INVESTMENTS - BP3211

Revised 09/11/95

The Board of Trustees authorizes the chancellor, or designee, to invest monies not required for the immediate necessities of the district in accordance with existing law. Funds are to be invested in a manner which will provide the maximum security of principal.

- Safety of principal is the foremost objective of the investment program. Investments shall be undertaken in a manner that seeks to ensure the preservation of capital.
- The investments shall remain sufficiently liquid to meet all operating obligations of the district.
- The investments shall be done with the objective of attaining a market rate of return, taking into account risks and liquidity needs.

Investments shall be made with judgement and care, which persons of prudence, discretion and intelligence would exercise for the safety of capital and reasonable income.

The Vice Chancellor of Business and Fiscal Services shall develop and maintain written administrative procedures for the operation of the investment program which are consistent with this investment policy.

Administrators and employees involved in the investment process shall refrain from personal business activity that could conflict with the proper execution of the investment activity or which could impair their ability to make impartial investment decisions.

ATEMENT OF ETHICAL CONDUCT - BP9002

Revised August 27, 2007

All Rancho Santiago Community College District board members are committed to maintaining the highest standards of conduct and ethical behavior. The Board believes that in promoting trust, confidence, and integrity in the working relationship between Trustees, administrators, faculty and Staff. The Board and its individual Trustees are committed to the following:

- Trustees clearly articulate to the Chancellor the Board's expectations, will support the work and efforts of the Chancellor, and keep the Chancellor informed of matters related to the district and colleges.
- Trustees will respect the confidentiality of all privileged information.
- Trustees will uphold the letter and spirit of the Ralph M. Brown Act and make all official decisions and actions of the Board of Trustees in open and public meetings.
- Trustees will remain informed about the district, educational issues, and responsibilities of trusteeship, and will work in the best interest of the entire district.

president of the board, in consultation with the Chancellor, is authorized to consult with legal counsel when they become e of or are informed about actual or perceived violations of pertinent laws and regulations, including but not limited to conflict of interest, open and public meetings, confidentiality of closed session information, and use of public resources. Violations of law may be referred to the District Attorney or Attorney General as provided for in law.

Violations of the board's policy code of ethics will be addressed by the president of the board, who will first discuss the violation with the trustee to reach a resolution. If resolution is not achieved and further action is deemed necessary, the president may appoint an ad hoc committee to examine the matter and recommend further courses of action to the board. Sanctions will be determined by the board officers and may include a recommendation to the board to censure of the trustee. If the president of the board is perceived to have violated the code, the vice president of the board is authorized to pursue resolution.

- Candidate travel;
- All position advertisements;
- Search committee incidentals;
- Search Team visits to candidate institutions;
- Time of district liaison devoted to this search.

In the event that the new Chancellor of the Rancho Santiago Community College District should resign within one calendar year his/her new assignment, CCSS agrees to undertake a new comprehensive search for expenses only.

Either party may cancel this agreement with a 30 day written notice to the other party. If instituted, the District would reimburse only those charges incurred by CCSS on behalf of the Rancho Santiago Community College District up to that point in time.

Fee is to be paid in two increments as follows: The first increment to be billed on March 1st, 2010 and the second increment and any remaining balance upon completion of all services as per above agreement on July 1, 2010. The amounts of each increment will to be determined by the Rancho Santiago Community College District.

BACKGROUND

During the 2006-2007 fiscal year, SB361 was enacted and authorized the creation of a new category of noncredit programs titled *Career Development and College Preparation (CDCP)* programs and allowed community colleges to earn an enhanced noncredit funding rate for certain noncredit courses. Title 5, Section 55151 defines CDCP courses as: courses that are part of a short-term vocational program; courses in elementary and secondary basic skills; courses involving workforce preparation in the basic skills of speaking, listening, reading, writing, mathematics, decision-making, and problem solving skills that are necessary to participate in job-specific technical training; or courses in English as a Second Language and Vocational English as a Second Language. To be eligible for enhanced funding, a CDCP noncredit course must be part of a program or sequence of courses leading toward: a noncredit certificate of completion leading to improved employability or job opportunities; or a noncredit certificate of competency in a recognized career field articulated with degree applicable coursework, completion of an associate degree, or transfer to a baccalaureate institution. In addition, Title 5, Section 55151 requires that content and assessment standards for certificates be defined by the local curriculum committee and that each noncredit certificate program be approved by the governing board of the district.

ANALYSIS

The noncredit apportionment rate per Full Time Equivalent Student (FTES) is currently \$2,745. Courses that meet the criteria stated above are entitled to an enhance rate of \$3,232 per FTES, a \$487 difference.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve and certify the attached list of new noncredit certificate programs for Santiago Canyon College, Division of Continuing Education.

BACKGROUND

AGREEMENT

Occupational Therapy Assistant Program

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into the 8th day of December, 2009 by and between Karate for All, hereinafter called the Agency, and Rancho Santiago Community College District, hereinafter called the District.

PART I. BASIS AND PURPOSE OF AGREEMENT

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the District and Agency acknowledge a public obligation to contribute to Occupational Therapy Assistant Program education for the benefit for students and to meet community needs.

WHEREAS, the District provides programs in Occupational Therapy Assistant Program education, which require clinical experience for students, enrolled in these programs.

WHEREAS, the Agency has facilities suitable for the clinical needs of the District programs in the Occupational Therapy Assistant Program.

WHEREAS, it is to the benefit of both District and Agency that Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students have opportunities for clinical experience to enhance their capabilities as practitioners.

NOW, THEREFORE, the District and Agency do covenant and agree as follows:

PART II. GENERAL RESPONSIBILITIES AND PRIVILEGES OF THE COLLEGE

- A. For the Program in General
 - 1. The District will assume full responsibility for offering Occupational Therapy Assistant Program education programs eligible for accreditation by the appropriate State Board.
 - 2. District faculty members may be invited to serve as voluntary resource persons to the Agency staff by serving on Occupational Therapy Assistant Program care committees, by sharing knowledge as clinical experts, and by participation in other matters dealing with the quality of patient care.
 - 3. For Background clearance
 The District shall inform The Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students of
 the Background Check requirement and their responsibility of payment.
 - 4. For Student Workmen's Compensation
 The District shall carry Workmen's Compensation Insurance on students of the

District during clinical assignment, and keep records of clinical attendance for audit by the State Workmen's Compensation Insurance Fund.

B. For Program Planning

- 1. The District will initiate the development of mutually acceptable clinical instruction plans for using the Agency's clinical areas to meet the educational goals of Occupational Therapy Assistant Program curricula. These plans will be made available to the Agency at a mutually agreed upon time prior to the beginning of the school term and subject to revision in instances of conflicts with agency patient care responsibilities and/or District interests.
- 2. The District has the privilege of regularly scheduled meetings with Agency staff, including both selected Agency personnel and administrative level representatives for the purpose of interpreting, discussing, and evaluating the educational program in occupational therapy.

C. For Occupational Therapy Assistant Program Students

1. The District will be responsible for assuring that Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students assigned to the Agency for clinical instruction meet both District and Agency standards of health and physical fitness, and shall provide certification that the Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students have been immunized against the common communicable diseases.

PART III. GENERAL RESPONSIBILITIES AND PRIVILEGES OF THE AGENCY

A. For the Program in General

- 1. The Agency will maintain the standards, which make it eligible for approval as a clinical area for instruction in accredited Occupational Therapy Assistant Program programs. To further this, the Agency agrees to provide and maintain personnel who are in its opinion, capable and qualified in those divisions in which students are placed.
- 2. The administration of the service and patient care at the Agency shall be the responsibility of and under the control and supervision of the Agency and shall be administered through the Agency staff.
- 3. The Agency will designate a staff member who will function as Education Coordinator for Occupational Therapy Assistant Program education uses of the Agency facilities, including joint planning and representatives of all involved Occupational Therapy Assistant Program programs.
- 4. The Agency will provide orientation for students and faculty to familiarize them with Agency policies and facilities before assigning them to duties at the Agency.

- 5. The Agency will permit its employees to participate in the educational program as resource persons and clinical experts provided such participation does not interfere with assigned duties.
- The Agency will permit the faculty and students of the District to use its patient care and patient service facilities for clinical education according to approved curricula.
- 7. The Agency will confer with the District prior to making a commitment for new or expanded use of its clinical facilities by any other Occupational Therapy Assistant Program that interfere with current student placement.

B. For Services and Facilities

- 1. The Agency will permit the educational use of such supplies and equipment as are commonly available for patient care.
- 2. The Agency will permit use of the following facilities and services by District Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students and faculty at such times and to the degrees considered feasible by the agency.
 - a. Parking areas.
 - b. Locker, storage and dressing facilities.
 - c. Same food services as are available for Agency staff.
 - d. First aid treatment with written consent required for minors.
 - e. Access to sources of information for education purposes such as:
 - 1. Patient's chart.
 - 2. Procedure guides policy manuals.
 - 3. Medical dictionaries, pharmacology references, and other references suitable to the clinical area.
 - 4. Books and periodicals in the Medical library.

