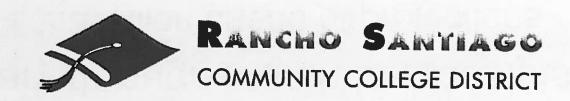

Board of Trustees Meeting May 10, 2010

Budget Update What's New?

- April state personal income tax revenues
 - Estimated \$10.2 billion for April
 - Actual \$7.1 billion
 - Shortfall of \$3.1 billion
- Combined April shortfall is \$3.6 billion below estimates included in January Budget Proposal
- January through March tax receipts
 - Up \$ 2.3 billion ahead of projections

Budget Update

- The good news of January through April was immediately wiped out by bad news of April tax collection shortfall
- Now combined California's deficit has grown by \$1.3 billion more than earlier projected
- Shortfall in April exacerbates state budget crisis
 - Legislature expected earlier economic recovery and earlier tax collection increases to help offset and minimize state budget crisis

Budget Update

- May Revise due this Friday, May 14th
- Most likely scenario is that the starting point will be the Governor's January Budget proposal with adjustments for updated revenue shortfall estimates (\$1.3 billion) and less than expected federal revenues (\$3 to \$4 billion)
 - However, Legislature made minor budget adjustments of \$1.3 billion in March

Budget Update

- ▶ \$20 billion budget imbalance may grow to possibly \$21 to \$23 billion (or more)
 - Depending on increased state expenses and recent lost court decisions
- Governor's January Budget Proposal
 - \$19.9 billion state budget imbalance at that time
 - LAO estimated \$20.7 billion in November

Governor's January Budget Proposal

- ► Negative COLA (0.38%)
 - Actual rate now (0.39%)
- 2.21% Growth statewide
 - Would help offset this year's workload measure reductions (negative growth)
- Additional categorical program reductions
- No student tuition fee increase proposed by Governor
 - LAO recommends \$40/unit

RDA conflict with state/cities/education

- Redevelopment Agencies (RDA) revenue shift
 - Public relations concern
 - \$2.05 billion used to balance this year's state budget (\$1.7 billion) and the following year (\$350 million)
- Court ruled last week that it was ok for state to do it
 - If lost, would have added another \$2 billion to current state budget shortfall
- RDA funds come from local property taxes. This increment of property taxes used for RDAs primarily comes from local school districts' and community colleges' property tax collections.
- The state historically makes up the difference (backfill) to local K-14 districts.
- State now wants to transfer the RDA tax increment back to K-14, thereby relieving the state of this funding shift backfill (helps the state, "wash" for K-14 education)
- "double-edged sword" in that K-14 education also receives, under law, redevelopment funds annually to support capital facilities improvements

What's going to happen next?

- Governor's commitment to protect higher education recently renewed?
- ► Prop 98 funding levels?
 - Non education vs. Prop 98
 - K-12 vs. community colleges
- Will the State Legislature continue to intentionally ignore state budget crisis?
 - Election year
 - Wait even longer for economic recovery?

RSCCD Budget Process What's next?

- RSCCD Tentative Budget to Board of Trustees on June 21st
 - Will <u>not</u> include adjustments from the May Revise
- ≥ 2010-2011 Adopted Budget
 - -September 2010
 - New assumptions dependent on May Revise and possible approved state budget

FARSCCD Contract Proposal for 2009-2011

April 30, 2010

Article 4 -- Leaves

4.14 -- Sabbatical Leave

For 2010-11, sabbatical leaves will be granted according to current contract language.

4.16 -- Banking Leave

For 2010-11, banking leaves will be approved according to the contract:

Banked LHE/hours may be utilized to release the faculty member from a portion of his/her contractual obligation, and may be used for professional or personal reasons.

Additionally and specifically, applications for banking leave will be approved for any of the following:

- a. if the faculty member and the administrator agree that the leave is necessary to make load;
- b. if the leave precedes the retirement/resignation of the faculty member prior to the start of the following academic year; or
- c. if the leave is necessary due to a family hardship or medical situation.

Increase the limit on banking leave accrual from 36 to 42 LHE.

All banked LHE will be set aside in a separate District account, to be used by faculty members in accordance with section 4.16 of the contract.

Article 5 -- Health and Welfare Benefits

5.2 - Benefits

For 2010-11, revise the 2008-09 contract language in section 5.2.1 to read as follows:

"Effective 7/1/2010, the portion of the premium paid by the District shall be limited to a maximum contribution equal to the premium for PPO 2-Party coverage. Thereafter, the maximum contribution shall be automatically increased by an amount not to exceed 10% in each succeeding year..."

Article 6 - Instructional Hours, Duties and Workload

6.1 - Workload

Maintain current contract language in sections 6.1.3.A, B, C and 6.1.4. There will be no increase in contract workload for full-time faculty.

6.4 and Appendices C & D - Instructional Calendars

For the 2011-2012 and future calendars, there will be:

- a. at least one full week between the end of Spring semester and the start of the designated Summer block; and
- b. at least one full week between the end of the designated Summer block and the start of the Fall flex week.

6.1.4 and 7.3 - Teaching Load

Change section 6.1.4 to agree with the 0.85 laboratory rate in section 7.3.

Article 7 - Salaries

7.1.1.A - Salary Schedules (Contract Year)

The first sentence will read: "For the 2010-2011 school year, the District agrees to maintain not less than ninth (9th) in the relative rank of the tenth active step on Class VI."

In the event the District receives a 2010-11 COLA adjustment from the State, this percentage will be retroactively applied to the 2010-11 salary schedule.

7.1.1.B - Salary Schedules (Contract Year)

In 2010-11, faculty steps and columns will be restored to their correct levels (as if there had been no freeze of steps and columns during 2009-2010).

Article 8 -- Evaluation

Develop language delimiting the use of on-line student evaluations.

Miscellaneous

Minor language changes previously bargained and approved for 2009-10 to be included in the 2009-11 contract.

- 4.1, 4.2, 4.4.4, etc. Revise to be consistent with the "spouse, domestic partner" language in 5.2.4.
- 4.7.1 3rd line, add colon to "under contract: ten (10)"
- 4.7.3 2nd line, should read "shall be entitled" ("be entitled" before the parenthesis)
- 4.8.1 1st line, delete the extra "or tenure"
- 4.14.7 4th line, delete "/or bonding"
- 4.16 Insert the approved increase to the limit on banking leave accrual from 30 to 36 (or 42) LHE.
- 6.1.6 Beyond Contract, 2nd paragraph, delete the statement "...assignments for part-time instructors will be limited to two (2) classes, up to eight (8) LHE." This statement conflicts with revised language of 6.1.3.E, which allows up to 10 LHE (67%) for part-time instructors.

As a result of funding reductions and program restructuring involving two categorically funded programs, the District must alter the program activities associated with these programs (Workability and Career Technical Education) for the 2010-11 fiscal year. As a result of these actions, two permanent classified positions at Santa Ana College must be eliminated due to a lack of work/lack of funds.

In addition, funding for the AmeriCorps program at Santiago Canyon College has been discontinued by the granting agency, California Volunteers. Three permanent employees are currently assigned to this grant and those positions must also be eliminated due to a lack of work/lack of funds.

<u>ANALYSIS</u>

These positions will be eliminated following a 45-day notice required by the Education Code.

DEPOSITS / PAYMENTS: A non-refundable deposit of thirty five percent (35%) of the Estimated Total Conference Charges is payable with the return of this signed Agreement and will be applied to the charges set forth herein. The balance of the Estimated Total Conference Charges will be due and payable on or before June 22, 2009. Final conference invoices are due and payable to the Conference Office within thirty (30) days of billing. Client agrees to pay all of the unpaid Estimated Total Conference Charges in a timely manner as set forth above. Past due accounts will be charged interest at 25% per annum on the unpaid balance. Client shall pay interest on any unpaid balance at the rate of 1.5% per month or the highest rate permitted by law, whichever is lower.

Non-refundable deposit of \$19,411.00 is due with return of the signed agreement by May 31, 2010.

The balance of \$36,049.00 will be due and payable on or before June 25, 2010.

A final invoice for the balance of all charges will be submitted within two (2) weeks of the Conference. Payment on the final balance is due within thirty (30) days of receipt.

CANCELLATIONS: Written notice of cancellation must be submitted to the University Conference Office no later than 30 days prior to the scheduled conference date. If such cancellation occurs within 90 days of the scheduled Conference, a service charge of five percent (5%) of the estimated total Conference charges shall be assessed; if within 60 days of the scheduled Conference, a service charge of ten percent (10%) of the estimated total Conference charges shall be assessed; and if within 30 days of the scheduled Conference, a service charge of fifteen percent (15%) of the estimated total Conference charges shall be assessed. The Client acknowledges and agrees that such charges are reasonably calculated to compensate the University for damages it will suffer in connection with such cancellation.

