that the Rotation is intended to meet certain educational performance objectives, and College shall provide a copy of such performance objectives to Clinical Facility on or before student placement. Clinical Facility shall be fully responsible for the availability and appropriateness of the learning environment in relation to the program's written objectives.
- 3. Exposure to Bloodbourne Pathogens. Program students and college faculty will comply with the final regulations issued by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration governing employee exposure to bloodbourne pathogens in the workplace under Section VI(b) of the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970, which regulations became effective March 6, 1992 (the "Regulations"), including but not limited to responsibility as the employer to provide all program students with (a) information and training about the hazards associated with blood and other potentially infectious materials, (b) information and training about the protective measures to be taken to minimize the risk of occupational exposure to bloodbourne pathogens, (c) training in the appropriate actions to take in an emergency involving exposure to blood and other potentially infectious materials, and (d) information as to the reasons the program student should participate in hepatitis B vaccination and post-exposure evaluation and follow-up.
- 4. <u>Applicable Procedure: Acceptance</u>. College agrees to provide Clinical Facility with a list of the name(s) of students who will be participating in a rotation.
- 5. Nondiscrimination. The parties agree not to discriminate in the selection, placement or evaluation of any student or faculty member because of race, creed, national origin, religion, sex, marital status, age, handicap, and/or medical condition. The Rancho Santiago Community College District complies with all Federal and state rules and regulations and does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, gender or disability. This holds true for all students who are interested in participating in educational programs and/or extracurricular school activities. Harassment of any employee/student with regard to race, color, national origin, gender or disability is strictly prohibited. Inquiries regarding compliance and/or grievance procedures may be directed to District's Title IX Officer and/or Section 504/ADA Coordinator.
- 6. <u>Academic Year</u>. The academic year consists of Fall, and Spring semesters, Summer session and Winter break intersession.
- Rotation Schedule. The rotation schedule shall be determined by College and Clinical Facility and may be amended from time to time by agreement of the parties. The number

of students in each rotation shall be limited to a number mutually agreed upon by both parties, not to exceed the number specified by the accrediting agency(s)

- 8. <u>Orientation</u>. Clinical Facility and College shall provide an orientation for assigned students and faculty participating in each rotation.
- Compliance with Clinical Facility Rules. Clinical Facility shall make available all
 applicable governing instruments, policies and procedures, rules and regulations of
 Clinical Facility to each student participating in a rotation, and student shall comply with
 these rules.

In providing the students with the clinical rotation that is the subject of this Agreement, Clinical Facility shall comply with all applicable laws, rules, regulations, statutes, policies, procedures, and ordinances and shall be consistent with the professional standards of a health care agency.

- 10. <u>Confidentiality of Patient Records</u>. Students and faculty understand and agree that Clinical Facility's patient files are confidential.
- 11. <u>Clinical Coordinator (College</u>). College agrees to designate a coordinator for each program. The coordinator, who may be an academic instructor, shall be responsible for all teaching activities.
- 12. Clinical Advisor (Clinical Facility). Clinical Facility agrees to designate a clinical advisor or coordinator who shall provide input to the clinical performance and evaluation of student(s), be a resource person for College's faculty and students, and shall communicate with the clinical coordinator designated by College regarding the proposed curriculum and the performance of individual students and shall arrange formal orientation to the facility for the faculty and students.
- 13. <u>Supervision of Students</u>. The supervision and direction of students while on site at Clinical Facility shall be the responsibility of the Clinical Coordinator (College) or designee as guided by the instructional objectives. No direct, hands—on patient care shall be provided by participating students at Clinical Facility, except in accordance with all applicable laws, Clinical Facility and Medical Staff rules, regulations, policies and procedures. District recognizes the patients' rights to refuse care provided by a student at Clinical Facility.
- 14. Removal of Students. Clinical Facility retains the right to exclude any student at any time from any clinical area. Any student who is asked to leave by Clinical Facility shall do so promptly and without protest. Clinical Facility shall also have the right, at any time, to request College to remove a student permanently from the rotation. Except as otherwise proved under any approachable policies, procedures, rules, regulations, and/or under any law, any such removal shall not require compliance with any notice, hearing or other procedural requirements.
- 15. <u>Patient Care</u>. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as conferring any right or duty upon College, its students or faculty members, to control or direct patient care or operations at Clinical Facility. Clinical Facility shall maintain sole responsibility and

- accountability for patient care and shall provide adequate staffing in number and competency to ensure safe and continuous health care during the term of this Agreement.
- 16. Student Evaluation. In the case of direct supervision of the students by the Clinical Instructor (College), he/she shall be responsible for student(s) evaluation. Unless otherwise mutually agreed between the Clinical Coordinator (College) and the Clinical Advisor (Clinical Facility), Clinical Facility may be responsible for submitting input to the Clinical Coordinator evaluating and appropriately documenting the performance of each student in the clinical rotation. The appropriate forms shall be provided by the Clinical Coordinator. Nothing herein shall be construed as a guarantee by or obligation of Clinical Facility regarding the performance of any student during the rotation. College shall keep records on the progress and evaluation of each student's clinical experience during a rotation for a period of three (3) years following the end of the specific rotation in which the student is involved.
- 17. Ongoing Communication. College has the privilege of regularly scheduled meetings with Clinical Facility staff, including both selected unit personnel and administrative level representatives for the purpose of interpreting, discussing, and evaluating College's health care programs at a mutually agreed upon time.
- 18. <u>Materials</u>. College agrees to provide students with all educational material required during the clinical program.
- 19. <u>Medical Library</u>. Clinical Facility agrees to provide students with access to a Medical Library, if available, during its normal business hours.
- 20. No Payments or Other Remuneration. College agrees that no fees or monetary payments of any kind shall be exchanged between Clinical Facility, its agents and employees, and College, its agents, employees and students under the terms of this Agreement. Further, neither College, its staff members, nor other representatives, shall attempt to bill or collect from any patient or from any other source fees for services provided to patients by said student.
 - The only exception shall be when Clinical Facility and College mutually agree to pay a Clinical Advisor a stipend for duties directly related to College's program.
- 21. No Right to Employment. The parties agree that the students of College shall not be considered employees, agents or volunteers of Clinical Facility, nor shall any student be entitled to any right, compensation, or other benefits normally afforded to employees of Clinical Facility, including but not limited to, Social Security, unemployment and workers' compensation insurance.
- 22. <u>Insurance Carried by the District</u>. District shall assure coverage of professional liability insurance for each student participating in the Rotation of not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and three million dollars (\$3,000,000) in the aggregate, and said policy shall remain in full force and effect during the term hereof. District shall provide workers' compensation coverage for students participating in the rotation. These coverage's are in effect while the student is on-site at Clinical Facility.

23. Insurance Carried by Clinical Facility. Clinical Facility shall secure and maintain comprehensive general liability insurance covering personal injury, property damage, and general liability claims in the amount of at least one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and three million dollars (\$3,000,000) in the aggregate with coverage for incidental contracts. A certificate of insurance must be provided that includes thirty (30) days notice of cancellation, modification, or reduction in said insurance. Clinical Facility shall deliver certificate(s) of insurance under Clinical Facility's comprehensive general liability insurance policy on or before the date of execution of this agreement. Upon request, District shall be provided a copy of said policy. Clinical Facility shall carry professional liability insurance for itself and each of its employee(s), partners, and/or representatives providing professional services at Clinical Facility, except for District's students and College faculty, in the amount of at least one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and three million dollars (\$3,000,000) in the aggregate. Clinical Facility shall provide District with thirty (30) days written notice prior to cancellation, or reduction in said insurance. Upon request, District shall be provided a copy of said policy.

Clinical Facility shall provide workers' compensation coverage for each of its employees.

24. Student Health Records. Any student participating in a rotation shall, at the request of Clinical Facility, provide a current statement from his or her physician that the student is in good health and capable of participating in the rotation. Clinical Facility, upon request, may require that any student returning from an extended absence caused by illness or injury submit to a physical examination or present a statement from a physician indicating that the student is capable of resuming clinical activities. Any such physical examination shall be the financial responsibility of the student. Documentation of student health records will be retained by the College.

Any student participating in a rotation shall provide verification of annual T.B. screening, immune status for rubeola, rubella, and chicken pox, hepatitis B (or signed waiver for hepatitis B). Documentation of immunizations will be retained by the College.

- 25. <u>Student Medical Care</u>. To the extent that any first aid or emergency care is required in connection with an injury or illness incurred by a student during performance of his/her clinical training during a rotation, the student shall be treated by Clinical Facility as appropriate.
- 26. Confidentiality of Student Record. Clinical Facility shall keep confidential and shall not disclose to any person or entity (i) student application; (ii) student health records or reports; and/or (iii) any student records as defined in California Education Code Section 76210 and the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, 20 U.S.C. paragraph 1232(g), concerning any student participating in the rotation, unless disclosure is authorized by (i) the student in writing, or (ii) disclosure is ordered by a court of competent jurisdiction.

All parties to this Agreement shall agree to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the other party, its officers, agents, employees, and volunteers, from and against all loss, cost, and expense arising out of any liability or claim of liability, sustained or claimed to have been sustained, arising out of the activities, or the performance or non-performance of obligations under this Agreement, of the indemnifying party, or those of any of its officers, agents, employees, or volunteers. The provisions of this Article do not apply to any damage or losses caused solely by the negligence or intentional acts of the non-indemnifying party or any of its agents or employees.
- 29. Governing Law. This Agreement shall be governed by and constructed in accordance with the laws of the State of California.
- 30. <u>Assignment</u>. Neither party hereto may assign this Agreement or delegate its duties hereunder without the prior written consent of the other party which can and may be withheld by either party in its sole and absolute discretion.
- 31. Effective Date Termination. This Agreement shall become effective on February 23, 2010 and shall remain in effect until February 22, 2015 unless sooner terminated by either party in accordance with this section. Either party may terminate this Agreement without cause by giving ninety (90) days prior written notice to the other party of its intention to terminate. In the event a rotation is in progress, any written notice to terminate with or without cause shall become effective at the expiration of the rotation. Notwithstanding the foregoing, in the event the Program is discontinued by College during its Term, this Agreement shall immediately terminate without further action by the parties hereto.
- 32. Notices. Any notices to be given hereunder by either party to the other may be effectuated only in writing and delivered either by personal deliver, or by U. S. mail. Mailed notices shall be addressed to the persons at the addresses set forth below, but each party may change the address by written notice in accordance with this paragraph. Notices delivered personally will be deemed communicated as of actual receipt, mailed notices will be deemed communicated as of ten (10) days after mailing.

AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this ____ day of February, 2010 between VICENTI, LLOYD & STUTZMAN LLP, a partnership of Certified Public Accountants hereinafter referred to as the Accountants, and RANCHO SANTIAGO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT hereinafter referred to as the District. The parties agree as follows:

1. AUTHORITY

WHEREAS, Section 84040 of the Education Code provides in part that:

The governing board of each community college district shall provide for an annual audit of all funds, books and accounts of the district in accordance with regulations of the board of governors and further provides that:

THE AUDITS shall be made by a certified public accountant or a public accountant, licensed by the California Board of Accountancy.

WHEREAS, it is the intention of the District, consisting of the duly elected governing board of the school district, to comply with the provisions relating to Section 84040 of the Education Code.

2. **CONSIDERATION**

THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual covenants, conditions and promises hereinafter contained, the District hereby engages the Accountant, and the Accountant hereby accepts engagement to conduct an audit of all financial statements of said District in the following manner and upon the following conditions.

3. PERIOD COVERED BY AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT shall cover the period necessary to make the required audit and examination for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010. The District and the Accountants have the option to terminate the agreement with 30 days written notice, and pay for services rendered up to that time.

4. **BEGINNING WORK**

THE ACCOUNTANTS shall commence their work for the fiscal year at such times as may be mutually agreed upon by the parties hereto. The Accountants will render their opinion on the financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting standards.

5. SCOPE AND OPINION

THE ACCOUNTANTS will audit the District's financial statements for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010 for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the fairness with which they present, in all material respects, financial position, results of operations and cash flows in conformity with generally accepted accounting principals.

We will conduct our audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement, whether caused by error or fraud. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence that supports the amounts and disclosures included in the financial statements. It also includes assessing the accounting principals used and estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. Our audit is designed to provide reasonable assurance of detecting misstatements that, in our judgment, could have a material effect on the financial statements taken as a whole. Consequently, our audit will not necessarily detect misstatements less than this materiality level that might exist due to error, fraudulent financial reporting, or misappropriation of assets.

The District's management is responsible for establishing and maintaining a sound system of internal control, which is the best means of preventing or detecting errors, fraudulent financial reporting, and misappropriation of assets.

AS PART of our engagement, we may propose standard, adjusting, or correcting journal entries to your financial statements. The District's management is responsible for reviewing the entries and understanding the nature of any proposed entries and the impact they have on the financial statements.

THE DISTRICT'S management is responsible for the design and implementation of programs and controls to prevent and detect fraud, and for informing us about all known or suspected fraud affecting the government involving (a) management, (b) employees who have significant roles in internal control, and (c) others where the fraud could have a material effect on the financial statements. You are also responsible for informing us of your knowledge of any allegations of fraud or suspected fraud affecting the government received in communications from employees, former employees, regulators, or others. In addition, you are responsible for identifying and ensuring that the entity complies with applicable laws and regulations. Additionally, as required by OMB Circular A-133, it is management's responsibility to follow up and take corrective action on reported audit findings and to prepare a summary schedule of prior audit findings and corrective action plan. Management is responsible for establishing and maintaining a sound system of internal control, which is the best means of preventing or detecting errors, fraudulent financial reporting, and misappropriation of assets.

THE ACCOUNTANTS SHALL also conduct a compliance audit in accordance with the standards in OMB Circular No. A-133, and the State Chancellor's Office, to extent considered necessary. The report will be submitted in the format required by the State Chancellor's Office.

THE AUDIT shall include all funds of the District including, but not limited to, District General Fund, Bond Funds, Building Funds, Bond Interest and Redemption Funds, Cafeteria Funds or Accounts, Student Financial Aid Fund, and all other funds and/or accounts under the control of the governing board of the community college district.

THE AUDIT and examination shall be based upon tests and samples of the accounting records and transactions sufficient to satisfy the Accountants of the fairness of presentation of the financial conditions, operating results of the District, and compliance with applicable laws and regulations and shall not comprise detailed examinations of all transactions.

IN CASES WHEREIN the Accountants can and do place reliance upon the work of a state agency, another individual accountant or firm of public accountants or certified public accountants, they shall state in their report the extent of such reliance and shall name the agency, accountant, or accountants upon whose work they rely. Nothing in this paragraph shall be construed to obligate the Accountants to accept or perform work which is not in compliance with the specifications of the agreement.

6. <u>COMPENSATION</u>

The rates and maximum cost of the various audits have remained the same as the 2008-09 contract. This is at a discount of approximately \$6,000 for the 2009-10 fiscal year.

Unforeseen circumstances that change the size or scope of the audit, will affect compensation as noted above. Compensation per this agreement is also dependent on all items requested at the pre-audit meeting being completed and included in the audit binder provided to District personnel. The above fee does not include consulting time to convert internal financial statements to the reporting format required by GASB Statement No. 34 and No. 35. Refer to Section 8 regarding additional compensation. In addition to the amounts stated above, we will expect to be reimbursed for mileage at the approved Internal Revenue Service rate for the year served, not to exceed \$2,000 for fiscal year 2009-10.

B. FINANCIAL & COMPLIANCE AUDIT FEES

THE MAXIMUM FEE which may be expended for services furnished in connection with the audits shall not exceed the sums specified in Section 6(A) subject to Sections 8 and 9. However, if audit requirements, State and Federal Compliance requirements and/or professional audit standards are revised significantly and additional time is necessary, we will bill for this additional time separately using the hourly rates stipulated in 6A.

7. BILLING AND PAYMENT OF FEES

IT IS AGREED that the aforesaid compensation shall be paid for as billings are presented at the above rates for the number of hours worked and expenses incurred.

8. ADDITIONAL COMPENSATION

THE AUDIT and examination specified herein and the maximum compensation stipulated in Section 6 contemplate that conditions satisfactory to normal progress and completion of the work will be encountered.

IN THE EVENT the Accountants find it necessary to do additional work or expend inordinate amounts of time because of (a) significant changes in accounting principles, auditing standards, compliance requirements or district operations, (b) incompleteness of records, (c) poor working conditions, (d) abnormal errors, (e) misappropriation of funds, (f) lack of cooperation from District employees, (g) internally prepared financial statements that do not comply with the reporting requirement of GASB Statements No. 34 and No. 35 (h) items requested at the pre-audit meeting are not completed in the format requested or in a mutually agreed upon format, or (i) other justifiable reasons, they shall report such conditions to the District's Administration and Board. Upon reasonable demonstration of the extension of such conditions, the Accountants shall be entitled to apply to the District for supplemental compensation at the hourly rates set forth in Section 6, without regard to any maximum. In the event it is agreed not to employ additional services and compensation for such conditions, then

the audit report will be subject to qualifications with respect to the circumstances involved.

If requested, we will convert the District's internal financial statements to the reporting format required by GASB Statement No. 34 and No. 35. In order to convert the financial statements, journal entries will be made to record long-term debt, reflect the current year principal payments, record additions and deletions to fixed assets, record current year depreciation expense and record any other items necessary to reflect the financial statements on the full accrual basis of accounting. This additional work will include completion of the financial statements including the Statement of Net Assets, the Statement of Revenues, Expenses and Changes in Net Assets, the Statement of Cash Flows and the functional expense footnote. The District will need to prepare a comparative Management's Discussion and Analysis section; our independence standards do not allow us to prepare this section of the audit report. This additional work will be under a separate engagement letter.

OTHER ACCOUNTING SERVICES

THE DISTRICT may request the Accountants to furnish other services which could include bookkeeping, advisory or systems and procedures services, extended auditing procedures, or special audits. Such services, if deemed independent, shall be subject to additional fees at the hourly rates set forth in Section 6 above, or a special contract upon a fee basis to be mutually agreed upon between the respective parties to this agreement. The District is responsible for preparing comprehensive financial statements that comply with GASB Statements No. 34/35. The Accountants can assist the District with certain implementation and issues outside the audit scope as indicated above.