C. For the Control of District Personnel

1. The Agency may refuse access to its clinical areas to Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students or district faculty who do not meet its employee standards for safety, health, cooperation, or ethical behavior pending investigation and resolution of the matter by the Agency and the District.

PART IV. JOINT RESPONSIBILITIES AND PRIVILEGES

A. For publications

 Publication by District faculty, or Agency staff members of any material relative to their clinical experience, that has not been approved for release by the District and Agency signers of this agreement, is prohibited.

B. Insurance:

Without limiting the indemnification obligations stated below, each party to the Agreement shall maintain and secure at its own expense comprehensive general liability, property damage insurance, and professional liability of not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and three million dollars (\$3,000,000) in the aggregate, and said policy shall remain in full force and effect during the term hereof. Thirty (30) days written notice shall be provided to the other party prior to cancellation, or reduction in said insurance. Upon request, the requesting party shall be provided a copy of said policy.

C. Indemnification

All parties to this Agreement shall agree to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the other part, its officers, agents, employees, and volunteers, from and against all loss, cost, and expense arising out of any liability or claim of liability, sustained or claimed to have been sustained, arising out of the activities, or the performance or nonperformance of obligations under this Agreement, of the indemnifying party, or those of any of its officers, agents, employees, or volunteers. The provision of the Article do not apply to any damage or losses caused solely by the negligence or intentional acts of the non-indemnifying party or any of its agents or employees.

PART V. STATUS OF OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY ASSISTANT STUDENTS

- A. Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students shall have the status as learners and shall not be considered to be Agency employees nor shall they replace Agency staff. Any service rendered by the student during the experience is to be considered in addition to planned patient care in that area. Clinical experience will be conducted as a laboratory learning experience. The Agency will provide regular staffing for patient care in areas where students are obtaining clinical experience.
- B. Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students are subject to the authority, policies, and regulations of the district. They are also subject, during clinical assignment, to applicable agency regulations and must conform to the same standards as are for Agency employees in matters relating to the welfare of patients and general Agency operations.
- C. Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students shall be responsible for proper coverage in regard to malpractice insurance, or any other liability insurance that might be required by either the District or the Agency.
- D. The District will be responsible for assuring that health care students assigned to the Agency for clinical instruction meet both District and Agency standards of health and physical fitness.

PART VI. PERIOD OF AGREEMENT, TERMINATION

A. This agreement shall be effective as of the date signed, and shall continue in effect for five years, unless terminated earlier by written notice of either party. Either party to this Agreement may, in its sole discretion, terminate this Agreement with or without cause by giving the other party at least 30 days' prior written notice. In the event the Agreement is terminated for cause, all of the obligations of the terminating party shall be waived immediately upon written notice of termination. In the event of termination without cause, the parties agree to fulfill their respective obligations associated with the current term or semester, prior to such termination becoming effective.

One of the requirements for bonds that are approved under the auspices of Proposition 39 is the provision of a citizens' bond oversight committee comprised of residents of the district who satisfy various categories of membership. The board approved the membership of the original committee in December of 2002 and acts upon the appointment, reappointment and reaffirmation of the committee each year.

BACKGROUND

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) has allocated \$226 million in American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) funds for the California State Energy Commission to award under the State Energy Program (SEP). There is up to \$95 million of ARRA SEP funds available for the Municipal and Commercial Building Targeted Measure Retrofit Program (RFP #400-09-402). These funds are to be used for energy efficiency, energy conservation, renewable energy and other energy related projects and activities authorized by ARRA. Because ARRA has a set of wide-ranging policy goals as well as limitations regarding the life of the funds, the Energy Commission is seeking projects through an RFP process. SEP funds awarded through this RFP process will be directed to energy efficiency retrofits of nonresidential buildings and the energy consuming processes within these buildings (community colleges qualify). To be considered for funding, each proposal is limited to no more than \$20 million and no less than \$2 million. Public, nonprofit or private organizations are eligible to apply for these funds.

ANALYSIS

The RSCCD project identified as a possible funded project by the SEP funds is a district wide energy retrofitting project to install central plant operations (heating and chilling systems) at both campuses. This energy efficiency project was originally analyzed and developed by Siemens Building Technologies approximately three years ago. By having a completed energy audit and engineering analysis in a completed report, this report will serve as the technical submission for the RFP response. The total estimated cost of the proposed project is \$20 million. The Utility companies will provide the project a \$1 million match for energy savings and the RSCCD district will commit to a \$4 million match to enhance the probability of receiving the grant. The proposal seeks \$15 million from the SEP.

Our facilities consultant, Ron Beeler, is completing all of the required and necessary paperwork to respond to this RFP. The RFP is due at the California Energy Commission on December 21, 2009.

The RFP process is a point based competitive process. By having an approved resolution by the RSCCD Board of Trustees supporting the RFP submission, this will earn an additional four points for the submittal.

WHEREAS, the Governing Board of the Rancho Santiago Community College District (District) recognizes that it is in the interest of the regional, state, and national economy to stimulate the economy; create and retain jobs; reduce fossil emissions; and reduce total energy usage and improve energy efficiency within our jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, State Energy Program (SEP) funds are available for energy efficiency, energy conservation, and other energy-related projects and activities as authorized by the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA); and

WHEREAS, the District is eligible for ARRA SEP funding under the Municipal and Commercial Building Targeted Measure Retrofit (MCR) Program RFP 400-09-402; and,

WHEREAS, the District is proposing to implement the energy efficiency retrofit projects at the Santiago Canyon and Santa Ana Community College campuses. The proposed projects will be accomplished through a comprehensive replacement of aging equipment at the campuses, including new variable air volume (VAV) system, chillers, hot water heating systems, space heating, and energy management systems (EMS). These projects will allow the District to incorporate innovative solutions and the latest energy efficient equipment to significantly reduce energy usage at each campus. A comprehensive monitoring-based commissioning (MBCx) project, in combination with an intensive energy usage study, will be performed to assure that these projects fit the campus Master Plan and provide the best possible energy savings/capital outlay.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that in compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), the Board of Trustees does hereby find that the approval of the energy efficiency projects described above would qualify under a Class I Categorical Exemption on the state side and on the federal side it would qualify under a Section B5.1 of the Department of Energy National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) implementing procedures. A CEQA Class 1 Categorical Exemption is allowed for projects that consist of the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing, or minor alteration of existing public or private structures, facilities, mechanical equipment, or topographical features, involving negligible or no expansion of use beyond that existing at the time of the lead agency's determination. The key consideration is whether the project involves negligible or no expansion of an existing use.

Section B5.1 of the Department of Energy NEPA implementing procedures describes the Categorical Exclusions (CEs) that are applicable to conservation, fossil and renewable

energy activities. CEs are allowed for actions to conserve energy, demonstrate potential energy conservation, and promote energy-efficiency that do not increase the indoor concentrations of potentially harmful substances. These actions may involve financial and technical assistance to individuals (such as builders, owners, consultants, designers), organizations (such as utilities), and state and local governments.

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees authorizes the submittal of the application to the Energy Commission's State Energy Program for funds under the Municipal and Commercial Building Targeted Measure Retrofit (MCR) Program RFP 400-09-402 to execute the proposed projects described above.

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED, if recommended for funding by the Energy Commission, the Board of Trustees authorizes the District to accept a grant award up to the amount of its application for \$15,000,000, and, that the Vice Chancellor, Business Operations/Fiscal Services, acting for the District is hereby authorized and empowered to execute in the name of the Rancho Santiago Community College District all necessary contracts and agreements, and amendments hereto, to implement and carry out the purposes specified in the application.

BACKGROUND

Each year, the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office contracts with Rancho Santiago Community College District (RSCCD) to be the fiscal agent and coordinator of a Local Tech Prep Consortium. In addition to RSCCD, partners in this consortium are the Garden Grove Unified School District (GGUSD), Orange Unified School District (OUSD), and Santa Ana Unified School District (SAUSD). The State Chancellor's Office has renewed the District's Tech Prep funding for 09/10 and the District wishes to renew the sub-award agreements with local partners.

ANALYSIS

The RSCCD Tech Prep Consortium has received a grant (Grant # 09-139-053) to fund Tech Prep activities for fiscal year 2009/2010. The Local Tech Prep Work Plan for 2009/2010 specifies the allocation of \$27,000 to the partners for Tech Prep activities within their respective educational systems. SUB-AWARD AGREEMENT BETWEEN RANCHO SANTIAGO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT AND THE

GARDEN GROVE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR THE

CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION IMPROVEMENT ACT OF 2006 TECH PREP CONSORTIUM

This Agreement is entered into between Rancho Santiago Community College District (hereinafter "RSCCD") and the Garden Grove Unified School District (hereinafter "GGUSD") for the delivery of services provided in Article I, A, Statement of Work, and in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth herein.

