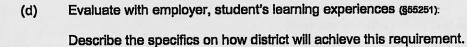

# LEASE AGREEMENT BETWEEN RANCHO SANTIAGO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT AND CREATION SALON

This lease between Creation Salon ("CS") and Rancho Santiago Community College District ("RSCCD") is entered into this 1<sup>st</sup> day of September, 2010.

- 1. CS leases to RSCCD certain classrooms at CS's site located at 17779 Main St, Irvine, California, 92614.
- 2. CS agrees to make classrooms available to RSCCD as feasible, and as mutually determined according to need and availability.
- 3. RSCCD agrees that the leased classrooms will be used solely for educational purposes.
- 4. This lease is entered into pursuant to the Education Code of California.
- 5. Apprenticeship classes and instruction will be monitored by the Apprenticeship Office at Santiago Canyon College.
- 6. The term of this lease will be for one(1) year beginning on 1September 2010 and terminating on 30 June 2011, unless earlier terminated by either party in the manner set forth herein.
- 7. Either party may terminate the lease without penalty upon thirty (30) days prior written notice.
- 8. RSCCD agrees to pay CS the amount of one thousand two hundred dollars (\$1,200.00). Payment is to be made in one (1) payment upon receipt of an invoice from CS.
- 9. CS shall, at its cost and expense, provide access and keys for instructors, room space, lights, and heat as needed. CS shall also provide all janitorial supplies and services to the leased classrooms and facilities to which RSCCD is authorized to use as well as all common areas, which shall include but not limited to, the replacement of restroom supplies, light bulbs and fluorescent tubes.
- 10. RSCCD shall not make any alterations to the classrooms or any other facility which RSCCD is authorized to use without the written consent of CS.

- 11. RSCCD shall, during the term of this lease, keep in good order, condition, and repair all leased classroom space.
- 12. Any notices to be given hereunder by either party to the other may be effectuated only in writing and delivered either by personal delivery, or sent by U.S. certified mail, postage pre-paid with return receipt requested. Mailed notices shall be addressed to the persons at the addresses set forth below, but each party may change the address by written notice in accordance with this paragraph. All such notices personally delivered shall be effective when received. All notices sent by certified mail shall be effective forty-eight hours after deposited in the mail.

Each party shall maintain and secure comprehensive general liability and property damage insurance of not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and three million dollars (\$3,000,000) in the aggregate, and said policy shall remain in full force and effect during the term hereof. Thirty (30) days written notice shall be provided to the other party prior to cancellation, or reduction in said insurance. Upon request, the requesting party shall be provided a copy of said policy.

RSCCD agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless CS and its officers, employees, agents, and volunteers from any and all claims, actions, losses, damages and/or liability arising out of the performance of this Agreement or from any cause whatsoever which may arise because of the negligence, misconduct, or other fault of RSCCD, including any acts, errors, or omissions of any officers, employees, instructors, students,

or agents of RSCCD in the performance of its obligations under this Agreement.

- 16. CS agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless RSCCD and its respective trustees, officers, employees, instructors, agents, representatives and students free and harmless from and against all claims, actions, damages, liability, loss and expense, including reasonable attorney's fees and court costs, or from any cause whatsoever which may arise because of the negligence, misconduct or other fault of CS, including any acts, errors, or omissions of any trustees, officers, employees, instructors, students, or agents of CS in the performance of its obligations under this Agreement.
- 17. Neither party hereto may assign this Agreement or delegate its duties hereunder without the prior written consent of the other party, which can and may be withheld by either party in its sole and absolute discretion.
- 18. This Agreement constitutes the entire understanding of the parties with respect to the matters stated herein. Any Agreements or promises, oral or written, which are not reflected in the written terms of this Agreements are and shall be superseded by the terms of this Agreement. No waiver or modification of the terms hereof shall be valid unless in writing and signed by both parties.

#### AGREEMENT

## Occupational Therapy Assistant Program

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into the August 24, 2010, by and between InJOY Life Resources, Inc. (InJOY), hereinafter called the Agency, and Rancho Santiago Community College District on behalf of Santa Ana College, hereinafter called the District.

## PART I. BASIS AND PURPOSE OF AGREEMENT

#### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the District and Agency acknowledge a public obligation to contribute to Occupational Therapy Assistant Program education for the benefit for students and to meet community needs.