ESTIMATE AND GUARANTEE: The University will hold beds for the estimated number of participants referred to in the housing facilities section of this Agreement. The Client must guarantee in writing the exact number of participants no later than 30 days prior to the beginning of the Conference, including name, gender and room assignments. Full charges will be made for the guarantee figure even if actual attendance is below this estimate. If no guarantee figure is so furnished, the reservations above will become the guaranteed figure and the Client agrees to pay that figure. Should the actual number of participants exceed the guarantee figure, the Client will be billed for the actual number. All guarantee figures are for the entire Conference period unless otherwise approved in writing by the University's Director of Conferences and Scheduling.

7. INSURANCE

INSURANCE: The Client shall, at its own cost and expense, secure and maintain in force at all times during which this Agreement is in effect policies of insurance that meet the minimum requirements of Chapman University as described below.

B. The Client must provide a Certificate of Insurance or other evidence of insurance satisfactory to Chapman University, with specific reference to the event described in this Agreement. Coverage must be written on an "occurrence" form and maintained throughout the term of the contract. With regard to coverages described under paragraphs A above:

i. By endorsement, the policy must reflect, "Chapman University, its trustees, officers, employees, faculty, and agents as an additional insured as their interest may appear with regard to the activity and/or operations under this Facilities Agreement."

ii. By endorsement, the policy must include a provision that the coverage will be primary and will not participate with nor be excess over any valid and collectible insurance or program of self-insurance carried or maintained by the University.

- iii. It is agreed that the provisions under (i), and (ii) above shall only apply in proportion to and to the extent of the negligent act or omissions of the Client, its officers, agents, or employees.
- By endorsement, the policy must reflect Waiver of Subrogation in favor of Chapman University.
- v. Where required "by endorsement," the presence of such endorsement must be noted on the Certificate of Insurance and a separate insurer issued endorsement must be accompany the Certificate of Insurance.
- C. Insurance maintained by Client shall apply on a first dollar basis. Any deductible or self-insured retention shall not exceed \$5,000 per occurrence, unless otherwise approved by Chapman University The client herein acknowledges their responsibility for any losses that fall under a deductible or self-insured retention.
- D It is agreed herein that the coverage, limits, and conditions referred to under A, B, and C above shall not in any way limit the liability of the Client. The Client shall furnish the University with Certificates of Insurance evidencing compliance with all requirements 30 days prior to commencement of this Agreement. Such certificates shall:
 - i. Provide for thirty (30)-days advance written notice to the University of any modification, change, or cancellation of any of the above insurance coverage. The Certificate of Insurance must reflect wording as follows: "Should any of the described policies be cancelled or coverage and/or limits reduced or materially altered prior to the expiration date thereof, the issuing insurer will mail 30 days written notice to the certificate holder named to the left."
 - ii. The above-described Certificate of Insurance will be due in the Conference Services Office by June 5, 2010.
- E. Each insurance policy shall be issued by an insurance company authorized to do business in the State of California or eligible surplus lines insurer acceptable to the State and having agents in California to whom service of process may be made, and currently rated by A.M. Best as "(A-) IX" or better
- F. The Client shall provide the University with Certificates of Insurance in conformance with the above requirements for any companies providing services to Client in connection with this Agreement.

8. <u>USE</u>

All individuals and Clients in their use and occupancy of University property shall comply with all applicable laws, rules and regulations, including University regulations. Any use of the University Facilities contrary to or in violation of any applicable law, rule or regulation shall bar such individual or Client from any further use of such Facilities.

The Client shall use the Facilities for the purposes as stated above and no other

The University reserves the right to reassign facilities to assure maximum and most appropriate utilization of University facilities, to revoke campus privileges, including residency in its buildings, of any occupant whose conduct becomes, in the University's opinion, injurious or potentially injurious to the residential community, to assign alternate housing and/or meeting space commensurate with reduced space needs should the actual number of participants fall below the attendance expected based upon the reserved space, to terminate the reservation of the Client should unforeseen emergencies occur making it inadvisable, illegal, or impossible to provide the facilities, and/or to add or delete from these policies any clause(s) whatsoever upon timely notification.

Use and occupancy of University property shall be primarily for University purposes. Any authorized use or occupancy of the Facilities or property by anyone, including Client, for other than University purposes shall be subordinate to such primary purposes.

No use or occupancy of University property will be permitted if the University Officials in the exercise of its discretion determines that such use or occupancy is prohibited by law, will interfere with the use of the property for University purposes or will result in picketing, rioting, disturbance of the peace or other disruption of University activities, or in damage to the property or alterations which may render it unfit for, or may interfere with its proper use for, University purposes.

During the Client's use of Facilities, the University shall have access to the Facilities as necessary to the University's use of its adjoining properties and to assure compliance with this Agreement.

9. UNIVERSITY POLICIES

MEDICAL SERVICES: It is understood and agreed that the University shall furnish no medical services to the Client or the Client's guests or employees.

ANIMALS: The Client is not permitted to have animals on campus.

AMPLIFIED SOUND: Chapman University has very strict policies about outdoor amplified sound. The Conference Office must approve all amplified sound.

SMOKING: No smoking shall be permitted in university buildings.

EQUIPMENT: Individuals or Clients who wish to bring any equipment on campus must obtain prior approval from the University Conference Office, and must agree to waive any University liability or responsibility regarding any and all damage to, or theft of, said equipment.

CONFERENCE PROGRAM: The University may require that it be furnished, within a reasonable period in advance of the scheduled Conference, with a complete program of the Conference, with copies of all talks and addresses and the script of any entertainment proposed to be given on the University property. If such copy reasonably demonstrates that the program will be in violation of law or of these rules and regulations, the proposed use shall not be permitted.

USE OF UNIVERSITY NAME: The Client will not use the Chapman University name in any advertisement material, brochure, mailer or any similar item in a manner that infers that the University is a sponsor/cosponsor or in any way affiliated with the user group. The University's name may only be used for reference of event location unless written approval has been granted by the Executive Vice President / Chief Operating Officer or designee.

10. <u>LEGAL ISSUES</u>

DAMAGE: The Client agrees to leave the Facilities and premises of the University in the same condition as at the commencement of the Conference and to pay the cost of extraordinary cleaning necessitated by the use of such Facilities and premises by the Client. The Client shall be liable for any damage to the Facilities or property therein which may be caused by any act or negligence of the Client, its employees, agents, and other individuals using the Facilities with its consent, and the University may, at its option, repair such damage, and the Client agrees to reimburse and compensate the University for the total cost of such repair or damage, within five (5) days of receiving a statement by University for the same.

PROPERTY OF THE CLIENT: The University is not responsible for lost, stolen or damaged property of the Client, its conferees or their guests.

RELICENSING OF SPACE: The University reserves the right to relicense all Facilities covered by this Agreement if this Agreement is not signed, returned to the University, and deposit paid by the due date listed herein.

INDEMNITY: Both parties shall conduct their activities upon the University premises so as not to negligently, recklessly or willfully endanger any person lawfully thereon. Each party will be responsible for its own negligent, reckless or willful acts or omissions, and will indemnify, defend and hold the other harmless from any and all claims, demands, loss, liability, costs, and expenses arising out of or resulting from its own negligent, reckless or willful acts or omissions. Such obligations will be for the benefit of the officers, trustee, agents, and employees of the respective parties. The foregoing obligations are in addition to, and not in lieu of, the other obligations of the parties under this agreement.

ASSIGNABILITY: The Client may not sublet or sublicense any portion of the Facilities or assign, mortgage, encumber, or otherwise transfer this Agreement without prior written consent of the University. Any consent by the University shall not constitute a waiver of this provision for any future assignment, encumbrance, sublease or transfer or a release of the Client from its obligations under this Agreement.

ATTORNEYS' FEES AND EXPENSES: If any action at law or in equity is commenced to enforce any of the provisions or rights under this Agreement, the unsuccessful party to such litigation, as determined by the court in a final judgment or decree, shall pay the successful party or parties all costs, expenses, and reasonable attorneys' fees incurred by the successful party or parties (including, without limitation, costs, expenses and fees on any appeals), and if the successful party recovers judgment in any such action or proceeding, such costs, expenses and attorneys' fees shall be included as part of the judgment.

CONSENT TO ARBITRATION: Any controversy, dispute, or claim of whatever nature arising out of, in connection with, or in relation to the interpretation, performance or breach of this Conference Agreement, including any claim based on contract, tort, or statute, shall be resolved, at the request of any party to this Agreement, by final and binding arbitration administered by and in accordance with the then existing Rules of Practice and Procedures of Judicial Arbitration & Mediation Services, Inc. Unless the parties otherwise agree, the arbitrator shall apply California substantive law, and the California Evidence Code to the proceeding. The arbitrator shall prepare in writing and provide to the parties an award including factual findings and the reasons on which the decision is based. The arbitrator shall not have the power to commit errors of law or legal reasoning, and the award may be vacated or corrected pursuant to California Code of Civil Procedure section 1286.2 or 1286.6 for any such error. The arbitration shall be conducted in Orange County, California.

AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT: It is the responsibility of the University to exercise reasonable effort in assuring that its Facilities are accessible to people with disabilities in a manner consistent with the guidelines of the Americans With Disabilities Act, provided that the Client uses reasonable effort to determine and report to University any special needs that may exist. The Client must insure that program activities covered under this Agreement are consistent with and comply with all legal requirements, including the requirements of the Americans With Disabilities Act. This includes, if necessary, the provision of auxiliary services, such as sign language interpreters. The Client is responsible for providing accommodations for special needs of participants including interpreters, guides, handicap vans, etc.

CATASTROPHES: In the event the Facilities licensed hereunder are unavailable due to destruction, partial or total, or for any other reason beyond the control of the University, including acts of God, natural disasters, strikes, or actions by governmental agencies, the University shall have the right to terminate this Agreement by refunding all deposits due to the Client. Integrated Testing with NCLEX-RN® Preparation Agreement

This Integrated Testing Agreement (the "Agreement") is entered into as of the 10th day of May, 2010 by and between **Kaplan**, **Inc.**, a corporation organized under the laws of the State of Delaware, with offices at 1440 Broadway, 8th Floor, New York, NY 10018 ("Kaplan") and **Rancho Santiago Community College District** on behalf of **Santa Ana College** (hereafter known as "SANTA ANA COLLEGE") with its principal office at 1530 West 17th Street, Santa Ana, CA 92706 (each, a "party" and collectively, "parties").

WHEREAS Kaplan has developed a test review program to prepare students and international nurses for the NCLEX-RN® examination (the "NCLEX-RN® Review Course") and holds certain trademarks, copyrights and the know-how in the written and online materials (the "Course Materials") and methods and processes relating to the NCLEX-RN® Review Course;

WHEREAS Kaplan has developed a series of tests designed to evaluate the nursing knowledge of students in an undergraduate program leading to RN licensure (the "Integrated Testing Program") and holds certain trademarks, copyrights and the know-how in the written and online materials (the "Course Materials") and methods and processes relating to the Integrated Testing Program;

WHEREAS, SANTA ANA COLLEGE desires to have Kaplan provide the Integrated Testing Program, Kaplan faculty for the NCLEX-RN® Review Course sessions to its students at SANTA ANA COLLEGE and Kaplan desires to provide such teaching faculty and staff, products and services in relation to the Integrated Testing Program and the NCLEX-RN® Review Course ("Deluxe Integrated Testing") on the terms and conditions of this Agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

1. KAPLAN'S OBLIGATIONS

During the Term of this Agreement and subject to the terms and conditions set forth below, Kaplan undertakes to:

- 1.2. Customize any of our standardized end-of-course exams to ensure that it maps to your curriculum. We will customize any of our exams one time for no additional charge. The request for the customized test must be submitted in writing via email to Kaplan Nursing at the start of the semester/term the customized test is needed. Customized tests will undergo statistical analysis as sufficient numbers of students complete the tests.

- 1.5. Provide a teacher(s) and pay all teaching expenses for Kaplan NCLEX-RN® Review Classroom or live online classes.
- 1.6. Provide the Academic and Lab Administrators designated by SANTA ANA COLLEGE with training and support necessary to execute the functions of the Integrated Testing Program.
- 1.7. Provide one *The Basics* book for each student designated to be a participant in Integrated Testing program and for each SANTA ANA COLLEGE faculty member. *The Basics* book will be shipped in bulk to SANTA ANA COLLEGE within 10 days of both parties signing the Agreement.
- 1.8. Provide one Home Study Kit for each graduating nursing student enrolled in the Kaplan NCLEX-RN® Review Courses. Home Study Kits will be shipped in bulk within 10 days of the class start to SANTA ANA COLLEGE in numbers equal to the number of nursing students on the roster provide by SANTA ANA COLLEGE. The Home Study Kit consists of: *The Course Book* to review nursing content frequently tested on the NCLEX-RN® exam.
- 1.9. Arrange for the shipment of the product materials as described in 1.2 to the Client, such materials to be shipped and paid for according to Section 3 of this Agreement to the following address:

- 1.10. Kaplan will allow SANTA ANA COLLEGE use of updated versions of the Review Course product without additional remuneration to Kaplan while the Terms and Conditions of this Agreement are in effect.
- 1.11. For the purposes of this Agreement, a Kaplan Program Participant is defined as any nursing student identified to Kaplan by SANTA ANA COLLEGE for whom Kaplan has received the payment of the Tuition Fee as described herein and whom SANTA ANA COLLEGE has deemed eligible for participation in the Deluxe Integrated Testing Program.
- 1.12. Kaplan may modify the Course Materials at Kaplan's sole discretion at any time without prior notice to SANTA ANA COLLEGE. Kaplan will nevertheless make reasonable efforts at its discretion to give advance notice to SANTA ANA COLLEGE of scheduled, substantive changes to the Course Materials.

2. SANTA ANA COLLEGE'S OBLIGATIONS

In connection with the teaching services to be provided by Kaplan and in addition to other SANTA ANA COLLEGE covenants contained herein, SANTA ANA COLLEGE undertakes to do the following:

- 2.1. Provide Kaplan with a written roster of Program Participants for each cohort at the start of each semester of the Integrated Testing program and again at least thirty (30) days in advance of their Review Course start date and payment of each semester's tuition installment fee in full to initiate and maintain the Integrated Testing Program with NCLEX-RN Review Course.
- **2.2.** Administer the Integrated Tests as proctored exams in a supervised setting to guarantee the security of test materials.
- 2.3. Designate an Academic Administrator for the Integrated Testing Program.
- 2.4. Provide a classroom(s) for the Classroom Kaplan review sessions at SANTA ANA COLLEGE free of charge upon a schedule mutually agreed upon by the parties.
- 2.5. The Rancho Santiago Community College District complies with all Federal and state rules and regulations and does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, gender or disability. This holds true for all students who are interested in participating in educational programs and/or extracurricular school activities. Harassment of any employee/student with regard to race, color, national origin, gender or disability is strictly prohibited. Inquiries regarding compliance and/or grievance procedures may be directed to District's Title IX Officer and/or Section 504/ADA Coordinator.

3. COMPENSATION

3.1. In consideration of the teaching services and products to be provided by or on behalf of Kaplan during the Term of this Agreement, SANTA ANA COLLEGE students shall pay Kaplan the tuition fees for the delivery of the Deluxe Integrated Testing Product ("Tuition Fees") as set forth below in this Section 3.

- 3.2. The terms of this agreement apply to all of SANTA ANA COLLEGE's active RN students during the period that the Integrated Testing program is in use. It is understood by all parties that the number of students beginning in any given cohort may change over time due to attrition or for other reasons. Only active RN students will be required to pay a tuition fee each semester. If, however, for any reason, the number of Program Participants on the written rosters provided at the start of any semester falls below 50% of the average number of expected participating students as listed in Appendix A below, then SANTA ANA COLLEGE agrees that it will pay Kaplan Tuition Fees for 50% of these expected participating students as listed in Appendix A below
- 3.3. SANTA ANA COLLEGE students will pay Kaplan Tuition Fees for each Program Participant enrolled in the Kaplan and Lippincott, Williams & Wilkins Integrated Testing Program with NCLEX-RN® Review using pricing as described in Appendix A below. The number of students listed in Appendix A are just estimates. Kaplan will collect payments each semester only from students described in rosters submitted by SANTA ANA COLLEGE each semester. Payments from students are due within thirty (30) days of Kaplan's receipt of rosters. If students have not made payments within thirty (30) days of Kaplan's receipt of rosters, their accounts will be turned off and won't be turned back on again until they have paid.
- 3.4. All payments of Tutton Fees and other amounts due to Kaplan hereunder shall be made free and clear of any deductions or withholdings for taxes, levies, duties or charges of any kind. It is understood that despite any currency fluctuation, Kaplan shall receive all payments in U.S. dollars as set forth in this Section 3.

4. OWNERSHIP OF COURSE MATERIALS

Nothing contained herein shall constitute a grant to SANTA ANA COLLEGE or any third party of any license of or to the Course Materials. SANTA ANA COLLEGE acknowledges that the Course Materials and all intellectual property rights thereto, including copyrights in the written, electronic and oral materials prepared by, delivered or performed by or on behalf of Kaplan, are and shall remain the sole and exclusive property of Kaplan. If requested by Kaplan, SANTA ANA COLLEGE shall execute whatever documents may reasonably be required to confirm the ownership rights of Kaplan to any of Course Materials. SANTA ANA COLLEGE acknowledges and agrees that, without Kaplan's prior written consent, it and its officers, employees and agents will not make any copies of or otherwise reproduce Course Materials which may be provided to SANTA ANA COLLEGE or Kaplan Program Participants under this Agreement, in part or in full, in any form or medium and will use best efforts to prevent Kaplan Program Participants from copying or otherwise reproducing the Course Materials. SANTA ANA COLLEGE shall promptly notify Kaplan if it becomes aware of any possible infringement of Kaplan's ownership rights in and to the Course Materials and SANTA ANA COLLEGE shall cooperate with Kaplan in good faith in taking whatever legal or other action may be appropriate under the circumstances. SANTA ANA COLLEGE shall, during the term of this Agreement and also for three (3) years thereafter, keep in strict confidence and shall not use for any purposes other than for such purposes granted or permitted under this Agreement the execution of this Agreement itself and any substance thereof, and any confidential information of the other party that comes into its possession pursuant to, as a result of, or in the performance of this Agreement.

