Ms. Holguin thanked the board for considering the students' views on delaying selection of a search firm to assist in the recruitment and selection process of a new chancellor.

Mr. Yarbrough thanked Ms. Laurie Weidner for her work with elected officials during this time of economic difficulty.

AGREEMENT FOR EMPLOYMENT OF ACADEMIC ADMINISTRATOR BETWEEN THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE RANCHO SANTIAGO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT OF ORANGE COUNTY AND KENNETH SOLTIS

This EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT (hereinafter "Agreement") is entered into by and between the GOVERNING BOARD of and on behalf of the RANCHO SANTIAGO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT (hereinafter "District") and Kenneth Soltis (hereinafter "Employee"). The District and the Employee hereby agree to this contract of employment with the following terms and conditions:

1. POSITION. The District hereby employs the Employee as Associate Dean of Fire Technology and Public Safety at Santa Ana College for the District. The Employee is an academic employee as defined by Education Code section 87001(a), an administrator as defined by Education Code section 87002(a), and a management employee as defined by Government Code section 3540.1(g).

2. STATUTORY AUTHORIZATION FOR AGREEMENT. This Agreement is a contract of employment entered into pursuant to Education Code section 72411. Any notice of non-reemployment in the position must be given by the District by March 15 of the year in which this Agreement terminates.

3. TERM. The District hereby employs the Employee as Associate Dean of Fire Technology and Public Safety at Santa Ana College for a period of two (2) years, commencing on October 1, 2009, and terminating on June 30, 2011. If, prior to June 30 of any year other than the last year of this Agreement the District does not send or deliver a written notice to the Employee that this Agreement shall not be extended for an additional year, then this Agreement automatically shall be extended for one more year. This provision shall not be interpreted in any way to authorize any extended Agreement to be for a term of more than two (2) years. 4. MAXIMUM CASH SETTLEMENT UPON ANY TERMINATION OF THIS AGREEMENT. Regardless of the term of this Agreement, if it is terminated by the Governing Board prior to the date on which the term of this Agreement would have otherwise expired, the maximum cash settlement that the Employee may receive shall be an amount equal to the monthly salary of the Employee multiplied by the number of months remaining on the unexpired term of this Agreement. However, if the unexpired term is greater than eighteen (18) months, the maximum cash settlement shall be an amount equal to the monthly salary of the employee multiplied by eighteen (18). Any cash settlement shall not include any other noncash items except health benefits, which may be continued for the same duration of time as covered in the settlement, or until the Employee finds other employment, whichever comes first. Again, however, if the unexpired term is greater than eighteen (18) months, the maximum time for continued health benefits paid for by the District shall be eighteen (18) months. The intent of this provision is to satisfy the requirements in Government Code sections 53260-53264, and shall be interpreted consistently with those statutes.

5. SALARY. The salary of the Employee shall be \$114,696 per school year (July 1 through June 30). The salary shall be paid in twelve (12) equal monthly installments. The District reserves the right to increase the annual salary of the Employee for any or all years of this Agreement. However, any action to increase the salary of the Employee shall not be interpreted as any new contract of employment or any extension thereto. The District also reserves the right to decrease the annual salary of the Employee for any decrease the annual salary of the Employee for any future year(s) of this Agreement as long as such decrease, on a percentage basis, is no more than what is implemented on a general basis for regular, full-time faculty of the District. Any action to decrease the salary of the Employee shall not be interpreted as any new contract of employment or any extension thereto.

6. DUTIES. The Employee shall have such duties, which are listed in any Job Description for the Employee's position and those that are delegated to the Employee by the Chancellor or other supervisor. The Governing Board may adopt or amend at any time a Job Description for the Employee's position, which is 2 of 6 pages

not inconsistent with the terms of this Agreement. The Chancellor, with the approval of the Governing Board, may transfer or reassign the Employee to any administrative position in the District during the term this Agreement but there shall be no loss of compensation solely due to such discretionary transfer or reassignment. The Chancellor with the approval of the Governing Board may change the title of the Employee's position during the term of this Agreement but there shall be no loss of compensation solely due to such discretionary action.

7. LENGTH OF WORK YEAR AND VACATION BENEFITS. The Employee is a full-time administrator with a work year of twelve months per year. The Employee is an exempt employee and is ineligible for overtime pay and ineligible for compensatory time off. The Employee is expected to devote full efforts and energies to the position, although the Employee may be absent for holidays designated by the District and shall be entitled to accrue two and one-quarter (2 ¼) vacation days for each month of service. The Employee may not accumulate more than fifty-four (54) days of unused vacation as of July 1st of any given year. The Employee may be an instructor in no more than one class per semester for addition compensation, but such additional work must not tend to impair the effectiveness of the Employee or interfere with the Employee's duties. The Employee also on an infrequent basis may be assigned to an extra pay assignment of a temporary nature for additional compensation but such assignment must be approved in writing by the Governing Board prior to the commencement of the assignment.

8. PROFESSIONAL MEETINGS AND ACTIVITIES. Prior approval by the Chancellor shall be obtained for the Employee to attend any function or meeting related to the Employee's employment with the District. The reasonable and necessary expenses of attendance by the Employee at such a function or meeting shall be paid by the District only if there is approval by the Chancellor. The Employee may undertake outside professional activities including consulting, speaking and writing, either with or without compensation provided such activities do not tend to impair the effectiveness of the Employee or interfere 3 of 6 pages with the Employee's duties. In those cases in which the Employee engages in outside professional activities which generate a fee for services, the Employee shall utilize vacation days as provided for under the terms of this Agreement. This requirement to utilize vacation days shall not apply to the possible infrequent occasion where the Employee engages in such professional activities early in the morning, at lunchtime or late in the day and still works a full workday for the District.