10. <u>ACCOUNTANTS NOT OFFICERS, EMPLOYEES, OR AGENTS OF THE DISTRICT</u>

WHILE ENGAGED in carrying out and complying with the terms and conditions of this agreement, the Accountants are independent contractors, and not officers, employees, or agents of the District.

11. HIRING OF VICENTI, LLOYD & STUTZMAN LLP STAFF

During the term of this Agreement and for twelve months following its termination, the DISTRICT shall not employ any Vicenti, Lloyd & Stutzman LLP employees or partners used by the Accountants in the performance under this agreement, without the prior notification and written consent of the Accountants. Vicenti, Lloyd & Stutzman LLP shall be entitled, in addition to any other remedies it may have at law or in equity, to a payment from the DISTRICT in an amount equal to one year's salary of any partner or employee the DISTRICT employs if notification was not received and approved by the Accountants.

12. RENDERING REPORTS

THE AUDIT shall be completed in accordance with Education Code Section 84040.5 and the audit reports shall be delivered to the parties set forth in the Contracted District Audit Manual.

13. AMENDMENT OR TERMINATION OF CONTRACT

THIS CONTRACT may be amended, altered or terminated on terms and conditions mutually agreed upon by the parties hereto.

14. OTHER MATTERS

IN THE EVENT it is necessary for us to institute a lawsuit against you in order to enforce any right which we have under this letter, and in the further event that we are the prevailing party in that lawsuit, then you agree to pay to us, in addition to any other amount to which we are entitled, all attorneys' fees and other costs incurred by us in connection with that lawsuit. On the other hand, if you are the prevailing party in that lawsuit, then we will pay to you all attorneys' fees and other costs which you incur in connection with that lawsuit.

The workpapers for this engagement are the property of the Accountants and constitute confidential information. However, we may be requested to make certain workpapers available to the State Chancellor's Office or a Federal Grantor Agency pursuant to authority given to it by law or regulation. If requested, access to such workpapers will be provided under the supervision of the Accountants' personnel. Furthermore, upon 5.3 (9)

request, we may provide photocopies of selected workpapers to the State Chancellor's Office or a Federal Grantor Agency who may intend, or decide, to distribute the photocopies or information contained therein to others, including other governmental agencies.

The workpapers for this engagement will be retained for a minimum of seven years after the date the auditors' report is issued or for any additional period requested by the State Chancellor's Office. If we are aware that a federal awarding agency, pass-through entity, or auditee is contesting an audit finding, we will contact the party(ies) contesting the audit finding for guidance prior to destroying the workpapers.

Government Auditing Standards require that we provide you with a copy of our most recent quality control review report. Our most recent peer review letter is available on our website.

Upon receipt of the statements of the Board of Trustees, Chancellor, Executive Vice Chancellor, Vice Chancellor and Presidents, the Filing Officer shall make and retain a copy and forward the original of these statements to the Clerk of the Orange County Board of Supervisors. Statements for all other designated employees will be retained by the Filing Officer.

TREASURER'S REPORT

In order to assist you in reading this report, please note that the current balances reflect the investments recorded in the portfolios for each particular fund for the period ending December 31 Each money market fund has an average maturity of less than sixty days, with a net asset value (NAV) falling within the range of \$0.9950 and \$1.0050 The Extended Fund shall have a duration not to exceed a leading 1-3 Year index +25%. All investments are marked to the market at the end of the reporting period due to the narrow valuation range prescribed by the Pools' Investment Policy Statement.

The reports reflect the par value (face value), the cost and market value (the price of each security at the close of the market on the last trading day of the month). Market values are derived from the Bloomberg Professional Service, a premier provider of instant access to realtime and historical financial data. The difference between the market value and book value is the unrealized gain or (loss). The Detail Transaction Report Section is provided in compliance with California Government Code Section 53607, which requires that the Treasurer file such a report with the Board of Supervisors, from whom his investment authority has been delegated.

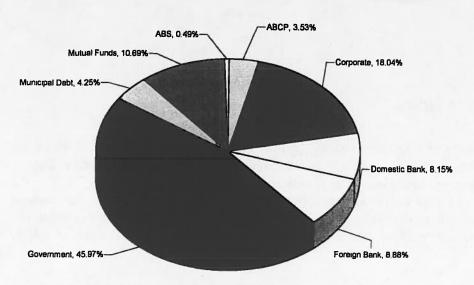
APPORTIONMENT OF COMMINGLED POOL INTEREST EARNINGS

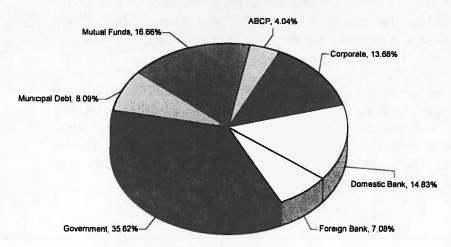
PORTFOLIO COMPOSITION

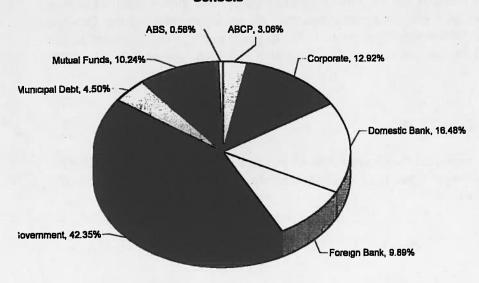
Exhibit 1: County

MARKET OBSERVATIONS

Orange County Treasurer's Office is delighted to report that The Educational Fund we manage achieved the third highest return and the County Fund achieved the fifth highest return of any state or municipal short-term investment fund in the United States. 2009 marks the third year in a row that our funds have been included in the *TRACS Top Ten* highest performing domestic government funds. From December 2006 through December 2009, the Orange County Treasurer's office has earned \$640,960,718 or an average yield of 3.76% over the period.

These results are even more satisfying when our clients consider that Orange County funds are 75% invested in US Government securities and our average maturity is half of the average of other comparable funds. The results we have achieved are the product of hard work, long hours and the creation of a powerful in-house research capability. We refuse to rely on Wall Street.

We became the first County in the nation and the first municipality in California to be awarded the prestigious rating of AAAm by Standard & Poors. The AAAm rating not only measures safety and security, it measures the level of liquidity available to a fund's investors in a crisis situation. There can be no doubt in anyone's mind that the financial markets have been suffering a two-year crisis. We have remained nimble throughout, and will continue to take advantage of market fluctuations as appropriate.

First 6 months of 2010 Projected Interest Rate Return - 1.05%

- The Orange County Treasurer's office expected rates to move higher at year end as bank lending escalated to support the Christmas Holiday season. We took advantage of this temporary borrowing binge to lock in higher yields for the next two years on \$450 million of our investment reserves.
- The Orange County Treasurer's office expects most investors will be stunned as the US and the world suffers an unpleasant bout of deflation. This market phenomenon will punish high risk investors with losses. Conservative high-quality, short-term bond buyers, such as Orange County, are positioned to benefit from capital gains as rates move lower.

Next fiscal year, 7/1/10 to 6/30/11, Interest Rate Return - 1.20%

• The Orange County Treasurer's office expects deflation will grind down the world economy through the spring of 2011 The United States will perform better, due to the production and labor ingenuity of our capitalistic system. Since the beginning in 2009, America has entered the early stages of a manufacturing renaissance. Our chronic negative balance of payments with trading partners has already been cut 18%, as US companies continue to become more competitive against Asian manufacturers. This import substitution by domestic manufacturers, will form the long base for a return of American economic dominance.

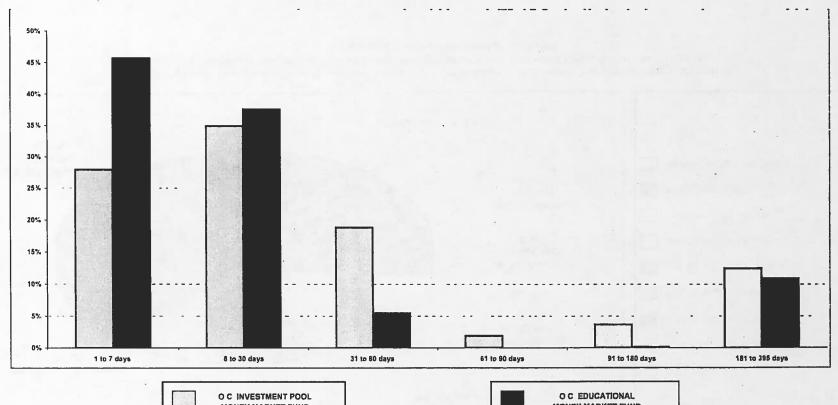

BACKGROUND

The district has been utilizing the services of Facilities Planning & Program Services, Inc. (FPPS) to evaluate completed district construction projects to ensure the appropriate close-out with the Division of State Architect (DSA). In reviewing 65 DSA RSCCD projects, it was found that 39 of these were still open and required close out documentation and follow up to formally close the projects. FPPS is also evaluating selected district facilities to evaluate seismic retrofitting options.

ANALYSIS

Mr. Ron Beeler has been assisting the district with these projects and also providing guidance for energy conservation initiatives to qualify these projects for energy conservation rebates. The investor owned utilities (So Cal Edison, So Cal Gas) offer districts cash incentives for energy conserving projects. Mr. Beeler is also instrumental in preparing the California Energy Commission grant proposal for federal funds submitted last December.

It is anticipated that Mr. Beeler will continue to assist the district, on an hourly rate basis, with various facilities related projects through the remainder of this fiscal year. Estimated cost is not to exceed \$65,000.

We will rely on the DSA Trakker System and the T & I list (Testing and Inspection) if available to get this information.

Once we know, what documents are missing, FPPS suggest that we enter into another agreement whereby FPPS will work with the District, their design professionals, the contractor/s, the IOR, and the testing and inspection company to locate and compile the missing documents. To this effect, we will need the District's authorization, in writing, to contact their design professionals, the contractor/s, the IOR, and the testing and inspection company in their behalf to locate/complete and file missing forms and reports, and resolve exceptions/open issues. FPPS will arrange for a meeting with DSA to discuss the closing of the project.

Without seeing the 90-day letter, close of file letter, or information from Trakker, FPPS won't be able to outline what we could do for RSCCD. However, from our close out experience, here are some of the challenges that we may be faced with the project:

AOR issues:

- change orders are not issued by the AOR to DSA for review and approval or are held by DSA for a long time
- missing/incomplete RFI, Bulletins

IOR has issues and won't sign Form 6:

- incomplete work;
- · waiting for contractor to complete the punch list;
- defective work
- tests shown on the T & I sheet are performed

Testing and Inspection Company issues:

- · failure to submit final affidavits/reports
- · failure to clear exceptions on affidavits
- missing Form 5 for Special Inspectors

Other issues:

- missing Form 6 from contractors
- missing Form 6A/E for architect/consultants

Deliverable:

Written report outlining what documents is RR (Required Received) and RM (Required Missing) on all outstanding DSA Projects that are not currently closed out.

Compensation:

FPPS will perform our investigative/research services on an hourly basis per the project team rate schedule. Reimbursable expenses are in addition to the hourly fees and include those expenses incurred in the interest of the project. They include project-related travel (mileage) printing, plotting, reprographic costs, postage and delivery charges. With the exception of mileage these expenses will be compensated at 1.10 times the amounts invoiced to FPPS. Mileage will be reimbursed at the IRS rate. The cost of the investigative/research services may not exceed \$15,000 for the initial scope of work and will be billed at the rate of appropriate project team category mentioned below. We estimate that you should budget \$1,000.00 for these costs. Depending upon District's requirements for reimbursable, the cost could exceed or be

considerably under the estimated reimbursable allowance. RSCCD will be invoiced only for those reimbursable costs incurred by FPPS.

The District is about to commence two separate projects. Installation of a new scoreboard and various improvements to the Baseball Complex, including ADA upgrades, at Santa Ana College and the renovation of the Child Development Center at Centennial Education Center. These projects require the services of a construction manager to coordinate the construction process and provide general oversight on behalf of the District.

The Santa Ana College Baseball Field improvements are intended to upgrade spectator seating and make accommodations that comply with ADA regulations. The existing antiquated scoreboard is expensive to maintain and will be replaced by a radio-controlled model. The renovation of the Child Development Center at Centennial Education Center is to maximize existing workspace for early childhood education, office staff and auxiliary services.

ANALYSIS:

Bernards has performed construction management services for several projects at SAC including the recently completed Classroom Building, the M & O facility, and currently the new Child Development Center. Since 2000, vacant space on the roof of Dunlap Hall at Santa Ana College (SAC) has been leased to a private cellphone provider company (Nextel) for purposes of a cellular communications site. More recently, the District's Facility Planning Department has been contacted regarding a proposal from AT&T to lease additional roof space at Dunlap Hall, also for the purpose of a cellular communications site.

ANALYSIS:

As required by Education Code Section 81365, the lease of community college property requires that the district follow a very specific procedure. The governing board, in a regular meeting, by a two-thirds vote of all its members, shall adopt a resolution declaring its intention to lease the property. This action shall allow the district to advertise and receive sealed proposals for the cellular antenna site at SAC. Proposals for the Dunlap Hall roof site shall be evaluated upon the aesthetics of the antenna system, space necessary to house the equipment, and the revenue produced.

The proposed lease is based upon the following criteria:

PROPOSAL TO LEASE ROOFTOP SPACE AT 1530 W. 17TH STREET, SANTA ANA, CA (DUNLAP HALL, SANTA ANA COLLEGE) FOR CELLULAR/WIRELESS TRANSMISSION FACILITIES

WHEREAS, the District has been approached by representatives of various cellular/wireless communications companies inquiring as to the District's willingness to allow placement of cellular/wireless transmission equipment on District property;

WHEREAS, cellular/wireless transmission facilities are currently in place and operating on a portion of the roof of Dunlap Hall at the District's Santa Ana College Campus, a four (4) story building located at 1530 West 17th Street in Santa Ana, CA;

WHEREAS, the existing cellular/wireless transmission facilities on the roof of Dunlap Hall are not interfering with the District's administrative and academic activities at the District's Santa Ana College Campus;

WHEREAS, there is space on the roof of Dunlap Hall to allow the placement of additional cellular/wireless facilities;

WHEREAS, allowing the placement of additional cellular/wireless transmission facilities on the roof of Dunlap Hall will allow for better or additional cellular/wireless communication service options in the residential and business areas near the District's Santa Ana College Campus;

WHEREAS, the placement of additional cellular/wireless communications equipment on the roof of Dunlap Hall will not interfere with any administrative or academic functions at Dunlap Hall or elsewhere at the District's Santa Ana College Campus;

WHEREAS, the District is desirous of obtaining additional income from the leasing of excess District facilities and/or properties so long as said leasing activity does not unduly interfere with any of the District's academic or administrative operations;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE DISTRICT'S BOARD OF TRUSTEES RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. If properly placed, designed, operated and maintained, additional cellular/wireless communications facilities can be installed and operated on the roof of Dunlap Hall in a manner that is not disruptive of other activities at the District's Santa Ana College campus;
- 2. The rooftop space at Dunlap Hall being considered for lease to a cellular/wireless communications company is not otherwise needed for the District's academic and/or administrative activities at the Santa Ana College Campus;
- 3. The District is desirous of obtaining bids from reputable companies to lease approximately 200 square feet of space on the roof of Dunlap Hall for the placement and operation of cellular/wireless communications equipment with ancillary rights to place certain antenna equipment along the perimeter of said rooftop. To be considered, each lease proposal received by the District in response to this Resolution shall specify: (i) a yearly rental of not less than \$39,600, which rental shall be triple net and subject to upward adjustment on a yearly basis to reflect CPI increases, (ii) a five (5) year

term with two (2) — five (5) year options without any right to assign or sublease to third parties except in connection with a merger or a sale of substantially all of lessee's assets, and (iii) the proposed lessee's agreement to: (aa) limit use of the rooftop space to the placement, operation and maintenance of cellular/wireless communications facilities, and (bb) make the placement, design, and operation of the transmission facilities subject to the District's reasonable approval and otherwise subject to all applicable governmental regulations pertaining to design, safety, operation and maintenance;

- 4. Notice of the adoption of this Resolution and the District's decision to solicit proposals as herein contemplated for the leasing of rooftop space at Dunlap Hall for the placement and operation of cellular/wireless transmission facilities shall be given by posting and publishing this Resolution in the manner prescribed by Education Code Section 81368;
- 5. Darryl Odum, Executive Director of District Construction and Support Services, is hereby appointed as District's representative for purposes of seeking, receiving and considering proposals respecting the lease of rooftop space at Dunlap Hall for the placement and operation of cellular/wireless communications facilities. All proposals to lease in response to the District's solicitation of offers shall be addressed to Mr. Odum's attention and shall be personally delivered or sent by U.S. Mail or reputable overnight courier or messenger service to the District's Administrative Offices located at 2323 N. Broadway, Room 112, Santa Ana, CA 92706. Each respondent to the District's request for proposals to lease shall be responsible for establishing proof of timely delivery of their respective proposal to lease;
- 6. To be considered, all written and sealed proposals to lease rooftop space at Dunlap Hall for the placement and operation of cellular/wireless communications facilities must be received by the District no later than 10:00 a.m. on <u>March 24, 2010</u>, (the "Bid Consideration Deadline"), at which time, in accordance with Education Code Section 81372, Mr. Odum (or his representative) shall open and consider all written proposals to lease the rooftop space at Dunlap Hall as herein contemplated. The District's decision with respect to the winning proposal to lease shall be confirmed by the District's Board of Trustees at their regularly scheduled meeting on April 12,2010.

RESOLUTION IMPLEMENTING PREQUALIFICATION OF CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTORS RANCHO SANTIAGO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT

RESOLUTION NO. 10-05

WHEREAS, Public Contract Code Section 20651.5 authorizes the governing Board of Trustees of a community college district to require that each prospective bidder for a construction contract complete and submit to the community college district a standardized questionnaire and financial statement in a form specified by the community college district ("Questionnaire");

WHEREAS, the Questionnaire is required to include a complete statement of the prospective bidder's financial ability and experience in performing public works;

WHEREAS, the Questionnaire and financial statement must be verified under oath by the bidder in the manner in which civil pleadings and civil actions are verified;

WHEREAS, the Questionnaire is not a public record and is not to be opened to public inspection;

WHEREAS, each Questionnaire submitted by a prospective bidder will be scored in accordance with an established point system;

WHEREAS, Public Contract Code Section 20651.5(b) requires any community college district requiring prospective bidders to complete and submit a Questionnaire to adopt and apply a uniform system of rating bidders on the basis of the completed Questionnaire in order to determine the size of the contracts or scope of work upon which each bidder will be deemed qualified to bid ("Uniform System"); and

WHEREAS, a community college district may not accept a proposal from any potential bidder who is required to submit a Questionnaire in accordance with Public Contract Code Section 20651.5(a), but has not done so at least five (5) days prior to the date fixed upon the public opening of sealed bids, or has not been prequalified by the community college district in accordance with Public Contract Code Section 20651.5(b) at least one (1) day prior to the opening of sealed bids.