This Subgrant Agreement is awarded under the authority of the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges under the Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Improvement (Perkins IV) Act of 2006 (P.L. 109-270), to fund the Tech Prep Consortium Project Agreement No. 09-139-053.

ARTICLE I PERFORMANCE AND DELIVERY

A. Statement of Work

RSCCD shall expand efforts to bring together community colleges to share ideas, concepts, and mutual concerns of Tech Prep programs for the benefit of students of the GGUSD.

GGUSD shall utilize funding provided under this Agreement to support any of the following kinds of Tech Prep activities for teachers, students, or administrators:

- 1) Articulation Activities
- 2) Work-based Learning
- 3) Service Learning
- 4) Career Planning
- 5) Integration of academic and vocational education
- 6) Job-shadowing
- 7) Implementation of PATHFINDER
- 8) Implementation of Career Explorer, Bridges, and other Web-based career guidance programs
- 9) Curriculum development mini-grants
- 10) Activities related to teaching to "all aspects of industry"
- 11) Teacher in-service mini-grants
- 12) Internships
- 13) Implementation of SCANS through the curriculum
- 14) Data collection

- 15) Career speakers
- 16) Development of business partners
- 17) OR other mutually agreed upon activities

An activities and spending plan must be submitted to the Tech Prep Consortia Director and approved by him before expenditures can be made.

Funding is for developmental work only and is not to be used for equipment purchases.

B. Travel

Only travel necessary to the project is allowed. Out-of-State travel requires prior approval of the Chancellor's Office Project Monitor and Tech Prep Consortium Director. The state reserves the right to limit Out-of-State travel.

C. Period of Performance

The period of performance for this subcontract shall be from July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2010.

D. Total Cost

The total cost to **RSCCD** for the performance of this subcontract shall not exceed \$9,000, to be paid in accordance with the terms set forth in Article II, C.

E. <u>Delivery</u>

All final materials and reports required under this subcontract shall be completed and delivered to **RSCCD** on or before July 10, 2010. The final report shall conform to the report format provided in **Exhibit 1** to this Agreement.

ARTICLE II COST, PAYMENT AND INVOICING

A. Allowable Costs and Fees

The allowable costs and fees eligible for reimbursement to GGUSD for performance of this Agreement shall be determined in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.

B. Payment

Payment will be made on a cost reimbursement basis by RSCCD to the GGUSD on a quarterly basis upon presentation of the GGUSD's itemized, properly formatted and timely invoice. Additionally, GGUSD shall provide a Quarterly Expenditure and Progress Report (as shown in Exhibit 2).

RSCCD shall not pay any invoice where the total payments would result in a cumulative payment in excess of the limitations established by Article I, C.

Invoices are due on the 10th day of the following months:

September 2009 December 2009 March 2010 June 2010

C. Invoicing

ARTICLE III GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

A. Documentation/Audit

GGUSD will maintain adequate financial records, in accordance with generally accepted accounting practices to clearly and easily identify expenses of the Agreement, to describe the nature of each expense and to establish relatedness to this Agreement. All records related to this Agreement shall be reasonably available for inspection by RSCCD and/or the State Auditor. The financial records of this Agreement shall be retained for a period of five (5) years after the final payment under the grant.

B. Subcontracts

This provision prohibits GGUSD from entering into a subcontract or subgrant without the additional written approval of the State's Project Monitor.

The Project Monitor's consent to one or more subcontracts or subgrants shall not constitute a waiver or diminution of the absolute power to approve each and every subsequent subcontract or subgrant.

C. Assignment

This Agreement may not be assigned in whole or in part by GGUSD without the prior written consent of RSCCD, which consent may be withheld by RSCCD in its sole and absolute discretion.

D. Termination

This Agreement may be terminated by either party upon thirty (30) days prior written notice to the other party, except that the termination of the Tech Prep Consortium Project Agreement No. 09-139-053 concurrently terminates this Agreement as of the same date. **GGUSD** shall be entitled to be compensated only for services rendered through the date of termination. Both parties agree to use all reasonable efforts to mitigate their expenses and obligations hereunder. This notice shall be deemed given when received or no later than three (3) days after the date of mailing whichever is sooner.

It is mutually understood between the parties that this subgrant may have been written before ascertaining the availability of congressional appropriation of funds, for the mutual benefit of both parties in order to avoid program and fiscal delays which would occur if the subgrant were executed after that determination was made.

This subgrant is valid and enforceable only if sufficient funds are made available to the State by the United States Federal Government for the current fiscal year for the purposes of this program. In addition, this subgrant is subject to any additional restrictions, limitations or conditions enacted by Congress which may affect the provisions, term or funding of this subgrant in any manner.

It is mutually agreed that if the Congress does not appropriate sufficient funds for the program, this grant shall be amended to reflect any reduction in funds.

The State has the option to void the grant under the thirty (30) day cancellation clause or to amend the grant to reflect any reduction of funds.

Any work performed prior to approval of the state or federal budget, as applicable, will be rendered on a voluntary basis, and shall not be compensated unless and until funding is authorized.

E. Compliance with Laws

GGUSD shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, rules, regulations and ordinances including worker's compensation in performing this Subcontract.

F. Document Disclosure

Any document or written report prepared for or under the direction of **RSCCD** or the State, in whole or in part by **GGUSD**, shall contain the grant number and dollar amount of the grant.

G. Work for Hire

- (1) GGUSD agrees that any and all services rendered, materials, inventions for processes, machines, manufacturers, or compositions of matter, and trademarks/servicemarks created, developed or produced pursuant to the subgrant agreement, shall be and are Work for Hire. All rights, title, and interest in and to the Work developed under this subcontract/Agreement/ subgrant shall be assigned and transferred to the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges. This Work for Hire agreement shall survive the expiration or early termination of this subgrant.
- (2) The copyright for all materials produced as a result of this Work for Hire agreement shall belong to the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges. GGUSD, and all subgrantees/subcontractors and others who produce copyright materials pursuant to the grant, assigns all rights, title and interest, including the copyright to any and all works created pursuant to this Work for Hire agreement, to the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges. The Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges shall acknowledge GGUSD or its Subgrantees or Subcontractors, if any, as the author of works produced pursuant to this Work for Hire agreement on all publications of such work. The Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges may license RSCCD or GGUSD or its Subgrantees or Subcontractors, if any, to reproduce and disseminate copies of such work, provided the licensee agrees not to permit infringement of the copyright by any person, to compensate the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges for any infringement which may occur, and to indemnify and hold harmless the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges for any and all claims arising out of or in connection with the licensing agreement. Said license shall include the right to create and use works derived from those created under this subgrant, even if such derivative works compete with those created under this subgrant.

All materials developed in draft and in final form pursuant to this subgrant shall, in a prominent place, bear the © (the letter "c" in a circle) or the word "Copyright," or the abbreviation "Copr."; followed by the year created; and the words "Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges." Acknowledgment may be given to RSCCD, or GGUSD or the actual author(s) of the work in an appropriate manner elsewhere in the copyright material. If it is deemed necessary by either the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges or the RSCCD or GGUSD that the copyright be registered with the U.S. Copyright Office, that party will be responsible for applying for, paying the filing fees for, and securing said copyright.

(3) All technical communications and records originated or prepared by the GGUSD or its Subgrantees or Subcontractors, if any, pursuant to this Work for Hire agreement including papers, reports, charts, computer programs, and technical schematics and diagrams, and other documentation, but not including GGUSD's administrative communications and records relating to this subgrant, shall be delivered to and shall become the exclusive property of the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges and may be copyrighted by the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges.

- (4) If it is deemed necessary by either the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges or GGUSD that a patent be obtained from the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office for any invention, process, machine, manufacturer, or composition of matter, GGUSD will be responsible for applying for, paying the filing fees for, and securing said patent. All patents for inventions, processes, machines, manufacturers, or compositions of matter developed pursuant to this subgrant shall be issued to the "Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges." All products and references to patents shall be marked and designated as such as required by law. Acknowledgment may be given to GGUSD or the actual inventor(s) in an appropriate manner. The Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges agrees to grant a nonexclusive license for such intellectual property to RSCCD or GGUSD, as appropriate. Said license shall include the right to use the patent inventions for processes, machines, manufacturers, or compositions of matter derived from those created under this subgrant.
- (5) All trademarks and servicemarks created, developed or acquired pursuant to this subgrant agreement shall be the property of the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges. If it is deemed necessary by either the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges, RSCCD, or the GGUSD that a trademark or servicemark be registered with state or federal agencies, GGUSD will be responsible for applying for, paying the filing fees for, and securing said protection. All trademarks and servicemarks obtained pursuant to this subgrant shall be issued to the "Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges" and carry the designations permitted or required by law. The Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges agrees to grant a nonexclusive license for the use of trademarks or servicemarks created, developed or obtained under this subgrant to GGUSD.
- (6) In connection with any license granted pursuant to the preceding paragraphs, GGUSD agrees not to permit infringement by any person, to compensate Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges for any infringement which may occur, and to indemnify and hold harmless the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges for any and all claims arising out of or in connection with such license. GGUSD may, with the permission of RSCCD and the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges, enter into a written sublicensing agreement subject to these same conditions.
- (7) Any and all services rendered, materials, inventions for processes, machines, manufacturers, or compositions of matter, and trademarks/servicemarks created, developed or produced pursuant to the subgrant agreement by subgrantees/subcontractors who create works for this subgrant for GGUSD are for and are the property of the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges. GGUSD shall obtain an acknowledgement of the work for hire performed

by these subgrantees/subcontractors who produce intellectual property pursuant to the grant agreement, and all rights, title, and interests in such property shall be assigned to the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges from all subgrantees/subcontractors. **GGUSD** shall incorporate the above applicable paragraphs, modified appropriately, into its agreements with subgrantees/subcontractors who create works for this grant. No unpaid volunteer or other person shall produce copyright materials under this subgrant without entering into a subgrant/subcontract between such person(s) and **GGUSD** giving the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges the foregoing rights in exchange for the payment of the sum of at least one dollar (\$1).