9. EVALUATION PROCEDURE. The Employee may be evaluated in writing at any time pursuant to any policies or procedures adopted by the Governing Board. The immediate supervisor shall evaluate the Employee in writing utilizing any goals and objectives, any self-assessment, the Employee's Job Description, input of other employees, and/or other duties of the Employee. No evaluation is required prior to any notice of non-reemployment in provision two or any notice of non-extension in provision three. Such notices are within the sole discretion of the District.

10. TERMINATION OF THIS AGREEMENT DURING ITS TERM. The Governing Board may terminate this Agreement during its term if there is a material and substantial breach of this Agreement or for just cause. The Governing Board, prior to terminating this Agreement under this provision, must give the Employee thirty (30) days prior written notice which shall contain a reasonably detailed statement of the charges and materials upon which the proposed termination is based. The Governing Board also must give the Employee the right to respond either orally or in writing prior to the proposed effective date of the termination, and also must give the Employee a right to an evidentiary hearing before the Governing Board before the proposed termination is made final.

11. ANY RIGHT TO OTHER EMPLOYMENT WITH THE DISTRICT. In the event the term of this Agreement is not extended or another Agreement entered into, or in the event that this Agreement is terminated during its term, the Employee has retreat rights to a faculty position in the following faculty service area(s): Fire Science/Fire Technology. The Employee has the responsibility to present the necessary

transcripts and materials to the District pursuant to current policies and procedures in order to maintain any current faculty service area or acquire faculty service areas. This provision shall not be interpreted to merthat the Governing Board may not terminate all employment rights of the Employee pursuant to applicable law.

12. RESIGNATION. The Employee may resign from employment at any time during the term of this Agreement upon ninety (90) days prior written notice to the Governing Board or upon a shorter period of time as may be approved by the Governing Board.

13. MEDICAL EXAMINATION. Upon request of the Governing Board or the Chancellor, the Employee agrees to undergo a comprehensive physical and/or psychiatric examination to determine if the Employee is able, with or without reasonable accommodation, to perform the essential functions of the Employee's position. The costs of any such examination shall be paid for by the District. A confidential written report regarding any such examination shall be filed with the Governing Board or the Chancellor indicating whether the Employee is able, with or without reasonable accommodation, to perform the essential functions of the Employee's position.

14. HEALTH BENEFITS. The Employee shall be provided with all health benefits generally provided to all other administrators in the District on the same terms and conditions.

15. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Agreement is held to be contrary to law by a court of competent jurisdiction, such provision shall be deemed invalid, but all other provisions shall continue in full force and effect.

16. This Agreement supersedes all Board Policies, rules, regulations, handbooks and practices inconsistent with or in conflict with this Agreement.

17. MANDATORY MEDIATION AND ARBITRATION OF ANY EMPLOYMENT DISPUTE. The Employee and the District hereby agree that any dispute, claim or controversy arising out of the 5 of 6 pages employment relationship, including, but not limited to, alleged violation(s) of federal, state and/or local statutes, including those prohibiting harassment and discrimination, and any other claims, including alleged violations of any provisions in the Education Code, which cannot be resolved through informal and confidential discussions, shall be submitted to mediation, and if mediation is unsuccessful, to binding arbitration before a neutral Arbitrator. The Mediator and any necessary Arbitrator shall be selected through the Judicial Arbitration & Mediation Services/Endispute (J.A.M.S.). Attachment "A" to this Agreement sets forth the procedures to be utilized and is hereby incorporated by reference into this Agreement as if fully set forth within. The Employee and the District hereby agree that they have carefully read Attachment "A" and knowingly agree to all of its contents, and knowingly agree to the covenant to mediate and arbitrate all employment disputes contained in Attachment "A".

18. The Employee and the District agree that this Agreement is not binding or enforceable unless it is ratified by the Governing Board at a meeting of the Governing Board.

BACKGROUND

On July 27, 2009, Chancellor Hernandez advised the Board of Trustees of his retirement on June 30, 2010. The Board ratified the Chancellor's retirement at the August 24, 2009 meeting. Board action on the commencement of a search process was postponed until the October 26, 2009 meeting and subsequently to the November 16, 2009 meeting.

ANALYSIS

Although the academic senates and student leadership have expressed concerns about the cost of a search, the majority of the expenses related to the search can be charged to categorical funds and will not impact the general fund. Five executive search firms submitted proposals to assist in the search. Staff is recommending that Community College Search Services (CCSS) be selected based upon price and familiarity with the District. CCSS conducted the search in 1997 when Chancellor Hernandez was selected and has also conducted the searches for both college presidents. The use of a search consultant will enable the District to conduct an effective, nationwide search for a new Chancellor. The search consultant will also conduct in-depth reference checks on the finalists for the position. The Chancellor's Cabinet is unanimously recommending that the Board begin the search process in accordance with the attached timeline, which is designed to have a new Chancellor in place by July 1, 2010.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1) It is recommended that the Board of Trustees engage Community College Search Services to assist in the recruitment and selection process for a new Chancellor.
- 2) It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve the timeline for the Chancellor search process and authorize the Executive Vice Chancellor of Human Resources and Educational Services to chair the screening committee and coordinate the recruitment and selection process with the search firm.