NOW THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE RANCHO SANTIAGO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT DOES HEREBY RESOLVE:

<u>Section 1</u>. In accordance with Public Contract Code Section 20651.5(a), the Board establishes a prequalification program for the swimming pool scope of work for the Santiago Canyon College Athletic & Aquatic Center project ("Prequalification Program").

- Section 2. The Prequalification Program shall utilize the Questionnaire attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein.
- Section 3. In accordance with Public Contract Code Section 20651.5(b), the District adopts the Uniform System of allocating points set forth in the document attached hereto as Exhibit "B" with respect to the District's review of any submitted Questionnaires. Any potential bidder who submits a Questionnaire that does not meet the above-referenced criteria set forth in this section shall be considered not qualified and rejected.
- Section 4. The Questionnaire shall be completed by any potential bidder in conformance with Public Contract Code Section 20651.5.
- Section 5. With respect to the swimming pool scope of work for the Santiago Canyon College Athletic & Aquatic Center project, each prospective bidder must be prequalified in conformance with the Prequalification Program prior to submitting a bid.
- Section 6. In submitting any bids for the swimming pool scope of work for the Santiago Canyon College Athletic & Aquatic Center project, the District will furnish each prospective bidder a standardized proposal form that when completed and executed, will constitute such potential bidder's bid ("Proposal").
- Section 7. A Proposal shall not be accepted from any person or other entity for the swimming pool scope of work for the Santiago Canyon College Athletic & Aquatic Center project who: (1) has not submitted a Questionnaire at least five (5) days prior to the date fixed for the public opening of sealed bids for such construction contract in accordance with Public Contract Code Section 20651.5(b); and (2) who has not been prequalified for at least one (1) day prior to the public opening of sealed bids for such contract, in accordance with Public Contract Code Section 20651.5(c).
- Section 8. Notwithstanding the foregoing section, the District hereby establishes a process in which a prospective bidder may be prequalified on a quarterly basis. Once prequalified pursuant to this section, such prequalification shall be valid for up to one (1) calendar year following the date of initial prequalification. The District will accept Questionnaires from potential bidders on a quarterly basis commencing on March 1, 2010, and after receipt of such Questionnaires, the District will make within a reasonable period of time, a determination as to whether each potential bidder submitting a Questionnaire is prequalified for the following calendar year.
- Section 9. The Board hereby delegates to the District's Vice Chancellor, Business Operations & Fiscal Services the authority to determine whether a potential bidder shall be considered prequalified.

I. Request for Prequalification of Bidders

As a condition of bidding for the swimming pool scope of work as set forth in Specifications Section 131100 for the Santiago Canyon College Athletic & Aquatic Center project ("Project"), and in accordance with California Public Contract Code Section 20651.5, all prospective bidders are required to submit to the Rancho Santiago Community College District ("District") a completed set of prequalification documents by completing all of the documents contained herein. These documents will be the basis for determining which bidders are qualified to bid on the Project. Bids will not be accepted if a Contractor has not been prequalified. If the Contractor intends to use a subcontractor of any tier to perform the swimming pool scope of work set forth in Specifications Section 131100 for the Project the Contractor must use a subcontractor that has been prequalified in accordance with these documents. Contractors and subcontractors shall be referred to hereinafter collectively as "Contractor". Ratings of individual firms will only be disclosed upon written request by that firm. The District reserves the right to check other available sources. All information contained in the prequalification documents is not public records and are not open to public inspection.

- Contractor's Statement of Experience
- 2. Insurance and Safety Record
- 3. Surety and Bonding Capacity
- 4. Financial Information
- 5. Declaration

A prequalification package may be required for each District project. The District may, at any time, specifically request a new prequalification package, in which case the Contractor must comply within thirty days or the rating on file may, at the discretion of the District, be considered expired. A Contractor may also file new packages at more frequent intervals if there is a substantial change in the Contractor's financial status or work experience, at which time, a new rating will be issued.

In addition to being disqualified for failure to meet the District's criteria, a Contractor will be automatically disqualified for any one of the following:

- A. Falsification of information
- B. Have had a surety complete work on any contract since January 1, 2000
- C. Contractor or any affiliated entities or subsidiaries including, but not limited to partnership or joint venture, has been deemed to be a non-responsible contractor by any public agency within the last seven years.
- D. Having an Experience Modification Rate (EMR) (California Workers' Compensation Insurance) of greater than 1.25.
- E. Not possessing a valid C-53 specialty contractor's license.

In addition to being disqualified for failure to meet the District's criteria, a Contractor <u>may</u> be <u>automatically disqualified</u> for any one of the following which is not adequately explained:

- A. Omission of requested information
- B. Prevailing wage violations or construction claims
- C. Inability to demonstrate bonding capacity or ability to obtain required insurance
- D. Is not duly licensed to perform the required work
- E. Has not had sufficient experience specifically related to swimming pools

III. Financial Information

In addition to the financial information requested, Contractors MAY provide either a reviewed or audited financial statement for consideration. A letter verifying the Contractor's availability of a line of credit may also be provided

for consideration. Greater weight and consideration will be given to Contractors providing additional financial information as discussed above, but such documentation is not mandatory.

Contractors will be notified of their prequalification rating by telephone/fax followed by mail. Notification will be made as soon as possible, but not later than 24 hours prior to bid opening as required by law.

If the Contractor chooses to challenge a prequalification determination, the Contractor shall provide a written request within two (2) working days after notification requesting a hearing. The District shall establish a committee for the hearing to review the facts and reconsider the disqualification. This committee shall render a final and binding decision within five (5) working days of the hearing.

Completed prequalification forms for this project must be submitted to the District not later than <u>TBD</u>. Contractors will be notified of their prequalification rating not later than <u>TBD</u>, but not later than at least one day prior to the bid due date as required by law.

Any false statements, inaccuracies, omissions or failures to disclose are grounds for exclusion from bidding. If the District should discover false statements, inaccuracies, omissions or failures to disclose by submitters at any time, the submitter will be notified of this disqualification and the inaccuracy which has been discovered. Submitter shall be afforded due process prior to being disqualified. However, if submitter shall seek due process and the false statement, inaccuracy or omission is adjudged to be intentional, then submitter shall be held nonresponsible by District for three years following the due process hearing. Contractor hereby certifies under penalty of perjury that all responses to this questionnaire are true and correct.

VII. Rating Procedure

The District has pre-established a rating system for prequalification of bidders. Contractors who receive the requisite number of points based on this rating system will be issued bidding documents and allowed to submit bids for the project. Contractors who do not receive the requisite number of points based on this rating system, or are disqualified under Section II, will not be considered qualified to submit bids for the project. The bidder shall be afforded due process prior to final disqualification.

Contractors who have been terminated by the owner, owner's representative or contracting party may be disqualified if it is determined that the cause for termination relates to the ability of the contractor to complete a project of this size and complexity or otherwise pertains to the responsibility of the contractor to perform the work.

These documents will be the basis for determining which bidders are qualified to bid on the Project. Bids will not be accepted if a Contractor has not been prequalified. If the Contractor intends to use a subcontractor of any tier to perform the swimming pool scope of work set forth in Specifications Section 131100 for the Project the Contractor must use a subcontractor that has been prequalified in accordance with these documents. Contractors and subcontractors shall be referred to hereinafter collectively as "Contractor". Ratings of individual firms will only be disclosed upon written request by that firm. The District reserves the right to check other available sources. All information contained in the prequalification documents is not public records and are not open to public inspection.

II. District's Prequalification Standards

- 1. Contractor's Statement of Experience
- 2. Insurance and Safety Record
- 3. Surety and Bonding Capacity
- 4. Financial Information
- 5. Declaration

A prequalification package may be required for each District project. The District may, at any time, specifically request a new prequalification package, in which case the Contractor must comply within thirty days or the rating on file may, at the discretion of the District, be considered expired. A Contractor may also file new packages at more frequent intervals if there is a substantial change in the Contractor's financial status or work experience, at which time, a new rating will be issued.

In addition to being disqualified for failure to meet the District's criteria, a Contractor will be automatically disqualified for any one of the following:

- A. Falsification of information
- B. Have had a surety complete work on any contract since January 1, 2000
- C. Contractor or any affiliated entities or subsidiaries including, but not limited to partnership or joint venture, has been deemed to be a non-responsible contractor by any public agency within the last seven years.
- D. Having an Experience Modification Rate (EMR) (California Workers' Compensation Insurance) of greater than 1.25.
- E. Not possessing a valid C-53 specialty contractor's license.

In addition to being disqualified for failure to meet the District's criteria, a Contractor <u>may</u> be <u>automatically</u> <u>disqualified</u> for any one of the following which is not adequately explained:

- A. Omission of requested information
- B. Prevailing wage violations or construction claims
- C. Inability to demonstrate bonding capacity or ability to obtain required insurance
- D. Is not duly licensed to perform the required work
- E. Has not had sufficient experience specifically related to swimming pools

III. Financial Information

In addition to the financial information requested, Contractors MAY provide either a reviewed or audited financial statement for consideration. A letter verifying the Contractor's availability of a line of credit may also be provided

for consideration. Greater weight and consideration will be given to Contractors providing additional financial information as discussed above, but such documentation is not mandatory.

Contractors will be notified of their prequalification rating by telephone/fax followed by mail. Notification will be made as soon as possible, but not later than 24 hours prior to bid opening as required by law.

If the Contractor chooses to challenge a prequalification determination, the Contractor shall provide a written request within two (2) working days after notification requesting a hearing. The District shall establish a committee for the hearing to review the facts and reconsider the disqualification. This committee shall render a final and binding decision within five (5) working days of the hearing.

Completed prequalification forms for this project must be submitted to the District not later than ______. Contractors will be notified of their prequalification rating not later than ______, but not later than at least one day prior to the bid due date as required by law.

Any false statements, inaccuracies, omissions or failures to disclose are grounds for exclusion from bidding. If the District should discover false statements, inaccuracies, omissions or failures to disclose by submitters at any time, the submitter will be notified of this disqualification and the inaccuracy which has been discovered. Submitter shall be afforded due process prior to being disqualified. However, if submitter shall seek due process and the false statement, inaccuracy or omission is adjudged to be intentional, then submitter shall be held nonresponsible by District for three years following the due process hearing. Contractor hereby certifies under penalty of perjury that all responses to this questionnaire are true and correct.

VII. Rating Procedure

The District has pre-established a rating system for prequalification of bidders. Contractors who receive the requisite number of points based on this rating system will be issued bidding documents and allowed to submit bids for the project. Contractors who do not receive the requisite number of points based on this rating system, or are disqualified under Section II, will not be considered qualified to submit bids for the project. The bidder shall be afforded due process prior to final disqualification.

BACKGROUND

The Santa Ana College Exercise Science Division has a baseball scoreboard that has exceeded its useful life. Therefore, it is necessary to declare this baseball scoreboard as surplus and sell it at auction. Legally, in order to dispose of District property, the Board must take action to declare the item as surplus prior to the auction.

Recently, the Board of Trustees approved the naming of the Santa Ana College baseball field to Don Sneddon Field and for the Santa Ana College Athletic Hall of Fame to sponsor the purchase of a new scoreboard.

ANALYSIS

The Nevco baseball scoreboard has been in service for approximately 30 years. It is old, outdated, damaged and often needs repairs. Based on the age and condition of the old scoreboard, it is recommended not to make this scoreboard available to other schools or non-profit organizations.

The District has a contract with The Liquidation Company (TLC) to conduct auctions for surplus items through June 30, 2011. The advantages of using The Liquidation Company are that they take the majority of our surplus property and they are licensed e-waste collectors. The auctioneer's fee is 35% of the gross sales. The fee includes advertising, transportation, labor and other related functions. TLC is willing to sell the scoreboard even though the scoreboard is in poor condition and the value is minimal.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees declare the Nevco baseball scoreboard as surplus property and to utilize The Liquidation Company to conduct an auction as presented.

WHEREAS the Governing Board has determined that the INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR is specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required, and

WHEREAS the DISTRICT under the terms of this agreement hereby agrees to pay the INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR for services at <u>Fifty Thousand Dollars & No Cents</u> (\$50,000,00) – plus \$8,000 allowable expenses

The contracted services are to commence on or about <u>February 23, 2010</u> and to be completed on or about, but not later than <u>June 30, 2010</u>.

WHEREAS the INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR in the performance of this agreement shall be and act as an INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR providing the necessary tools and equipment and provide the Board of Trustees a final finished report and/or product within the prescribed time allocated, and

WHEREAS the INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR shall assume all other expenses incurred in connection with the performance of this contract and the DISTRICT shall not be responsible for payment of any other expenses. While engaged in carrying out and complying with any of the terms and conditions of this agreement, the INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR is not an officer, agent or employee of the DISTRICT, and

WHEREAS the INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR shall provide worker's compensation insurance or self-insure services, and

WHEREAS the INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR shall indemnify and hold harmless the DISTRICT, its officers, agents, and employees from every claim or demand made, and every liability, loss, damages, or expense, of any nature whatsoever, which may be incurred by reason of:

a) Contractor agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the Rancho Santiago Community District (District), its officers, agents, employees, and volunteers from all loss, cost, and expense arising out of any liability or claim of liability for personal injury, bodily injury to persons, contractual liability and damage to property sustained or claimed to have been sustained arising of activities of the Contractor, its subcontractors, or those of any of its officers, agents, or employees, whether such act is authorized by this Agreement or not; and Contractor shall pay for any and all damage to the property, done or caused by such persons. District assumes no responsibility whatsoever for any property placed on the premises. Contractor further agrees to waive all rights of subrogation against the District. The provisions of the Article do not apply to any damage or losses caused solely by the negligence of the District or any of its agents or employees.

WHEREAS upon mutual agreement in writing of the parties hereto, this agreement may be terminated for any reason, and

WHEREAS the parties to this agreement, under penalty of perjury, certify that all of the above items are to the best of their knowledge true and correct statements.

Funded through U.S Department of Health and Human Services, EHS is a federally funded community-based program for low-income families with infants and toddlers and pregnant women. Its mission is simple:

to promote healthy prenatal outcomes for pregnant women, to enhance the development of very young children, and to promote healthy family functioning.

EHS provides services to pregnant women and expectant families, and to the child from birth to age three, in a variety of service delivery models and in diverse settings. The goal of serving pregnant women and expectant families in the Early Head Start is to provide early, continuous, intensive, and comprehensive child development and family support services. Services include early and continuous risk assessments, health promotion and treatment, including medical and dental examinations as early in the pregnancy as possible, as well as mental health interventions and follow-up as needed.

Rancho Santiago Community College (RSCCD) has determined to contract with Muckenthaler & Associates, Inc. to provide training and technical assistance as an EHS start-up planner. The next section outlines the tasks to be completed by Muckenthaler & Associates, Inc. with Cinda Muckenthaler as the primary consultant for the EHS project.

As principal of **Muckenthaler & Associates**, Inc., Cinda Muckenthaler will provide start-up guidance based on her experience and knowledge about how to operationalize the Program Performance Standards. She possess:

Management and organizational development skills;

o Communication skills necessary to work with staff and a program planning group;

o A clear understanding of Head Start/Early Head Start within the context of the community;

o The ability to assist in the facilitation and implementation of the planning process; and

o Assessment capacity as to when to seek additional help from the Federal Program Specialist or QIC staff.

The scope of work includes the following capacity as related to the Early Head Start Organizational Readiness Chart outlined below. Ms. Muckenthaler will:

- 1. Provide resource services to RSCCD, including attending, participating, and representing RSCCD EHS program at meetings (as needed) relevant to the Early Head Start program and as determined by RSCCD staff.
- 2. Provide assistance and act as a technical resource to RSCCD key staff and relevant partners including Help me Grow, HABLA and MOMS of Orange County in relation to the EHS Program.
- 3. Coordinate with the RSCCD EHS staff in developing services plans, and reports based on the goals of the program
- 4. Report to RSCCD EHS key staff on a regular basis regarding the status of the program, the tasks completed during the reporting period, and any issues needing to be addressed.
- 5. Assist in EHS program development, including, but not limited to program services as listed above.
- 6. Engage in one-on-one interaction with EHS key staff to develop program policies and procedures to meet EHS Performance Standards.
- 7. Assess current needs in the development of the EHS services platform to assist with development and/or integration of policies and procedures as applicable to EHS Performance Standards. Identify current policies/procedures and recommend service gaps and strategies to bridge these gaps.

YEAR ONE AGREEMENT BETWEEN RANCHO SANTIAGO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT AND HABLA/PHFE

Early Head Start (Grant No.09SA9091/01)

This Agreement is entered into on the first day of December, 2009 between Rancho Santiago Community College District (hereinafter "RSCCD") and HABLA (hereinafter "SUBRECIPIENT").

WHEREAS, RSCCD has received the first year of funding of a grant entitled Early Head Start ARRA Expansion (Grant No. 09SA9091/01; CFDA No. 93.709), from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF Administration for Children and Families (ACF), for the purpose of providing services to children and their families, and

WHEREAS, SUBRECIPIENT has agreed to participate in the purpose of this grant, and

WHEREAS, RSCCD has the right to enter into agreements with outside entities for various services with the approval of the Board of Trustees;

NOW, THEREFORE the DISTRICT and SUBRECIPIENT do covenant and agree as follows:

TERM

1. The effective term of this Agreement shall be from the period beginning December 1, 2009 and ending September 30, 2010 in the amount of \$263,203 (\$25,051 for Start-Up Budget and \$238,152 Operating Budget for first year) and subject to the provisions of this Agreement

PURPOSE

2. The purpose of the program funded by this Agreement is to support Early Head Start services and is designed to improve the quality and long-term effectiveness of children and families by developing comprehensive services to the whole family which will lead to self sufficiency. SUBRECIPIENT shall ensure that the program funded hereby shall comply with this purpose.

