- May Revise released May 14, 2010
 - Revision to the Governor's January Proposal
- May Revise is essentially the Governor's Proposed Budget from January 2010
 - "Strategy document"
 - Not a real budget proposal
 - Political "Lines drawn in the sand"
- LAO released "Overview of May Revise" on May 18, 2010

State budget shortfall now - \$19.1 billion

- Includes \$1.2 billion reserve
- \$17.9 billion structural shortfall
- \$7.7 billion in current 2009-2010 fiscal year
- \$10.2 billion in 2010-2011 budget year

Governor proposes \$12.2 billion in cuts
 Expected Federal funds - \$3.4 billion
 Borrowing/accounting shifts - \$2.6 billion
 New revenues - \$0.9 billion

- For California Community Colleges essentially the same as January Budget Proposal
- Governor has stated publicly on several occasions that he will veto any state budget from the legislature that reduces the May Revise proposed funding levels for Higher Education (UC, CSU and the community colleges)

2.21% for "enrollment funding" (Growth)

- Partial backfill of current year workload measures reductions (negative growth)
- RSCCD approximately \$3 million more in additional revenue
- ► (0.38)% negative COLA
 - RSCCD loss of approximately \$500,000 in revenue

- Calculated negative (0.39)% COLA

- Elimination of CalWORKS program – most likely will not happen
- However, if approved;
- Funding stays with districts as part of Prop 98
- Flexibility to use these funds to support other programs
- Would also eliminate TANF program funding

Additional Categorical Program cuts

- Part-Time Faculty Compensation (parity pay)

Both intra-year deferrals (within the existing fiscal year) and inter-year (crossing over to a new fiscal year) are being considered

- For RSCCD Total impact of May Revise, if enacted precisely as presented, is at best an increase in workload measure reduction backfill and negative COLA = \$2.5 million in additional state revenues
- This is the best case scenario
- Ultimate state budget will most likely not be as generous

Legislative Analyst Overview of the May Revise

- Legislative Analyst Mac Taylor issued a response to the May Revise on May 18th.
- He recommends Legislature:
 - Suspend Proposition 98 funding guarantee formula
 - Reject drastic cuts to Health and Human Services programs
 - Reduce funding to UC and CSU
 - Raise targeted taxes

LAO Recommendations

- \$125 million funding base cut to community colleges
- Student tuition fee increase to \$40/unit to backfill \$125 million base cut
- \$150 million funding reduction to credit Physical Education (PE) programs
 - reduces by approximately 50% the state total FTES for these programs

LAO Recommendations

- Add Financial Aid Administration (BFAP) as a "flexible" program
- Suspend the Fifty Percent Law

PERS Retirement System - Proposed Employer rate increase

The California Public Employee Retirement System is currently underfunded due to a combination of investment losses, and more members are retiring than expected. The PERS **Benefits and Program Administration Committee** has recommended to the PERS Board that employer contribution rates be increased by 0.5% of classified payroll. This increase would be on top of an already approved increase for the 2010-2011 fiscal year (effective July 1, 2010) 2 010.570.

PERS Retirement System- Proposed Employer rate increase

The PERS Board reviewed the recommendation at their meeting on May 19th and decided to delay the discussion another month. PERS Board members expressed concern that the recommendation to increase rates would be a large burden to bear for the state budget to an already difficult budget problem. The rate increase would add \$600 million in extra costs for the state. This rate increase would also affect city, counties, school districts and community colleges employer contribution rates. School districts are reimbursed for any increases to employer contributions to PERS (up to 13.02%). Community colleges must absorb the cost increases in their local budgets.

PERS Retirement System- Proposed Employer rate increase

If approved, this additional employer contribution rate increase would be an additional budgetary cost to RSCCD of approximately \$400,000. The current fiscal year PERS rate (2009-2010) is 9.705%. The PERS rate for 2010-2011 was already approved to increase to 10.2% as of July 1, 2010, at an additional cost of \$400,000. This additional increase, from 10.2% to 10.7%, is estimated to cost RSCCD an additional approximately \$400,000, for a total PERS employer contribution cost increase of \$800,000. PERS has also indicated that they will need to progressively increase the employer rate up to 14% of payroll in the next three years. They are also discussing increasing the employee contribution rate in the near future, although it takes an act of the legislature to increase the employee rate.

BACKGROUND

Rancho Santiago Community College District collaborates with the County of Orange Sheriff's Department to provide an Inmate Education Program in the Orange County Jails. The program has three components (hence three contracts): a) vocational education (contract #SCC-10-011), b) general education (contract #SCC-10-013), and c) GED testing (contract #SCC-10-012). The Sheriff has requested a five-year renewal of the program, beginning July 1, 2010 and ending June 30, 2015.

ANALYSIS

The following program components of the Inmate Education Program with the County of Orange Sheriff's Department will be renewed.