- 5.1. The above confidentiality obligation shall not apply to any information that: (a) is generally known to the public without the default of the information-receiving party; (b) is independently developed by the information-receiving party; (c) the information-receiving party receives from a third party who has no confidential obligation for such information; (d) is already known to the receiving party prior to receipt of such information; or (e) is disclosed pursuant to the valid and verifiable legal process of a government agency or a court of law.
- 5.2. Except as otherwise set forth herein, neither of the parties will issue any press release(s) or make any public announcement(s) relating in any way whatsoever to this Agreement or the relationship established by this Agreement without the express prior written consent of the other party. For the purposes of this Agreement, discussions with potential Kaplan Program Participants in the normal course of business as contemplated by this Agreement shall not constitute a public announcement or press release.

6. REPRESENTATIONS, WARRANTIES AND INDEMNIFICATION

- 6.1. Kaplan warrants and represents that: (a) it has the necessary rights to enter into this Agreement; (b) its entry into this Agreement will not cause any breach of its obligations to third parties; (c) to the best of its knowledge, no Course Materials used by Kaplan in providing the Program infringe any personal, intellectual property or other rights of any third party. Kaplan agrees to indemnify and hold harmless SANTA ANA COLLEGE and its trustees officers, employees and agents from and against all claims, damages, costs and expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees and litigation expenses) arising out of or as a result of Kaplan's breach of this Agreement, any breach of Kaplan's representations and warranties herein, or any claims resulting or arising out of or related to trademark, libel, defamation, copyright or patent infringement (right of publicity, right of privacy, defamation) or any other actions or claims relating to the use of the Course Materials.
- 6.2. SANTA ANA COLLEGE warrants and represents that: (a) it has the necessary rights to enter into this Agreement; (b) its entry into this Agreement will not cause any breach of its obligations to third parties; and (c) in performing its obligations hereunder, it will comply with all laws, rules and regulations of all governmental bodies having jurisdiction thereof. SANTA ANA COLLEGE agrees to indemnify and hold harmless Kaplan and its subsidiaries, affiliates, directors, shareholders, officers, employees and agents from and against all claims, damages, costs and expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees and litigation expenses) arising out of or as a result of its breach of this Agreement, any breach of its representations and warranties herein, or any claims resulting or arising out of or related to any injuries, damages or any other actions or claims, whether in contract, tort or any other theory of recovery, due to its negligence or malfeasance in operating, maintaining, servicing or otherwise controlling or owning the premises on or off-campus where Kaplan is providing the NCLEX-RN® Review Course.
- 6.3. All parties to this Agreement shall agree to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the other party, its officers, agents, employees, and volunteers, from and against all loss, cost, and expense arising out of any liability or claim of liability, sustained or claimed to have been sustained, arising out of the activities, or the performance or non-performance of obligations under this Agreement, of the indemnifying party, or those of any of its officers, agents, employees, or volunteers. The provisions of this Article do not apply to any damage or losses

caused solely by the negligence or intentional acts of the non-indemnifying party or any of its agents or employees.

7. TERM AND TERMINATION

- 7.1. This Agreement shall remain in full force and effect commencing on the date first above written and terminating two years later thereof (the "Term") unless earlier terminated as provided in this Section 7.
- 7.2. If either party (i) fails to make any payment of money to the other party when due hereunder; or (ii) materially breaches its obligations hereunder and fails to cure such breach within thirty (30) days after receiving written notice thereof from the non-breaching party (except for a failure to pay monies owed, in which case such period shall be ten (10) days), then the non-breaching party may, in addition to whatever remedies it may have at law or otherwise arising out of such breach, elect to terminate this Agreement, in whole or in part, in which event the non-breaching party shall be entitled to cease performance of the terminated portion of the Agreement and all amounts owed hereunder shall become immediately due and payable.
- 7.3. In the event either party becomes insolvent, is adjudicated bankrupt or otherwise is unable to meet its financial commitments as they become due, or is subject to voluntary or involuntary dissolution proceedings, the other party may elect to terminate this Agreement by giving the insolvent party written notice of such election, such notice to be effective upon receipt unless otherwise provided therein.
- 7.4. If, prior to the expiration of the term of this Agreement, any federal, state or local regulatory body, including but not limited to, the Center for Medicare and Medicard Services (CMS), the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) or the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) determines that this Agreement is illegal or jeopardizes either party's tax status or otherwise materially affects either party's business, the Board of Trustees (Directors) of either party (or authorized manager if unincorporated) in its reasonable discretion may terminate this Agreement with such notice as it deems appropriate.
- 7.5. Upon termination of this Agreement, including any early termination, SANTA ANA COLLEGE shall, within ten (10) business days of any such termination, at its sole expense, deliver to Kaplan all of the Course Materials then in its possession or control and shall cease to make any of the Course Materials available to Kaplan Program Participants, SANTA ANA COLLEGE students or any other persons immediately upon any such termination.

8. GOVERNING LAW; JURISDICTION

This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of New York, exclusive of its choice of law provisions.

9. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

EXCEPT FOR LIABILITY ARISING AS A RESULT OF GROSS NEGLIGENCE OR WILFULL MISCONDUCT OF KAPLAN, IN NO EVENT SHALL KAPLAN BE LIABLE TO SANTA ANA COLLEGE FOR ANY SPECIAL, CONSEQUENTIAL, INCIDENTAL, INDIRECT, OR PUNITIVE DAMAGES, HOWEVER CAUSED AND ON ANY THEORY OF LIABILITY, ARISING OUT OF THIS AGREEMENT, WHETHER OR NOT KAPLAN IS ADVISED OF THE POSSIBILITY OF SUCH DAMAGES, AND

NOTWITHSTANDING ANY FAILURE OF ESSENTIAL PURPOSE OF ANY LIMITED REMEDY. IN NO EVENT SHALL KAPLAN'S LIABILITY EXCEED THE TOTAL AMOUNT PAID TO KAPLAN BY SANTA ANA COLLEGE HEREUNDER.

- 11.1. This Agreement shall be binding on, and enforceable against, each of the signatories hereto as of the date first above written.

Broadway, Santa Ana, CA 92706-1640 and Target 2421 ("Clinical Facility"), located at 101 South Euclid Street, Anaheim, CA 92802.

WHEREAS, District and Clinical Facility desire to contribute to community health education;

WHEREAS, District operates Santa Ana College ("College") and College is a duly accredited educational institution that conducts the program(s) described and identified in this Agreement (the "Program");

WHEREAS, District has obtained all necessary licenses, consents and/or approvals to conduct the Program from the State of California and any other applicable government agency;

WHEREAS, Clinical Facility operates a duly licensed health care agency at the address listed above and has obtained all necessary licenses, consents, and approvals;

WHEREAS, as part of the Program, students are required to participate in a clinical experience rotation;

WHEREAS, District desires to affiliate with the Clinical Facility in order that students may participate in a clinical experience rotation at the Clinical Facility; and

WHEREAS, District and Clinical Facility desire to enter into this Agreement to memorialize their respective rights, duties, and obligations with respect to the clinical experience rotation of students of the College's Program.