WHEREAS, the District provides programs in Occupational Therapy Assistant Program education, which require clinical experience for students, enrolled in these programs.

WHEREAS, the Agency has facilities suitable for the clinical needs of the District programs in the Occupational Therapy Assistant Program.

WHEREAS, it is to the benefit of both District and Agency that Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students have opportunities for clinical experience to enhance their capabilities as practitioners.

NOW, THEREFORE, the District and Agency do covenant and agree as follows:

## PART II. GENERAL RESPONSIBILITIES AND PRIVILEGES OF THE COLLEGE

- A. For the Program in General
  - 1. The District will assume full responsibility for offering Occupational Therapy Assistant Program education programs eligible for accreditation by the appropriate State Board.
  - 2. District faculty members may be invited to serve as voluntary resource persons to the Agency staff by serving on Occupational Therapy Assistant Program care committees, by sharing knowledge as clinical experts, and by participation in other matters dealing with the quality of patient care.
  - 3. For Background clearance
    The District shall inform The Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students
    of the Background Check requirement and their responsibility of payment.

4. For Student Workmen's Compensation
The District shall carry Workmen's Compensation Insurance on students of the
District during clinical assignment, and keep records of clinical attendance for
audit by the State Workmen's Compensation Insurance Fund.

## B. For Program Planning

- 1. The District will initiate the development of mutually acceptable clinical instruction plans for using the Agency's clinical areas to meet the educational goals of Occupational Therapy Assistant Program curricula. These plans will be made available to the Agency at a mutually agreed upon time prior to the beginning of the school term and subject to revision in instances of conflicts with agency patient care responsibilities and/or District interests.
- The District has the privilege of regularly scheduled meetings with Agency staff, including both selected Agency personnel and administrative level representatives for the purpose of interpreting, discussing, and evaluating the educational program in occupational therapy.

## C. For Occupational Therapy Assistant Program Students

1. The District will be responsible for assuring that Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students assigned to the Agency for clinical instruction meet both District and Agency standards of health and physical fitness, and shall provide certification that the Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students have been immunized against the common communicable diseases.

# PART III. GENERAL RESPONSIBILITIES AND PRIVILEGES OF THE AGENCY

# A. For the Program in General

- 1. The Agency will maintain the standards, which make it eligible for approval as a clinical area for instruction in accredited Occupational Therapy Assistant Program programs. To further this, the Agency agrees to provide and maintain personnel who are in its opinion, capable and qualified in those divisions in which students are placed.
- 2. The administration of the service and patient care at the Agency shall be the responsibility of and under the control and supervision of the Agency and shall be administered through the Agency and shall be administered through the Agency staff.
- 3. The Agency will designate a staff member who will function as Education Coordinator for Occupational Therapy Assistant Program education uses of the Agency facilities, including joint planning and representatives of all involved Occupational Therapy Assistant Program programs.

- 4. The Agency will provide orientation for students and faculty to familiarize them with Agency policies and facilities before assigning them to duties at the Agency.
- 5. The Agency will permit its employees to participate in the educational program as resource persons and clinical experts provided such participation does not interfere with assigned duties.
- 6. The Agency will permit the faculty and students of the District to use its patient care and patient service facilities for clinical education according to approved curricula.
- 7. The Agency will confer with the District prior to making a commitment for new or expanded use of its clinical facilities by any other Occupational Therapy Assistant Program that interfere with current student placement.

#### B. For Services and Facilities

- 1. The Agency will permit the educational use of such supplies and equipment as are commonly available for patient care.
- 2. The Agency will permit use of the following facilities and services by District Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students and faculty at such times and to the degrees considered feasible by the agency.
  - a. Parking areas.
  - b. Locker, storage and dressing facilities.
  - c. Same food services as are available for Agency staff.
  - d. First aid treatment with written consent required for minors.
  - e. Access to sources of information for education purposes such as:
    - 1. Patient's chart.
    - 2. Procedure guides policy manuals.
    - 3. Medical dictionaries, pharmacology references, and other references suitable to the clinical area.
    - 4. Books and periodicals in the Medical library.

#### C. For the Control of District Personnel

1. The Agency may refuse access to its clinical areas to Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students or district faculty who do not meet its employee standards for safety, health, cooperation, or ethical behavior pending investigation and resolution of the matter by the Agency and the District.