- 1. The vocational education component will provide training services for up to 213,793 student attendance hours with an hourly rate of \$1.45
- 2. The <u>general education</u> component will provide educational services for up to 248,000 hours of student attendance, at an hourly rate of \$0.50
- 3. The GED testing component will administer up to 200 tests at a cost of \$21.00 per test

Jim Kennedy is the project administrator.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve the three agreements for the Inmate Education Program with the County of Orange for the period beginning July 1, 2010 and ending June 30, 2015.

FIVE (5) YEAR AGREEMENT FOR VOCATIONAL EDUCATION PROGRAMS BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF ORANGE AND THE

RANCHO SANTIAGO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into by and between the RANCHO SANTIAGO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT, hereinafter referred to as "DISTRICT," and the COUNTY OF ORANGE, a political subdivision of the State of California, hereinafter referred to as "COUNTY."

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is authorized under Section 78021 of the California Education Code to establish contract education programs by agreement with any public or private agency, corporation, or association, to provide specific educational programs or training to meet the needs to these entities;

WHEREAS, "Contract Education" is defined to mean those situations in which a community college district contracts with a public or private entity for the purposes of providing instruction or services or both by the community college;

WHEREAS, DISTRICT wishes to offer educational programs and services in certain correctional facilities operated by the COUNTY;

WHEREAS, COUNTY, as a political subdivision of the State of California, is a public agency and, under the provisions of Section 1061 of Title 15, Article 6, of the California Code of Regulations, can enter into agreement with DISTRICT for the provision of educational programs and services for inmates in jails which it operates;

WHEREAS, through this Agreement with COUNTY, DISTRICT intends to provide educational programs for the benefit of eligible inmates housed in COUNTY's correctional facilities, which include the James A. Musick Facility, 13502 Musick, Irvine, CA; the Theo Lacy Facility, 501 City Drive, Orange, CA; the Intake and Release Center (IRC), 550 N. Flower Street, Santa Ana, CA; the Men's Central Jail, 550 N. Flower Street, Santa Ana, CA; and the Women's Central Jail, 550 N. Flower Street, Santa Ana, CA;

WHEREAS, COUNTY operates on the basis of sound administrative policies and adheres to non-discriminatory practices and does not and shall not discriminate on the bases of sex, race, disability, sexual orientation, religion, ethnic or national origin, age, prior educational status, or any other unreasonable basis for discrimination;

WHEREAS, COUNTY's physical facilities meet requirements of State and local Health and Safety regulations and are adequate and suitable for the courses offered and the number of students in attendance; and,

WHEREAS, COUNTY through its Sheriff-Coroner, hereinafter referred to as "SHERIFF," maintains current and accurate student attendance and progress records, and SHERIFF consents to inspection of these records by authorized representatives of DISTRICT, the California Community College Board of Governors, and other regulatory and administrative agencies.

RECITALS:

All the above recitals are true and correct and incorporated herein by reference.

B. TERM:

A.

The term of this Agreement shall be for five (5) years, commencing July 1, 2010, and terminating June 30, 2015, unless earlier terminated by either Party in the manner set forth herein.

C. OPTIONAL TERMINATION:

COUNTY or DISTRICT may terminate this Agreement, without cause, at the end of any semester or summer session, upon thirty days written notice to the other Party.

D. **RESPONSIBILITIES OF DISTRICT:**

- DISTRICT shall provide instruction and training to inmates in COUNTY's James Musick Facility and Theo Lacy Facility, Intake and Release Center (IRC), Men's Jail, and Women's Jail. DISTRICT is responsible for the education program conducted at these jail facility sites.
- 2. DISTRICT shall provide instruction for the following subjects, not to exceed 213,793 attendance hours per fiscal year:

Short Term Vocational

Short-term vocational programs with high employment potential consists of a course of study, or an organized sequence of courses leading to a vocational/career technical objective, certificate or award that is directly related to employment. Courses to be offered include:

Workforce Readiness; Intro to Computer Software Applications; Introduction to Keyboarding & Basic Windows; Introduction to Word Processing using MS Word; Introduction to Spreadsheets using Excel; Introduction to Databases using MS Access; Introduction to Electronic Presentation using PowerPoint; Introduction to Desktop Publishing using Adobe InDesign; Introduction to Document Processing using Adobe Acrobat; Introduction to Commercial Sewing; Fundamentals of Commercial Sewing; Introduction to Welding; Fundamentals of Welding; Introduction to Construction Safety; Introduction to Cabinetry; Fundamentals of Cabinetry; and Institutional Food Preparation.

Basic Skills

Basic Skills consist of a course, a course of study, or an organized sequence of courses to provide instruction for individuals in elementary and secondary-level reading, writing, computation and problem-solving skills in order to assist them in achieving their academic, vocational, and personal goals. Elementary-level is generally recognized to mean that where appropriate, the coursework addresses the content and proficiencies at levels through the eighth grade secondary level is generally recognized to mean that the coursework addresses the content and proficiencies at levels through the coursework addresses the content and proficiencies at levels through the coursework addresses the content and proficiencies at levels through the twelfth grade and may incorporate a high school diploma or GED preparation. Courses to be offered include:

Adult Basic Education; Citizenship; English as Second Language Beginning 1-3 Multi Level; GED Test Preparation; and High School Subjects Individualized Instruction.