COMPLIANCE WITH LAW

- 3. In its performance under this Agreement, SUBRECIPIENT shall fully comply with the requirements of the following, whether or not otherwise referred to in this Agreement:
 - a. The Act and all applicable federal statutes, regulations, policies, procedures and directives, including but not limited to 45 CFR 74; 45 CFR 1301-1310; OMB Circular A-110 Uniform Administrative Requirements for Awards and Sub-Awards With Institutions of Higher Education, Hospitals, and Other Non-Profit Organizations; OMB Circular A-21 Cost

6.3(2)

Principles for Educational Institutions; and OMB Circular A-133 Appendix B Audits of States, Local Governments and Non-Profit Organizations, Compliance Supplement;

- b. All applicable standards and orders and requirements issued under Section 306 of the Clean Air Act, Section 508 of the Clean Water Act and Environmental Protection Agency regulations in contracts in excess of \$100,000;
- c. All applicable State statutes, regulations, policies, procedures and directives;
- d. All applicable local ordinances and requirements, including use permits and licensing;
- e. Court orders applicable to its operation; and
- f. The terms and conditions of this Agreement.

If any of the foregoing is enacted, amended, or revised, SUBRECIPIENT will comply with such or will notify RSCCD after enactment or modification that it cannot so comply. RSCCD may thereupon terminate this Agreement, if necessary.

STATEMENT OF WORK

4. This Agreement is based on the Application for Federal Assistance included with the Year One Agreement. SUBRECIPIENT agrees to comply with all provisions, to perform all work, and to provide all services set forth in this Agreement and the aforementioned Application for Federal Assistance in a professional, timely and diligent manner (see Exhibit C). The parties hereto agree that concerning matters not specifically contained within the body of this Agreement, the Application for Federal assistance will be controlling.

MODIFICATION OF PROGRAM COMPONENTS AND SERVICE LEVELS

5. The parties hereto agree that those program components and service levels detailed in the aforementioned Application for Federal Assistance may be modified so long as the total payments under this Agreement are not increased and the project scope, objectives, and key personnel (in accordance with 45 CFR 74.25 (c)(2)) are not altered. However, any such modification shall not be made without the prior written notification of RSCCD. Any requests for changes in scope, objectives or key personnel require written approval and should be coordinated through RSCCD for submission to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF.

PLANS AND PROCEDURES

6. SUBRECIPIENT shall monitor its program for compliance with the provisions of this Agreement and all applicable laws, regulations and its institutional policies and procedures.

REPORTS

7. SUBRECIPIENT shall submit such reports, data and information at such times as RSCCD may require, and in the form RSCCD may require, regarding the performance of SUBRECIPIENT'S services, or SUBRECIPIENT'S activities, costs or other data.

NO SUPPLANTATION

8. Funds provided under this Agreement shall be used only for activities that are in addition to those that would otherwise be available in the absence of such funds. SUBRECIPIENT shall not render the same services under this Agreement to any participant whose cost of services is otherwise paid for by any other person or entity.

INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

9. SUBRECIPIENT agrees that the service provided hereunder are rendered in its capacity as an independent contractor and that it is not in any way an agent of RSCCD, nor shall its employees be entitled to any personnel benefits of RSCCD whatsoever.

SUBCONTRACT ASSIGNMENT

10. None of the duties of, or work to be performed by, SUBRECIPIENT under this Agreement shall be sub-contracted or assigned to any agency, consultant, or person without the prior written consent of RSCCD. No subcontract or assignment shall terminate or alter the legal obligation of SUBRECIPIENT pursuant to this Agreement. SUBRECIPIENT shall insure that all subcontracts for services and contracted staff are procured in a manner consistent with Federal and local SUBRECIPIENT guidelines. SUBRECIPIENT shall itemize all sub-contractor and contracted staff costs in the budget so it is clear how the funds will be allocated and spent by each SUBRECIPIENT. By entering into this Agreement SUBRECIPIENT agrees that it is the direct provider of intended services. Upon request, SUBRECIPIENT shall submit to RSCCD copies of all sub-contracts for services and contracted staff, and other agreements, as well as documentation indicating the approving authority's approval, that relate to this Agreement.

BUDGET SCHEDULE

11. SUBRECIPIENT agrees that the expenditures of any and all funds under this Agreement will be in accordance with the approved budget, a copy of which is attached as **Exhibit B**, and which by this reference is incorporated herein and made a part hereof as if fully set forth.

MODIFICATION OF BUDGET SCHEDULE

12. SUBRECIPIENT shall have the authority to transfer allocated program funds from one category of the overall program budget to any other category of the overall program budget, as long as the amount of the total grant is not increased and the scope of the program is not altered. Where the scope of the program is altered and results in the need for a change in the budget, written approval is required and should be coordinated through RSCCD for submission to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF.

TIME EXTENSIONS

13. RSCCD will not be requesting a time extension for Year One activities from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF. As a result, SUBRECIPIENT will not be granted an extension. Therefore, SUBRECIPIENT must spend all of the funds allocated through this agreement within the timeframe of the agreement. Under this agreement, SUBRECIPIENT will only be reimbursed for expenses that are incurred prior to October 1, 2010.

SUBMISSION OF INVOICES

14. Upon the effective date of this Agreement, RSCCD shall make payments to SUBRECIPIENT in accordance with the following payment schedule:

a. <u>Payments</u>. Beginning upon execution of this agreement, no more often than once a month and no less than once per quarter, upon receipt and approval by RSCCD of SUBRECIPIENT'S invoice, RSCCD shall make reimbursement payments as long as the total payments under this Agreement do not exceed \$263,203. Invoices should show itemized expenditures in accordance with the invoice template provided with the Year One Agreement, see Exhibit D.

- b. <u>Progress Reports</u>. Failure to submit timely Progress Reports will result in delays of payment to SUBRECIPIENT. Progress Reports are due to the Project Director by the following dates:
 - i. First semi-annual report March 1, 2010
 - ii. Second semi-annual report July 1, 2010
 - iii. Final Program Report October 10, 2010
 - iv. Other reports as required upon request

FISCAL ACCOUNTABILITY

- 15. a. <u>Financial Management System</u>. SUBRECIPIENT shall establish and maintain a sound financial management system, based upon generally accepted accounting principles. SUBRECIPIENT'S system shall provide fiscal control and accounting procedures that will include the following:
 - 1. Information pertaining to this Agreement and contract awards, obligations, unobligated balances, assets, expenditures, and income;
 - 2. Effective internal controls to safeguard assets and assure their proper use;

17. SUBRECIPIENT shall arrange for an independent audit of their federal funds in accordance with OMB Circular A-133. This program should be listed in their Schedule of Federal Expenditures. SUBRECIPIENT shall submit a copy of each required audit report to RSCCD within thirty (30) days after the date received by the SUBRECIPIENT.

ACCESS AND RECORDS

- 18. a. Access. RSCCD, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF, and the United States Government and/or their representatives, shall have access, for purposes of monitoring auditing, and examining, to SUBRECIPIENT'S activities, books, documents and papers (including computer records) and to records of SUBRECIPIENT'S subcontractors, consultants, contracted employees, bookkeepers, accountants, employees and participants related to this Agreement. Such agencies or representatives shall have the right to make excerpts, transcripts and photocopies of such records and to schedule on-site monitoring at their discretion. Monitoring activities also may include, but are not limited to, questioning employees and participants and entering any premises or onto any site in which any of the services or activities funded hereunder are conducted or in which any of the records of SUBRECIPIENT are kept. In the event SUBRECIPIENT does not make the above-referenced documents available within the County of Orange, California, SUBRECIPIENT agrees to pay all necessary and reasonable expenses incurred by RSCCD in conducting any audit at the location where said records and books of account are maintained.
 - b. Records Retention. All accounting records and evidence pertaining to all costs of SUBRECIPIENT and all documents related to this Agreement shall be kept available at SUBRECIPIENT'S office or place of business for the duration of this Agreement and thereafter for three (3) years after completion of an audit. Records that relate to 1) complaints, claims, administrative proceedings or litigation arising out of the performance of this Agreement, or 2) costs and expenses of this Agreement to which RSCCD or any other government agency takes exception, shall be retained beyond the three (3) year period until final resolution or disposition of such appeals, litigation, claims, or exceptions.

FRAUD

19. SUBRECIPIENT shall immediately report all suspected or known instances and facts concerning possible fraud, abuse or criminal activity under this Agreement, in accordance with the applicable federal laws and regulations.

NONDISCRIMINATION AND COMPLIANCE PROVISIONS

- 20. As a condition of this award of financial assistance under the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF to SUBRECIPIENT from RSCCD, SUBRECIPIENT assures, with respect to operation of all programs or activities funded with funds provided pursuant to the Act, and all agreements to carry out such programs or activities, that it will comply fully with the nondiscrimination and equal opportunity provisions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended; section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended; the Age Discrimination Act of 1975, as amended; and with all applicable requirements imposed by or pursuant to regulations implementing those laws, including, but not limited to, 45 CFR 84, 85, 86, 90, 91 et seq. The United States, the State of California and RSCCD have the right to seek judicial enforcement of this assurance.
 - a. During the performance of this Agreement, SUBRECIPIENT and its subcontractors will not deny the Agreement's benefits to any person on the basis of race, ancestry, national origin, religion, color, ethnic group identification, sex, age, physical or mental disability (including HIV and AIDS), medical condition (cancer), marital status, nor will they unlawfully discriminate, harass or allow harassment against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, ancestry, religion, color, ethnic group identification, national origin, ancestry, mental or physical disability (including HIV and AIDS), medical condition (cancer), marital status, age (over 40), sex, denial of family care leave, or political affiliation or belief.

SUBRECIPIENT will insure that the evaluation and treatment of employees and applicants for employment are free from such discrimination and harassment.

b. SUBRECIPIENT will include the non-discrimination and compliance provisions of this Section

of the Agreement in all subcontracts to perform work under this Agreement.

c. SUBRECIPIENT will give written notice of its obligations under this Section of the Agreement to labor organizations with which SUBRECIPIENT has a collective bargaining or other agreement.

CONFIDENTIALITY

21. Without prejudice to any other section of this Agreement, SUBRECIPIENT shall, where applicable, maintain the confidential nature of information provided to it concerning participants in accordance with the requirements of federal and state laws. However, SUBRECIPIENT shall submit to RSCCD, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF, and/or the United States Government or their representatives, all records requested for administrative purposes, including audit, examinations, monitoring and verification of reports submitted by SUBRECIPIENT, costs incurred and services rendered hereunder.

PROPERTY

22. a. **Definitions**

1. "Real Property" is land, including land improvements, structures, and appurtenances thereto,

excluding movable machinery and equipment.

2. "Equipment": For purchase on or after July 1, 1993, "equipment" is tangible nonexpendable personal property having a useful life of more than one year and an acquisition cost of \$5,000 or more per unit. Equipment is NOT considered an allowable cost without prior written approval of the Grants Officer.

b. Property Management. SUBRECIPIENT shall budget, manage and maintain an inventory of property in accordance with the standards established by the U.S. Government. SUBRECIPIENT shall retain records pertaining to all equipment or property described above, and to costs incurred with respect thereto, for a period of three (3) years after final disposition of such property. SUBRECIPIENT shall immediately return all equipment, finished or unfinished documents, photographs, data, studies and reports or unused supplies prepared or purchased by SUBRECIPIENT under this Agreement to RSCCD or its representatives, or dispose of them in accordance with directions from RSCCD.

INDEMNIFICATION

23. All parties to this Agreement shall agree to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the other party, it's officers, agents, employees, and volunteers, from and against all loss, cost, and expense arising out of any liability or claim of liability, sustained or claimed to have been sustained, arising out of the activities, or the performance or nonperformance of obligations under this Agreement, of the indemnifying party, or those of any of its officers, agents, employees, or volunteers. provisions of this Article do not apply to any damage or losses caused solely by the negligence or intentional acts of the non-indemnifying party of any of its agents or employees.

INSURANCE

24. SUBRECIPIENT shall secure and maintain comprehensive general liability insurance covering personal injury, property damage, and general liability claims in the amount of at least one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and three million dollars (\$3,000,000) in the aggregate with

coverage for incidental contracts. A certificate of insurance must be provided that includes a thirty (30) day notice of cancellation, modification, or reduction in said insurance. SUBRECIPIENT shall deliver certificate(s) of insurance under SUBRECIPIENT'S comprehensive general liability insurance policy on or before the date of execution of this agreement. Upon request, RSCCD shall be provided a copy of said policy.

SUBRECIPIENT shall provide workers' compensation coverage for each of its employees.

PATENT/COPYRIGHT MATERIALS/PROPRIETARY INFORMATION

25. SUBRECIPIENT agrees to grant RSCCD, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF, and/or the United States Government a royalty-free, nonexclusive and irrevocable license to publish, copy, translate or use, now and hereafter, all materials, data, films, tapes, etc., developed under this Agreement. RSCCD, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF, and/or the United States Government reserve the right to authorize others to use or reproduce such materials. Further, these parties shall have access to any report, preliminary findings or data assembled by SUBRECIPIENT under this Agreement and in accordance with 45 CFR 74.36, any publication filed by a grantee for an invention made under a grant must include the following statement in the first paragraph: "The invention described in this application was made under a grant from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF."

STANDARDS OF CONDUCT

26. a. General Assurance. In accordance with 45 CFR 74.42 every reasonable course of action will be taken by SUBRECIPIENT in order to maintain the integrity of this expenditure of public funds and to avoid favoritism and questionable or improper conduct. This Agreement will be administered in an impartial manner, free from efforts to gain personal financial or political gain. SUBRECIPIENT, its officers and employees, in administering this Agreement, will avoid situations that give rise to a suggestion that any decision was influenced by prejudice, bias, special interest or desire for personal gain.

b. Conducting Business Involving Relatives. No relative by blood, adoption or marriage of any executive or employee of SUBRECIPIENT will receive favorable treatment when considered

for enrollment in programs provided by, or employment with, SUBRECIPIENT.

c. <u>Conducting Business Involving Close Personal Friends and Associates</u>. Executives of SUBRECIPIENT will be particularly aware of the varying degrees of influence that can be exerted by personal friends and associates and, in administering this Agreement, will exercise due diligence to avoid situations which give rise to an assertion that favorable treatment is being granted to friends and associates. When it is in the public interest for SUBRECIPIENT to conduct business with a friend or associate of an executive or employee of SUBRECIPIENT, or an elected official in the area, a permanent record of the transaction will be retained.

d. Avoidance of Economic Interest. No executive or employee of SUBRECIPIENT, elected official in the area, will solicit or accept money or any other consideration from a third person, for the performance of an act reimbursed in whole or part by SUBRECIPIENT or RSCCD. Supplies, materials, equipment or services purchased with Agreement funds will be used solely

for purposes allowed under this Agreement.

DRUG FREE WORKPLACE

27. SUBRECIPIENT shall abide by the Government-wide Requirements for a Drug Free Workplace in accordance with 45 CFR 82.205. By signing and submitting the subcontract agreement the SUBRECIPIENT certifies that it will comply with these requirements.

ENVIRONMENTAL TOBACCO SMOKE

28. Public Law 103227, Part C Environmental Tobacco Smoke, also known as the Pro Children Act of 1994, requires that smoking not be permitted in any portion of any indoor routinely owned or leased or contracted for by an entity and used routinely or regularly for provision of health, day care, education, or library services to children under the age of 18, if the services are funded by Federal programs either directly or through State or local governments, by Federal grant, contract, loan, or loan guarantee. The law does not apply to children's services provided in private residences, facilities funded solely by Medicare or Medicaid funds, and portions of facilities used for inpatient drug or alcohol treatment. Failure to comply with the provisions of the law may result in the imposition of a civil monetary penalty of up to \$1,000 per day and/or the imposition of an administrative compliance order on the responsible entity. By signing and submitting the subcontract agreement the SUBRECIPIENT certifies that it will comply with the requirements of the Act.

DEBARMENT AND SUSPENSION

29. SUBRECIPIENT certifies that it is not debarred or suspended or otherwise excluded from or ineligible for participation in Federal programs in accordance with 45 CFR Part 74.13.

TRAFFICKING VICTIMS PROTECTION ACT

30. AS required under Section 106 (g) of the TVPA as amended in 22 U.S.C. 7104(g) RSCCD retains the right to terminate this sub-agreement, without penalty, if the SUBRECIPIENT, or any of its subcontractors (i) engages in severe forms of trafficking in persons or has procured a commercial sex act during the period of time that the grant, or sub-agreement is in effect, or (ii) uses forced labor in the performance of this sub-agreement.

LITERATURE AND PUBLIC ANNOUNCEMENTS

31. As required under Section 508 of Public Law 103-333, the following conditions are applicable to the SUBRECIPIENT: "When issuing statements, press releases, requests for proposals, bid solicitations and other documents describing projects or programs funded in whole or in part with Federal money, all grantees receiving Federal funds, including but not limited to States and local governments and recipients of Federal research grants shall clearly state 1) the percentage of the total costs of the program or project which will be financed with Federal money, 2) the dollar amount of Federal funds for the program or project, and 3) the percentage and dollar amount of total costs of program or project that will be refinanced by non-governmental sources."

LOBBYING

32. As required by Section 1352, Title 31, of the U.S. Code, and implemented at 45 CFR Part 93, SUBRECIPIENT certifies that:

a. No Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid, by or on behalf of the undersigned, to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with the making of any Federal grant, the entering into of

any cooperative agreement, and the extension, continuation, renewal, amendment, or modification of any Federal grant or cooperative agreement;

b. If any funds other than Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with this Federal grant or cooperative agreement, the undersigned shall complete and submit Standard Form-LLL, "Disclosure Form to Report Lobbying," in accordance with its instructions.