Chancellor Search Timeline

A thorough search process will take approximately six months. If it is the board's interest to have the new chancellor start on July 1, 2010, the process would need to commence in November and conclude by May 1 in order to allow time for the successful candidate to conclude his/her current assignment and, if necessary, relocate to Orange County.

Using a July 1 start date, the following steps and target dates are recommended:

- <u>Retain Services of Search Consultant (November)</u> The Human Resources office will refine the scope of work and finalize an agreement with the search consultant.
- <u>Develop Position Announcement (November December)</u> Input will be solicited from campus and community constituencies on the characteristics needed in the next chancellor. A position announcement will be drafted and approved by the board. The Human Resources department will work with the employee groups to appoint the screening committee, which should have balanced representation from both colleges and all campus constituencies.
- <u>Recruitment (January May)</u>

The position will be advertized nationally and nominations will be solicited from community college leaders. It is recommended that applications be accepted until the position is filled, which will provide the screening committee and Board of Trustees with maximum flexibility.

- <u>Screening and Selection (March April)</u> The applications will be reviewed by the screening committee. Interviews will be conducted with the top candidates, and finalists will be selected and recommended to the board of trustees.
- <u>Board Interviews and Selection (April May)</u>
 The board will interview the finalists and select the new chancellor.

<u>Transition (May – June)</u> After the board selects the chancellor, the Human Resources department will assist in the finalization of the employment contract and any additional transition and relocation issues. Board of Trustees November 16, 2009

BACKGROUND

Attached is a list of students who successfully completed coursework at Santiago Canyon College leading to an associate degree, certificate of achievement, and/or certificate for summer 2009. Also attached are the statistical tables showing degrees, certificates of achievement, and certificates awarded by major.

ANALYSIS

Santiago Canyon College awarded 88 associate degrees in summer 2009 as compared to 73 last summer, an increase of 20%. The area of Liberal Arts was a significant factor with 76 degrees awarded which is an increase of 20% from last summer. Increases were also seen in Chemistry, Computer Information Systems, Mathematics, Political Science, and Survey/Mapping Sciences-Land Surveyor. Decreases were seen in the areas of Anthropology, Business Administration, English, History, and Science.

Santiago Canyon College awarded 145 Certificates of Achievement in summer 2009 as compared to 114 last summer. A substantial increase is noted as a result of offering CSU and IGETC General Education Breadth certificates of achievement beginning summer 2009. The number of CSU and IGETC Certificates of Achievement should increase over the next year as students become more aware of the new offerings. Increases were seen in American Sign Language, Apprenticeship-Electricity Industrial Option, Apprenticeship-Electricity Sound & Communication, Apprenticeship-Surveying Chief of the Party, Cosmetology, and Survey/Mapping Sciences-Land Surveyor. Decreases were seen in Apprenticeship-Electricity Power Lineman, Apprenticeship-Maintenance Mechanic, Apprenticeship-Surveying Chainman, Gemology, Public Works, and Water Utility Science.

Santiago Canyon College awarded 14 Certificates in summer 2009 as compared to 12 last summer. An increase was seen in Computer Information Systems Web Design and Web Programming, Survey/Mapping-Land Surveyor in Training, and TV/Video Communications-Media Studies. A decrease was seen in Cosmetician, Marketing, Advertising, and Water Utility Supervisor.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees ratify the recipients of the associate degrees, certificates of achievement, and certificates for the summer 2009 as presented.



BACKGROUND

The Santa Ana College Community Services Program offers classes that are of special interest or those designed for a specific audience or need. They are noncredit, usually shorter in duration than credit classes, and do not require lengthy preparation or rigorous testing. From the creative arts and financial management to computer software and special tours, these programs are offered to the general public for educational, cultural, social and recreational purposes for a fee. These brief programs often serve as exposure and entry to college programs. The Community Services Program serves as a recruitment tool for Santa Ana College credit program often providing pilot courses that introduce a more in-depth and complete offering through college classes. Its inherent flexibility allows the addition or replacement of classes that have the most cost-effective impact on our program and the community.

ANALYSIS

The Spring 2010 course offering aims to provide 140 inclusive education and recreation course for adults and children in the Santa Ana College service area. This comprehensive menu of courses seeks to meet the demographic and diverse service needs in our community while generating revenue to ensure the continued expansion of the Community Services Program.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING Between Rancho Santiago Community College District And Our Lady of Pilar Church

THIS AGREEMENT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES (hereinafter "Agreement") is entered into July 1, 2009, by and between Rancho Santiago Community College District on behalf of Santa Ana College School of Continuing Education (hereinafter called "College") and Our Lady of Pilar Church (hereinafter called OLPC), in consideration of the mutual promises set forth below.

1. Description of Services; The College engages OLPC to provide, and OLPC agrees to provide, the services to the College which are described in Appendix A, attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference (the "Services") in accordance with the terms and provisions of this Agreement. OLPC agrees to obtain the written approval of the College prior to commencement of any new projects or services beyond the scope of this Agreement.

2. Term. The term of this agreement shall commence on July 1, 2009, and continue for five (5) years, as described in <u>Appendix A</u>.

3. Compensation. OLPC shall be compensated by College at the rate of \$3.50 per class hour for a maximum of 1,500 hours per fiscal year.

4. **Ownership**. Upon payment for Services rendered and expenses incurred, source code documentation and training materials relating to the Services shall become the property of College.