Parenting Education

Parenting education consists of a course, a course of study or an organized sequence of courses specifically designed to offer lifelong education in parenting, child development and family relations in order to enhance the quality of home, family, career and community life. Courses to be offered include: Effective Parenting.

Health and Safety

Health and Safety consists of a course, a course of study or an organized sequence of courses, specifically designed to offer lifelong education to promote the health, safety and well-being of individuals, families and communities. Courses to be offered include:

Health Issues and Concepts; Substance Abuse; and Health and Safety Awareness and Application.

Subjects Total Hours combined, shall not exceed: 213,793 Hours per year

- 3. The Curriculum shall be as described in the Rancho Santiago Community College District's Santiago Canyon College Catalog and the program and course outlines on file in the Instruction Office as approved by the Curriculum Council, the Chancellor, the Board of Trustees of DISTRICT, and the Chancellor's Office of the California Community College.
- 4. DISTRICT shall use selected SHERIFF staff as instructors to provide the instruction and training covered in this Agreement. In order to meet the California Code of Regulations, Title 5, requirement, that students be under the immediate supervision of an "employee" of DISTRICT, DISTRICT will invoke the provision of Title 5, Section 58058(b).

Accordingly, SHERIFF staff that is used, as instructors will be required to enter into written individual instructor service agreement with DISTRICT regarding their responsibilities for delivering the curriculum called for in this Agreement.

DISTRICT shall have the primary right to control and direct instructional activities of the instructor while instructor is conducting a class, or classes, given through an instructional service agreement between DISTRICT and the SHERIFF.

5. Instruction to be claimed for apportionment by DISTRICT under this Agreement shall be under the immediate supervision and control of an employee of the DISTRICT (Title 5, Section 58058) who has met the minimum qualifications for instruction in a vocational or non-credit subject in a California community college.

- DISTRICT's minimum qualifications for instructors teaching the courses in the Inmate Education Program are consistent with requirements in other similar courses given at the DISTRICT's colleges.
 - DISTRICT shall demonstrate control and direction of the courses offered under the Inmate Education Program through such appropriate actions as providing the instructors with an orientation, instructor's manual, course outline, curriculum material, testing and grading procedures, and any other materials and services it would provide to its hourly instructors on campus.
- 8. DISTRICT has specified the subjects of instruction within this Agreement, for any course offered through this agreement the outlines of record for such courses have been approved by the college's curriculum committee as meeting Title 5 course standards, DISTRICT's board of trustees, and the Chancellor's Office of the California Community College.
- 9. DISTRICT shall use procedures to assure that faculty teaching different sections of the same course teach in a manner consistent with the approved outline of record for that course. DISTRICT shall assure that the courses in the Inmate Education program, and the faculty and the students, are held to a level of rigor comparable to that of the other sections of non-credit courses offered within the DISTRICT.
- 10. DISTRICT shall claim state apportionment for student attendance generated in classes covered by this Agreement, COUNTY shall not claim state apportionment for the same student attendance hours claimed by DISTRICT.
- 11. DISTRICT shall reimburse COUNTY for use of staff and facilities, in accordance with the terms stated in Section F, "PAYMENT."
- 12. DISTRICT shall provide the normal administrative functions, including admissions, counseling, registration, achievement records, and awarding of completion certificates comparable to those maintained for any student of DISTRICT.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF COUNTY:

- 1. SHERIFF shall provide staff and facilities for DISTRICT to utilize in the operation of its instructional programs for inmates housed at the jail facilities.
- 2. SHERIFF staff who are used as instructors under this Agreement will be appropriately credentialed to teach the subject areas covered by this Agreement.
- 3. Pursuant to California Code of Regulations, Title 5, Section 58058(b), SHERIFF staff used as instructors under this Agreement will enter into individual agreements with DISTRICT regarding their responsibilities as instructors for DISTRICT, specifically for delivery of the curriculum covered by this Agreement. All instructor agreements will be attached to this Agreement when transmitted to the DISTRICT for Agreement approval.
- 4. DISTRICT shall not be obligated to make any payment to SHERIFF's staff for services under the terms of this Agreement. Any and all salaries and benefits payable or owning to SHERIFF staff who are used as instructors under the terms of this Agreement are the sole responsibility and liability of COUNTY.
- 5. SHERIFF staff conducting classes authorized in this Agreement shall meet the state approved minimum qualifications for the Subject area in which they are teaching or successfully obtain equivalency for the subject area through the District's equivalency process. The following subject areas are eligible to be taught under this Agreement:

Short Term Vocational Basic Skills Parenting Education Health and Safety

- 6. COUNTY shall not be reimbursed for more than the total hours called for in the curriculum in any one subject area for any one student.