H. Federal Nondiscrimination Clause

In addition to complying with the requirements of provision X of this Agreement, Subcontractors receiving federal funds shall also comply with Titles VI and VII, Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. 2000 et seq.); Sections 503 and 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended (29 U.S.C. 793-794); Title IX, Education Amendments of 1972 (20 U.S.C. 1618 et seq.); Chapter 4 (beginning with Section 30), Division 1, Title 5, California Code of Regulations; California State Plan for Use of Carl D. Perkins Funds; and Section 613(a), Individuals with Disabilities Education Act of 1975, as amended.

I. Student Participation

No person shall be excluded from, or otherwise subjected to discrimination with respect to participation in any program or activity funded under this subgrant on the basis of ethnic group identification, national origin, religion, age, sex, race, color, ancestry, physical or mental disability, or sexual orientation. Such programs should not be designed, administered, or advertised in a manner which discourages participation by students on any of these bases. Any informational, advertising, or promotional materials regarding such programs may not include any statements to the effect that a program is for, or designed for students of a particular race, color, national origin, or ethnicity. In the event that mentoring or counseling services are provided with funding provided by this grant, students may not be paired with mentors or counselors based solely upon the race, color, national origin, or ethnicity of the students, mentors, or counselors. The Chancellor's Office may, by written approval of the Chancellor, grant an exception to the requirements of this paragraph where subgrantee provides documentation clearly demonstrating that designing a program for a particular group of students is justified under applicable legal standards as a remedy for past discrimination.

J. Eligibility for Non-citizens

Funds provided under this subgrant shall only be used to employ, contract with, or provides services to citizens of the United States or non-citizens who are eligible to receive public benefits pursuant to Section 4001 (with respect to federally funded activities) or Section 411 (with respect to state funded activities) of the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996, P.L. 104-193.

K. Nondiscrimination Clause

During the performance of this subgrant, GGUSD and its subcontractors shall not unlawfully discriminate, harass, or allow harassment, against any employee or applicant for employment because of sex, race, color, ancestry, religious creed, national origin, physical disability (including HIV and AIDS), mental disability, medical condition (cancer), age (over 40), marital status, denial of family care leave or sexual orientation. GGUSD and its subcontractors shall insure that the evaluation and treatment of their employees and applicants for employment are free from such discrimination and harassment. GGUSD and its subcontractors shall comply with the provisions of the Fair Employment and Housing Act (Government Code Section 12900 et seq.) and the applicable regulations promulgated thereunder (California Code of Regulations, Title 2, Section 7285.0 et seq.). The applicable regulations of the Fair Employment and Housing Commission implementing Government Code Section 12990 (a-f), set forth in Chapter 5 of Division 4 of Title 2 of the California Code of Regulations are incorporated into this subcontract by reference and made a part hereof as if set forth in full. GGUSD and its subcontractors shall give written notice of their obligations under this clause to labor organizations with which they have a collective bargaining or other agreement.

L. Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990

By signing this Agreement, GGUSD assures the state that it complies with the Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA) of 1990, (42 U.S.C. 12101 et seq.), which prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability, as well as all applicable regulations and guidelines issued pursuant to the ADA. GGUSD shall upon request by any person, make any materials produced with subgrant funds available in Braille, large print, electronic text, or other appropriate alternate format. GGUSD shall establish policies and procedures to respond to such requests in a timely manner. All data-processing, telecommunications, and/or instructional equipment purchased under this grant (if allowed within the funding category) and all instructional software/resources purchased or developed under this subgrant shall, where feasible, be designed to permit use by persons with disabilities (including those who are visually impaired or hearing impaired) or appropriate adaptive equipment or software shall be purchased or developed to provide accessibility for persons with disabilities. Design of computer or web-based instructional material shall conform to guidelines of the Web Access Initiative (see http://www.w3.org/TR/WAI-WEBCONTENT/) or similar guidelines developed by the Chancellor's Office.

M. Drug-Free Workplace Certification

By signing this Agreement, GGUSD hereby certifies under penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of California that GGUSD will comply with the requirements of the Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1990 (Government Code Section 8350 et seq.) and will provide a drug-free workplace by taking the following actions:

(1) Publish a statement notifying employees that unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensation, possession, or use of a controlled substance is prohibited and specifying actions to be taken against employees for violations.

- (2) Establish a Drug-Free Awareness Program to inform employees about:
 - 1. The dangers of drug-abuse in the workplace;
 - 2. The person or organization's policy of maintaining a drug-free workplace;
 - 3. Any available counseling, rehabilitation, and employee assistance programs; and,
 - 4. Penalties that may be imposed upon employees for drug abuse violations.

O. Indemnification by GGUSD

GGUSD agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless RSCCD and its authorized agents, officers, trustees, volunteers, employees, and students, from any and all claims, actions, losses, damages and/or liability arising out of the performance of this Subcontract Agreement or from any cause whatsoever which may arise because of the negligence, misconduct or other fault of GGUSD, including any acts errors, or omissions of any officers, employees, instructors, or agents of GGUSD, for any costs and expenses incurred by RSCCD on account of any claims therefore except where such indemnification is prohibited by law.



SUB-AWARD AGREEMENT BETWEEN RANCHO SANTIAGO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT AND THE

ORANGE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR THE

CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION IMPROVEMENT ACT OF 2006 TECH PREP CONSORTIUM

This Agreement is entered into between Rancho Santiago Community College District (hereinafter "RSCCD") and the Orange Unified School District (hereinafter "OUSD") for the delivery of services provided in Article I, A, Statement of Work, and in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth herein.

This Subgrant Agreement is awarded under the authority of the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges under the Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Improvement (Perkins IV) Act of 2006 (P.L. 109-270), to fund the Tech Prep Consortium Project Agreement No. 09-139-053.

ARTICLE I PERFORMANCE AND DELIVERY

A. Statement of Work

RSCCD shall expand efforts to bring together community colleges to share ideas, concepts, and mutual concerns of Tech Prep programs for the benefit of students of the OUSD. OUSD shall utilize funding provided under this Agreement to support any of the following kinds of Tech Prep activities for teachers, students, or administrators:

- 1) Articulation Activities
- 2) Work-based Learning
- 3) Service Learning
- 4) Career Planning
- 5) Integration of academic and vocational education
- 6) Job-shadowing
- 7) Implementation of PATHFINDER
- 8) Implementation of Career Explorer, Bridges, and other Web-based career guidance programs
- 9) Curriculum development mini-grants
- 10) Activities related to teaching to "all aspects of industry"
- 11) Teacher in-service mini-grants
- 12) Internships
- 13) Implementation of SCANS through the curriculum
- 14) Data collection

15) Career speakers

16) Development of business partners

17) OR other mutually agreed upon activities

An activities and spending plan must be submitted to the Tech Prep Consortia Director and approved by him before expenditures can be made.

Funding is for developmental work only and is not to be used for equipment purchases.

B. Travel

Only travel necessary to the project is allowed. Out-of-State travel requires prior approval of the Chancellor's Office Project Monitor and Tech Prep Consortium Director. The state reserves the right to limit Out-of-State travel.

C. Period of Performance

The period of performance for this subcontract shall be from July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2010.

D. Total Cost

The total cost to **RSCCD** for the performance of this subcontract shall not exceed \$9,000, to be paid in accordance with the terms set forth in Article II, C.

E. Delivery

All final materials and reports required under this subcontract shall be completed and delivered to **RSCCD** on or before July 10, 2009. The final report shall conform to the report format provided in **Exhibit 1** to this Agreement.

ARTICLE II COST, PAYMENT AND INVOICING

A. Allowable Costs and Fees

The allowable costs and fees eligible for reimbursement to OUSD for performance of this Agreement shall be determined in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.