For purposes of this Agreement, the following definitions shall apply:

"District" shall refer to the Rancho Santiago Community College District, its member Colleges, the District's Governing Board, and each of their trustees, employees, agents, representatives, successors and assigns;

"College" shall refer to Santa Ana College, and each of it employees, agents, representatives and assigns;

"Clinical Facility" shall refer to <u>Target 2421</u>, its parents, subsidies, related companies, and each of their officers, directors, employees, agents representatives, successors, and assigns;

The "Program" shall refer to the Clinical training in health science programs as identified and described in this Agreement; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the following covenants, conditions and agreements, the parties hereto agree as follows:

TERMS

- 1. <u>Clinical Experience Rotation</u>. Clinical Facility agrees to provide students of the Program who are specified by College with a clinical experience rotation ("Rotation"), in accordance with standards established by governmental agencies and recognized professional accrediting agencies, and subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement.
- 2. Development of Curriculum. College shall be fully responsible for the development, planning, and administration of the program, including, without limitation, programming, administration, matriculation, promotion and graduation. College acknowledges and agrees that the Rotation is intended to meet certain educational performance objectives, and College shall provide a copy of such performance objectives to Clinical Facility on or before student placement. Clinical Facility shall be fully responsible for the availability and appropriateness of the learning environment in relation to the program's written objectives.
- 23. Exposure to Bloodborne Pathogens. Program students and college faculty will comply with the final regulations issued by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration governing employee exposure to bloodborne pathogens in the workplace under Section VI(b) of the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970, which regulations became effective March 6, 1992 (the "Regulations"), including but not limited to responsibility as the employer to provide all program students with (a) information and training about the hazards associated with blood and other potentially infectious materials, (b) information and training about the protective measures to be taken to minimize the risk of occupational exposure to bloodborne pathogens, (c) training in the appropriate actions to take in an emergency involving exposure to blood and other potentially infectious materials, and (d) information as to the reasons the program student should participate in hepatitis B vaccination and post-exposure evaluation and follow-up.
- 4. <u>Applicable Procedure: Acceptance</u>. College agrees to provide Clinical Facility with a list of the name(s) of students who will be participating in a rotation.
- 5. <u>Nondiscrimination</u>. The parties agree not to discriminate in the selection, placement or evaluation of any student or faculty member because of race, creed, national origin, religion, sex, marital status, age, handicap, and/or medical condition.
- 6. <u>Academic Year</u>. The academic year consists of Fall and Spring semesters, Summer session and Winter break intersession.

- 7. Rotation Schedule. The rotation schedule shall be determined by College and Clinical Facility and may be amended from time to time by agreement of the parties. The number of students in each rotation shall be limited to a number mutually agreed upon by both parties, not to exceed the number specified by the accrediting agency(s).
- 8. <u>Orientation</u>. Clinical Facility and College shall provide an orientation for assigned students participating in each rotation.
- 9. <u>Compliance With Clinical Facility Rules</u>. Clinical Facility shall make available all applicable governing instruments, policies and procedures, rules and regulations of Clinical Facility to each student participating in a rotation, and student shall comply with these rules.

In providing the students with the clinical rotation that is the subject of this Agreement, Clinical Facility shall comply with all applicable laws, rules, regulations, statutes, polices, procedures, and ordinances and shall be consistent with the professional standards of a health care agency.

- 10. <u>Confidentiality of Patient Records</u>. Students and faculty understand and agree that Clinical Facility's patient files are confidential.
- 11. <u>Clinical Instructor (College)</u>. College agrees to designate a coordinator for each program. The coordinator, who may be an academic instructor, shall be responsible for all teaching activities.
- 12. Clinical Advisor (Clinical Facility). Although the Instructor assigns the grade for the student, Clinical Facility via a Clinical Advisor may provide input to the clinical performance and evaluation of student(s), be a resource person for College's faculty and students, and shall communicate with the clinical coordinator designated by College regarding the clinical rotation and shall arrange formal orientation to the facility for the faculty and students.
- 13. Supervision of Students. The supervision, evaluation and direction of students while on site at Clinical Facility shall be the responsibility of the Clinical Advisor (Clinical Facility) or designee as guided by the instructional objectives. No direct, hands-on patient care shall be provided by participating students at Clinical Facility, except in accordance with all applicable laws, Clinical Facility rules, regulation, policies and procedures. District recognizes the patients' rights to refuse care provided by a student at Clinical Facility.
- 14. Removal of Students. Clinical Facility retains the right to exclude any student at any time from any clinical area. Any student who is asked to leave by Clinical Facility shall do so promptly and without protest. Clinical Facility shall also have the right, at any time, to request College to remove a student permanently from the rotation. Except as otherwise provided under any approachable policies, procedures, rules regulations, and/or under any law, any such removal shall not require compliance with any notice, hearing or other procedural requirements.

- 15. Patient Care. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as conferring any right or duty upon College, its students or faculty members, to control or direct patient care or operations at Clinical Facility. Clinical Facility shall maintain sole responsibility and accountability for patient care and shall provide adequate staffing in number and competency to ensure safe and continuous health care during the term of this Agreement.
- Instructor (College), he/she shall be responsible for student(s) evaluation. Unless otherwise mutually agreed between the Clinical Instructor (College) and the Clinical Advisor (Clinical Facility), Clinical Facility may be responsible for submitting input to the Clinical Instructor evaluating and appropriately documenting the performance of each student in the clinical rotation. The appropriate forms shall be provided by the Clinical Instructor. Nothing herein shall be construed as a guarantee by or obligation of Clinical Facility regarding the performance of any student during the rotation. College shall keep records on the progress and evaluation of each student's clinical experience during a rotation for a period of three (3) years following the end of the specific rotation in which the student is involved.
- 17. Ongoing Communication. College has the privilege of regularly scheduled meetings with Clinical Facility staff, including both selected unit personnel and administrative level representatives for the purpose of interpreting, discussing, and evaluating College's health care programs at a mutually agreed upon time.
- 18. <u>Materials</u>. College agrees to provide students with all educational material required during the clinical program.
- 19. Access to Clinical Facility's Services/Facilities. Clinical Facility agrees to provide students with access to the medical library, parking, lockers, food services and first aid where the Clinical Facility has those types of services/facilities available during its normal business hours.
- 20. No Payments or Other Remuneration. College agrees that no fees or monetary payments of any kind shall be exchanged between Clinical Facility, its agents and employees, and College, its agents, employees and students under the terms of this Agreement. Further, neither College, its staff members nor other representatives, shall attempt to bill or collect from any patient or from any other source fees for services provided to patients by said student.

The only exception shall be when Clinical Facility and College mutually agree to pay a Clinical Advisor a stipend for duties directly related to College's program.

21. No Right To Employment. The parties agree that the students of College shall not be considered employees, agents or volunteers of Clinical Facility, nor shall any student be entitled to any right, compensation, or other benefits normally afforded to employees of Clinical Facility, including but not limited to, Social Security, unemployment and workers' compensation insurance.

- 22. <u>Insurance Carried by the District</u>. District shall assure coverage of professional liability insurance for each student participating in the Rotation of not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and three million dollars (\$3,000,000) in the aggregate, and said policy shall remain in full force and effect during the term hereof. District shall provide workers' compensation coverage for students participating in the rotation. These coverages are in effect while the student is on-site at Clinical Facility.
- 23. <u>Insurance Carried By Clinical Facility</u>. Clinical Facility shall secure and maintain comprehensive general liability insurance covering personal injury, property damage, and general liability claims in the amount of at least one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and three million dollars (\$3,000,000) in the aggregate with coverage for incidental contracts. A certificate of insurance must be provided that includes thirty (30) days notice of cancellation, modification, or reduction in said insurance. Clinical Facility shall deliver certificate(s) of insurance under Clinical Facility's comprehensive general liability insurance policy on or before the date of execution of this agreement. Upon request, District shall be provided a copy of said policy.

Clinical Facility shall carry professional liability insurance for itself and each of its employee(s), partners, and/or representatives providing professional services at Clinical Facility, except for District's students and College faculty, in the amount of at least one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and three million dollars (\$3,000,000) in the aggregate. Clinical Facility shall provide District with thirty (30) days written notice prior to cancellation, or reduction in said insurance. Upon request, District shall be provided a copy of said policy.

Clinical Facility shall provide workers' compensation coverage for each of its employees.

- 24. <u>Student Health Records</u>. Any student participating in a rotation shall provide verification of annual T.B. screening. This record shall be maintained in the Department of Pharmacy Technology at the College.
- 25. Student Medical Care. To the extent that any first aid or emergency care is required in connection with an injury or illness incurred by a student during performance of his/her clinical training during a rotation, the student shall be treated by Clinical Facility as appropriate.
- 26. Confidentiality of Student Records. Clinical Facility shall keep confidential and shall not disclose to any person or entity (i) student application; (ii) student health records or reports; and/or (iii) any student records as defined in California Education Code Section 76210 and the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, 20 U.S.C. paragraph 1232(g), concerning any student participating in the rotation, unless disclosure is authorized by (i) the student in writing, or (ii) disclosure is ordered by a court of competent jurisdiction. Clinical Facility shall adopt and enforce whatever policies and procedures are necessary to protect the confidentiality of student records as defined herein.