5. Authority. OLPC shall have no authority to bind, obligate or commit College by any promise or representation without the prior written approval of College.

6. Taxes. OLPC shall be responsible for and payment of all costs of conducting its business, including but not limited to, the expense and responsibility for any applicable insurance or city, county, state or federal licenses, permits, taxes or assessments of any kind. OLPC shall be responsible for payment of its self-employment taxes including, but not limited to, income taxes, Social Security taxes, and worker's compensation premiums for college employees.

7. Termination of Agreement.

a. This Agreement will automatically expire upon conclusion of its term, unless extended by mutual agreement. Additionally, notwithstanding the term stated in Section 2 and Appendix A, this Agreement may be terminated by either party, with or without cause, at any time before its expiration, by either party giving the other 30 calendar days written notice.

b. Termination of this Agreement by College, requires that OLPC will return College's papers and property promptly upon receipt of payment for outstanding fees and costs. Termination of this agreement will not affect College's responsibility for payment of Services rendered and out-of-pocket expenses incurred before termination and in connection with an orderly transition of the Services to another service provider.

8. Confidentiality. In consideration of this agreement with College, OLPC agrees to the following conditions relating specifically to College's confidential information (as defined below):

a. Confidential information includes, but is not limited to, all proprietary information of College such as: trade secrets; designs; drawings; specifications; computer programs; support materials; information regarding College's students, business operations and plans; or other records concerning College's finances, contracts, services or personnel.

b. OLPC shall respect the confidences of College and shall not at any time, during or after its relationship with College, directly or indirectly, divulge or disclose for any purpose or use for its own benefit any confidential information that has been obtained as a result of the relationship with College.

c. OLPC shall take such steps as may be reasonably necessary to prevent disclosure of confidential information to others and shall not disclose confidential information to others without the prior written consent of College. OLPC agrees that confidential information disclosed to it under the terms of this Agreement may be disclosed only to its employees or agents who have a need to know such confidential information.

d. This Agreement not to disclose confidential information will continue to apply after termination of this Agreement, and until such time as the confidential information becomes public knowledge through no fault of its own. OLPC will report to College any and all unauthorized disclosures or uses of confidential information.

e. The following information of College shall not be considered confidential information for purposes of this Agreement: (1) information known by OLPC at time of acknowledgement; or (2) information lawfully obtainable from other sources.

9. Limitation of Liability. Neither party will be liable for any incidental, indirect, special or consequential damages arising out of or in connection with the services provided by OLPC even if a party has been advised of the possibility of such damages. OLPC's total liability arising out of, or in connection with, any event or series of connected events occurring in connection with the services of this Agreement shall not exceed the amount of fees paid under this Agreement.

10. Indemnification. All parties to this agreement shall agree to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the other party, its officers, agents, employees, and volunteers, from and against all loss, cost, and expense arising out of any liability or claim of liability, sustained or claimed to have been sustained, arising out of the activities, or the performance or nonperformance of obligations under this agreement, of the indemnifying party, or those of any of its officers, agents, employees, or volunteers. The provisions of this article do not apply to any damage or loss caused solely by the negligence or intentional acts of the non-indemnifying party or any of its agents or employees.

11. Entire Agreement. This document contains the entire Agreement of the parties regarding the subject matter described herein, and all other promises, representations, understandings, arrangements and prior agreements related thereto are merged herein and superseded hereby. The provisions of this Agreement may not be amended, except by an agreement in writing signed by the party against whom enforcement of any amendment is sought.

12. Notices. Except as otherwise provided in the Agreement, all notices or other communications hereunder shall be in writing and delivered to the addresses below the signatures to this Agreement. Such addresses may be changed by notice given by either party to the other pursuant to this Section or by other form of notice agreed to by the parties.

13. Severability. If any provision of this Agreement is invalid or unenforceable in any jurisdiction, the other provisions herein shall remain in full force and effect in such jurisdiction and shall be liberally construed in order to effectuate the purpose and intent of this Agreement, and the invalidity or unenforceability of any provision of this Agreement in any jurisdiction shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any such provision in any other jurisdiction.

14. Attorney's Fees. In the event an action is brought to enforce any provision of or declare a breach of this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover, in addition to any other amounts awarded, reasonable legal costs including attorney's fees incurred thereby.

15. Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all such counterparts shall together constitute one and the same instrument.

16. Survival. The representations, warranties, covenants, and agreements of the parties to this Agreement shall survive termination of this Agreement.

AGREEMENT

Occupational Therapy Assistant Program

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into by and between Head To Toe Therapy, hereinafter called the Agency, and Rancho Santiago Community College District, on behalf of Santa Ana College, hereinafter called the District.

PART I. BASIS AND PURPOSE OF AGREEMENT

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the District and Agency acknowledge a public obligation to contribute to Occupational Therapy Assistant Program education for the benefit for students and to meet community needs.

WHEREAS, the District provides programs in Occupational Therapy Assistant Program education, which require clinical experience for students, enrolled in these programs.

WHEREAS, the Agency has facilities suitable for the clinical needs of the District programs in the Occupational Therapy Assistant Program.

WHEREAS, it is to the benefit of both District and Agency that Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students have opportunities for clinical experience to enhance their capabilities as practitioners.