- 8. SHERIFF billing shall include evidence of positive attendance in accordance with State regulations. All billings shall be accompanied by attendance sheets verifying the number of enrollees and number of actual hours of instruction.
- 9. SHERIFF shall retain records of enrollee's attendance for at least five (5) years and shall, upon request, make them available for review by DISTRICT, the Office of Private Postsecondary Education, and the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges.
- 10. SHERIFF shall provide those administrative functions essential for the operation of its facilities.

F. RESPONSIBILITIES OF DISTRICT AND COUNTY:

- 1. DISTRICT and COUNTY will make available as appropriate support services such as counseling, guidance and placement assistance for the students.
- 2. DISTRICT and COUNTY will supervise students and evaluate student progress.
- 3. DISTRICT and COUNTY will determine the withdrawal procedures and documentation applicable to inmate students who seek to withdraw prior to completion of a course.
- 4. Procedures, Terms and Conditions. The enrollment period for the courses in the Inmate Education Program is determined by DISTRICT and is unique to this program. The inmate students do not pay enrollment fees for the courses. The DISTRICT determines the number of class hours sufficient to meet the stated performance objectives.

G. PAYMENT:

 DISTRICT shall reimburse COUNTY for the use of staff and facilities at the rate of \$1.45 per student attendance hour, up to a maximum of 213,793 hours (\$310,000.00) per fiscal year. The hours claimed under this Agreement must be 9 of 17 Contract # MA-060-10012860

certified to DISTRICT for actual attendance during the preceding month for all properly enrolled students. Such payment is considered full payment to cover all of COUNTY's contract cost of operating the instructional programs covered by this Agreement.

- 2. DISTRICT shall reimburse COUNTY within twenty (20) days after receipt of billing.
- DISTRICT shall pay COUNTY in accordance with COUNTY Billing Policy, adopted by the Board of Supervisors through Minute Order dated October 27, 1992, and incorporated in this Agreement as Attachment A.
- 4. COUNTY shall charge DISTRICT late payment penalties in accordance with COUNTY Board of Supervisor's approved COUNTY Billing Policy.

H. NOTICES:

 Except for the notices provided for in Subsection 2 of this Section, all notices authorized or required by this Agreement shall be effective when written and deposited in the United States Mail, first class postage prepaid and addressed as follows:

COUNTY is, and shall at all time be deemed to be an independent Contractor. Nothing herein contained shall be construed as creating the relationship of employer and employee, or principal and agent, between DISTRICT and COUNTY, or any of COUNTY's agents or employees. COUNTY, its agents and employees shall not be entitled to any rights or privileges of DISTRICT employees and shall not be considered in any manner to be DISTRICT employees.

DISTRICT is, and shall at all times be deemed an independent Contractor. Nothing herein contained shall be construed as creating the relationship of employer and employee, or principal and agent, between COUNTY and DISTRICT, or any of DISTRICT's agents or employees. DISTRICT, its agents and employees, shall not be entitled to any rights or privileges of COUNTY employees and shall not be considered in any manner to be COUNTY employees.

J. ALTERATION OF TERMS:

This Agreement fully expresses all understanding of DISTRICT and COUNTY, with respect to the subject matter of this Agreement and shall constitute the total Agreement between the parties for these purposes. No addition to, or alteration of the terms of this Agreement shall be valid unless made in writing, formally approved and executed by duly authorized agents of both Parties.

K. CERTIFICATION BY DISTRICT:

DISTRICT hereby certifies that on all student attendance from classes offered through this Agreement which it reports for state apportionment, it does not, and will not, receive full compensation for the direct education costs of the courses from any other public or private agency, individual, or group.

CERTIFICATION BY COUNTY:

COUNTY hereby certifies that in receiving the compensation for attendance hours stipulated in this Agreement, it does not, and will not, receive full compensation for the direct education costs for the courses from any other public or private agency individual, or group.

M. INSURANCE:

DISTRICT and COUNTY agree that the following insurance requirements are reciprocal and that DISTRICT and COUNTY will each comply with them. Any and all of these requirements may be met by Self-Insurance and the DISTRICT and COUNTY shall provide a verification letter of Self-Insurance upon request.

Prior to the provision of services under this Contract, the Contractor agrees to purchase all required insurance at Contractor's expense and to deposit with the County Certificates of Insurance, including all endorsements required herein, necessary to satisfy the County that the insurance provisions of this Contract have been complied with and to keep such insurance coverage and the certificates therefore on deposit with the County during the entire term of this Contract. In addition, all subcontractors performing work on behalf of Contractor pursuant to this Contract shall obtain insurance subject to the same terms and conditions as set forth herein for Contractor.