- 27. <u>Verification</u>. College warrants and represents that it has obtained all necessary approvals and consents from any and all agencies to enable Clinical Facility to offer the rotation to College's students participating in the Program. If requested by Clinical Facility, College will provide Clinical Facility with verification that the Program is duly licensed, duly accredited and/or certified, as applicable, by appropriate agencies. District covenants and agrees that at all times during the term hereof it shall retain such licensure, accreditation and/or certification, and its Program and faculty members shall continue to meet any and all federal, state and local requirements.
- 28. <u>Indemnification</u>. All parties to this Agreement shall agree to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the other party, its officers, agents, employees, and volunteers, from and against all loss, cost and expense arising out of any liability or claim of liability, sustained or claimed to have been sustained, arising out of the activities or the performance or nonperformance of obligations under this Agreement, of the indemnifying party, or those of any of its officers, agents, employees or volunteers. The provisions of this Article do not apply to any damage or losses caused solely by the negligence or intentional acts of the no-indemnifying party or any of its agents or employees.
- 29. Governing Law. This Agreement shall be governed by and constructed in accordance with the laws of the State of California.
- 30. <u>Assignment</u>. Neither party hereto may assign this Agreement or delegate its duties hereunder without the prior written consent of the other party which can and may be withheld by either party in its sole and absolute discretion.
- 31. Effective Date Termination. This Agreement shall become effective May 10, 2010, and shall remain in effect until May 10, 2015, unless sooner terminated by either party in accordance with this section. Either party may terminate this Agreement without cause by giving ninety (90) days prior written notice to the other party of its intention to terminate. In the event a rotation is in progress, any written notice to terminate with or without cause shall become effective at the expiration of the rotation. Notwithstanding the foregoing, in the event the Program is discontinued by College during its Term, this Agreement shall immediately terminate without further action by the parties hereto.
- Notices. Any notices to be given hereunder by either party to the other may be effectuated only in writing and delivered either by personal delivery, or by U.S. mail. Mailed notices shall be addressed to the persons at the addresses set forth below, but each party may change the address by written notice in accordance with this paragraph. Notices delivered personally will be deemed communicated as of actual receipt; mailed notices will be deemed communicated as of ten (10) days after mailing.

BACKGROUND

The American's with Disabilities Act and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act require community colleges to provide access to programs offered to all students. Often because of their physical limitations, deaf and hard of hearing students (DHH) cannot participate in their classes without the services of a sign language interpreter. Santa Ana College has seen an increase in enrollment of DHH students requiring the services of sign language interpreters. RSCCD employs short term, hourly professional experts: sign language interpreters to provide this highly specialized service. The RSCCD currently holds a contract for this service with CRC, Inc. and finds it necessary to amend this agreement to allow for continuation of services.

ANALYSIS

The proposed amendment to the contractual affiliation agreement with CRC Sign Language Interpreting Services, Inc. will yield appropriately qualified interpreters on an as needed basis. The contractual agreement covers the scope of program operations of the facility, as well as insurance and other issues relating to liability for both parties. This amendment extends the period of performance of this agreement and includes a yearly estimate of costs. The agreement has been reviewed and approved by college staff.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve the amendment to the affiliation agreement with CRC Sign Language Interpreting Services, Inc. to extend the term of the agreement and for services estimated at \$130,000 per fiscal year.

BACKGROUND

The American's with Disabilities Act and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act require community colleges to provide access to programs offered to all students. Often because of their physical limitations, deaf and hard of hearing students (DHH) cannot participate in their classes without the services of an appropriate reasonable accommodation. Sometimes the deaf student does not know sign language and therefore cannot benefit from the provision of a sign language interpreter. In these cases the reasonable accommodation provided is that of a Real-Time Computer Aided Transcriptionist (CART). Students who can appropriately benefit from CART services are often raised in an oral environment (non-signing) or have lost their hearing after learning aural/oral language. In addition to this, the student must have mastery of the English language and appropriate reading skills. In this past semester RSCCD has seen an increase in enrollment of oral deaf students not able to benefit from sign language interpreters and require the services of CART

ANALYSIS

RSCCD employs short term, hourly professional experts as sign language interpreters to provide the more 'traditional' accommodation for DHH students. However these individuals are not qualified to provide CART services. Transcription skills are developed in a specialized setting and require additional certification for speed and accuracy using a stenotype machine and software. The proposed contractual affiliation agreement with QuickCAPTION will yield appropriately qualified captionists on an as needed basis who will provide their own equipment and software. If RSCCD were to hire individuals directly for the provision of this accommodation the district may be required to purchase the expensive stenographic equipment and software needed to provide the service. The contractual agreement covers the scope of program operations of the facility, as well as insurance and other issues relating to liability for both parties. This amendment extends the period of performance of this agreement and includes a yearly estimate of costs. The agreement has been reviewed and approved by college staff.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve the amendment to the affiliation agreement with QuickCAPTION to extend the term of the agreement and CART services estimated at \$90,000 per fiscal year.

THIS AGREEMENT, dated for purposes of identification only this 10th day of April, 2010 is made and entered into by and between the

CITY OF ANAHEIM, a municipal corporation, hereinafter referred to as "ANAHEIM,"

AND

RANCHO SANTIAGO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT, hereinafter referred to as "DISTRICT." on behalf of Santa Ana College

WITNESSETH:

C. Supervise and Control Instruction: The instruction to be claimed for apportionment under this contract shall be under the immediate supervision and control of a DISTRICT employee who has met the minimum qualifications for instruction in a vocational subject in a California community college.

D. Instructor Who Is Not a DISTRICT Employee - DISTRICT's Responsibilities. Where Agency's instructor is not a paid employee of the DISTRICT, the DISTRICT shall have a written agreement with each such instructor who is conducting instruction for which Full Time Equivalency Students (FTES) are to be reported. The agreement shall state that the DISTRICT has the primary right to control and direct the instructional activities of Agency's instructor.

E. Qualifications of Instructors. DISTRICT shall list the minimum qualifications for instructors teaching these courses. Such qualifications shall be consistent with requirements in other similar courses given within the DISTRICT.

F. DISTRICT's Control of and Direction for Instructors.

DISTRICT shall provide instructors with an orientation, instructors manual, course outlines, curriculum materials, testing and grading procedures, and any of the other necessary materials and services that it would provide to its regular instructors on campus.

G. Courses of Instruction. These are specified in Attachment A to this Agreement. It is the DISTRICT's responsibility to insure that the outlines of record for such course are approved by the DISTRICT's curriculum committee as meeting Title 5 course standards, and that the courses have been approved by the DISTRICT's board of trustees.

H. Different Sections of Courses. DISTRICT shall have procedures that insure that faculty teaching different sections of the same course teach in a manner consistent with the approved outline of record for that course. Such procedures apply to the faculty and courses that are the subject of this contract, and the students shall be held to a comparable level of rigor.

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1	I. Enrollment. DISTRICT will advise ANAHEIM of the enrollme
2	period, student enrollment fees, the number of class hours sufficient to meet the stated
3	performance objectives, policy regarding the supervision and evaluation of students, and the
4	procedure applicable to the withdrawal of students prior to completion of a course or program.
5	J. Obtaining Approval of Degree and Certificate Program Is
6	DISTRICT's Responsibility. It is required that degree and certificate programs have been
7	approved by the State Chancellor's Office and courses that make up the programs must be part of
8	the approved programs, or DISTRICT must have received delegated authority to separately
9	approve those courses locally.
10	K. Classes Held Outside of DISTRICT. If the classes are to be
11	located outside the boundaries of the DISTRICT, the DISTRICT must comply with the
12	requirements of Title 5, concerning approval by adjoining high school or community college
13	districts and use of non-DISTRICT facilities.
14	L. Funding Source. DISTRICT shall certify that it does not receive
15	full compensation for the direct education costs of the courses from any public or private agency,
16	individual, or group;
17	M. Certification. DISTRICT is responsible for obtaining
18	certification verifying that the instruction activity to be conducted will not be fully funded by other
19	sources.
20	1.2 ANAHEIM's Responsibilities:
21	A. ANAHEIM shall diligently furnish to DISTRICT the services
22	and personnel to perform such services as set forth in Attachment "A" attached hereto and
23	incorporated herein by this reference.
24	B. ANAHEIM shall maintain records of student attendance and
25	achievement. Said records will be open for review at all times by DISTRICT and be submitted to
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This Agreement shall commence in accordance with Paragraph 13 and shall continue for a period of five (5) years unless terminated in accordance with Paragraph 8.

3 <u>COMPENSATION</u>

DISTRICT shall pay ANAHEIM for services and materials to be supplied hereunder at a rate of Three Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$3.50) per student contact hour. ANAHEIM shall invoice DISTRICT at the end of each semester, supplying mutually acceptable documentation of student contact hours during the semester.

4 <u>INDEMNIFICATION</u>

ANAHEIM shall indemnify, defend and save the DISTRICT, its officers, agents and employees harmless from any and all claims and losses accruing or resulting to any and all contractors, subcontractors, laborers and any other persons, firms, or corporations furnishing or supplying work, services, materials or supplies who may be injured or damaged by ANAHEIM in the performance of this Agreement, and from any and all claims and losses accruing or resulting to any person, firm or corporation who may be injured or damaged by ANAHEIM in the performance of this Agreement. ANAHEIM shall provide necessary worker's compensation insurance for its employees at ANAHEIM's own cost and expense.