NOW, THEREFORE, the District and Agency do covenant and agree as follows:

PART II. GENERAL RESPONSIBILITIES AND PRIVILEGES OF THE DISTRICT

- A. For the Program in General
 - 1. The District will assume full responsibility for offering Occupational Therapy Assistant Program education programs eligible for accreditation by the appropriate State Board.
 - 2. District faculty members may be invited to serve as voluntary resource persons to the Agency staff by serving on Occupational Therapy Assistant Program care committees, by sharing knowledge as clinical experts, and by participation in other matters dealing with the quality of patient care.
 - 3. For Student Workmen's Compensation

The District shall carry Workmen's Compensation Insurance on students of the District during clinical assignment, and keep records of clinical attendance for audit by the State Workmen's Compensation Insurance Fund.

B. For Program Planning

- 1. The District will initiate the development of mutually acceptable clinical instruction plans for using the Agency's clinical areas to meet the educational goals of Occupational Therapy Assistant Program curricula. These plans will be made available to the Agency at a mutually agreed upon time prior to the beginning of the school term and subject to revision in instances of conflicts with agency patient care responsibilities and/or District interests.
- 2. The District has the privilege of regularly scheduled meetings with Agency staff, including both selected Agency personnel and administrative level representatives for the purpose of interpreting, discussing, and evaluating the educational program in occupational therapy.
- C. For Occupational Therapy Assistant Program Students
 - 1. The District will be responsible for assuring that Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students assigned to the Agency for clinical instruction meet both District and Agency standards of health and physical fitness, and shall provide certification that the Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students have been immunized against the common communicable diseases.

PART III. GENERAL RESPONSIBILITIES AND PRIVILEGES OF THE AGENCY

- A. For the Program in General
 - 1. The Agency will maintain the standards, which make it eligible for approval as a clinical area for instruction in accredited Occupational Therapy Assistant Program programs. To further this, the Agency agrees to provide and maintain personnel who are in its opinion, capable and qualified in those divisions in which students are placed.
 - 2. The administration of the service and patient care at the Agency shall be the responsibility of and under the control and supervision of the Agency and shall be administered through the Agency and shall be administered through the Agency staff.
 - 3. The Agency will designate a staff member who will function as Education Coordinator for Occupational Therapy Assistant Program education uses of the Agency facilities, including joint planning and representatives of all involved Occupational Therapy Assistant Program programs.
 - 4. The Agency will provide orientation for students and faculty to familiarize them with Agency policies and facilities before assigning them to duties at the Agency.

- 5. The Agency will permit its employees to participate in the educational program as resource persons and clinical experts provided such participation does not interfere with assigned duties.
- 6. The Agency will permit the faculty and students of the District to use its patient care and patient service facilities for clinical education according to approved curricula.
- 7. The Agency will confer with the District prior to making a commitment for new or expanded use of its clinical facilities by any other Occupational Therapy Assistant Program that interfere with current student placement.
- B. For Services and Facilities
 - 1. The Agency will permit the educational use of such supplies and equipment as are commonly available for patient care.
 - 2. The Agency will permit use of the following facilities and services by District Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students and faculty at such times and to the degrees considered feasible by the agency.
 - a. Parking areas.
 - b. Locker, storage and dressing facilities.
 - c. Same food services as are available for Agency staff.
 - d. First aid treatment with written consent required for minors.
 - e. Access to sources of information for education purposes such as:
 - 1. Patient's chart.
 - 2. Procedure guides policy manuals.
 - 3. Medical dictionaries, pharmacology references, and other references suitable to the clinical area.
 - 4. Books and periodicals in the Medical library.
- C. For the Control of District Personnel
 - 1. The Agency may refuse access to its clinical areas to Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students or district faculty who do not meet its employee standards for safety, health, cooperation, or ethical behavior pending investigation and resolution of the matter by the Agency and the District.

PART IV. JOINT RESPONSIBILITIES AND PRIVILEGES

- A. For publications
 - 1. Publication by District faculty, or Agency staff members of any material relative to their clinical experience, that has not been approved for release by the District and Agency signers of this agreement, is prohibited.

B. Insurance:

Without limiting the indemnification obligations stated below, each party to the Agreement shall maintain and secure at its own expense comprehensive general liability, property damage insurance, and professional liability of not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and three million dollars (\$3,000,000) in the aggregate, and said policy shall remain in full force and effect during the term hereof. Thirty (30) days written notice shall be provided to the other party prior to cancellation, or reduction in said insurance. Upon request, the requesting party shall be provided a copy of said policy.

C. Indemnification

All parties to this Agreement shall agree to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the other party, its officers, agents, employees, and volunteers, from and against all loss, cost, and expense arising out of any liability or claim of liability, sustained or claimed to have been sustained, arising out of the activities, or the performance or nonperformance of obligations under this Agreement, of the indemnifying party, or those of any of its officers, agents, employees, or volunteers. The provision of the Article does not apply to any damage or losses caused solely by the negligence or intentional acts of the non-indemnifying party or any of its agents or employees.

PART V. STATUS OF OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY ASSISTANT STUDENTS

- A. Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students shall have the status as learners and shall not be considered to be Agency employees nor shall they replace Agency staff. Any service rendered by the student during the experience is to be considered in addition to planned patient care in that area. Clinical experience will be conducted as a laboratory learning experience. The Agency will provide regular staffing for patient care in areas where students are obtaining clinical experience.
- B. Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students are subject to the authority, policies, and regulations of the district. They are also subject, during clinical assignment, to applicable agency regulations and must conform to the same standards as are for Agency employees in matters relating to the welfare of patients and general Agency operations.
- C. Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students shall be responsible for proper coverage in regard to malpractice insurance, or any other liability insurance that might be required by either the District or the Agency.
- D. The District will be responsible for assuring that health care students assigned to the Agency for clinical instruction meet both District and Agency standards of health and physical fitness.

