#### Report to POE Santa Ana College 8/25/21

Santa Ana College enrollment is beginning to show signs of recovery. When compared to last year at this time, Credit headcount is at 105%. Dual Enrollment headcount alone is at 146%. Course enrollments in Counseling, Fine and Performing Arts, Human Services and Technology and Kinesiology are either very near or above last year's numbers. Disciplines such as TV/Video, AUTO, Fashion, Welding, American Sign Language, Ethnic Studies, Intercollegiate Athletics, and the Medical Assistant program are showing strong growth.

In terms of schedule types, Online and Hybrid courses continue to see historic growth and strong fill rates. Remote Instruction is filling well and In-Person classes are filling more slowly.

While the overall FTES comparison between this year and last year at this time shows an 5% decline, when you factor in NCR, we are actually up by 4%. Provided that Santa Ana College public safety academies, advanced officer training, Lifeguard, and Wellness programs do well (which we fully expect that they will!), Santa Ana College should be able to meet or exceed its NCR/CR target for Fall 2021.

Of course, none of this could happen without a coordinated effort between Academic Affairs, Student Services, the Office of the President, and District Marketing. The outreach efforts and in-person services that SAC has provided along with a robust marketing campaign have come together in very meaningful ways. Events such as the Johnson Student Center, Resource Fair, Phone Campaign, and Open Section booths have helped direct students to the courses they need.