All insurance policies required by this Contract shall declare any deductible or selfinsured retention (SIR) in an amount in excess of \$25,000 (\$25,000 for automobile liability), which shall specifically be approved by the County Procurement Office (CPO)/Office of Risk Management. Contractor shall be responsible for reimbursement of any deductible to the insurer. Any self-insured retentions (SIRs) or deductible shall be clearly stated on the Certificate of Insurance.

If the Contractor fails to maintain insurance acceptable to the County for the full term of this Contract, the County may terminate this Contract. Qualified Insurer

The Policy or policies of insurance must be issued by an insurer licensed to do business in the State of California (California Admitted Carrier). If the carrier is a non-admitted carrier in the State of California, CPO/Office of Risk Management retains the right to approve or reject carrier after a review of the Company's performance and financial ratings.

Minimum insurance company ratings as determined by the most current edition of the **Best's Key Rating Guide/Property-Casualty/United States or ambest.com** shall be A-(Secure Best's Rating) and VIII (Financial Size Category).

The Policy or policies of insurance maintained by the Contractor shall provide the minimum limits and coverage as set forth below:

All liability insurance, required by this Contract shall be at least \$1,000,000 combined single limit per occurrence. The minimum aggregate limit for the Commercial General Liability policy shall be \$2,000,000.

The County of Orange shall be added as an additional insured on all insurance policies required by this Contract with respect to work done by the Contractor under the terms of this Contract (except Worker's Compensation/Employer's Liability). An additional

insured endorsement evidencing that the County of Orange is an additional insured shall accompany the Certificate of Insurance.

All insurance policies required by this Contract shall be primary insurance, and any insurance maintained by the County of Orange shall be excess and non-contributing with insurance provided by these policies. An endorsement evidencing that the Contractor's insurance is primary and non-contributing shall specifically accompany the Certificate of Insurance for the Commercial General Liability and Sexual Misconduct Liability.

All Insurance policies required by this Contract shall give the County of Orange 30 days notice in the event of cancellation. This shall be evidenced by an endorsement separate from the Certificate of Insurance. In additional, the cancellation clause must include language as follows, which edits the pre-printed ACORD certificate:

SHOULD ANY OF THE ABOVE DESCRIBED POLICIES BE CANCELLED BEFORE THE EXPIRATION DATE THEREOF, THE ISSUING COMPANY WILL MAIL 30 DAYS WRITTEN NOTICE TO THE CERTIFICATE HOLDER NAMED TO THE LEFT.

All insurance policies required by this Contract shall waive all rights of subrogation against the County of Orange and members of the Board of Supervisors, its elected and appointed officials, officers, agents and employees when acting within the scope of their appointment or employment.

The Commercial General Liability policy shall contain a severability of interest clause.

The Contractor is aware of the provisions of Section 3700 of the California Labor Code, which requires every employer to be insured against liability for Worker's Compensation or be self-insured in accordance with provision of that code. The Contractor will comply with such provision and shall furnish the County satisfactory evidence that the Contractor has secured, for the period of this Contract, statutory Worker's Compensation insurance and Employer's Liability insurance with minimum limits of \$1,000,000 per occurrence.

Insurance certificates should be forwarded to the agency/department address listed on the

within seven (7) days of notification by CPO/Purchasing or the agency/department purchasing division, award made be made to the next qualified vendor.

County expressly retains the right to require Contractor to increase or decrease insurance of any of the above types throughout the term of this Contract. Any increase or decrease in insurance will be as deemed by the County or Orange Risk Manager as appropriate to adequately protect County.

The procuring of such required policy or policies of insurance shall not be construed to limit Contractor's Liability hereunder nor to fulfill the indemnification provisions and requirements of this Contract.

The County of Orange Certificate of Insurance and the Special Endorsement for the County of Orange can be utilized to verify compliance with the above-mentioned insurance requirements in place of commercial insurance certificates and endorsements.

N. **INDEMNIFICATION:**

COUNTY, its officers, agents, and employees shall not be deemed to have assumed any liability for the negligence or nay other act or omission of DISTRICT, or nay of its officers or employees.

DISTRICT shall indemnify and hold COUNTY, its officers, agents, employees, and independent Contractors free and harmless from any claim or liability whatsoever, based or asserted upon any act or omission of DISTRICT, its officers, agents, employees, subcontractors and independent contractors related to this Agreement, for property damage, bodily injury or death, or any other element of damage of any kind or nature, and DISTRICT shall defend, at its expense, including attorney fees, COUNTY, its officers, agents, employees, and independent Contractors in any legal action or claim of any kind based upon such alleged acts or omissions.

COUNTY shall indemnify and hold DISTRICT, its officers, agents, employees, and independent contractors, free and harmless from any claim or liability whatsoever, based or asserted upon any act or omission of COUNTY, its officers, agents, employees, and

The term of this Agreement shall be for five (5) years, starting, July 1, 2010 through and including June 30, 2015, unless earlier terminated by either party in the manner set forth herein.