PART VI. PERIOD OF AGREEMENT, TERMINATION

A. This agreement shall be effective as of the date signed, and shall continue in effect for five years, unless terminated earlier by written notice of either party. Either party to this Agreement may, in its sole discretion, terminate this Agreement with or without cause by giving the other party at least 30 days' prior written notice. In the event the Agreement is terminated for cause, all of the obligations of the terminating party shall be waived immediately upon written notice of termination. In the event of termination without cause, the parties agree to fulfill their respective obligations associated with the current term or semester, prior to such termination becoming effective.

BACKGROUND

Don Sneddon has won 957 games during his coaching career making him the all-time leader in wins in California Community College baseball history. During his tenure at Santa Ana College, Coach Sneddon has guided the Dons to 13 Conference Championships and three State Championships.

Prior to Coach Sneddon's first season as head coach, the Dons had only 14 winning seasons in 43 years. Since taking over, Sneddon has led the Dons to 28 straight winning seasons. He has also helped 103 players sign contracts with professional teams, while helping another 186 student-athletes receive scholarships to four-year universities.

All of these accomplishments along with his contributions to the Exercise Science Division and Santa Ana College led the Athletic Hall of Fame Executive Committee to formally vote that the Santa Ana College Baseball Field be named <u>Sneddon Field</u>. This recommendation by the SAC Administration and Athletic Hall of Fame was previously presented and reviewed at the Board Facilities Committee meeting on October 6, 2009.

ANALYSIS

BACKGROUND

Education Code section 76060.5 provides that a mandatory student representation fee of \$1 per semester may be charged of all students, upon a favorable vote of two-thirds of students voting in an election on that matter (provided that the number of students who vote equals or exceeds the average of the number of students who voted in the previous three student body elections). Students may refuse to pay the representation fee for religious, political, financial, or moral reasons.

It is the opinion of the Chancellor's Office that revenues from the student representation fee can be used for any purpose related to representing the views of students with governmental bodies. Such revenue can be used to travel to and from conferences sponsored by student organizations where legislative matters will be discussed (i.e., Student Senate for California Community Colleges); to purchase computer equipment needed to conduct legislative research; to subscribe to legislative publications; and/or to pay for any other expenses reasonably necessary to effectuate student representation activities (Legal Opinion O 95-24). It is also the Chancellor's Office view that revenues from the student representation fee may not be used to support or oppose ballot measures or candidates.

ANALYSIS

In the spring of 2008, SCC Associated Student Government (ASG) held an election which included a referendum on implementing the student representation fee. Out of 210 eligible votes, 153 students voted "yes" and 57 voted "no." The referendum passed with a favorable vote that exceeded the required two-thirds threshold. The number of students who voted in this election exceeded the average number of students who voted in the previous three student body elections.

However, the district's GLINK data system did not have the capacity to distinguish billing only SCC students; as such the request to authorize the representation fee was delayed. In the current Datatel environment billing is possible based on home-campus designation. Students will be advised of the option of not paying the fee for religious, political, financial, or moral reasons and a mechanism for declining to pay will be established.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees support the ASG referendum and authorize the student representation fee at Santiago Canyon College for implementation in the spring 2010 term.

The information provided herein, including all charts, tables, graphs and numerical representations, is provided to readers solely as a general overview of the economic and market conditions which the Treasurer utilizes in making investment decisions. In addition, a complete version of this report is also available for download at our website <u>www.ttc.ocgov.com</u>.

TREASURER'S REPORT

In order to assist you in reading this report, please note that the current balances reflect the investments recorded in the portfolios for each particular fund for the period ending September 30th. Each money market fund has an average maturity of less than sixty days, with a net asset value (NAV) falling within the range of 0.9950 and 1.0050. The Extended Fund shall have a duration not to exceed a leading 1-3 Year index +25%. All investments are marked to the market at the end of the reporting period due to the narrow valuation range prescribed by the Pools' Investment Policy Statement.

The reports reflect the par value (face value), the cost and market value (the price of each security at the close of the market on the last trading day of the month). Market values are derived from the Bloomberg Professional Service, a premier provider of instant access to real-time and historical financial data. The difference between the market value and book value is the unrealized gain or (loss). The Detail Transaction Report Section is provided in compliance with California Government Code Section 53607, which requires that the Treasurer file such a report with the Board of Supervisors, from whom his investment authority has been delegated.




APPORTIONMENT OF COMMINGLED POOL INTEREST EARNINGS

We have prepared a forecast for the timing of the County Investment Pool's August 2009 and September 2009 interest apportionments. We anticipate posting the August 2009 and September 2009 interest apportionments to participants' cash accounts in the County general ledger by approximately October 21 and November 23, 2009 respectively.

MARKET OBSERVATIONS

Treasurer's Monthly Management Report

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The United States has always prided itself on the ability to be an innovator that gains economic dominance during periods of rapid change. As the world suffers through the change brought on by the most difficult recession since the Great Depression, the American economy is rapidly restructuring in order to achieve dominance in the future. We forecast that during this "return to normal" interest rates will remain low.

Most Americans would describe the 1990s as an era of great economic growth. For the developing world, the period will be remembered for extreme economic pain. Russia, Mexico, Argentina and many others went bankrupt and even the rapidly developing Asian economics, including China, suffered huge economic challenges. While the US celebrated an economic boom and basked in the ego associated with its strong dollar, the developing world adopted "Beggar Thy Neighbor" strategies aimed at cheapening their currencies through devaluation in order to undercut US competitiveness.