B. Payment

Payment will be made on a cost reimbursement basis by RSCCD to the OUSD on a quarterly basis upon presentation of the OUSD's itemized, properly formatted and timely invoice. Additionally, OUSD shall provide a Quarterly Expenditure and Progress Report (as shown in Exhibit 2).

RSCCD shall not pay any invoice where the total payments would result in a cumulative payment in excess of the limitations established by Article I, C.

Invoices are due on the 10th day of the following months:

September 2009 December 2009 March 2010 June 2010

C. Invoicing

Invoices shall be submitted with the following required information and in the following manner:

ARTICLE III GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

A. Documentation/Audit

OUSD will maintain adequate financial records, in accordance with generally accepted accounting practices to clearly and easily identify expenses of the Agreement, to describe the nature of each expense and to establish relatedness to this Agreement. All records related to this Agreement shall be reasonably available for inspection by RSCCD and/or the State Auditor. The financial records of this Agreement shall be retained for a period of five (5) years after the final payment under the grant.

B. Subcontracts

This provision prohibits OUSD from entering into a subcontract or subgrant without the additional written approval of the State's Project Monitor.

The Project Monitor's consent to one or more subcontracts or subgrants shall not constitute a waiver or diminution of the absolute power to approve each and every subsequent subcontract or subgrant.

C. Assignment

This Agreement may not be assigned in whole or in part by OUSD without the prior written consent of RSCCD, which consent may be withheld by RSCCD in its sole and absolute discretion.

D. Termination

This Agreement may be terminated by either party upon thirty (30) days prior written notice to the other party, except that the termination of the Tech Prep Consortium Project Agreement No. 09-139-053 concurrently terminates this Agreement as of the same date. OUSD shall be entitled to be compensated only for services rendered through the date of termination. Both parties agree to use all reasonable efforts to mitigate their expenses and obligations hereunder. This notice shall be deemed given when received or no later than three (3) days after the date of mailing whichever is sooner.

It is mutually understood between the parties that this subgrant may have been written before ascertaining the availability of congressional appropriation of funds, for the mutual benefit of both parties in order to avoid program and fiscal delays which would occur if the subgrant were executed after that determination was made.

This subgrant is valid and enforceable only if sufficient funds are made available to the State by the United States Federal Government for the current fiscal year for the purposes of this program. In addition, this subgrant is subject to any additional restrictions, limitations or conditions enacted by Congress which may affect the provisions, term or funding of this subgrant in any manner.

It is mutually agreed that if the Congress does not appropriate sufficient funds for the program, this grant shall be amended to reflect any reduction in funds.

The State has the option to void the grant under the thirty (30) day cancellation clause or to amend the grant to reflect any reduction of funds.

Any work performed prior to approval of the state or federal budget, as applicable, will be rendered on a voluntary basis, and shall not be compensated unless and until funding is authorized.

E. Compliance with Laws

OUSD shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, rules, regulations and ordinances including worker's compensation in performing this Subcontract.

F. Document Disclosure

Any document or written report prepared for or under the direction of RSCCD or the State, in whole or in part by OUSD, shall contain the grant number and dollar amount of the grant.

G. Work for Hire

(1) OUSD agrees that any and all services rendered, materials, inventions for processes, machines, manufacturers, or compositions of matter, and trademarks/servicemarks created, developed or produced pursuant to the subgrant agreement, shall be and are Work for Hire. All rights, title, and interest in and to the Work developed under this subcontract/Agreement/ subgrant shall be assigned and transferred to the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges. This Work for Hire agreement shall survive the expiration or early termination of this subgrant.

(2) The copyright for all materials produced as a result of this Work for Hire agreement shall belong to the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges. **OUSD**, and all subgrantees/subcontractors and others who produce copyright materials pursuant to the grant, assigns all rights, title and interest, including the copyright to any and all works created pursuant to this Work for Hire agreement, to the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges. The Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges shall acknowledge OUSD or its Subgrantees or Subcontractors, if any, as the author of works produced pursuant to this Work for Hire agreement on all publications of such work. The Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges may license RSCCD or OUSD or its Subgrantees or Subcontractors, if any, to reproduce and disseminate copies of such work, provided the licensee agrees not to permit infringement of the copyright by any person, to compensate the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges for any infringement which may occur, and to indemnify and hold harmless the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges for any and all claims arising out of or in connection with the licensing agreement. Said license shall include the right to create and use works derived from those created under this subgrant, even if such derivative works compete with those created under this subgrant.

All materials developed in draft and in final form pursuant to this subgrant shall, in a prominent place, bear the © (the letter "c" in a circle) or the word "Copyright," or the abbreviation "Copr."; followed by the year created; and the words "Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges." Acknowledgment may be given to RSCCD, or OUSD or the actual author(s) of the work in an appropriate manner elsewhere in the copyright material. If it is deemed necessary by either the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges or the RSCCD or OUSD that the copyright be registered with the U.S. Copyright Office, that party will be responsible for applying for, paying the filing fees for, and securing said copyright.

- (3) All technical communications and records originated or prepared by the OUSD or its Subgrantees or Subcontractors, if any, pursuant to this Work for Hire agreement including papers, reports, charts, computer programs, and technical schematics and diagrams, and other documentation, but not including OUSD's administrative communications and records relating to this subgrant, shall be delivered to and shall become the exclusive property of the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges and may be copyrighted by the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges.
- (4) If it is deemed necessary by either the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges or OUSD that a patent be obtained from the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office for any invention, process, machine, manufacturer, or composition of matter, OUSD will be responsible for applying for, paying the filing fees for, and securing said patent. All patents for inventions, processes, machines, manufacturers, or compositions of matter developed pursuant to this subgrant shall be issued to the "Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges." All products and

- references to patents shall be marked and designated as such as required by law. Acknowledgment may be given to OUSD or the actual inventor(s) in an appropriate manner. The Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges agrees to grant a nonexclusive license for such intellectual property to RSCCD or OUSD, as appropriate. Said license shall include the right to use the patent inventions for processes, machines, manufacturers, or compositions of matter derived from those created under this subgrant.
- (5) All trademarks and servicemarks created, developed or acquired pursuant to this subgrant agreement shall be the property of the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges. If it is deemed necessary by either the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges, RSCCD, or the OUSD that a trademark or servicemark be registered with state or federal agencies, OUSD will be responsible for applying for, paying the filing fees for, and securing said protection. All trademarks and servicemarks obtained pursuant to this subgrant shall be issued to the "Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges" and carry the designations permitted or required by law. The Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges agrees to grant a nonexclusive license for the use of trademarks or servicemarks created, developed or obtained under this subgrant to OUSD.
- (6) In connection with any license granted pursuant to the preceding paragraphs, OUSD agrees not to permit infringement by any person, to compensate Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges for any infringement which may occur, and to indemnify and hold harmless the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges for any and all claims arising out of or in connection with such license.

 OUSD may, with the permission of RSCCD and the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges, enter into a written sublicensing agreement subject to these same conditions.
- (7) Any and all services rendered, materials, inventions for processes, machines, manufacturers, or compositions of matter, and trademarks/servicemarks created, developed or produced pursuant to the subgrant agreement by subgrantees/subcontractors who create works for this subgrant for OUSD are for and are the property of the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges. OUSD shall obtain an acknowledgement of the work for hire performed by these subgrantees/subcontractors who produce intellectual property pursuant to the grant agreement, and all rights, title, and interests in such property shall be assigned to the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges from all subgrantees/subcontractors. OUSD shall incorporate the above applicable paragraphs, modified appropriately, into its agreements with subgrantees/subcontractors who create works for this grant. No unpaid volunteer or other person shall produce copyright materials under this subgrant without entering into a subgrant/subcontract between such person(s) and OUSD giving the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges the foregoing rights in exchange for the payment of the sum of at least one dollar (\$1).

H. Federal Nondiscrimination Clause

In addition to complying with the requirements of provision X of this Agreement, Subcontractors receiving federal funds shall also comply with Titles VI and VII, Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. 2000 et seq.); Sections 503 and 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended (29 U.S.C. 793-794); Title IX, Education Amendments of 1972 (20 U.S.C. 1618 et seq.); Chapter 4 (beginning with Section 30), Division 1, Title 5, California Code of Regulations; California State Plan for Use of Carl D. Perkins Funds; and Section 613(a), Individuals with Disabilities Education Act of 1975, as amended.

I. Student Participation

No person shall be excluded from, or otherwise subjected to discrimination with respect to participation in any program or activity funded under this subgrant on the basis of ethnic group identification, national origin, religion, age, sex, race, color, ancestry, physical or mental disability, or sexual orientation. Such programs should not be designed, administered, or advertised in a manner which discourages participation by students on any of these bases. Any informational, advertising, or promotional materials regarding such programs may not include any statements to the effect that a program is for, or designed for students of a particular race, color, national origin, or ethnicity. In the event that mentoring or counseling services are provided with funding provided by this grant, students may not be paired with mentors or counselors based solely upon the race, color, national origin, or ethnicity of the students, mentors, or counselors. The Chancellor's Office may, by written approval of the Chancellor, grant an exception to the requirements of this paragraph where subgrantee provides documentation clearly demonstrating that designing a program for a particular group of students is justified under applicable legal standards as a remedy for past discrimination.