BREACH - SANCTIONS

33. If, through any cause, SUBRECIPIENT violates any of the terms and conditions of this Agreement, or any prior Agreements whereby grant funds were received by SUBRECIPIENT, or if SUBRECIPIENT reports inaccurately, or if any audit report makes disallowances, SUBRECIPIENT shall promptly remedy its acts or omissions and/or repay RSCCD all amounts due RSCCD as a result thereof. For any such failures or violations RSCCD shall also have the right, at its sole discretion, to: 1) immediately discontinue program support until such time as SUBRECIPIENT fulfills its obligations or remedies all violations of this Agreement or prior Agreements; and/or 2) collect outstanding amounts, as determined by RSCCD to be due RSCCD from SUBRECIPIENT, by offsetting or debiting from current claims or invoices, if after thirty (30) days written notice SUBRECIPIENT has failed to repay same or a repayment schedule has not been made; and/or 3) terminate this Agreement in accordance with Section 34 herein.

DISPUTES

34. In the event of a dispute between the parties, the aggrieved party shall notify the other party and provide a detailed description of the alleged problem. The parties agree to use reasonable efforts to resolve such dispute by good faith negotiations and mutual agreement. In the event such informal resolution is not successful within a reasonable period of time, the parties hereby agree that such dispute will be resolved in the manner specified below.

Any dispute concerning any question arising under this Agreement, except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, shall be decided by RSCCD or the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF. In such a case, the decision shall be reduced to writing and a copy thereof shall be mailed or otherwise furnished to SUBRECIPIENT. The decision shall be final and conclusive unless within thirty (30) calendar days from the mailing or delivery of such copy, RSCCD receives from SUBRECIPIENT a written request to appeal said decision. Pending final decision of the appeal, SUBRECIPIENT shall act in accordance with the written decision of RSCCD or the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF, whichever is the final arbiter of the dispute.

The handling of non-criminal complaints, including discrimination complaints, and complaints and reports of criminal fraud, waste and abuse shall be as prescribed by RSCCD, and/or the State of California, and/or the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF, whichever is applicable, in accordance with applicable provisions of the Code of Federal Regulations.

TERMINATION

35. Either party may terminate this Agreement, with or without cause upon thirty (30) days written notice served upon the other party. Notice shall be deemed served on the date of mailing. Upon

termination, or notice thereof, the parties agree to cooperate with one another in the orderly transfer of service responsibilities, active case records, and pertinent documents.

The obligations of RSCCD under this Agreement are contingent upon the availability of Federal and/or State funds, as applicable, for the reimbursement of SUBRECIPIENT'S expenditures, and inclusion of sufficient funds for the services hereunder in the budget approved by the RSCCD Board of Trustees each fiscal year this Agreement remains in effect or operation. In the event that such funding is terminated or reduced, RSCCD shall provide SUBRECIPIENT with written notification of such determination. SUBRECIPIENT shall immediately comply with RSCCD'S decision.

TOTAL AGREEMENT

36. This Agreement, together with the attachments hereto, expresses the total understanding of the parties. There are no oral understandings of the parties or terms and conditions other than as are stated herein. SUBRECIPIENT acknowledges that it has read and agrees to all terms and conditions included in this contract.

AMENDMENTS

37. This Agreement may be modified or revised at any time by the parties as long as the amendment is made in writing and signed by both parties.

NOTICES

38. All notices, reports and correspondence between the parties hereto respecting this Agreement shall be in writing and deposited in the United States Mail, postage prepaid, addressed as follows:

YEAR ONE AGREEMENT BETWEEN RANCHO SANTIAGO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT AND CHOC CHILDREN'S

Early Head Start (Grant No.09SA9091/01)

This Agreement is entered into on the first day of December, 2009 between Rancho Santiago Community College District (hereinafter "RSCCD") and CHOC CHILDREN'S on behalf of HELP ME GROW OC (hereinafter "SUBRECIPIENT").

WHEREAS, RSCCD has received the first year of funding of a grant entitled Early Head Start ARRA Expansion (Grant No. 09SA9091/01; CFDA No. 93.709), from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Administration for Children and Families (ACF), for the purpose of providing services to children and their families, and

WHEREAS, SUBRECIPIENT has agreed to participate in the purpose of this grant, and

WHEREAS, RSCCD has the right to enter into agreements with outside entities for various services with the approval of the Board of Trustees;

NOW, THEREFORE the DISTRICT and SUBRECIPIENT do covenant and agree as follows:

TERM

1. The effective term of this Agreement shall be from the period beginning December 1, 2009 and ending September 30, 2010 in the amount of \$105,754 (\$1,992 for Start-Up Budget and \$103,762 Operating Budget for first year) and subject to the provisions of this Agreement

PURPOSE

2. The purpose of the program funded by this Agreement is to support Early Head Start services and is designed to improve the quality and long-term effectiveness of children and families by developing comprehensive services to the whole family which will lead to self sufficiency. SUBRECIPIENT shall ensure that the program funded hereby shall comply with this purpose.

COMPLIANCE WITH LAW

- 3. In its performance under this Agreement, SUBRECIPIENT shall fully comply with the requirements of the following, whether or not otherwise referred to in this Agreement:
 - a. The Act and all applicable federal statutes, regulations, policies, procedures and directives, including but not limited to 45 CFR 74; 45 CFR 1301-1310; OMB Circular A-110 Uniform Administrative Requirements for Awards and Sub-Awards With Institutions of Higher Education, Hospitals, and Other Non-Profit Organizations; OMB Circular A-21 Cost

Principles for Educational Institutions; and OMB Circular A-133 Appendix B Audits of States, Local Governments and Non-Profit Organizations, Compliance Supplement;

- b. All applicable standards and orders and requirements issued under Section 306 of the Clean Air Act, Section 508 of the Clean Water Act and Environmental Protection Agency regulations in contracts in excess of \$100,000;
- c. All applicable State statutes, regulations, policies, procedures and directives;
- d. All applicable local ordinances and requirements, including use permits and licensing;
- e. Court orders applicable to its operation; and
- f. The terms and conditions of this Agreement.

If any of the foregoing is enacted, amended, or revised, SUBRECIPIENT will comply with such or will notify RSCCD after enactment or modification that it cannot so comply. RSCCD may thereupon terminate this Agreement, if necessary.

STATEMENT OF WORK

4. This Agreement is based on the Application for Federal Assistance included with the Year One Agreement. SUBRECIPIENT agrees to comply with all provisions, to perform all work, and to provide all services set forth in this Agreement and the aforementioned Application for Federal Assistance in a professional, timely and diligent manner (see Exhibit C). The parties hereto agree that concerning matters not specifically contained within the body of this Agreement, the Application for Federal assistance will be controlling.

MODIFICATION OF PROGRAM COMPONENTS AND SERVICE LEVELS

5. The parties hereto agree that those program components and service levels detailed in the aforementioned Application for Federal Assistance may be modified so long as the total payments under this Agreement are not increased and the project scope, objectives, and key personnel (in accordance with 45 CFR 74.25 (c)(2)) are not altered. However, any such modification shall not be made without the prior written notification of RSCCD. Any requests for changes in scope, objectives or key personnel require written approval and should be coordinated through RSCCD for submission to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF.

PLANS AND PROCEDURES

6. SUBRECIPIENT shall monitor its program for compliance with the provisions of this Agreement and all applicable laws, regulations and its institutional policies and procedures.

REPORTS

7. SUBRECIPIENT shall submit such reports, data and information at such times as RSCCD may require, and in the form RSCCD may require, regarding the performance of SUBRECIPIENT'S services, or SUBRECIPIENT'S activities, costs or other data.

NO SUPPLANTATION

8. Funds provided under this Agreement shall be used only for activities that are in addition to those that would otherwise be available in the absence of such funds. SUBRECIPIENT shall not render the same services under this Agreement to any participant whose cost of services is otherwise paid for by any other person or entity.

INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

9. SUBRECIPIENT agrees that the service provided hereunder are rendered in its capacity as an independent contractor and that it is not in any way an agent of RSCCD, nor shall its employees be entitled to any personnel benefits of RSCCD whatsoever.

SUBCONTRACT ASSIGNMENT

10. None of the duties of, or work to be performed by, SUBRECIPIENT under this Agreement shall be sub-contracted or assigned to any agency, consultant, or person without the prior written consent of RSCCD. No subcontract or assignment shall terminate or alter the legal obligation of SUBRECIPIENT pursuant to this Agreement. SUBRECIPIENT shall insure that all subcontracts for services and contracted staff are procured in a manner consistent with Federal and local SUBRECIPIENT guidelines. SUBRECIPIENT shall itemize all sub-contractor and contracted staff costs in the budget so it is clear how the funds will be allocated and spent by each SUBRECIPIENT. By entering into this Agreement SUBRECIPIENT agrees that it is the direct provider of intended services. Upon request, SUBRECIPIENT shall submit to RSCCD copies of all sub-contracts for services and contracted staff, and other agreements, as well as documentation indicating the approving authority's approval, that relate to this Agreement.

BUDGET SCHEDULE

11. SUBRECIPIENT agrees that the expenditures of any and all funds under this Agreement will be in accordance with the approved budget, a copy of which is attached as **Exhibit B**, and which by this reference is incorporated herein and made a part hereof as if fully set forth.

MODIFICATION OF BUDGET SCHEDULE

12. SUBRECIPIENT shall have the authority to transfer allocated program funds from one category of the overall program budget to any other category of the overall program budget, as long as the amount of the total grant is not increased and the scope of the program is not altered. Where the scope of the program is altered and results in the need for a change in the budget, written approval is required and should be coordinated through RSCCD for submission to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF.

TIME EXTENSIONS

13. RSCCD will not be requesting a time extension for Year One activities from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF. As a result, SUBRECIPIENT will not be granted an extension. Therefore, SUBRECIPIENT must spend all of the funds allocated through this agreement within the timeframe of the agreement. Under this agreement, SUBRECIPIENT will only be reimbursed for expenses that are incurred prior to October 1, 2010.

SUBMISSION OF INVOICES

14. Upon the effective date of this Agreement, RSCCD shall make payments to SUBRECIPIENT in accordance with the following payment schedule:

a. <u>Payments</u>. Beginning upon execution of this agreement, no more often than once a month and no less than once per quarter, upon receipt and approval by RSCCD of SUBRECIPIENT'S invoice, RSCCD shall make reimbursement payments as long as the total payments under this Agreement do not exceed \$XXX. Invoices should show itemized expenditures in accordance with the invoice template provided with the Year One Agreement, see Exhibit D.

- 15. a. <u>Financial Management System</u>. SUBRECIPIENT shall establish and maintain a sound financial management system, based upon generally accepted accounting principles. SUBRECIPIENT'S system shall provide fiscal control and accounting procedures that will include the following:
 - 1. Information pertaining to this Agreement and contract awards, obligations, unobligated balances, assets, expenditures, and income;
 - 2. Effective internal controls to safeguard assets and assure their proper use;
 - 3. Source documentation to support accounting records; and
 - 4. Proper charging of costs and cost allocation.
 - b. SUBRECIPIENT'S Records. SUBRECIPIENT'S records shall be sufficient to:
 - 1. Permit preparation of required reports;
 - 2. Permit the tracing of funds to a level of expenditure adequate to establish that funds have not been used in violation of the applicable restrictions on the use of such funds; and
 - 3. Permit the tracing of program income, or profits earned, and any costs incurred that are otherwise allowable except for funding limitations.
 - c. Costs Charged. Costs shall be charged to this contract only in accordance with the following:
 - 1. Budget provided by Rebecca Hernandez, Director, HELP ME GROW. (Exhibit B)

PROGRAM INCOME

16. SUBRECIPIENT must comply with Exhibit F Use of Program Income for all program income generated.

ANNUAL AUDIT

17. SUBRECIPIENT shall arrange for an independent audit of their federal funds in accordance with OMB Circular A-133. This program should be listed in their Schedule of Federal Expenditures. SUBRECIPIENT shall submit a copy of each required audit report to RSCCD within thirty (30) days after the date received by the SUBRECIPIENT.

ACCESS AND RECORDS

- 18. a. Access. RSCCD, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF, and the United States Government and/or their representatives, shall have access, for purposes of monitoring auditing, and examining, to SUBRECIPIENT'S activities, books, documents and papers (including computer records) and to records of SUBRECIPIENT'S subcontractors, consultants, contracted employees, bookkeepers, accountants, employees and participants related to this Agreement. Such agencies or representatives shall have the right to make excerpts, transcripts and photocopies of such records and to schedule on-site monitoring at their discretion. Monitoring activities also may include, but are not limited to, questioning employees and participants and entering any premises or onto any site in which any of the services or activities funded hereunder are conducted or in which any of the records of SUBRECIPIENT are kept. In the event SUBRECIPIENT does not make the above-referenced documents available within the County of Orange, California, SUBRECIPIENT agrees to pay all necessary and reasonable expenses incurred by RSCCD in conducting any audit at the location where said records and books of account are maintained.
 - b. Records Retention. All accounting records and evidence pertaining to all costs of SUBRECIPIENT and all documents related to this Agreement shall be kept available at SUBRECIPIENT'S office or place of business for the duration of this Agreement and thereafter for three (3) years after completion of an audit. Records that relate to 1) complaints, claims, administrative proceedings or litigation arising out of the performance of this Agreement, or 2) costs and expenses of this Agreement to which RSCCD or any other government agency takes exception, shall be retained beyond the three (3) year period until final resolution or disposition of such appeals, litigation, claims, or exceptions.

FRAUD

19. SUBRECIPIENT shall immediately report all suspected or known instances and facts concerning possible fraud, abuse or criminal activity under this Agreement, in accordance with the applicable federal laws and regulations.

NONDISCRIMINATION AND COMPLIANCE PROVISIONS

- 20. As a condition of this award of financial assistance under the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF to SUBRECIPIENT from RSCCD, SUBRECIPIENT assures, with respect to operation of all programs or activities funded with funds provided pursuant to the Act, and all agreements to carry out such programs or activities, that it will comply fully with the nondiscrimination and equal opportunity provisions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended; section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended; the Age Discrimination Act of 1975, as amended; and with all applicable requirements imposed by or pursuant to regulations implementing those laws, including, but not limited to, 45 CFR 84, 85, 86, 90, 91 et seq. The United States, the State of California and RSCCD have the right to seek judicial enforcement of this assurance.
 - a. During the performance of this Agreement, SUBRECIPIENT and its subcontractors will not deny the Agreement's benefits to any person on the basis of race, ancestry, national origin, religion, color, ethnic group identification, sex, age, physical or mental disability (including HIV and AIDS), medical condition (cancer), marital status, nor will they unlawfully discriminate, harass or allow harassment against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, ancestry, religion, color, ethnic group identification, national origin, ancestry, mental or physical disability (including HIV and AIDS), medical condition (cancer), marital

status, age (over 40), sex, denial of family care leave, or political affiliation or belief. SUBRECIPIENT will insure that the evaluation and treatment of employees and applicants for employment are free from such discrimination and harassment.

b. SUBRECIPIENT will include the non-discrimination and compliance provisions of this Section

of the Agreement in all subcontracts to perform work under this Agreement.

c. SUBRECIPIENT will give written notice of its obligations under this Section of the Agreement to labor organizations with which SUBRECIPIENT has a collective bargaining or other agreement.

CONFIDENTIALITY

21. Without prejudice to any other section of this Agreement, SUBRECIPIENT shall, where applicable, maintain the confidential nature of information provided to it concerning participants in accordance with the requirements of federal and state laws. However, SUBRECIPIENT shall submit to RSCCD, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF, and/or the United States Government or their representatives, all records requested for administrative purposes, including audit, examinations, monitoring and verification of reports submitted by SUBRECIPIENT, costs incurred and services rendered hereunder.

PROPERTY

22. a. Definitions

1. "Real Property" is land, including land improvements, structures, and appurtenances thereto,

excluding movable machinery and equipment.

2. "Equipment": For purchase on or after July 1, 1993, "equipment" is tangible nonexpendable personal property having a useful life of more than one year and an acquisition cost of \$5,000 or more per unit. Equipment is NOT considered an allowable cost without prior written approval of the Grants Officer.

b. Property Management. SUBRECIPIENT shall budget, manage and maintain an inventory of property in accordance with the standards established by the U.S. Government. SUBRECIPIENT shall retain records pertaining to all equipment or property described above, and to costs incurred with respect thereto, for a period of three (3) years after final disposition of such property. SUBRECIPIENT shall immediately return all equipment, finished or unfinished documents, photographs, data, studies and reports or unused supplies prepared or purchased by SUBRECIPIENT under this Agreement to RSCCD or its representatives, or dispose of them in accordance with directions from RSCCD.

INDEMNIFICATION

23. All parties to this Agreement shall agree to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the other party, it's officers, agents, employees, and volunteers, from and against all loss, cost, and expense arising out of any liability or claim of liability, sustained or claimed to have been sustained, arising out of the activities, or the performance or nonperformance of obligations under this Agreement, of the indemnifying party, or those of any of its officers, agents, employees, or volunteers. provisions of this Article do not apply to any damage or losses caused solely by the negligence or intentional acts of the non-indemnifying party of any of its agents or employees.

INSURANCE

24. SUBRECIPIENT shall secure and maintain comprehensive general liability insurance covering personal injury, property damage, and general liability claims in the amount of at least one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and three million dollars (\$3,000,000) in the aggregate with coverage for incidental contracts. A certificate of insurance must be provided that includes a thirty (30) day notice of cancellation, modification, or reduction in said insurance. SUBRECIPIENT shall deliver certificate(s) of insurance under SUBRECIPIENT'S comprehensive general liability insurance policy on or before the date of execution of this agreement. Upon request, RSCCD shall be provided a copy of said policy.

SUBRECIPIENT shall provide workers' compensation coverage for each of its employees.

PATENT/COPYRIGHT MATERIALS/PROPRIETARY INFORMATION

25. SUBRECIPIENT agrees to grant RSCCD, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF, and/or the United States Government a royalty-free, nonexclusive and irrevocable license to publish, copy, translate or use, now and hereafter, all materials, data, films, tapes, etc., developed under this Agreement. RSCCD, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF, and/or the United States Government reserve the right to authorize others to use or reproduce such materials. Further, these parties shall have access to any report, preliminary findings or data assembled by SUBRECIPIENT under this Agreement and in accordance with 45 CFR 74.36, any publication filed by a grantee for an invention made under a grant must include the following statement in the first paragraph: "The invention described in this application was made under a grant from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF."

