1. Participatory Governance Items

There were no participatory governance items brought up for discussion.

2. Redistricting

Chancellor Rodríguez reported on the efforts relating to the redistricting of Trustee areas. Proposed areas developed by the consultant were sent to the Trustees on Thursday, May 3. At a Community Forum held on Sunday, May 6, feedback on the proposed areas was received and alternative plans from community members in attendance were discussed. A presentation of the process behind the development of the proposed areas and the areas proposed by the consultant will be made at the May 7 Board meeting. Alternative proposals suggested by the community will also be discussed. The presentation at the Board Meeting is a first read and no vote will be taken.

3. Review of Board Docket

The May 7, 2012 board docket was reviewed. Dr. Rodríguez stated that the public hearing for Items 1.9 and 1.10 will be pulled to allow time for advertisement of the hearing and will be placed on a future meeting agenda. It was reported that, in addition to the classified staff, the Board may consider recognizing all employee groups at a Board Meeting next year. Finally, Dr. Rodríguez advised that clarification is being sought relating to the resolution in agenda item 6.6 in light of the current redistricting efforts.

3. Reports

Academic Senate/SAC: SAC Academic Senate President Ray Hicks reported that an Academic Senate meeting will be held on Tuesday, May 8. Among the items being discussed are accelerated classes and addressing SLOs on the class syllabus.

Academic Senate/SCC: SCC Academic Senate President Morrie Barembaum reported that the last Academic Senate meeting was held last week; and, in its first year of operating under a resolution model, the Academic Senate passed 15 resolutions.

CSEA: CSEA President Marti Reiter commented on the combined award ceremony held at Santa Ana College last week and expressed her view that this was a very positive event and the classified staff appreciated being included with the other employee groups.