DISTRICT shall indemnify, defend and save ANAHEIM, its officers, agents and employees harmless from any and all claims and losses accruing or resulting to any and all contractors, subcontractors, laborers and any other persons, firms, or corporations furnishing or supplying work, services, materials or supplies who may be injured or damaged by DISTRICT in the performance of this Agreement, and from any and all claims and losses accruing or resulting to any person, firm or corporation who may be injured or damaged by DISTRICT in the performance of this Agreement. DISTRICT shall provide necessary worker's compensation insurance for its employees at DISTRICT's own cost and expense.

5. <u>ENTIRE AGREEMENT</u>

This writing constitutes the entire agreement between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof, and supersedes all oral or written representations or written agreements

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which may have been entered into between the parties. No modification or revision shall be of a force or effect, unless the same is in writing and executed by the parties hereto.

If any provision of this Agreement shall be held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the other provisions hereof, and to this extent, the provisions of this Agreement are intended to be and shall be deemed severable. The parties shall agree, if reasonably practicable, upon provisions which are equivalent from an economic point of view to replace any provision which is determined to be invalid.

6. ASSIGNMENT

This Agreement is personal and shall not be assigned by ANAHEIM either in whole or in part. Any such purported assignment voids this Agreement.

7. GOVERNING LAW

This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of California. If any portion of this Agreement is held invalid under any applicable statute or rule of law, then such portion only shall be deemed invalid.

8. TERMINATION

Either ANAHEIM or DISTRICT may terminate this Agreement without cause upon giving thirty (30) days prior written notice to the other party.

DISTRICT may terminate this Agreement and be relieved of any consideration to ANAHEIM should ANAHEIM fail to perform the covenants herein at the time and in the manner provided. In the event of such termination, DISTRICT may proceed with the work in any manner deemed proper by DISTRICT. The cost to the DISTRICT shall be deducted from any sum due ANAHEIM under this Agreement, and the balance, if any, shall be paid to ANAHEIM.

9. <u>INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR</u>

ANAHEIM is at all times an independent contractor pursuant to this Agreement and shall not, in any way, be considered to be an officer, agent or employee of DISTRICT.

10. NO THIRD PARTY RIGHTS

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The parties intend not to create rights in, or to grant remedies to, any third party as a beneficiary of this Agreement or of any duty, covenant, obligation or undertaking established herein.

11. NOTICES

Notices and communication concerning this Agreement shall be sent to the following addresses:

The Fire Chief, or his or her designee, shall be responsible for the administration of this Agreement for ANAHEIM.

Nothing contained in this section shall be construed to authorize the department head to amend, cancel, waive, or otherwise modify any terms of this Agreement, except to the extent such changes or modifications are expressly authorized by this Agreement.

13. <u>EFFECTIVE DATE AND AUTHORITY</u>

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DISTRICT and DISTRICT's signators represent that the signators are authorized execute this Agreement on behalf of DISTRICT and to bind DISTRICT hereto.

The effective date of this Agreement shall be the latest date of execution hereinafter set forth opposite the names of the signators hereto. In the event DISTRICT fails to set forth a date of execution opposite the name(s) of DISTRICT's signator(s), DISTRICT hereby authorizes ANAHEIM to insert the date of execution by DISTRICT's signator(s) as the date said Agreement, as executed by DISTRICT, is received by ANAHEIM.

EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY

The parties to this Agreement agree to promote equal employment opportunities through its policies and regulations. This means that both parties will not discriminate, nor tolerate discrimination, against any applicant or employee because of race, color, religion, gender, sexual orientations, national origin, age, disabled, or veteran status. Additionally, the parties will provide an environment that is free from sexual harassment, as well as harassment and intimidation on account of an individual's race, color, religion, gender, sexual orientation, national origin, age, disability, or veteran status.

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ATTACHMENT A

INTER-AGENCY SERVICES TO BE

PROVIDED BY ANAHEIM FIRE DEPARTMENT

- 1. Teaching Approved Curriculum: All student contact hours submitted by

 ANAHEIM to Rancho Santiago Community College District shall be part of a course of
 instruction that has either been approved by DISTRICT's Curriculum and Instruction Council, or
 has been accepted as a topics course and approved by the DISTRICT's Chief Instructional Officer.
- 2. <u>Instructor Qualifications</u>: All student contact hours submitted by ANAHEIM to DISTRICT shall have been taught under the line of sight supervision of instructors who meet DISTRICT's minimum or equivalent qualifications for hiring as part-time Fire Technology Instructors. This expertise is furnished at the expense of ANAHEIM. The services include the use of their specialized equipment, facilities, all handouts, and instructors with specific expertise.
- 3. Non-overlap With Other Funding Sources: The above instructional hours are conducted as full-time equivalent students (FTES) under courses through the Fire Technology Department of DISTRICT, and ANAHEIM certifies that no student contact hours will be submitted to DISTRICT which also have been or will be submitted for California Joint Apprenticeship Committee, JPTA funding or state sponsored colleges.
- 4. Enrollment of Students: DISTRICT will supply current student enrollment forms to ANAHEIM. ANAHEIM will return properly completed enrollment forms and enrollment fees to DISTRICT. ANAHEIM recognizes that out-of-state tuition fees will be charged for students who are not California residents. Student attendance and achievement records will be maintained by ANAHEIM and will be available for review at normal business hours.
- 5. <u>Instructional Activities</u>: The Administrators of Rancho Santiago Community
 College District and ANAHEIM and/or their designees will meet at mutually agreed intervals to
 plan, review class hours to meet performance objectives, schedule and budget for instructional
 activities; the joint consent of the District and ANAHEIM shall precede any instructional activity
 and include supervision and evaluation of students and student withdrawals prior to completion of
 a course.

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- 6. <u>List of Course(s) Or Course Topics</u>: DISTRICT will make available to ANAHEIM all courses listed in the course catalog and additional topics classes consistent with DISTRICT standards for curriculum adoption.
- 7. <u>Services</u>: DISTRICT and ANAHEIM will insure that ancillary and support services such as counseling, guidance, and placement assistance are available to all students and that enrollment in courses is open to any person who has been admitted to DISTRICT's colleges and has met applicable pre-requisites.

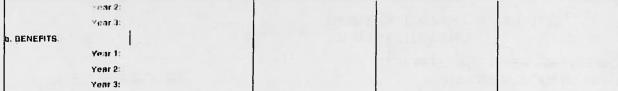

Attached please find the Treasurer's Management Report for the County of Orange for the month ended March 31, 2010. The information provided herein, including all charts, tables, graphs and numerical representations, is provided to readers solely as a general overview of the economic and market conditions which the Treasurer utilizes in making investment decisions. In addition, a complete version of this report is also available for download at our website www.ttc.ocgov.com.

TREASURER'S REPORT

In order to assist you in reading this report, please note that the current balances reflect the investments recorded in the portfolios for each particular fund for the period ending March 31, 2010. Each money market fund has an average maturity of less than sixty days, with a net asset value (NAV) falling within the range of \$0.9950 and \$1.0050. The Extended Fund shall have a duration not to exceed a leading 1-3 Year index +25%. All investments are marked to the market at the end of the reporting period due to the narrow valuation range prescribed by the Pools' Investment Policy Statement.

The reports reflect the par value (face value), the cost and market value (the price of each security at the close of the market on the last trading day of the month). Market values are derived from the Bloomberg Professional Service, a premier provider of instant access to real-time and historical financial data. The difference between the market value and book value is the unrealized gain or (loss). The Detail Transaction Report Section is provided in compliance

with California Government Code Section 53607, which requires that the Treasurer file such a report with the Board of Supervisors, from whom his investment authority has been delegated.

APPORTIONMENT OF COMMINGLED POOL INTEREST EARNINGS

We have prepared a forecast for the timing of the County Investment Pool's March 2010 interest apportionment. We anticipate posting the March 2010 interest apportionment to participants' cash accounts in the County general ledger by approximately May 17, 2010.

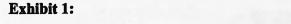
DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY

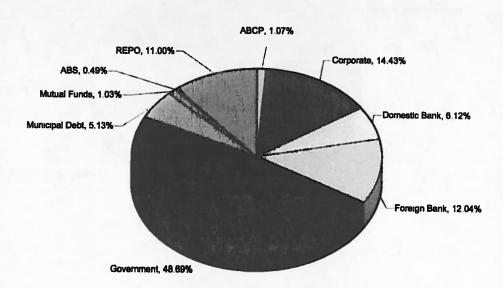
On Tuesday March 16, 2010 the Orange County Board of Supervisors approved an Urgency Ordinance (10-007) repealing Section 1-2-320 of the Codified Ordinances of the County of Orange, thereby revoking all investment authority delegated to the Treasurer - Tax Collector.