STANDARDS OF CONDUCT

- 26. a. General Assurance. In accordance with 45 CFR 74.42 every reasonable course of action will be taken by SUBRECIPIENT in order to maintain the integrity of this expenditure of public funds and to avoid favoritism and questionable or improper conduct. This Agreement will be administered in an impartial manner, free from efforts to gain personal financial or political gain. SUBRECIPIENT, its officers and employees, in administering this Agreement, will avoid situations that give rise to a suggestion that any decision was influenced by prejudice, bias, special interest or desire for personal gain.
 - b. <u>Conducting Business Involving Relatives</u>. No relative by blood, adoption or marriage of any executive or employee of SUBRECIPIENT will receive favorable treatment when considered for enrollment in programs provided by, or employment with, SUBRECIPIENT.
 - c. Conducting Business Involving Close Personal Friends and Associates. Executives of SUBRECIPIENT will be particularly aware of the varying degrees of influence that can be exerted by personal friends and associates and, in administering this Agreement, will exercise due diligence to avoid situations which give rise to an assertion that favorable treatment is being granted to friends and associates. When it is in the public interest for SUBRECIPIENT to conduct business with a friend or associate of an executive or employee of SUBRECIPIENT, or an elected official in the area, a permanent record of the transaction will be retained.
 - d. Avoidance of Economic Interest. No executive or employee of SUBRECIPIENT, elected official in the area, will solicit or accept money or any other consideration from a third person, for the performance of an act reimbursed in whole or part by SUBRECIPIENT or RSCCD. Supplies, materials, equipment or services purchased with Agreement funds will be used solely for purposes allowed under this Agreement.

DRUG FREE WORKPLACE

27. SUBRECIPIENT shall abide by the Government-wide Requirements for a Drug Free Workplace in accordance with 45 CFR 82.205. By signing and submitting the subcontract agreement the SUBRECIPIENT certifies that it will comply with these requirements.

ENVIRONMENTAL TOBACCO SMOKE

28. Public Law 103227, Part C Environmental Tobacco Smoke, also known as the Pro Children Act of 1994, requires that smoking not be permitted in any portion of any indoor routinely owned or leased or contracted for by an entity and used routinely or regularly for provision of health, day care, education, or library services to children under the age of 18, if the services are funded by Federal programs either directly or through State or local governments, by Federal grant, contract, loan, or loan guarantee. The law does not apply to children's services provided in private residences, facilities funded solely by Medicare or Medicaid funds, and portions of facilities used for inpatient drug or alcohol treatment. Failure to comply with the provisions of the law may result in the imposition of a civil monetary penalty of up to \$1,000 per day and/or the imposition of an administrative compliance order on the responsible entity. By signing and submitting the subcontract agreement the SUBRECIPIENT certifies that it will comply with the requirements of the Act.

DEBARMENT AND SUSPENSION

29. SUBRECIPIENT certifies that it is not debarred or suspended or otherwise excluded from or ineligible for participation in Federal programs in accordance with 45 CFR Part 74.13.

TRAFFICKING VICTIMS PROTECTION ACT

30. AS required under Section 106 (g) of the TVPA as amended in 22 U.S.C. 7104(g) RSCCD retains the right to terminate this sub-agreement, without penalty, if the SUBRECIPIENT, or any of its subcontractors (i) engages in severe forms of trafficking in persons or has procured a commercial sex act during the period of time that the grant, or sub-agreement is in effect, or (ii) uses forced labor in the performance of this sub-agreement.

LITERATURE AND PUBLIC ANNOUNCEMENTS

31. As required under Section 508 of Public Law 103-333, the following conditions are applicable to the SUBRECIPIENT: "When issuing statements, press releases, requests for proposals, bid solicitations and other documents describing projects or programs funded in whole or in part with Federal money, all grantees receiving Federal funds, including but not limited to States and local governments and recipients of Federal research grants shall clearly state 1) the percentage of the total costs of the program or project which will be financed with Federal money, 2) the dollar amount of Federal funds for the program or project, and 3) the percentage and dollar amount of total costs of program or project that will be refinanced by non-governmental sources."

LOBBYING

32. As required by Section 1352, Title 31, of the U.S. Code, and implemented at 45 CFR Part 93, SUBRECIPIENT certifies that:

a. No Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid, by or on behalf of the undersigned, to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with the making of any Federal grant, the entering into of

any cooperative agreement, and the extension, continuation, renewal, amendment, or modification of any Federal grant or cooperative agreement;

b. If any funds other than Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with this Federal grant or cooperative agreement, the undersigned shall complete and submit Standard Form-LLL, "Disclosure Form to Report Lobbying," in accordance with its instructions.

BREACH - SANCTIONS

33. If, through any cause, SUBRECIPIENT violates any of the terms and conditions of this Agreement, or any prior Agreements whereby grant funds were received by SUBRECIPIENT, or if SUBRECIPIENT reports inaccurately, or if any audit report makes disallowances, SUBRECIPIENT shall promptly remedy its acts or omissions and/or repay RSCCD all amounts due RSCCD as a result thereof. For any such failures or violations RSCCD shall also have the right, at its sole discretion, to: 1) immediately discontinue program support until such time as SUBRECIPIENT fulfills its obligations or remedies all violations of this Agreement or prior Agreements; and/or 2) collect outstanding amounts, as determined by RSCCD to be due RSCCD from SUBRECIPIENT, by offsetting or debiting from current claims or invoices, if after thirty (30) days written notice SUBRECIPIENT has failed to repay same or a repayment schedule has not been made; and/or 3) terminate this Agreement in accordance with Section 34 herein.

DISPUTES

34. In the event of a dispute between the parties, the aggrieved party shall notify the other party and provide a detailed description of the alleged problem. The parties agree to use reasonable efforts to resolve such dispute by good faith negotiations and mutual agreement. In the event such informal resolution is not successful within a reasonable period of time, the parties hereby agree that such dispute will be resolved in the manner specified below.

Any dispute concerning any question arising under this Agreement, except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, shall be decided by RSCCD or the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF. In such a case, the decision shall be reduced to writing and a copy thereof shall be mailed or otherwise furnished to SUBRECIPIENT. The decision shall be final and conclusive unless within thirty (30) calendar days from the mailing or delivery of such copy, RSCCD receives from SUBRECIPIENT a written request to appeal said decision. Pending final decision of the appeal, SUBRECIPIENT shall act in accordance with the written decision of RSCCD or the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF, whichever is the final arbiter of the dispute.

The handling of non-criminal complaints, including discrimination complaints, and complaints and reports of criminal fraud, waste and abuse shall be as prescribed by RSCCD, and/or the State of California, and/or the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF, whichever is applicable, in accordance with applicable provisions of the Code of Federal Regulations.

TERMINATION

35. Either party may terminate this Agreement, with or without cause upon thirty (30) days written notice served upon the other party. Notice shall be deemed served on the date of mailing. Upon

termination, or notice thereof, the parties agree to cooperate with one another in the orderly transfer of service responsibilities, active case records, and pertinent documents.

The obligations of RSCCD under this Agreement are contingent upon the availability of Federal and/or State funds, as applicable, for the reimbursement of SUBRECIPIENT'S expenditures, and inclusion of sufficient funds for the services hereunder in the budget approved by the RSCCD Board of Trustees each fiscal year this Agreement remains in effect or operation. In the event that such funding is terminated or reduced, RSCCD shall provide SUBRECIPIENT with written notification of such determination. SUBRECIPIENT shall immediately comply with RSCCD'S decision.

TOTAL AGREEMENT

36. This Agreement, together with the attachments hereto, expresses the total understanding of the parties. There are no oral understandings of the parties or terms and conditions other than as are stated herein. SUBRECIPIENT acknowledges that it has read and agrees to all terms and conditions included in this contract.

AMENDMENTS

37. This Agreement may be modified or revised at any time by the parties as long as the amendment is made in writing and signed by both parties.

NOTICES

37. All notices, reports and correspondence between the parties hereto respecting this Agreement shall be in writing and deposited in the United States Mail, postage prepaid, addressed as follows:

YEAR ONE AGREEMENT BETWEEN RANCHO SANTIAGO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT AND

REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, IRVINE

Early Head Start (Grant No.09SA9091/01)

This Agreement is entered into on the first day of December, 2009 between Rancho Santiago Community College District (hereinafter "RSCCD") and REGENTS OF UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, IRVINE, on behalf of HELP ME GROW OC (hereinafter "SUBRECIPIENT").

WHEREAS, RSCCD has received the first year of funding of a grant entitled Early Head Start ARRA Expansion (Grant No. 09SA9091/01; CFDA No. 93.709), from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Administration for Children and Families (ACF), for the purpose of providing services to children and their families, and

WHEREAS, SUBRECIPIENT has agreed to participate in the purpose of this grant, and

WHEREAS, RSCCD has the right to enter into agreements with outside entities for various services with the approval of the Board of Trustees;

NOW, THEREFORE the DISTRICT and SUBRECIPIENT do covenant and agree as follows:

TERM

1. The effective term of this Agreement shall be from the period beginning December 1, 2009_and ending September 30, 2010 in the amount of \$18,367 (\$11,617 for Start-Up Budget and \$6,750 Operating Budget for first year) and subject to the provisions of this Agreement

PURPOSE

2. The purpose of the program funded by this Agreement is to support Early Head Start services and is designed to improve the quality and long-term effectiveness of children and families by developing comprehensive services to the whole family which will lead to self sufficiency. SUBRECIPIENT shall ensure that the program funded hereby shall comply with this purpose.

COMPLIANCE WITH LAW

- 3. In its performance under this Agreement, SUBRECIPIENT shall fully comply with the requirements of the following, whether or not otherwise referred to in this Agreement:
 - a. The Act and all applicable federal statutes, regulations, policies, procedures and directives, including but not limited to 45 CFR 74; 45 CFR 1301-1310; OMB Circular A-110 Uniform

Administrative Requirements for Awards and Sub-Awards With Institutions of Higher Education, Hospitals, and Other Non-Profit Organizations; OMB Circular A-21 Cost Principles for Educational Institutions; and OMB Circular A-133 Appendix B Audits of States, Local Governments and Non-Profit Organizations, Compliance Supplement;

- b. All applicable standards and orders and requirements issued under Section 306 of the Clean Air Act, Section 508 of the Clean Water Act and Environmental Protection Agency regulations in contracts in excess of \$100,000;
- c. All applicable State statutes, regulations, policies, procedures and directives;
- d. All applicable local ordinances and requirements, including use permits and licensing;
- e. Court orders applicable to its operation; and
- f. The terms and conditions of this Agreement.

If any of the foregoing is enacted, amended, or revised, SUBRECIPIENT will comply with such or will notify RSCCD after enactment or modification that it cannot so comply. RSCCD may thereupon terminate this Agreement, if necessary.

STATEMENT OF WORK

4. This Agreement is based on the Application for Federal Assistance included with the Year One Agreement. SUBRECIPIENT agrees to comply with all provisions, to perform all work, and to provide all services set forth in this Agreement and the aforementioned Application for Federal Assistance in a professional, timely and diligent manner (see Exhibit C). The parties hereto agree that concerning matters not specifically contained within the body of this Agreement, the Application for Federal assistance will be controlling.

MODIFICATION OF PROGRAM COMPONENTS AND SERVICE LEVELS

5. The parties hereto agree that those program components and service levels detailed in the aforementioned Application for Federal Assistance may be modified so long as the total payments under this Agreement are not increased and the project scope, objectives, and key personnel (in accordance with 45 CFR 74.25 (c)(2)) are not altered. However, any such modification shall not be made without the prior written notification of RSCCD. Any requests for changes in scope, objectives or key personnel require written approval and should be coordinated through RSCCD for submission to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF.

PLANS AND PROCEDURES

6. SUBRECIPIENT shall monitor its program for compliance with the provisions of this Agreement and all applicable laws, regulations and its institutional policies and procedures.

REPORTS

7. SUBRECIPIENT shall submit such reports, data and information at such times as RSCCD may require, and in the form RSCCD may require, regarding the performance of SUBRECIPIENT'S services, or SUBRECIPIENT'S activities, costs or other data.

NO SUPPLANTATION

8. Funds provided under this Agreement shall be used only for activities that are in addition to those that would otherwise be available in the absence of such funds. SUBRECIPIENT shall not render the same services under this Agreement to any participant whose cost of services is otherwise paid for by any other person or entity.

INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

9. SUBRECIPIENT agrees that the service provided hereunder are rendered in its capacity as an independent contractor and that it is not in any way an agent of RSCCD, nor shall its employees be entitled to any personnel benefits of RSCCD whatsoever.

SUBCONTRACT ASSIGNMENT

10. None of the duties of, or work to be performed by, SUBRECIPIENT under this Agreement shall be sub-contracted or assigned to any agency, consultant, or person without the prior written consent of RSCCD. No subcontract or assignment shall terminate or alter the legal obligation of SUBRECIPIENT pursuant to this Agreement. SUBRECIPIENT shall insure that all subcontracts for services and contracted staff are procured in a manner consistent with Federal and local SUBRECIPIENT guidelines. SUBRECIPIENT shall itemize all sub-contractor and contracted staff costs in the budget so it is clear how the funds will be allocated and spent by each SUBRECIPIENT. By entering into this Agreement SUBRECIPIENT agrees that it is the direct provider of intended services. Upon request, SUBRECIPIENT shall submit to RSCCD copies of all sub-contracts for services and contracted staff, and other agreements, as well as documentation indicating the approving authority's approval, that relate to this Agreement.

BUDGET SCHEDULE

11. SUBRECIPIENT agrees that the expenditures of any and all funds under this Agreement will be in accordance with the approved budget, a copy of which is attached as **Exhibit B**, and which by this reference is incorporated herein and made a part hereof as if fully set forth.

MODIFICATION OF BUDGET SCHEDULE

12. SUBRECIPIENT shall have the authority to transfer allocated program funds from one category of the overall program budget to any other category of the overall program budget, as long as the amount of the total grant is not increased and the scope of the program is not altered. Where the scope of the program is altered and results in the need for a change in the budget, written approval is required and should be coordinated through RSCCD for submission to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF.

TIME EXTENSIONS

13. RSCCD will not be requesting a time extension for Year One activities from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF. As a result, SUBRECIPIENT will not be granted an extension. Therefore, SUBRECIPIENT must spend all of the funds allocated through this agreement within the timeframe of the agreement. Under this agreement, SUBRECIPIENT will only be reimbursed for expenses that are incurred prior to October 1, 2010.

SUBMISSION OF INVOICES

- 14. Upon the effective date of this Agreement, RSCCD shall make payments to SUBRECIPIENT in accordance with the following payment schedule:
 - a. <u>Payments</u>. Beginning upon execution of this agreement, no more often than once a month and no less than once per quarter, upon receipt and approval by RSCCD of SUBRECIPIENT'S invoice, RSCCD shall make reimbursement payments as long as the total payments under this Agreement do not exceed \$XXX. Invoices should show itemized expenditures in accordance with the invoice template provided with the Year One Agreement, see Exhibit D.

- b. <u>Progress Reports</u>. Failure to submit timely Progress Reports will result in delays of payment to SUBRECIPIENT. Progress Reports are due to the Project Director by the following dates:
 - i. First semi-annual report March 1, 2010
 - ii. Second semi-annual report July 1, 2010
 - iii. Final Program Report October 10, 2010
 - iv. Other reports as required upon request
- c. <u>Invoices</u>. One original signed invoice (separate for Start-Up and Operating budgets) should be sent to the Project Director, as follows:

FISCAL ACCOUNTABILITY

- 15. a. <u>Financial Management System</u>. SUBRECIPIENT shall establish and maintain a sound financial management system, based upon generally accepted accounting principles. SUBRECIPIENT'S system shall provide fiscal control and accounting procedures that will include the following:
 - 1. Information pertaining to this Agreement and contract awards, obligations, unobligated balances, assets, expenditures, and income;
 - 2. Effective internal controls to safeguard assets and assure their proper use;
 - 3. Source documentation to support accounting records; and
 - 4. Proper charging of costs and cost allocation.
 - b. SUBRECIPIENT'S Records. SUBRECIPIENT'S records shall be sufficient to:
 - 1. Permit preparation of required reports;
 - 2. Permit the tracing of funds to a level of expenditure adequate to establish that funds have not been used in violation of the applicable restrictions on the use of such funds; and
 - 3. Permit the tracing of program income, or profits earned, and any costs incurred that are otherwise allowable except for funding limitations.
 - c. Costs Charged. Costs shall be charged to this contract only in accordance with the following:
 - 1. Budget provided by Rebecca Hernandez, Director, HELP ME GROW. (Exhibit B)

PROGRAM INCOME

16. SUBRECIPIENT must comply with Exhibit F Use of Program Income for all program income generated.

ANNUAL AUDIT

17. SUBRECIPIENT shall arrange for an independent audit of their federal funds in accordance with OMB Circular A-133. This program should be listed in their Schedule of Federal Expenditures. SUBRECIPIENT shall submit a copy of each required audit report to RSCCD within thirty (30) days after the date received by the SUBRECIPIENT.

ACCESS AND RECORDS

- 18. a. Access. RSCCD, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF, and the United States Government and/or their representatives, shall have access, for purposes of monitoring auditing, and examining, to SUBRECIPIENT'S activities, books, documents and papers (including computer records) and to records of SUBRECIPIENT'S subcontractors, consultants, contracted employees, bookkeepers, accountants, employees and participants related to this Agreement. Such agencies or representatives shall have the right to make excerpts, transcripts and photocopies of such records and to schedule on-site monitoring at their discretion. Monitoring activities also may include, but are not limited to, questioning employees and participants and entering any premises or onto any site in which any of the services or activities funded hereunder are conducted or in which any of the records of SUBRECIPIENT are kept. In the event SUBRECIPIENT does not make the above-referenced documents available within the County of Orange, California, SUBRECIPIENT agrees to pay all necessary and reasonable expenses incurred by RSCCD in conducting any audit at the location where said records and books of account are maintained.
 - b. Records Retention. All accounting records and evidence pertaining to all costs of SUBRECIPIENT and all documents related to this Agreement shall be kept available at SUBRECIPIENT'S office or place of business for the duration of this Agreement and thereafter for three (3) years after completion of an audit. Records that relate to 1) complaints, claims, administrative proceedings or litigation arising out of the performance of this Agreement, or 2) costs and expenses of this Agreement to which RSCCD or any other government agency takes exception, shall be retained beyond the three (3) year period until final resolution or disposition of such appeals, litigation, claims, or exceptions.

FRAUD

19. SUBRECIPIENT shall immediately report all suspected or known instances and facts concerning possible fraud, abuse or criminal activity under this Agreement, in accordance with the applicable federal laws and regulations.