J. Eligibility for Non-citizens

Funds provided under this subgrant shall only be used to employ, contract with, or provides services to citizens of the United States or non-citizens who are eligible to receive public benefits pursuant to Section 4001 (with respect to federally funded activities) or Section 411 (with respect to state funded activities) of the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996, P.L. 104-193.

K. Nondiscrimination Clause

During the performance of this subgrant, OUSD and its subcontractors shall not unlawfully discriminate, harass, or allow harassment, against any employee or applicant for employment because of sex, race, color, ancestry, religious creed, national origin, physical disability (including HIV and AIDS), mental disability, medical condition (cancer), age (over 40), marital status, denial of family care leave or sexual orientation. OUSD and its subcontractors shall insure that the evaluation and treatment of their employees and applicants for employment are free from such discrimination and harassment. OUSD and its subcontractors shall comply with the provisions of the Fair Employment and Housing Act (Government Code Section 12900 et seq.) and the applicable regulations promulgated thereunder (California Code of Regulations, Title 2, Section 7285.0 et seq.). The applicable regulations of the Fair Employment and Housing Commission implementing Government Code Section 12990 (a-f), set forth in Chapter 5 of Division 4 of Title 2 of the California

Code of Regulations are incorporated into this subcontract by reference and made a part hereof as if set forth in full. OUSD and its subcontractors shall give written notice of their obligations under this clause to labor organizations with which they have a collective bargaining or other agreement.

L. Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990

By signing this Agreement, OUSD assures the state that it complies with the Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA) of 1990, (42 U.S.C. 12101 et seq.), which prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability, as well as all applicable regulations and guidelines issued pursuant to the ADA. OUSD shall upon request by any person, make any materials produced with subgrant funds available in Braille, large print, electronic text, or other appropriate alternate format. OUSD shall establish policies and procedures to respond to such requests in a timely manner. All data-processing, telecommunications, and/or instructional equipment purchased under this grant (if allowed within the funding category) and all instructional software/resources purchased or developed under this subgrant shall, where feasible, be designed to permit use by persons with disabilities (including those who are visually impaired or hearing impaired) or appropriate adaptive equipment or software shall be purchased or developed to provide accessibility for persons with disabilities. Design of computer or web-based instructional material shall conform to guidelines of the Web Access Initiative (see http://www.w3.org/TR/WAI-WEBCONTENT/) or similar guidelines developed by the Chancellor's Office.

M. Drug-Free Workplace Certification

By signing this Agreement, OUSD hereby certifies under penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of California that OUSD will comply with the requirements of the Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1990 (*Government Code* Section 8350 et seq.) and will provide a drug-free workplace by taking the following actions:

- (1) Publish a statement notifying employees that unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensation, possession, or use of a controlled substance is prohibited and specifying actions to be taken against employees for violations.
- (2) Establish a Drug-Free Awareness Program to inform employees about:

1. The dangers of drug-abuse in the workplace;

- 2. The person or organization's policy of maintaining a drug-free workplace;
- Any available counseling, rehabilitation, and employee assistance programs; and,
- 4. Penalties that may be imposed upon employees for drug abuse violations.
- (3) Every employee who works the proposed grant will:

1. Receive a copy of the company's drug-free policy statement; and,

2. Agree to abide by the terms of the company's statement as a condition of employment on the grant.

N. Indemnification by RSCCD

RSCCD agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless OUSD and its officers, employees, agents, and volunteers from and all claims, actions, losses, damages and/or liability arising out of the performance of this Subcontract Agreement or from any cause whatsoever which

may arise because of the negligence, misconduct, or other fault of **RSCCD**, including any acts, errors, or omissions of any officers, employees, instructors, students, or agents of **RSCCD**, for any costs and expenses incurred by **OUSD** of account of any claims therefore except where such indemnification is prohibited by law.

O. Indemnification by OUSD

OUSD agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless RSCCD and its authorized agents, officers, trustees, volunteers, employees, and students, from any and all claims, actions, losses, damages and/or liability arising out of the performance of this Subcontract Agreement or from any cause whatsoever which may arise because of the negligence, misconduct or other fault of OUSD, including any acts errors, or omissions of any officers, employees, instructors, or agents of OUSD, for any costs and expenses incurred by RSCCD on account of any claims therefore except where such indemnification is prohibited by law.

SUB-AWARD AGREEMENT BETWEEN RANCHO SANTIAGO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT AND THE

SANTA ANA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR THE

CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION IMPROVEMENT ACT OF 2006 TECH PREP CONSORTIUM

This Agreement is entered into between Rancho Santiago Community College District (hereinafter "RSCCD") and the Santa Ana Unified School District (hereinafter "SAUSD") for the delivery of services provided in Article I, A, Statement of Work, and in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth herein.

This Subgrant Agreement is awarded under the authority of the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges under the Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Improvement (Perkins IV) Act of 2006 (P.L. 109-270), to fund the Tech Prep Consortium Project Agreement No. 09-139-053.

ARTICLE I PERFORMANCE AND DELIVERY

A. Statement of Work

RSCCD shall expand efforts to bring together community colleges to share ideas, concepts, and mutual concerns of Tech Prep programs for the benefit of students of the SAUSD.

SAUSD shall utilize funding provided under this Agreement to support any of the following kinds of Tech Prep activities for teachers, students, or administrators:

- 1) Articulation Activities
- 2) Work-based Learning
- 3) Service Learning
- 4) Career Planning
- 5) Integration of academic and vocational education
- 6) Job-shadowing
- 7) Implementation of PATHFINDER
- 8) Implementation of Career Explorer, Bridges, and other Web-based career guidance programs
- 9) Curriculum development mini-grants
- 10) Activities related to teaching to "all aspects of industry"
- 11) Teacher in-service mini-grants
- 12) Internships
- 13) Implementation of SCANS through the curriculum
- 14) Data collection

15) Career speakers

16) Development of business partners

17) OR other mutually agreed upon activities

An activities and spending plan must be submitted to the Tech Prep Consortia Director and approved by him before expenditures can be made.

Funding is for developmental work only and is not to be used for equipment purchases.

B. Travel

Only travel necessary to the project is allowed. Out-of-State travel requires prior approval of the Chancellor's Office Project Monitor and Tech Prep Consortium Director. The state reserves the right to limit Out-of-State travel.

C. Period of Performance

The period of performance for this subcontract shall be from July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2010.

D. Total Cost

The total cost to **RSCCD** for the performance of this subcontract shall not exceed \$9,000, to be paid in accordance with the terms set forth in Article II, C.

E. Delivery

All final materials and reports required under this subcontract shall be completed and delivered to **RSCCD** on or before July 10, 2009. The final report shall conform to the report format provided in **Exhibit 1** to this Agreement.

ARTICLE II COST, PAYMENT AND INVOICING

A. Allowable Costs and Fees

The allowable costs and fees eligible for reimbursement to SAUSD for performance of this Agreement shall be determined in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.

B. Payment

Payment will be made on a cost reimbursement basis by RSCCD to the SAUSD on a quarterly basis upon presentation of the SAUSD's itemized, properly formatted and timely invoice. Additionally, SAUSD shall provide a Quarterly Expenditure and Progress Report (as shown in Exhibit 2).

RSCCD shall not pay any invoice where the total payments would result in a cumulative payment in excess of the limitations established by Article I, C.

Invoices are due on the 10th day of the following months:

ARTICLE III GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

A. Documentation/Audit

SAUSD will maintain adequate financial records, in accordance with generally accepted accounting practices to clearly and easily identify expenses of the Agreement, to describe the nature of each expense and to establish relatedness to this Agreement. All records related to this Agreement shall be reasonably available for inspection by RSCCD and/or the State Auditor. The financial records of this Agreement shall be retained for a period of five (5) years after the final payment under the grant.

B. Subcontracts

This provision prohibits SAUSD from entering into a subcontract or subgrant without the additional written approval of the State's Project Monitor.

The Project Monitor's consent to one or more subcontracts or subgrants shall not constitute a waiver or diminution of the absolute power to approve each and every subsequent subcontract or subgrant.

C. Assignment

This Agreement may not be assigned in whole or in part by SAUSD without the prior written consent of RSCCD, which consent may be withheld by RSCCD in its sole and absolute discretion.

D. Termination

This Agreement may be terminated by either party upon thirty (30) days prior written notice to the other party, except that the termination of the Tech Prep Consortium Project Agreement No. 09-139-053 concurrently terminates this Agreement as of the same date. SAUSD shall be entitled to be compensated only for services rendered through the date of termination. Both parties agree to use all reasonable efforts to mitigate their expenses and obligations hereunder. This notice shall be deemed given when received or no later than three (3) days after the date of mailing whichever is sooner.