B. OPTIONAL TERMINATION:

- 3. COUNTY shall ensure that the jail facilities used for classes are maintained properly.
- 4. COUNTY shall cooperate with DISTRICT in providing the appropriate and timely reporting of student attendance from courses offered under this Agreement.

D. DISTRICT'S SERVICES AND RESPONSIBILITITES:

- 1. DISTRICT shall be responsible for the Continuing Education inmate educational program conducted on site.
- 2. DISTRICT shall ensure that the instruction in the Continuing Education Inmate Education Program is under the immediate supervision and control of an employee of the DISTRICT (Title 5, Section 58058) who has met the minimum qualifications for instruction in a non-credit subject in a California community college.
- 3. DISTRICT shall demonstrate control and direction of the Continuing Education Inmate Education Program through such appropriate actions as providing the instructor with an orientation, instructor's manual, course outline, curriculum material, testing and grading procedures, and any other materials and services it would provide to its hourly instructors on campus.



- 4. DISTRICT's minimum qualifications for instructors teaching these Continuing Education courses in the Inmate Education program are consistent with requirements in other similar courses given at the colleges or the District.
- 5. DISTRICT's non-credit continuing education courses shall have been approved by the local curriculum committee as meeting Title 5 course standards, approved by the DISTRICT'S board of trustees and approved by the State Chancellor's Office.

DISTRCIT shall assure that the Continuing Education courses in the Inmate Education program, and the faculty and the students, are held to a level of rigor comparable to that of the other sections of continuing education courses offered within the DISTRICT.
- 8. DISTRICT shall claim state apportionment for student attendance generated in the classes covered by this Agreement. COUNTY shall not claim state apportionment for the same student attendance hours claimed by DISTRICT.

E. RESPONSIBILITIES OF DISTRICT AND COUNTY:

- 1. DISTRICT and COUNTY shall not discriminate on the basis of race, ethnic or national origin, sex, age, disability, sexual orientation, or prior educational status or any other unreasonable basis for discrimination.
- 2. DISTRICT and COUNTY shall make available as appropriate support services such as counseling, guidance and placement assistance for the students.
- 3. DISTRICT and COUNTY shall determine the withdrawal procedures and documentation applicable to inmate students who seek to withdraw prior to completion of a course.
- 4. PROCEDURES, TERMS AND CONDITIONS: The enrollment period for the Continuing Education courses in the Inmate Education Program is determined by DISTRICT and is unique to this program. The inmate students do not pay enrollment fees for the Continuing Education courses. The DISTRICT determines the number of class hours sufficient to meet the stated performance objectives. - The Five (5) year Vocational Education Agreement between DISTRICT and COUNTY, executed by the Board of Supervisors at the same time as this Agreement, allows for reimbursement to COUNTY of up to a specified number of instruction hours per year. An additional insured endorsement evidencing that the County of Orange is an additional insured shall accompany the certificate of insurance.

The Contractor will comply with such provision and shall furnish the County satisfactory evidence that the Contractor has secured, for the period of this Contract, statutory Worker's Compensation insurance and Employer's Liability insurance with minimum limits of \$1,000,000 per occurrence.





No responsibility is assumed by the COMPANY for the control or correction of conditions or practices existing at the facilities, or at any other premises surveyed by the COMPANY for and on behalf of the CLIENT. The COMPANY'S services shall be governed by the standard of practice for professional services measured as at the time those services are rendered.

4. <u>INDEMNIFICATION</u>, Except for breach of this Agreement or negligence of the COMPANY, the COMPANY shall have no liability to the CLIENT with respect to any loss or other damage suffered or incurred in connection with the services provided to the CLIENT shall indemnify and hold the COMPANY, its egents and employees, harmless from and against all damages, judgments, costs or other expenses (including reasonable legal fees) incurred as a result of any claim or charge made against the COMPANY, or the CLIENT in connection with the services rendered to the CLIENT in COMPANY, except such damages, judgments, costs or expenses caused by or resulting from the COMPANY's breach of this Agreement or its negligence.

5. <u>LIMITATION OF LIABILITY</u> In no event shall COMPANY be liable in any way to CLIENT or others for any indirect, special or consequential damages of any nature, whether foreseeable or not, regardless of whether COMPANY had been advised of the possibility of such damages. In no event will COMPANY'S liability in connection with the services whether caused by non-performance, defects, errors, breech of warranty or otherwise, exceed the total compensation paid to COMPANY by CLIENT, exclusive of reimbursed costs hereunder. These limitations apply to all causes of action in the aggregate, whether based in contract, tort or otherwise, but do not apply to claims arising out of damage to tangible personal property or personal injury caused by COMPANY'S employees while on CLIENT'S premises.