NONDISCRIMINATION AND COMPLIANCE PROVISIONS

- 20. As a condition of this award of financial assistance under the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF to SUBRECIPIENT from RSCCD, SUBRECIPIENT assures, with respect to operation of all programs or activities funded with funds provided pursuant to the Act, and all agreements to carry out such programs or activities, that it will comply fully with the nondiscrimination and equal opportunity provisions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended; section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended; the Age Discrimination Act of 1975, as amended; and with all applicable requirements imposed by or pursuant to regulations implementing those laws, including, but not limited to, 45 CFR 84, 85, 86, 90, 91 et seq. The United States, the State of California and RSCCD have the right to seek judicial enforcement of this assurance.
 - a. During the performance of this Agreement, SUBRECIPIENT and its subcontractors will not deny the Agreement's benefits to any person on the basis of race, ancestry, national origin, religion, color, ethnic group identification, sex, age, physical or mental disability (including HIV and AIDS), medical condition (cancer), marital status, nor will they unlawfully discriminate, harass or allow harassment against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, ancestry, religion, color, ethnic group identification, national origin, ancestry, mental or physical disability (including HIV and AIDS), medical condition (cancer), marital

status, age (over 40), sex, denial of family care leave, or political affiliation or belief. SUBRECIPIENT will insure that the evaluation and treatment of employees and applicants for employment are free from such discrimination and harassment.

b. SUBRECIPIENT will include the non-discrimination and compliance provisions of this Section

of the Agreement in all subcontracts to perform work under this Agreement.

c. SUBRECIPIENT will give written notice of its obligations under this Section of the Agreement to labor organizations with which SUBRECIPIENT has a collective bargaining or other agreement.

CONFIDENTIALITY

21. Without prejudice to any other section of this Agreement, SUBRECIPIENT shall, where applicable, maintain the confidential nature of information provided to it concerning participants in accordance with the requirements of federal and state laws. However, SUBRECIPIENT shall submit to RSCCD, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF, and/or the United States Government or their representatives, all records requested for administrative purposes, examinations, monitoring and verification of reports submitted by including audit, SUBRECIPIENT, costs incurred and services rendered hereunder.

PROPERTY

22. a. Definitions

1. "Real Property" is land, including land improvements, structures, and appurtenances thereto,

excluding movable machinery and equipment.

2. "Equipment": For purchase on or after July 1, 1993, "equipment" is tangible nonexpendable personal property having a useful life of more than one year and an acquisition cost of \$5,000 or more per unit. Equipment is NOT considered an allowable cost without prior written approval of the Grants Officer.

b. Property Management. SUBRECIPIENT shall budget, manage and maintain an inventory of property in accordance with the standards established by the U.S. Government. SUBRECIPIENT shall retain records pertaining to all equipment or property described above, and to costs incurred with respect thereto, for a period of three (3) years after final disposition of such property. SUBRECIPIENT shall immediately return all equipment, finished or unfinished documents, photographs, data, studies and reports or unused supplies prepared or purchased by SUBRECIPIENT under this Agreement to RSCCD or its representatives, or dispose of them in accordance with directions from RSCCD.

INDEMNIFICATION

23. All parties to this Agreement shall agree to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the other party, it's officers, agents, employees, and volunteers, from and against all loss, cost, and expense arising out of any liability or claim of liability, sustained or claimed to have been sustained, arising out of the activities, or the performance or nonperformance of obligations under this Agreement, of the indemnifying party, or those of any of its officers, agents, employees, or volunteers. provisions of this Article do not apply to any damage or losses caused solely by the negligence or intentional acts of the non-indemnifying party of any of its agents or employees.

INSURANCE

24. SUBRECIPIENT shall secure and maintain comprehensive general liability insurance covering personal injury, property damage, and general liability claims in the amount of at least one million

dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and three million dollars (\$3,000,000) in the aggregate with coverage for incidental contracts. A certificate of insurance must be provided that includes a thirty (30) day notice of cancellation, modification, or reduction in said insurance. SUBRECIPIENT shall deliver certificate(s) of insurance under SUBRECIPIENT'S comprehensive general liability insurance policy on or before the date of execution of this agreement. Upon request, RSCCD shall be provided a copy of said policy.

SUBRECIPIENT shall provide workers' compensation coverage for each of its employees.

PATENT/COPYRIGHT MATERIALS/PROPRIETARY INFORMATION

25. SUBRECIPIENT agrees to grant RSCCD, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF, and/or the United States Government a royalty-free, nonexclusive and irrevocable license to publish, copy, translate or use, now and hereafter, all materials, data, films, tapes, etc., developed under this Agreement. RSCCD, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF, and/or the United States Government reserve the right to authorize others to use or reproduce such materials. Further, these parties shall have access to any report, preliminary findings or data assembled by SUBRECIPIENT under this Agreement and in accordance with 45 CFR 74.36, any publication filed by a grantee for an invention made under a grant must include the following statement in the first paragraph: "The invention described in this application was made under a grant from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF."

STANDARDS OF CONDUCT

- 26. a. General Assurance. In accordance with 45 CFR 74.42 every reasonable course of action will be taken by SUBRECIPIENT in order to maintain the integrity of this expenditure of public funds and to avoid favoritism and questionable or improper conduct. This Agreement will be administered in an impartial manner, free from efforts to gain personal financial or political gain. SUBRECIPIENT, its officers and employees, in administering this Agreement, will avoid situations that give rise to a suggestion that any decision was influenced by prejudice, bias, special interest or desire for personal gain.
 - b. <u>Conducting Business Involving Relatives</u>. No relative by blood, adoption or marriage of any executive or employee of SUBRECIPIENT will receive favorable treatment when considered for enrollment in programs provided by, or employment with, SUBRECIPIENT.
 - c. <u>Conducting Business Involving Close Personal Friends and Associates</u>. Executives of SUBRECIPIENT will be particularly aware of the varying degrees of influence that can be exerted by personal friends and associates and, in administering this Agreement, will exercise due diligence to avoid situations which give rise to an assertion that favorable treatment is being granted to friends and associates. When it is in the public interest for SUBRECIPIENT to conduct business with a friend or associate of an executive or employee of SUBRECIPIENT, or an elected official in the area, a permanent record of the transaction will be retained.
 - d. Avoidance of Economic Interest. No executive or employee of SUBRECIPIENT, elected official in the area, will solicit or accept money or any other consideration from a third person, for the performance of an act reimbursed in whole or part by SUBRECIPIENT or RSCCD. Supplies, materials, equipment or services purchased with Agreement funds will be used solely for purposes allowed under this Agreement.

DRUG FREE WORKPLACE

27. SUBRECIPIENT shall abide by the Government-wide Requirements for a Drug Free Workplace in accordance with 45 CFR 82.205. By signing and submitting the subcontract agreement the SUBRECIPIENT certifies that it will comply with these requirements.

ENVIRONMENTAL TOBACCO SMOKE

28. Public Law 103227, Part C Environmental Tobacco Smoke, also known as the Pro Children Act of 1994, requires that smoking not be permitted in any portion of any indoor routinely owned or leased or contracted for by an entity and used routinely or regularly for provision of health, day care, education, or library services to children under the age of 18, if the services are funded by Federal programs either directly or through State or local governments, by Federal grant, contract, loan, or loan guarantee. The law does not apply to children's services provided in private residences, facilities funded solely by Medicare or Medicaid funds, and portions of facilities used for inpatient drug or alcohol treatment. Failure to comply with the provisions of the law may result in the imposition of a civil monetary penalty of up to \$1,000 per day and/or the imposition of an administrative compliance order on the responsible entity. By signing and submitting the subcontract agreement the SUBRECIPIENT certifies that it will comply with the requirements of the Act.

DEBARMENT AND SUSPENSION

29. SUBRECIPIENT certifies that it is not debarred or suspended or otherwise excluded from or ineligible for participation in Federal programs in accordance with 45 CFR Part 74.13.

TRAFFICKING VICTIMS PROTECTION ACT

30. AS required under Section 106 (g) of the TVPA as amended in 22 U.S.C. 7104(g) RSCCD retains the right to terminate this sub-agreement, without penalty, if the SUBRECIPIENT, or any of its subcontractors (i) engages in severe forms of trafficking in persons or has procured a commercial sex act during the period of time that the grant, or sub-agreement is in effect, or (ii) uses forced labor in the performance of this sub-agreement.

LITERATURE AND PUBLIC ANNOUNCEMENTS

31. As required under Section 508 of Public Law 103-333, the following conditions are applicable to the SUBRECIPIENT: "When issuing statements, press releases, requests for proposals, bid solicitations and other documents describing projects or programs funded in whole or in part with Federal money, all grantees receiving Federal funds, including but not limited to States and local governments and recipients of Federal research grants shall clearly state 1) the percentage of the total costs of the program or project which will be financed with Federal money, 2) the dollar amount of Federal funds for the program or project, and 3) the percentage and dollar amount of total costs of program or project that will be refinanced by non-governmental sources."

LOBBYING

- 32. As required by Section 1352, Title 31, of the U.S. Code, and implemented at 45 CFR Part 93, SUBRECIPIENT certifies that:
 - a. No Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid, by or on behalf of the undersigned, to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with the making of any Federal grant, the entering into of

- any cooperative agreement, and the extension, continuation, renewal, amendment, or modification of any Federal grant or cooperative agreement;
- b. If any funds other than Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with this Federal grant or cooperative agreement, the undersigned shall complete and submit Standard Form-LLL, "Disclosure Form to Report Lobbying," in accordance with its instructions.

BREACH - SANCTIONS

33. If, through any cause, SUBRECIPIENT violates any of the terms and conditions of this Agreement, or any prior Agreements whereby grant funds were received by SUBRECIPIENT, or if SUBRECIPIENT reports inaccurately, or if any audit report makes disallowances, SUBRECIPIENT shall promptly remedy its acts or omissions and/or repay RSCCD all amounts due RSCCD as a result thereof. For any such failures or violations RSCCD shall also have the right, at its sole discretion, to: 1) immediately discontinue program support until such time as SUBRECIPIENT fulfills its obligations or remedies all violations of this Agreement or prior Agreements; and/or 2) collect outstanding amounts, as determined by RSCCD to be due RSCCD from SUBRECIPIENT, by offsetting or debiting from current claims or invoices, if after thirty (30) days written notice SUBRECIPIENT has failed to repay same or a repayment schedule has not been made; and/or 3) terminate this Agreement in accordance with Section 34 herein.

DISPUTES

34. In the event of a dispute between the parties, the aggrieved party shall notify the other party and provide a detailed description of the alleged problem. The parties agree to use reasonable efforts to resolve such dispute by good faith negotiations and mutual agreement. In the event such informal resolution is not successful within a reasonable period of time, the parties hereby agree that such dispute will be resolved in the manner specified below.

Any dispute concerning any question arising under this Agreement, except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, shall be decided by RSCCD or the U.S. .Department of Health and Human Services ACF. In such a case, the decision shall be reduced to writing and a copy thereof shall be mailed or otherwise furnished to SUBRECIPIENT. The decision shall be final and conclusive unless within thirty (30) calendar days from the mailing or delivery of such copy, RSCCD receives from SUBRECIPIENT a written request to appeal said decision. Pending final decision of the appeal, SUBRECIPIENT shall act in accordance with the written decision of RSCCD or the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF, whichever is the final arbiter of the dispute.

The handling of non-criminal complaints, including discrimination complaints, and complaints and reports of criminal fraud, waste and abuse shall be as prescribed by RSCCD, and/or the State of California, and/or the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF, whichever is applicable, in accordance with applicable provisions of the Code of Federal Regulations.

TERMINATION

35. Either party may terminate this Agreement, with or without cause upon thirty (30) days written notice served upon the other party. Notice shall be deemed served on the date of mailing. Upon

termination, or notice thereof, the parties agree to cooperate with one another in the orderly transfer of service responsibilities, active case records, and pertinent documents.

The obligations of RSCCD under this Agreement are contingent upon the availability of Federal and/or State funds, as applicable, for the reimbursement of SUBRECIPIENT'S expenditures, and inclusion of sufficient funds for the services hereunder in the budget approved by the RSCCD Board of Trustees each fiscal year this Agreement remains in effect or operation. In the event that such funding is terminated or reduced, RSCCD shall provide SUBRECIPIENT with written notification of such determination. SUBRECIPIENT shall immediately comply with RSCCD'S decision.

TOTAL AGREEMENT

36. This Agreement, together with the attachments hereto, expresses the total understanding of the parties. There are no oral understandings of the parties or terms and conditions other than as are stated herein. SUBRECIPIENT acknowledges that it has read and agrees to all terms and conditions included in this contract.

AMENDMENTS

37. This Agreement may be modified or revised at any time by the parties as long as the amendment is made in writing and signed by both parties.

NOTICES

37. All notices, reports and correspondence between the parties hereto respecting this Agreement shall be in writing and deposited in the United States Mail, postage prepaid, addressed as follows:

YEAR ONE AGREEMENT BETWEEN RANCHO SANTIAGO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT AND

MOMS Orange County

Early Head Start (Grant No. 09SA9091/01)

This Agreement is entered into on the first day of December 2009 between Rancho Santiago Community College District (hereinafter "RSCCD") and MOMS Orange County (hereinafter "SUBRECIPIENT").

WHEREAS, RSCCD has received the first year of funding of a grant entitled Early Head Start ARRA Expansion (Grant No. 09SA9091/01; CFDA No. 93.709), from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Administration for Children and Families (ACF), for the purpose of providing services to children and their families, and

WHEREAS, SUBRECIPIENT has agreed to participate in the purpose of this grant, and

WHEREAS, RSCCD has the right to enter into agreements with outside entities for various services with the approval of the Board of Trustees;

NOW, THEREFORE the DISTRICT and SUBRECIPIENT do covenant and agree as follows:

TERM

1. The effective term of this Agreement shall be from the period beginning December 1, 2009 and ending September 30, 2010 in the amount of \$95,616 ((\$8,182 for Start-Up Budget and \$87,434 Operating Budget for first year) and subject to the provisions of this Agreement

PURPOSE

2. The purpose of the program funded by this Agreement is to support Early Head Start services and is designed to improve the quality and long-term effectiveness of children and families by developing comprehensive services to the whole family which will lead to self sufficiency. SUBRECIPIENT shall ensure that the program funded hereby shall comply with this purpose.

COMPLIANCE WITH LAW

- 3. In its performance under this Agreement, SUBRECIPIENT shall fully comply with the requirements of the following, whether or not otherwise referred to in this Agreement:
 - a. The Act and all applicable federal statutes, regulations, policies, procedures and directives, including but not limited to 45 CFR 74; 45 CFR 1301-1310; OMB Circular A-110 Uniform Administrative Requirements for Awards and Sub-Awards With Institutions of Higher Education, Hospitals, and Other Non-Profit Organizations; OMB Circular A-21 Cost

Principles for Educational Institutions; and OMB Circular A-133 Appendix B Audits of States, Local Governments and Non-Profit Organizations, Compliance Supplement;

- b. All applicable standards and orders and requirements issued under Section 306 of the Clean Air Act, Section 508 of the Clean Water Act and Environmental Protection Agency regulations in contracts in excess of \$100,000;
- c. All applicable State statutes, regulations, policies, procedures and directives;
- d. All applicable local ordinances and requirements, including use permits and licensing;
- e. Court orders applicable to its operation; and
- f. The terms and conditions of this Agreement.

If any of the foregoing is enacted, amended, or revised, SUBRECIPIENT will comply with such or will notify RSCCD after enactment or modification that it cannot so comply. RSCCD may thereupon terminate this Agreement, if necessary.

STATEMENT OF WORK

4. This Agreement is based on the Application for Federal Assistance included with the Year One Agreement. SUBRECIPIENT agrees to comply with all provisions, to perform all work, and to provide all services set forth in this Agreement and the aforementioned Application for Federal Assistance in a professional, timely and diligent manner (see Exhibit C). The parties hereto agree that concerning matters not specifically contained within the body of this Agreement, the Application for Federal assistance will be controlling.

MODIFICATION OF PROGRAM COMPONENTS AND SERVICE LEVELS

5. The parties hereto agree that those program components and service levels detailed in the aforementioned Application for Federal Assistance may be modified so long as the total payments under this Agreement are not increased and the project scope, objectives, and key personnel (in accordance with 45 CFR 74.25 (c)(2)) are not altered. However, any such modification shall not be made without the prior written notification of RSCCD. Any requests for changes in scope, objectives or key personnel require written approval and should be coordinated through RSCCD for submission to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF.

PLANS AND PROCEDURES

6. SUBRECIPIENT shall monitor its program for compliance with the provisions of this Agreement and all applicable laws, regulations and its institutional policies and procedures.

REPORTS

7. SUBRECIPIENT shall submit such reports, data and information at such times as RSCCD may require, and in the form RSCCD may require, regarding the performance of SUBRECIPIENT'S services, or SUBRECIPIENT'S activities, costs or other data.

NO SUPPLANTATION

8. Funds provided under this Agreement shall be used only for activities that are in addition to those that would otherwise be available in the absence of such funds. SUBRECIPIENT shall not render the same services under this Agreement to any participant whose cost of services is otherwise paid for by any other person or entity.

INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

9. SUBRECIPIENT agrees that the service provided hereunder are rendered in its capacity as an independent contractor and that it is not in any way an agent of RSCCD, nor shall its employees be entitled to any personnel benefits of RSCCD whatsoever.

SUBCONTRACT ASSIGNMENT

10. None of the duties of, or work to be performed by, SUBRECIPIENT under this Agreement shall be sub-contracted or assigned to any agency, consultant, or person without the prior written consent of RSCCD. No subcontract or assignment shall terminate or alter the legal obligation of SUBRECIPIENT pursuant to this Agreement. SUBRECIPIENT shall insure that all subcontracts for services and contracted staff are procured in a manner consistent with Federal and local SUBRECIPIENT guidelines. SUBRECIPIENT shall itemize all sub-contractor and contracted staff costs in the budget so it is clear how the funds will be allocated and spent by each SUBRECIPIENT. By entering into this Agreement SUBRECIPIENT agrees that it is the direct provider of intended services. Upon request, SUBRECIPIENT shall submit to RSCCD copies of all sub-contracts for services and contracted staff, and other agreements, as well as documentation indicating the approving authority's approval, that relate to this Agreement.