The first decade of the 21st Century will be remembered for the economic rebirth of China, Brazil and India. Each country unleashed a system of centrally planned export capitalism to make their products extremely competitive. In the past these former socialist countries had been highly restrictive of allowing foreign companies to use their labor or sell into their protected markets. The pain of the 90s required them to seek outside capital to re-launch their economies. Massive capital poured in and massive exports poured out. Treasurer's Monthly Management Report Page 4

As the competitiveness of these new economic behemoths rose, the capital markets began to strengthen their currencies and thus cut off their new success. Instead of increasing the standard of living for their citizens, these centrally planned capitalists purchased massive amounts of US Government bonds in order to return the cash to America and bid up the US currency. This resulted in a stronger US dollar and greater competitiveness for the new market entrants and cheaper prices for the US consumer. Many people started referring to WalMart as the Great Wall of Mart, in honor of the fact that 85% of WalMart's non-food products tended to be imported from China. This also facilitated cheap interest rates which drove up real estate prices until the recent collapse of this game.

Like all temporary economic predatory strategies, Beggar Thy Neighbor is collapsing. Americans are cutting back on their consumer purchasing and deleveraging their borrowing. America has moved from spending 7% more than they earn to saving 5% of what they earn. This process is driving down the value of the US dollar as the exporters have less sales and thus dollars to invest. Interest rates are low due to former US consumers becoming savers.

Once again the United States sits in the catbird's seat. The US economy is highly self sufficient and the US appears to be willing to accept lower asset values and a weaker US dollar. The exporters are losing market and beginning to understand that they will be suffering massive losses on the depreciating currency value of the US bond investments. With the fall in the US dollar, American competitiveness is rising. Low interest rates are allowing the US Federal government to cushion the shock of change with a huge temporary stimulus of "make work" projects.

Although the United States could destroy its own economic rebirth by following the Japanese model of trying to have government spending pave the yellow brick road back to prosperity, our people are already demanding spending discipline. With our centrally planned competitors in disarray and headed for shambles, the US will continue to innovate and prepare for the next economic launch forward.

All indications from our research of the economy point to a period of slow growth for the US over the next two years. Individuals and corporations will continue to emphasize reducing debt and building savings. Over time a huge pool of savings will be available to fund a new era of growth. This will just take some time arrive.



BACKGROUND:

The District sent out a Request for Proposals (RFP) for Construction Management Services for multi-prime construction services for the next phase of construction projects at Santiago Canyon College.

The estimated combined construction cost for these projects is \$55,000,000 and will be funded with Measure E bond funds. The construction projects list includes a Gymnasium & Aquatic Complex, a Humanities Classroom Building, the relocation of the existing Physical Education Modular Buildings, completion of the new Chapman Avenue entry and the construction of a new campus surface parking lot.

The District is preparing to bid construction of these projects under the multiple-prime delivery system. The multi-prime delivery system has been utilized with significant success at the District's Orange Education Center and the Santiago Canyon College Science Center. In order to coordinate and manage these projects, it is necessary to hire a construction management firm with experience in the multi-prime delivery system.

ANALYSIS

LPA Architects, the architect of record for these projects, recommended (7) construction management firms be sent RFP packages. These seven firms met with the district's architect, Young Min and district staff on October 15, 2009 to review the detailed scope of work included in the RFP. Proposals were due on October 30, 2009. Five (5) construction management firms responded to the RFP.

All of these firms have extensive experience in construction management and specifically with delivering projects under a multi-prime scenario. Based upon and estimated construction cost of \$55,000,000, the cost proposals were as follows:

The apparent low responder to the RFP, Bernards, did not meet the minimum requirements in the scope of work. The RFP specifications require that two project managers be assigned by the CM firm, one for the Humanities Building and another for the Gym/Aquatic Complex projects. Bernards only responded with one project manager for both projects. If an additional project manager was included with their proposal, the cost estimate would exceed the second lowest responder. Therefore, the proposal by Bernards is found non-responsive to the RFP specifications.

Base on a review of the submitted required staffing plan by Seville Construction Services and their familiarity with the campus layout and working knowledge of the current construction projects and activities, it is recommended that Seville Construction Services be hired as the construction management firm for these Santiago Canyon College projects. The President of Santiago Canyon College, Juan Vazquez, and the Vice President of Administrative Services, Steve Kawa, were both present at the RFP opening and recommend Seville Construction Services.

Seville Construction Services is currently managing the construction of the SCC Science Center and the SCC Maintenance and Operations Building. The estimated cost for these construction management services, based on current project construction schedules, is estimated at \$3,031,485 with reimbursable expenses. All reimbursable cost associated with the project will be invoiced at direct cost with no mark up.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees authorize the Chancellor or his designee to enter into an agreement with Seville Construction Management Services in the amount of \$3,031,485 for these various projects as presented.

BUSINESS OPERATIONS AND FISCAL SERVICES

BACKGROUND

The District has accumulated a considerable amount of surplus property, which requires an auction to dispose of this property. Legally, in order to dispose of District property, the Board must take action to declare the left over items as surplus prior to the auction.