Upon revocation, the Chief Financial Officer has been requested to exercise the Board's investment authority. The County's current Chief Financial Officer meets the statutory qualifications for the Treasurer-Tax Collector as set forth in California Government Code Section 27000.7

PORTFOLIO COMPOSITION

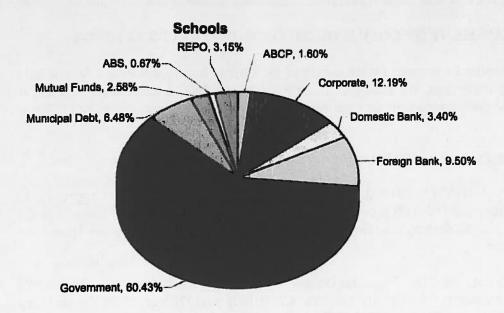

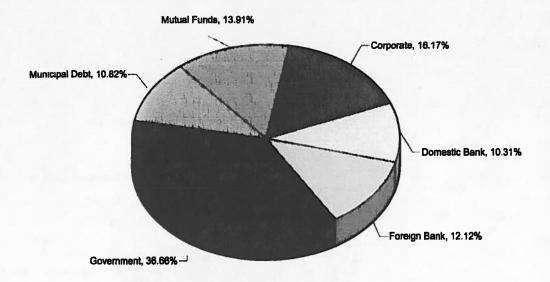

MARKET OBSERVATIONS

Short term interest rates moved higher during the month of March. One and three month LIBOR jumped from the lowest levels ever by 3 and 5 basis points respectively. One month LIBOR currently stands at 0.25% and three month LIBOR at 0.30%. Intermediate rates increased as well with two year Treasury yields increasing from 0.80% to over 1.00%.

We have taken advantage of these higher levels by extending the duration of the Extended Fund to 1.25 years. The Merrill Lynch 1-3 index (our benchmark) duration is currently 1.818 years and our strategy is to continue to maintain duration shorter than the benchmark.

Our forecast for the remainder of 2010 is for continued sluggish growth in the economy. Unemployment will remain elevated at current levels and diminishing government intervention in the economy should keep a lid on inflation. Because of this we anticipate longer term rates to remain within a range of \pm . 50% of current levels. Although we believe short term rates will remain low, we believe there will continue to be upward pressure and are still leery of locking in longer maturities.

Based on the above observations, our office will continue to take advantage of moves in the marketplace to selectively extend our duration, while investing in securities that will protect us from higher short-term interest rates.

Interest Rate Forecast

The Treasurer's Investment Committee is currently estimating an average interest yield of 1.35% for 2009-2010.

The Treasurer's Office appreciates your continued confidence as well as the opportunity to provide you exemplary portfolio and cash management services in the future.

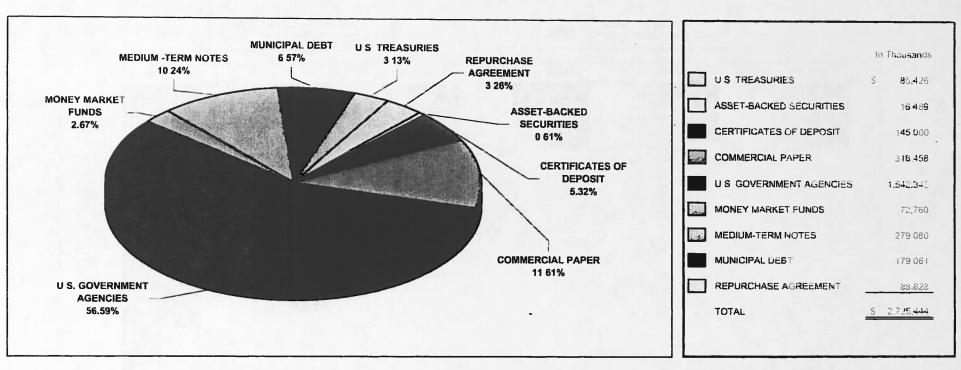

March 31, 2010

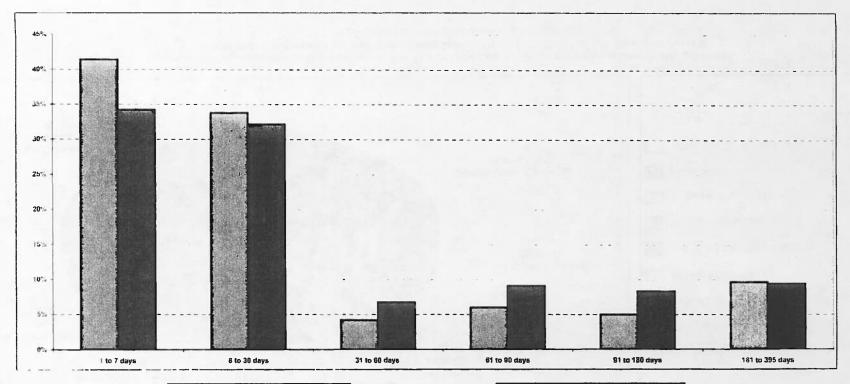

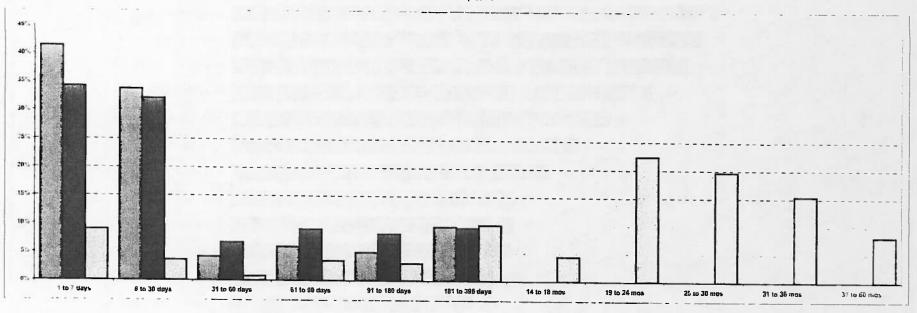

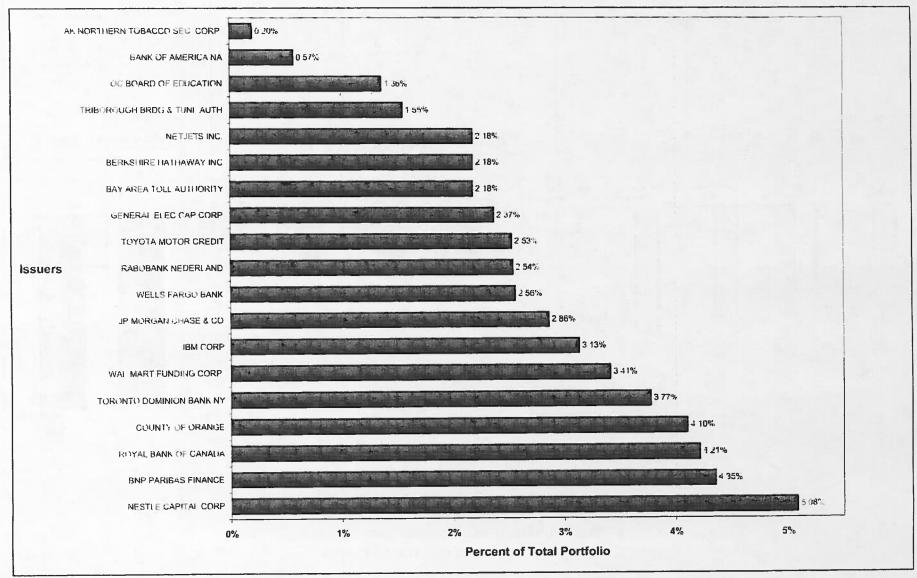

Government Code Section 53646 (b) (3), effective on January 1, 1996, requires the Treasurer-Tax Collector to include a statement in the investment report, denoting the ability of the Orange County Investment Pool (OCIP) and the Orange County Educational Investment Pool (OCEIP) to meet their expenditure requirements for the next six months.

The OCIP and OCEIP consist of funds in the treasury deposited by various entities required to do so by statute, as well as those entities voluntarily depositing monies in accordance with Government Code Section 53684.

The Treasurer-Tax Collector is required to disburse monies placed in the treasury as directed by the Auditor-Controller and the Department of Education, except for the making of legal investments, to the extent funds are transferred to one or more clearing funds in accordance with Government Code Section 29808.

The Treasurer-Tax Collector, in his projection of cash availability to disburse funds as directed by the Auditor-Controller and the Department of Education, is relying exclusively on historical activity involving deposits and disbursements and future cash flow projections. No representation is made as to an individual depositor's ability to meet their anticipated expenditures with anticipated revenues.

The Cash Availability Projection for the six months ending September 30, 2010, indicates the ability of the pools to meet projected cash flow requirements. However, there will usually be differences between projected and actual results because events and circumstances frequently do not occur as expected and those differences may be material.

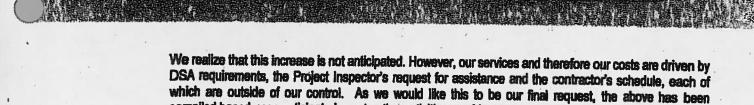