It is mutually understood between the parties that this subgrant may have been written before ascertaining the availability of congressional appropriation of funds, for the mutual benefit of both parties in order to avoid program and fiscal delays which would occur if the subgrant were executed after that determination was made.

This subgrant is valid and enforceable only if sufficient funds are made available to the State by the United States Federal Government for the current fiscal year for the purposes of this program. In addition, this subgrant is subject to any additional restrictions, limitations or conditions enacted by Congress which may affect the provisions, term or funding of this subgrant in any manner.

It is mutually agreed that if the Congress does not appropriate sufficient funds for the program, this grant shall be amended to reflect any reduction in funds.

The State has the option to void the grant under the thirty (30) day cancellation clause or to amend the grant to reflect any reduction of funds.

Any work performed prior to approval of the state or federal budget, as applicable, will be rendered on a voluntary basis, and shall not be compensated unless and until funding is authorized.

E. Compliance with Laws

SAUSD shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, rules, regulations and ordinances including worker's compensation in performing this Subcontract.

F. Document Disclosure

Any document or written report prepared for or under the direction of RSCCD or the State, in whole or in part by SAUSD, shall contain the grant number and dollar amount of the grant.

G. Work for Hire

(1) **SAUSD** agrees that any and all services rendered, materials, inventions for processes, machines, manufacturers, or compositions of matter, and trademarks/servicemarks

created, developed or produced pursuant to the subgrant agreement, shall be and are Work for Hire. All rights, title, and interest in and to the Work developed under this subcontract/Agreement/ subgrant shall be assigned and transferred to the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges. This Work for Hire agreement shall survive the expiration or early termination of this subgrant.

(2) The copyright for all materials produced as a result of this Work for Hire agreement shall belong to the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges. SAUSD, and all subgrantees/subcontractors and others who produce copyright materials pursuant to the grant, assigns all rights, title and interest, including the copyright to any and all works created pursuant to this Work for Hire agreement, to the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges. The Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges shall acknowledge SAUSD or its Subgrantees or Subcontractors, if any, as the author of works produced pursuant to this Work for Hire agreement on all publications of such work. The Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges may license RSCCD or SAUSD or its Subgrantees or Subcontractors, if any, to reproduce and disseminate copies of such work, provided the licensee agrees not to permit infringement of the copyright by any person, to compensate the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges for any infringement which may occur, and to indemnify and hold harmless the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges for any and all claims arising out of or in connection with the licensing agreement. Said license shall include the right to create and use works derived from those created under this subgrant, even if such derivative works compete with those created under this subgrant.

All materials developed in draft and in final form pursuant to this subgrant shall, in a prominent place, bear the © (the letter "c" in a circle) or the word "Copyright," or the abbreviation "Copr."; followed by the year created; and the words "Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges." Acknowledgment may be given to RSCCD, or SAUSD or the actual author(s) of the work in an appropriate manner elsewhere in the copyright material. If it is deemed necessary by either the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges or the RSCCD or SAUSD that the copyright be registered with the U.S. Copyright Office, that party will be responsible for applying for, paying the filing fees for, and securing said copyright.

(3) All technical communications and records originated or prepared by the SAUSD or its Subgrantees or Subcontractors, if any, pursuant to this Work for Hire agreement including papers, reports, charts, computer programs, and technical schematics and diagrams, and other documentation, but not including SAUSD's administrative communications and records relating to this subgrant, shall be delivered to and shall become the exclusive property of the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges and may be copyrighted by the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges.

- (4) If it is deemed necessary by either the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges or SAUSD that a patent be obtained from the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office for any invention, process, machine, manufacturer, or composition of matter, SAUSD will be responsible for applying for, paying the filing fees for, and securing said patent. All patents for inventions, processes, machines, manufacturers, or compositions of matter developed pursuant to this subgrant shall be issued to the "Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges." All products and references to patents shall be marked and designated as such as required by law. Acknowledgment may be given to SAUSD or the actual inventor(s) in an appropriate manner. The Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges agrees to grant a nonexclusive license for such intellectual property to RSCCD or SAUSD, as appropriate. Said license shall include the right to use the patent inventions for processes, machines, manufacturers, or compositions of matter derived from those created under this subgrant.
- (5) All trademarks and servicemarks created, developed or acquired pursuant to this subgrant agreement shall be the property of the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges. If it is deemed necessary by either the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges, RSCCD, or the SAUSD that a trademark or servicemark be registered with state or federal agencies, SAUSD will be responsible for applying for, paying the filing fees for, and securing said protection. All trademarks and servicemarks obtained pursuant to this subgrant shall be issued to the "Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges" and carry the designations permitted or required by law. The Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges agrees to grant a nonexclusive license for the use of trademarks or servicemarks created, developed or obtained under this subgrant to SAUSD.
- (6) In connection with any license granted pursuant to the preceding paragraphs, SAUSD agrees not to permit infringement by any person, to compensate Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges for any infringement which may occur, and to indemnify and hold harmless the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges for any and all claims arising out of or in connection with such license. SAUSD may, with the permission of RSCCD and the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges, enter into a written sublicensing agreement subject to these same conditions.
- (7) Any and all services rendered, materials, inventions for processes, machines, manufacturers, or compositions of matter, and trademarks/servicemarks created, developed or produced pursuant to the subgrant agreement by subgrantees/subcontractors who create works for this subgrant for SAUSD are for and are the property of the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges. SAUSD shall obtain an acknowledgement of the work for hire performed by these subgrantees/subcontractors who produce intellectual property pursuant to the grant agreement, and all rights, title, and interests in such property shall be assigned to the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges from all subgrantees/subcontractors. SAUSD shall incorporate the above applicable

paragraphs, modified appropriately, into its agreements with subgrantees/subcontractors who create works for this grant. No unpaid volunteer or other person shall produce copyright materials under this subgrant without entering into a subgrant/subcontract between such person(s) and SAUSD giving the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges the foregoing rights in exchange for the payment of the sum of at least one dollar (\$1).

H. Federal Nondiscrimination Clause

In addition to complying with the requirements of provision X of this Agreement, Subcontractors receiving federal funds shall also comply with Titles VI and VII, Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. 2000 et seq.); Sections 503 and 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as armended (29 U.S.C. 793-794); Title IX, Education Amendments of 1972 (20 U.S.C. 1618 et seq.); Chapter 4 (beginning with Section 30), Division 1, Title 5, California Code of Regulations; California State Plan for Use of Carl D. Perkins Funds; and Section 613(a), Individuals with Disabilities Education Act of 1975, as amended.

I. Student Participation

No person shall be excluded from, or otherwise subjected to discrimination with respect to participation in any program or activity funded under this subgrant on the basis of ethnic group identification, national origin, religion, age, sex, race, color, ancestry, physical or mental disability, or sexual orientation. Such programs should not be designed, administered, or advertised in a manner which discourages participation by students on any of these bases. Any informational, advertising, or promotional materials regarding such programs may not include any statements to the effect that a program is for, or designed for students of a particular race, color, national origin, or ethnicity. In the event that mentoring or counseling services are provided with funding provided by this grant, students may not be paired with mentors or counselors based solely upon the race, color, national origin, or ethnicity of the students, mentors, or counselors. The Chancellor's Office may, by written approval of the Chancellor, grant an exception to the requirements of this paragraph where subgrantee provides documentation clearly demonstrating that designing a program for a particular group of students is justified under applicable legal standards as a remedy for past discrimination.

J. Eligibility for Non-citizens

Funds provided under this subgrant shall only be used to employ, contract with, or provides services to citizens of the United States or non-citizens who are eligible to receive public benefits pursuant to Section 4001 (with respect to federally funded activities) or Section 411 (with respect to state funded activities) of the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996, P.L. 104-193.

K. Nondiscrimination Clause

During the performance of this subgrant, SAUSD and its subcontractors shall not unlawfully discriminate, harass, or allow harassment, against any employee or applicant for employment because of sex, race, color, ancestry, religious creed, national origin, physical disability (including HIV and AIDS), mental disability, medical condition (cancer), age (over 40), marital status, denial of family care leave or sexual orientation. SAUSD and its

subcontractors shall insure that the evaluation and treatment of their employees and applicants for employment are free from such discrimination and harassment. SAUSD and its subcontractors shall comply with the provisions of the Fair Employment and Housing Act (Government Code Section 12900 et seq.) and the applicable regulations promulgated thereunder (California Code of Regulations, Title 2, Section 7285.0 et seq.). The applicable regulations of the Fair Employment and Housing Commission implementing Government Code Section 12990 (a-f), set forth in Chapter 5 of Division 4 of Title 2 of the California Code of Regulations are incorporated into this subcontract by reference and made a part hereof as if set forth in full. SAUSD and its subcontractors shall give written notice of their obligations under this clause to labor organizations with which they have a collective bargaining or other agreement.

L. Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990

By signing this Agreement, SAUSD assures the state that it complies with the Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA) of 1990, (42 U.S.C. 12101 et seq.), which prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability, as well as all applicable regulations and guidelines issued pursuant to the ADA. SAUSD shall upon request by any person, make any materials produced with subgrant funds available in Braille, large print, electronic text, or other appropriate alternate format. SAUSD shall establish policies and procedures to respond to such requests in a timely manner. All data-processing, telecommunications, and/or instructional equipment purchased under this grant (if allowed within the funding category) and all instructional software/resources purchased or developed under this subgrant shall, where feasible, be designed to permit use by persons with disabilities (including those who are visually impaired or hearing impaired) or appropriate adaptive equipment or software shall be purchased or developed to provide accessibility for persons with disabilities. Design of computer or web-based instructional material shall conform to guidelines of the Web Access Initiative (see http://www.w3.org/TR/WAI-WEBCONTENT/) or similar guidelines developed by the Chancellor's Office.

M. <u>Drug-Free Workplace Certification</u>

By signing this Agreement, SAUSD hereby certifies under penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of California that SAUSD will comply with the requirements of the Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1990 (Government Code Section 8350 et seq.) and will provide a drug-free workplace by taking the following actions:

- (1) Publish a statement notifying employees that unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensation, possession, or use of a controlled substance is prohibited and specifying actions to be taken against employees for violations.
- (2) Establish a Drug-Free Awareness Program to inform employees about:
 - 1. The dangers of drug-abuse in the workplace;
 - 2. The person or organization's policy of maintaining a drug-free workplace;
 - 3. Any available counseling, rehabilitation, and employee assistance programs; and,

SAUSD agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless RSCCD and its authorized agents, officers, trustees, volunteers, employees, and students, from any and all claims, actions, losses, damages and/or liability arising out of the performance of this Subcontract Agreement or from any cause whatsoever which may arise because of the negligence, misconduct or other fault of SAUSD, including any acts errors, or omissions of any officers, employees, instructors, or agents of SAUSD, for any costs and expenses incurred by RSCCD on account of any claims therefore except where such indemnification is prohibited by law.



Townsend Public Affairs (TPA) has worked on behalf of students, faculty, and the administration of Rancho Santiago Community College District (RSCCD) to secure funding for key projects including the Tessman Planetarium and Garden Grove Nursing Education complex; troubleshoot regulatory issues; and ensure the district remains at the forefront of policy development in Sacramento and Washington, D.C.

ANALYSIS

Proposal for Advocacy Services

Our firm has a long and successful history working on behalf of the students, faculty and leadership of the Rancho Santiago Community College District. In cooperation with District leadership and staff we have been honored to play a role in securing funding for key projects and working to protect the District's resources through the legislative and budget processes in Sacramento and Washington, D.C. Having worked so closely with the District over the years, we are acutely aware of the challenges brought about by the stagnant economy, in general, and the state's budget crisis in particular. As such, we have sought to provide significant and tangible value for the investment the District has made in our services, including:

- Forging a partnership between the Tessman Planetarium at Santa Ana College, Discovery Science Center and NASA that resulted in \$750,000 in improvements to the Planetarium and expanded educational programs in the local community.
- Sponsoring and advocating AB 212 (Correa) in 2002, which played a critical role
 in securing the site on the Tustin Marine Base, worth millions of dollars, that is
 now the Sheriff's Training Academy.
- Working closely with District staff and the state's Division of the State Architect to expedite the approval of plans for the library at Santiago Canyon College.
- Securing nearly \$500,000 in funding through appropriations earmarks in the past two federal budget cycles for the Garden Grove Nursing Education Complex.
- Lobbying, as part of a statewide coalition the District helped develop, to expand funding for Basic Skills development by \$30 million.
- Advocating the needs of the District and its colleges on a range of legislation affecting not only broader educational resources, but also specific programs in which serve both students and the community.
- Ensuring that the District has remained at the forefront of policy and budget development to help mitigate the impacts of the struggling state budget.

While budget challenges persist this is also a time of unprecedented opportunity, particularly in the area of funding, with sweeping legislation being considered on the federal level that will impact the entire higher education system. The annual federal budget appropriations process is also set to begin, and we've had great success in that process for the District over the years. And of course the state is still facing daunting fiscal challenges that will need to be addressed through the budget cycle that will kick off in earnest in the first week of January.

To help ensure that the District is in a position to maximize its efforts in these key funding areas, we propose a targeted scope of work to focus on the following initiatives:

American Graduation Initiative: Student Aid and Fiscal Responsibility Act (SAFRA) - HR 3221

This legislation holds the potential to shape the administration of billions of dollars in funding over the next several years and is without question the most significant initiative affecting the future of community colleges on the national level. To that end, our DC team has leveraged our strong relationships with relevant committee staff to provide an unparalleled opportunity to provide input into this process.

Most recently, our DC team met with staff from the Senate Health, Education, Labor and Pensions Committee and the House Education and Labor Committee to discuss HR 3221. As you probably know, the House has passed this legislation, which basically included the President's education initiatives outlined in July. The Senate is working on its version, which will likely include most of the same programs, but probably with different funding and program guidelines. Most specifically, they do not want program funds to go through the state, but would like non-for-profits and community college districts to be able to apply directly for funds. They also will likely increase funding for some programs, which could include community college initiatives.

As consideration of this legislation continues, opportunities to impact its overall direction will grow more limited. Given its status among the leadership of California's community colleges, Rancho Santiago is in a great position to be a strong voice, and your team possesses a strong knowledge of the issues affecting the breadth of districts here in California and even across the country. Our team stands ready to help you engage in this process and, of course, to maximize opportunities once the legislation has passed.

FY11 Federal Appropriations Process

With the request submission process shifting to early February over the past couple years, now is the time to begin crafting and developing funding requests to be submitted through the District's Congressional members. Our approach is to work with staff from both your elected representatives and the staff from the appropriate appropriations subcommittee to ensure that the request(s) submitted have full support and that we have adequate time to answer any questions or requests for information.

Proposed Actions:

- Meet immediately with RSCCD staff and key personnel to assess potential projects for submission.
- Develop one-page summaries suitable for engagement with key staff in the Capitol.
- Conduct meetings with Congressional and subcommittee staff to assess potential for each potential request, as well as to assess the need for additional information and local support.
- Assist the District in identifying conducting outreach to local elected officials, community groups and other sources of support.
- Ensure submission of requests prior to the end of the calendar year, allowing for continued response to information requests and other troubleshooting well in advance of actual submission deadlines.
- Once requests are submitted, work directly with member staff and subcommittee staff to ensure priority ranking of each request as part of the member submission process.

Legislative Tracking and Monitoring

The breadth of legislative proposals made each two-year session, and the extent to which these proposals might impact the District and its students, requires a comprehensive approach to tracking and monitoring legislation from the time it is introduced all the way through the legislative process. Our advanced, online legislative tracking system can provide customized, continually updated reports on legislation at any time.

In addition, our team will provide both ad hoc and regularly scheduled reports on legislation, whether to the Board of Trustees, a legislative committee or whatever venue the District requires. We can serve as an extension of your staff in conducting these meetings, providing great leverage for your staff resources. This provides a significant savings of time and resources on the part of District staff, who are already stretched thin.

Support for Funding, Budget and Legislative Initiatives

While our focus would be the appropriations process, during the time of our engagement, our team would provide support to the District's overall advocacy efforts with regard to ongoing or potential funding opportunities (e.g. the allied health program or other stimulus-related opportunities), assist with advocacy related to the state budget for community colleges, and, of course, provide information and analysis regarding emerging legislative initiatives, including maintaining a priority legislative matrix. These services are a standard part of any engagement, and would help provide the District with the ability to leverage existing staff resources.

Additionally, with our offices in Sacramento and Washington, DC, our team can provide leverage to the District's scaled-back travel budgets by providing on-the-ground support and service with no additional cost to the District. This could be a very helpful way to provide critical support to the District's advocacy-related initiatives, while conserving precious resources at a difficult time.

Other Tasks as Assigned

Throughout the many years our team has served the Rancho Santiago Community College District, we have taken great pride in providing a comprehensive level of service to the District. Your priorities are our priorities and we relish the opportunity to add value to any and all initiatives the District chooses to pursue.

Cost Proposal

Because of our unique capabilities on both the state and federal levels, TPA is able to craft cost proposals that maximize limited resources without limiting the District's reach. While fees of \$7,500 to \$10,000 per month are standard for state and federal lobbying firms when working separately, we are pleased to offer a discounted rate of \$6,000 per month for this engagement. As always, our contract will include a 30-day, no-fault termination clause that ensures a consistently high level of service and a mutual agreement on the value that TPA adds to the District's initiatives.