6. <u>CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION.</u> The CLIENT and the COMPANY each acknowledges that during the term of this Agreement each will acquire confidential information relating to the business and operations of the other including, without limitation, each party's methods of doing business, and each party's products, processes, and customer lists (collectively, the "Confidential information"). Each party hereby acknowledges that ALL OF THE OTHER PARTY'S Confidential information is valuable, unique, and constitutes trade secrets and proprietary information and, upon the termination of this Agreement, each party's knowledge of the other party's Confidential Information will enable it (or any other individual, company, or person with which it is associated in any manner) to compete with the other party in a manner likely to cause irreparable harm upon the disclosure of such Confidential Information. Accordingly, each party hereby that it shall not disclose, directly or indirectly, any of the Confidential information to any individual, firm, company, or other entity and shall not use any Confidential formation.

Information in any manner whatsoever except as permitted under this Agreement, unless such Confidential Information becomes a matter of public record or as information made available to the public, or unless legally required to do so. This obligation as to confidentiality and non-use shall survive the Terms of this Agreement.

7 <u>INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR</u>. In providing its services, the COMPANY shall be an independent contractor, and the CLIENT will have no right to exercise supervision as to the manner or method by which the COMPANY provides its services, except that the COMPANY'S employees and representatives shall adhere to the safety policies and procedures provided by the CLIENT of the designated sites/facilities while on the premises thereof.

8. <u>ARBITRATION</u>. As a condition precedent to any right of action hereunder, any dispute or difference between the parties in connection with or ansing out of this Agreement shall be referred to and determined by arbitration under the rules and procedures of the American Arbitration Association; provided, however, the arbitration shall be decided by a panel of three arbitrators. 9. <u>GOVERNING LAW: VENUE.</u> The provisions of this Agreement shall be governed by laws of the state of California and the parties to this Agreement consent to and acknowledge that any disputes (including arbitration) arising under this Agreement shall be venued in Los Angeles County, California.

10. <u>ENTIRE_AGREEMENT.</u> This Agreement constitutes the entire Agreement between the parties with respect to the subject matter of this Agreement and merges and supersedes all proor discussions, understandings and agreements between the parties relating to the subject matter thereof. This Agreement may be amended or modified only by a written document executed by both the COMPANY and the CLIENT, and the terms hereof shall not be modified by any purchase order of acknowledgment, even though the COMPANY may have signed such a document.

11. <u>ASSIGNMENT.</u> No assignment of this Agreement, or of the rights, duties, and obligations theraunder, shall be permitted, except with the prior written consent of the other party.

12. <u>SEVERABILITY AND SURVIVAL</u>, if any of the provisions contained in this Agreement are held to be illegal, invalid, or unenforceable, the enforceability of the remaining provisions shall not be impaired and the Agreement shall continue as if such illegal, invalid, or unenforceable provisions were not and are not contained in this Agreement. Limitations of liability and indemnities described in this Agreement shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

BACKGROUND

The District has a total of twenty-four elevators at Santa Ana College, Digital Media Center, Santiago Canyon College and the District Office that require monthly inspection and service. This work must be performed by a licensed elevator technician.

ANALYSIS

Working with staff members from all four sites, a bid package was prepared and sent out to fourteen (14) bidders for competitive pricing for elevator maintenance service for a period of three years with an option to renew for an additional two years.

A mandatory pre-bid conference and job walk was conducted to discuss the bidding procedures and to allow the bidders to visit the sites. A total of eleven (11) bidders attended; however, only one bidder responded and provided prices for this service. The bidder was Amtech Elevator Services, the company that has been providing elevator repair and maintenance service at Santa Ana College and Digital Media Center for the past five years.


Various reasons were given from other interested vendors for not bidding. Some of the reasons were: unable to secure a bid bond; cashier's check or certified check; meeting District's insurance requirements; unable to compete with larger companies; profit margin would be to low; and missed the due date.

Due to the lack of participation and the various reasons for not bidding, it is in the best interest of the District to reject the bid and rebid the Elevator Repairs & Maintenance Service with changes that would make it easier for small companies to participate.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees reject the bid for Bid #1158-Elevator Repair and Maintenance Service and rebid as presented.



Intellectual Property Rights - BP7002

Adopted 12/10/01 - Revised May 24, 2010

RSCCD recognizes the need to maintain an Intellectual Property Rights policy which encourages faculty and staff to engage in the production <u>and development</u> of scholarly works, creative publications, and technology-based materials, <u>grant proposals</u>, and <u>programs and services that enhance the educational and economic well being of the community</u>. This policy assumes that:

The rights of faculty, staff and the District need to be fairly balanced through mutual agreement.

The District retains full rights to and ownership of any and all programs that are developed, implemented and administered by individuals who are acting within the course and scope of their employment with the District. This includes programs and activities supported by the District General Fund as well as categorically funded programs.

The District is not interested in entering into agreements regarding intellectual property rights for the express purpose of achieving a financial gain. The District is interested in receiving fair compensation for use of public resources employed in the creation of such works.