ANALYSIS

An open house was held on October 22, 2009 for district staff to select usable items for their divisions or departments. Later that morning, an open house was held for non-profit organizations and school districts to select from the remaining items. Four (4) school districts attended the preview. Attached is a listing of all the surplus property as of October 28, 2009. This record will change as items continually move in and out of storage. Also, there are non-inventoriable, miscellaneous items that are not listed but will be disposed at the sale.

The District has used The Liquidation Company (TLC) for the past several years. The advantages of using TLC are that they take the majority of our surplus property which is rare among auctioneers and they are licensed e-waste collectors. The auctioneer's fee is 35% of the gross sales which is competitive among the five auction vendors recently surveyed by the Purchasing Department. Based on the survey, fees ranged from 10% for an on-site auctioneer which require district's staff to provide labor and other related services to 50% for service comparable to the current service the District receives from TLC. The fee from TLC includes advertising, transportation, labor and other related functions. Their performance and service have been very satisfactory. The agreement is good through June 30, 2011.

Following the auction, District staff shall discard any remaining surplus property. This is in accordance with Board Policy BP3405 and AR3405.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees declare the attached list of equipment as surplus property and to utilize The Liquidation Company to conduct an auction as presented.

BACKGROUND

The construction for the Santiago Canyon College Science Center is near completion and will be ready for equipment to be purchased and installed. The audio visual equipment for each of the eighteen (18) classrooms include a PC/Video projector, DVD player, document camera, sound system including amplification, and system control from the instructor's podium. Faculty using these classrooms and large lecture hall will be able to project PC display or video control sound, connect to a laptop or document camera from a small console which is connected to the college network. SCC Media Department will monitor use and perform basic troubleshooting of equipment from their area thereby improving service and reducing help calls.

Due to the bid limit, this project required us to go through the public bidding process and obtain Board approval.

ANALYSIS

Bids were sent to twenty-one (21) potential bidders. A mandatory job walk was held October 20, 2009 and fifteen (15) bidders attended.

Eleven (11) bidders provided bids for this project, one being non-responsive because the bid was not signed. The Santiago Canyon College Media Committee made up of four members evaluated the bids. Troxell Communications, Inc. is the lowest responsible and responsive bidder meeting specifications. Troxell has done other work throughout the District in the past and we have always been pleased with their performance.

BACKGROUND

On May 09, 2005, the Board approved the purchase of information technology equipment, goods and services pursuant to contracts awarded by the State of Minnesota on behalf of the National Association of State Procurement Officials (NASPO) and the Western States Contracting Alliance (WSCA). These contracts were Master Price Agreement #A63307 awarded to Dell Marketing L.P. and Master Price Agreement #A63309 awarded to Hewlett Packard Company. These contracts were approved for usage in California by the California Department of General Services. Both contracts have now expired.

ANALYSIS

The State of Minnesota on behalf of NASPO and WSCA awarded new contracts for computer equipment, software, peripherals and related services in 2009 to Dell Marketing L.P. and Hewlett Packard Company. These contracts were approved for usage in California by the Department of General Services. Using these contracts will allow the District to continue to purchase technology products including equipment, software, peripherals and related services on an asneeded basis. These contracts were competitively bid in order to achieve cost-effective and efficient acquisition of quality products and services. The District can take advantage of the cumulative volume discounts which are in the best interest of the District.

Depending on the product or service, there is up to 13.14% discount for Dell products/services and up to 40% for HP products/services. In addition, the discount is even higher based on volume purchases.

5.4 Quarterly Investment Report as of September 30, 2009

Are we liquid enough in our cash reserves to meet the obligations we have for this semester?

Yes

Given that we expect the state government to again impose a mid-year budget cut, how are our cash reserves prepared to meet our obligations?

• Erik Skinner from the State Chancellors Office advises that although mid-year budget cuts should be in order, due to the expected current year budget shortfall in revenues and increased expenditures, they do not believe the state legislature will make any significant mid-year reductions to K-14 education under Proposition 98. They believe the legislature will simply push forward the current year deficit into the 2010-2011 fiscal year.

I see that we are pursuing a short term maturity strategy in our investment accounts to prepare for any potential inflation. How will this strategy maintain our purchasing power if inflation occurs and the federal reserve raises interest rates?

• The Orange County Treasury has decided that short term investments through their investment policies are a hedge, at this time, to inflation. If inflation occurs, interest rates will quickly follow, especially on shorter term investments.

Describe "Net Asset Value (NAV) falling within the range of \$0.9950 and \$1.0050.", (page 5.4 (4) par. 1 Treasurers Report) and what this means toward performance.

• Net Asset Value is how the Orange County Treasury adjusts their investments, on our behalf, to current market values and risks. This current NAV range is very good.

63.24% of our reserves are invested in General Obligation Bonds. Please describe this security, its rating, its historical reliability and how this addresses our need for surety.

• The \$139,272,011 cash balance in the County Treasury, as of September 30, 2009, that is titled General Obligations Bonds are the Measure E remaining cash balances with accrued interest. Measure E Bond funds are not invested in GO Bonds at the County Treasury. Measure E Bond funds are included in the schools pool and are currently invested by the Orange County Treasury as described by the pie chart on page 5.4(6) in the Board Docket.

 The non-profit list we use was developed years ago by the Purchasing Department and has been updated throughout the years. Employees will inquire about having their non-profit organization of interest added to our list. We ask them for contact information; verify the non-profit status by requesting a copy of their 501 (c) (3) letter from the IRS. We then add them to our list. We aren't aware of Mercy House or WisePlace, but will research and contact them for inclusion in future open house events.