BUDGET SCHEDULE

11. SUBRECIPIENT agrees that the expenditures of any and all funds under this Agreement will be in accordance with the approved budget, a copy of which is attached as **Exhibit B**, and which by this reference is incorporated herein and made a part hereof as if fully set forth.

MODIFICATION OF BUDGET SCHEDULE

12. SUBRECIPIENT shall have the authority to transfer allocated program funds from one category of the overall program budget to any other category of the overall program budget, as long as the amount of the total grant is not increased and the scope of the program is not altered. Where the scope of the program is altered and results in the need for a change in the budget, written approval is required and should be coordinated through RSCCD for submission to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Service ACF.

TIME EXTENSIONS

13. RSCCD will not be requesting a time extension for Year One activities from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF. As a result, SUBRECIPIENT will not be granted an extension. Therefore, SUBRECIPIENT must spend all of the funds allocated through this agreement within the timeframe of the agreement. Under this agreement, SUBRECIPIENT will only be reimbursed for expenses that are incurred prior to October 1, 2010.

SUBMISSION OF INVOICES

14. Upon the effective date of this Agreement, RSCCD shall make payments to SUBRECIPIENT in accordance with the following payment schedule:

a. Payments. Beginning upon execution of this agreement, no more often than once a month and no less than once per quarter, upon receipt and approval by RSCCD of SUBRECIPIENT'S invoice, RSCCD shall make reimbursement payments as long as the total payments under this Agreement do not exceed \$95,616 Invoices should show itemized expenditures in accordance with the invoice template provided with the Year One Agreement, see Exhibit D.

- b. <u>Progress Reports</u>. Failure to submit timely Progress Reports will result in delays of payment to SUBRECIPIENT. Progress Reports are due to the Project Director by the following dates:
 - i. First semi-annual report March 1, 2010
 - ii. Second semi-annual report July 1, 2010
 - iii. Final Program Report October 10, 2010
 - iv. Other reports as required upon request
- c. <u>Invoices</u>. One original signed invoice (separate for Start-Up and Operating budgets) should be sent to the Project Director, as follows:

FISCAL ACCOUNTABILITY

- 15. a. <u>Financial Management System</u>. SUBRECIPIENT shall establish and maintain a sound financial management system, based upon generally accepted accounting principles. SUBRECIPIENT'S system shall provide fiscal control and accounting procedures that will include the following:
 - 1. Information pertaining to this Agreement and contract awards, obligations, unobligated balances, assets, expenditures, and income;
 - 2. Effective internal controls to safeguard assets and assure their proper use;
 - 3. Source documentation to support accounting records; and
 - 4. Proper charging of costs and cost allocation.
 - b. SUBRECIPIENT'S Records. SUBRECIPIENT'S records shall be sufficient to:
 - 1. Permit preparation of required reports;
 - 2. Permit the tracing of funds to a level of expenditure adequate to establish that funds have not been used in violation of the applicable restrictions on the use of such funds; and
 - 3. Permit the tracing of program income, or profits earned, and any costs incurred that are otherwise allowable except for funding limitations.
 - c. Costs Charged. Costs shall be charged to this contract only in accordance with the following:
 - 1. Budget provided by Pam Pimentel, Director, MOMS Orange County. (Exhibit B

PROGRAM INCOME

16. SUBRECIPIENT must comply with Exhibit F, Use of Program Income for all program income generated.

ANNUAL AUDIT

17. SUBRECIPIENT shall arrange for an independent audit of their federal funds in accordance with OMB Circular A-133. This program should be listed in their Schedule of Federal Expenditures. SUBRECIPIENT shall submit a copy of each required audit report to RSCCD within thirty (30) days after the date received by the SUBRECIPIENT.

ACCESS AND RECORDS

- 18. a. Access. RSCCD, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF, and the United States Government and/or their representatives, shall have access, for purposes of monitoring auditing, and examining, to SUBRECIPIENT'S activities, books, documents and papers (including computer records) and to records of SUBRECIPIENT'S subcontractors, consultants, contracted employees, bookkeepers, accountants, employees and participants related to this Agreement. Such agencies or representatives shall have the right to make excerpts, transcripts and photocopies of such records and to schedule on-site monitoring at their discretion. Monitoring activities also may include, but are not limited to, questioning employees and participants and entering any premises or onto any site in which any of the services or activities funded hereunder are conducted or in which any of the records of SUBRECIPIENT are kept. In the event SUBRECIPIENT does not make the above-referenced documents available within the County of Orange, California, SUBRECIPIENT agrees to pay all necessary and reasonable expenses incurred by RSCCD in conducting any audit at the location where said records and books of account are maintained.
 - b. Records Retention. All accounting records and evidence pertaining to all costs of SUBRECIPIENT and all documents related to this Agreement shall be kept available at SUBRECIPIENT'S office or place of business for the duration of this Agreement and thereafter for three (3) years after completion of an audit. Records that relate to 1) complaints, claims, administrative proceedings or litigation arising out of the performance of this Agreement, or 2) costs and expenses of this Agreement to which RSCCD or any other government agency takes exception, shall be retained beyond the three (3) year period until final resolution or disposition of such appeals, litigation, claims, or exceptions.

FRAUD

19. SUBRECIPIENT shall immediately report all suspected or known instances and facts concerning possible fraud, abuse or criminal activity under this Agreement, in accordance with the applicable federal laws and regulations.

NONDISCRIMINATION AND COMPLIANCE PROVISIONS

- 20. As a condition of this award of financial assistance under the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF to SUBRECIPIENT from RSCCD, SUBRECIPIENT assures, with respect to operation of all programs or activities funded with funds provided pursuant to the Act, and all agreements to carry out such programs or activities, that it will comply fully with the nondiscrimination and equal opportunity provisions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended; section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended; the Age Discrimination Act of 1975, as amended; and with all applicable requirements imposed by or pursuant to regulations implementing those laws, including, but not limited to, 45 CFR 84, 85, 86, 90, 91 et seq. The United States, the State of California and RSCCD have the right to seek judicial enforcement of this assurance.
 - a. During the performance of this Agreement, SUBRECIPIENT and its subcontractors will not deny the Agreement's benefits to any person on the basis of race, ancestry, national origin, religion, color, ethnic group identification, sex, age, physical or mental disability (including HIV and AIDS), medical condition (cancer), marital status, nor will they unlawfully discriminate, harass or allow harassment against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, ancestry, religion, color, ethnic group identification, national origin, ancestry, mental or physical disability (including HIV and AIDS), medical condition (cancer), marital

status, age (over 40), sex, denial of family care leave, or political affiliation or belief. SUBRECIPIENT will insure that the evaluation and treatment of employees and applicants for employment are free from such discrimination and harassment.

b. SUBRECIPIENT will include the non-discrimination and compliance provisions of this Section

of the Agreement in all subcontracts to perform work under this Agreement.

c. SUBRECIPIENT will give written notice of its obligations under this Section of the Agreement to labor organizations with which SUBRECIPIENT has a collective bargaining or other agreement.

CONFIDENTIALITY

21. Without prejudice to any other section of this Agreement, SUBRECIPIENT shall, where applicable, maintain the confidential nature of information provided to it concerning participants in accordance with the requirements of federal and state laws. However, SUBRECIPIENT shall submit to RSCCD, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ACF, and/or the United States Government or their representatives, all records requested for administrative purposes, including audit, examinations, monitoring and verification of reports submitted by SUBRECIPIENT, costs incurred and services rendered hereunder.

PROPERTY

22. a. Definitions

1. "Real Property" is land, including land improvements, structures, and appurtenances thereto,

excluding movable machinery and equipment.

2. "Equipment": For purchase on or after July 1, 1993, "equipment" is tangible nonexpendable personal property having a useful life of more than one year and an acquisition cost of \$5,000 or more per unit. Equipment is NOT considered an allowable cost without prior written approval of the Grants Officer.

b. Property Management. SUBRECIPIENT shall budget, manage and maintain an inventory of property in accordance with the standards established by the U.S. Government. SUBRECIPIENT shall retain records pertaining to all equipment or property described above, and to costs incurred with respect thereto, for a period of three (3) years after final disposition of such property. SUBRECIPIENT shall immediately return all equipment, finished or unfinished documents, photographs, data, studies and reports or unused supplies prepared or purchased by SUBRECIPIENT under this Agreement to RSCCD or its representatives, or dispose of them in accordance with directions from RSCCD.

INDEMNIFICATION

23. All parties to this Agreement shall agree to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the other party, it's officers, agents, employees, and volunteers, from and against all loss, cost, and expense arising out of any liability or claim of liability, sustained or claimed to have been sustained, arising out of the activities, or the performance or nonperformance of obligations under this Agreement, of the indemnifying party, or those of any of its officers, agents, employees, or volunteers. provisions of this Article do not apply to any damage or losses caused solely by the negligence or intentional acts of the non-indemnifying party of any of its agents or employees.

INSURANCE

24. SUBRECIPIENT shall secure and maintain comprehensive general liability insurance covering personal injury, property damage, and general liability claims in the amount of at least one million

dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and three million dollars (\$3,000,000) in the aggregate with coverage for incidental contracts. A certificate of insurance must be provided that includes a thirty (30) day notice of cancellation, modification, or reduction in said insurance. SUBRECIPIENT shall deliver certificate(s) of insurance under SUBRECIPIENT'S comprehensive general liability insurance policy on or before the date of execution of this agreement. Upon request, RSCCD shall be provided a copy of said policy.

SUBRECIPIENT shall provide workers' compensation coverage for each of its employees.

PATENT/COPYRIGHT MATERIALS/PROPRIETARY INFORMATION

25. SUBRECIPIENT agrees to grant RSCCD, the US Department of Health and Human Services ACF, and/or the United States Government a royalty-free, nonexclusive and irrevocable license to publish, copy, translate or use, now and hereafter, all materials, data, films, tapes, etc., developed under this Agreement. RSCCD, the US Department of Health and Human Services ACF, and/or the United States Government reserve the right to authorize others to use or reproduce such materials. Further, these parties shall have access to any report, preliminary findings or data assembled by SUBRECIPIENT under this Agreement and in accordance with 45 CFR 74.36, any publication filed by a grantee for an invention made under a grant must include the following statement in the first paragraph: "The invention described in this application was made under a grant from the Department of Health and Human Services ACF."

STANDARDS OF CONDUCT

- 26. a. General Assurance. In accordance with 45 CFR 74.42 every reasonable course of action will be taken by SUBRECIPIENT in order to maintain the integrity of this expenditure of public funds and to avoid favoritism and questionable or improper conduct. This Agreement will be administered in an impartial manner, free from efforts to gain personal financial or political gain. SUBRECIPIENT, its officers and employees, in administering this Agreement, will avoid situations that give rise to a suggestion that any decision was influenced by prejudice, bias, special interest or desire for personal gain.
 - b. <u>Conducting Business Involving Relatives</u>. No relative by blood, adoption or marriage of any executive or employee of SUBRECIPIENT will receive favorable treatment when considered for enrollment in programs provided by, or employment with, SUBRECIPIENT.
 - c. Conducting Business Involving Close Personal Friends and Associates. Executives of SUBRECIPIENT will be particularly aware of the varying degrees of influence that can be exerted by personal friends and associates and, in administering this Agreement, will exercise due diligence to avoid situations which give rise to an assertion that favorable treatment is being granted to friends and associates. When it is in the public interest for SUBRECIPIENT to conduct business with a friend or associate of an executive or employee of SUBRECIPIENT, or an elected official in the area, a permanent record of the transaction will be retained.
 - d. Avoidance of Economic Interest. No executive or employee of SUBRECIPIENT, elected official in the area, will solicit or accept money or any other consideration from a third person, for the performance of an act reimbursed in whole or part by SUBRECIPIENT or RSCCD. Supplies, materials, equipment or services purchased with Agreement funds will be used solely for purposes allowed under this Agreement.

DRUG FREE WORKPLACE

27. SUBRECIPIENT shall abide by the Government-wide Requirements for a Drug Free Workplace in accordance with 45 CFR 82.205. By signing and submitting the subcontract agreement the SUBRECIPIENT certifies that it will comply with these requirements.

ENVIRONMENTAL TOBACCO SMOKE

28. Public Law 103227, Part C Environmental Tobacco Smoke, also known as the Pro Children Act of 1994, requires that smoking not be permitted in any portion of any indoor routinely owned or leased or contracted for by an entity and used routinely or regularly for provision of health, day care, education, or library services to children under the age of 18, if the services are funded by Federal programs either directly or through State or local governments, by Federal grant, contract, loan, or loan guarantee. The law does not apply to children's services provided in private residences, facilities funded solely by Medicare or Medicaid funds, and portions of facilities used for inpatient drug or alcohol treatment. Failure to comply with the provisions of the law may result in the imposition of a civil monetary penalty of up to \$1,000 per day and/or the imposition of an administrative compliance order on the responsible entity. By signing and submitting the subcontract agreement the SUBRECIPIENT certifies that it will comply with the requirements of the Act.

DEBARMENT AND SUSPENSION

29. SUBRECIPIENT certifies that it is not debarred or suspended or otherwise excluded from or ineligible for participation in Federal programs in accordance with 45 CFR Part 74.13.

TRAFFICKING VICTIMS PROTECTION ACT

30. AS required under Section 106 (g) of the TVPA as amended in 22 U.S.C. 7104(g) RSCCD retains the right to terminate this sub-agreement, without penalty, if the SUBRECIPIENT, or any of its subcontractors (i) engages in severe forms of trafficking in persons or has procured a commercial sex act during the period of time that the grant, or sub-agreement is in effect, or (ii) uses forced labor in the performance of this sub-agreement.

LITERATURE AND PUBLIC ANNOUNCEMENTS

31. As required under Section 508 of Public Law 103-333, the following conditions are applicable to the SUBRECIPIENT: "When issuing statements, press releases, requests for proposals, bid solicitations and other documents describing projects or programs funded in whole or in part with Federal money, all grantees receiving Federal funds, including but not limited to States and local governments and recipients of Federal research grants shall clearly state 1) the percentage of the total costs of the program or project which will be financed with Federal money, 2) the dollar amount of Federal funds for the program or project, and 3) the percentage and dollar amount of total costs of program or project that will be refinanced by non-governmental sources."

LOBBYING

- 32. As required by Section 1352, Title 31, of the U.S. Code, and implemented at 45 CFR Part 93, SUBRECIPIENT certifies that:
 - a. No Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid, by or on behalf of the undersigned, to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with the making of any Federal grant, the entering into of

any cooperative agreement, and the extension, continuation, renewal, amendment, or modification of any Federal grant or cooperative agreement;

b. If any funds other than Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with this Federal grant or cooperative agreement, the undersigned shall complete and submit Standard Form-LLL, "Disclosure Form to Report Lobbying," in accordance with its instructions.

BREACH - SANCTIONS

33. If, through any cause, SUBRECIPIENT violates any of the terms and conditions of this Agreement, or any prior Agreements whereby grant funds were received by SUBRECIPIENT, or if SUBRECIPIENT reports inaccurately, or if any audit report makes disallowances, SUBRECIPIENT shall promptly remedy its acts or omissions and/or repay RSCCD all amounts due RSCCD as a result thereof. For any such failures or violations RSCCD shall also have the right, at its sole discretion, to: 1) immediately discontinue program support until such time as SUBRECIPIENT fulfills its obligations or remedies all violations of this Agreement or prior Agreements; and/or 2) collect outstanding amounts, as determined by RSCCD to be due RSCCD from SUBRECIPIENT, by offsetting or debiting from current claims or invoices, if after thirty (30) days written notice SUBRECIPIENT has failed to repay same or a repayment schedule has not been made; and/or 3) terminate this Agreement in accordance with Section 34 herein.

DISPUTES

34. In the event of a dispute between the parties, the aggrieved party shall notify the other party and provide a detailed description of the alleged problem. The parties agree to use reasonable efforts to resolve such dispute by good faith negotiations and mutual agreement. In the event such informal resolution is not successful within a reasonable period of time, the parties hereby agree that such dispute will be resolved in the manner specified below.

Any dispute concerning any question arising under this Agreement, except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, shall be decided by RSCCD or the Department of Health and Human Services ACF. In such a case, the decision shall be reduced to writing and a copy thereof shall be mailed or otherwise furnished to SUBRECIPIENT. The decision shall be final and conclusive unless within thirty (30) calendar days from the mailing or delivery of such copy, RSCCD receives from SUBRECIPIENT a written request to appeal said decision. Pending final decision of the appeal, SUBRECIPIENT shall act in accordance with the written decision of RSCCD or the Department of Health and Human Services ACF, whichever is the final arbiter of the dispute.

The handling of non-criminal complaints, including discrimination complaints, and complaints and reports of criminal fraud, waste and abuse shall be as prescribed by RSCCD, and/or the State of California, and/or the US Department of Health and Human Services ACF, whichever is applicable, in accordance with applicable provisions of the Code of Federal Regulations.

TERMINATION

35. Either party may terminate this Agreement, with or without cause upon thirty (30) days written notice served upon the other party. Notice shall be deemed served on the date of mailing. Upon

termination, or notice thereof, the parties agree to cooperate with one another in the orderly transfer of service responsibilities, active case records, and pertinent documents.

The obligations of RSCCD under this Agreement are contingent upon the availability of Federal and/or State funds, as applicable, for the reimbursement of SUBRECIPIENT'S expenditures, and inclusion of sufficient funds for the services hereunder in the budget approved by the RSCCD Board of Trustees each fiscal year this Agreement remains in effect or operation. In the event that such funding is terminated or reduced, RSCCD shall provide SUBRECIPIENT with written notification of such determination. SUBRECIPIENT shall immediately comply with RSCCD'S decision.

TOTAL AGREEMENT

36. This Agreement, together with the attachments hereto, expresses the total understanding of the parties. There are no oral understandings of the parties or terms and conditions other than as are stated herein. SUBRECIPIENT acknowledges that it has read and agrees to all terms and conditions included in this contract.

AMENDMENTS

37. This Agreement may be modified or revised at any time by the parties as long as the amendment is made in writing and signed by both parties.

NOTICES

38. All notices, reports and correspondence between the parties hereto respecting this Agreement shall be in writing and deposited in the United States Mail, postage prepaid, addressed as follows:

- Increase student intersession parking from \$8 to \$10

ANALYSIS