The following guidelines regarding copyright, <u>trademark</u>, royalties, patents, and utilization of all materials will be consistent with the promotion of academic freedom and "fair use" principles.

Copyright Ownership, Royalties, and Distribution

- A faculty or staff member may claim the right to patents or to copyright any material created outside of the faculty or staff member's employment with the District. If this creation involves the use of district supplies or staff resources, the faculty and staff member shall retain the right to copyright the material, but shall reimburse the District for the cost of production. Faculty and staff members with full copyright or patents ownership retain full royalty distribution rights.
- 2. The District may claim the right to patents, to trademark names associated with programs and services, or to copyright material if the District specifically commissioned it, or the work is identified as an institutional effort. Otherwise, the right to patents and to copyright material will belong to the faculty or staff member responsible for its creation, according to the terms stated above. The District with full copyright, trademark, or patent ownership retains full royalty, use, and distribution rights.
- 3. The District and the faculty or staff member may agree to share the rights to copyright materials or patents if the work is created by the faculty or staff member, and the District contributes services, staff, or financial resources necessary for completion. This will be accomplished through a separate agreement created at the time the project is initiated. If the District and the faculty and staff member share copyright or patent ownership, royalty distribution rights will be distributed to reimburse the copyright or patent owners for documented expenses related to the creation and production of the materials. Any remaining royalties or profits will be distributed according to the terms of the separate agreement.

Copyright Registration

Responsibility for the official registration of the copyright or patent will lie with the owner of the copyright. In those cases where there is shared ownership, the District will be responsible for filing for both parties for registration of copyright or patent.

Summary: Would establish the Pilot Program for Accelerated Nursing and Allied Health Care Profession Education at the California Community Colleges, and would require the Office of the Chancellor of the California Community Colleges to design a pilot program in accordance with prescribed criteria with the goal of facilitating early graduation by reducing the time it takes to earn a degree to 18 months or less for students participating in the pilot program. The bill would require the chancellor's office to establish policies and procedures for the process of establishing an application process that would lead to the selection of the community college campuses that would participate in the pilot program. The bill would require the chancellor's office to design the program to commence in the 2012-13 academic year and to provide accelerated learning in a variety of formats, including online and distance learning courses and intensive weekend and evening course modules. This bill contains other related provisions.

Summary: Would require the trustees to ensure compliance with specified requirements for the adoption of changes in the criteria for admission to a campus of the university that affect the eligibility of applicants residing within the local service area, as defined, of the campus. The bill would require these procedures to include specified notice, hearing, and approval requirements. The bill would require a change in admissions criteria that affects the eligibility of applicants residing within the local service area of the affected campus to become effective only after a period of at least one year has elapsed after approval of that change by the trustees.

Rationale for Recommendation: Supports transfer enabling local community colleges to enter into transfer agreements with local CSU campuses.

The bill also would require the maximum Cal Grant C award to equal the sum of the tuition and fee award level and the book and supply award level in the Budget Act of 2009, adjusted annually by a specified inflation factor. This bill contains other existing laws.

Rationale for Recommendation: Appears to restrict the number of CalGrant recipients.

The bill would require a district that elects to purchase supplies and materials by contract let in accordance with those policies to submit a specified report to the Legislative Analyst on or before January 1, 2015, and would require the Legislative Analyst to report to the Legislature on or before April 1, 2015. This bill contains other related provisions and other existing laws.

Rationale for Recommendation: Some concerns about phrasing and language.

The bill would require that a decrease in FTES in a district that is due solely to a change in calculation required by this bill shall not result in a reduction in the general apportionment made to that district prior to the 2012-13 fiscal year.

SB 1440 (Padilla D) California Community Colleges: student transfer. Status: 5/14/2010-Set for hearing May 24.

Summary: Would enact the Student Transfer Achievement Reform Act, which would require a community college district, commencing with the fall term of the 2011-12 academic year, to grant an associate degree to a student in his or her field of study that would deem the student eligible for transfer into a California State University baccalaureate program when the student meets prescribed requirements. This bill would prohibit a community college district from imposing any requirements, in addition to these requirements, for a student to be eligible for the associate degree, and would prohibit remedial noncollegiate level coursework from being counted towards the units required for the associate degree. This bill would require the California State University to guarantee admission with junior status to any community college student who meets the requirements for the associate degree. This bill would not guarantee a student admission for specified majors or campuses, but would require the California State University to grant a student priority admission to a program or major that is similar to his or her community college major or area of emphasis. This bill would authorize the California State University to require a transferring student to take additional coursework in specified circumstances, and would prohibit the California State University from requiring a transferring student to repeat courses that are similar to those taken at the community college that counted towards the units required for the associate degree. This bill would also require the Legislative Analyst's Office to review and report to the Legislature, within a prescribed time period, on specified outcomes and recommendations related to this act. This bill contains other related provisions and other existing laws.

Rationale for Recommendation: Promotes transfer. Supported by entire system. Streamlines transfer to CSU.