## JOINT RESPONSIBILITIES AND PRIVILEGES

#### A. For publications

PART IV.

1. Publication by District faculty, or Agency staff members of any material relative to their clinical experience, that has not been approved for release by the District and Agency signers of this agreement, is prohibited.

#### B. Insurance:

Without limiting the indemnification obligations stated below, each party to the Agreement shall maintain and secure at its own expense comprehensive general liability, property damage insurance, and professional liability of not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and three million dollars (\$3,000,000) in the aggregate, and said policy shall remain in full force and effect during the term hereof. Thirty (30) days written notice shall be provided to the other party prior to cancellation, or reduction in said insurance. Upon request, the requesting party shall be provided a copy of said policy.

#### C. Indemnification

All parties to this Agreement shall agree to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the

other party, its officers, agents, employees, students and volunteers, from and against all loss, cost, and expense arising out of any liability or claim of liability, sustained or claimed to have been sustained, arising out of the activities, or the performance or nonperformance of obligations under this Agreement, of the indemnifying party, or those of any of its officers, agents, employees, students or volunteers. The provisions of this Article do not apply to any damage or losses caused solely by the negligence or intentional acts of the non-indemnifying party or any of its agents or employees.

# PART V. STATUS OF OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY ASSISTANT STUDENTS

- A. Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students shall have the status as learners and shall not be considered to be Agency employees nor shall they replace Agency staff. Any service rendered by the student during the experience is to be considered in addition to planned patient care in that area. Clinical experience will be conducted as a laboratory learning experience. The Agency will provide regular staffing for patient care in areas where students are obtaining clinical experience.
- B. Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students are subject to the authority, policies, and regulations of the district. They are also subject, during clinical assignment, to applicable agency regulations and must conform to the same standards as are for Agency employees in matters relating to the welfare of patients and general Agency operations.

- C. Occupational Therapy Assistant Program students shall be responsible for proper coverage in regard to malpractice insurance, or any other liability insurance that might be required by either the District or the Agency.
- D. The District will be responsible for assuring that health care students assigned to the Agency for clinical instruction meet both District and Agency standards of health and physical fitness.

## PART VI. PERIOD OF AGREEMENT, TERMINATION

A. This agreement shall be effective as of the date signed, and shall continue in effect for five years, unless terminated earlier by written notice of either party. Either party to this Agreement may, in its sole discretion, terminate this Agreement with or without cause by giving the other party at least 30 days' prior written notice. In the event the Agreement is terminated for cause, all of the obligations of the terminating party shall be waived immediately upon written notice of termination. In the event of termination without cause, the parties agree to fulfill their respective obligations associated with the current term or semester, prior to such termination becoming effective.

## STANDARD CLINICAL AFFILIATION AGREEMENT

This standard Clinical Affiliation Agreement (the "Agreement") is made and entered into between the Rancho Santiago Community College District, a public educational agency ("District") located in Santa Ana, California, and Schaefer Ambulance ("Clinical Facility") located in Santa Ana, California.

WHEREAS, District and Clinical Facility desire to contribute to community health education;

WHEREAS, District operates Santa Ana College ("College") and College is a duly accredited educational institution that conducts the program(s) described and identified herein this Agreement (the "Program");

WHEREAS, District has obtained all necessary licenses, consents and/or approvals to conduct the Program from the State of California and any other applicable government agency;

WHEREAS, Clinical Facility operates a duly licensed health care agency and has obtained all necessary licenses, consents, and approvals;

WHEREAS, as part of the Program, students are required to participate in a clinical experience rotation;

WHEREAS, District desires to affiliate with the Clinical Facility in order that students may participate in a clinical experience rotation at the Clinical Facility; and

WHEREAS, District and Clinical Facility desire to enter into this Agreement to memorialize their respective rights, duties, and obligations with respect to the clinical experience rotation of students of the College's Program.

#### For purposes of this Agreement, the following definitions shall apply:

"District" shall refer to the Rancho Santiago Community College District, its member Colleges, the District's Governing Board, and each of their trustees, employees, agents, representatives, successors and assigns;

"College" shall refer to Santa Ana College, and each of its employees, agents, representatives and assigns;

"Clinical Facility" shall refer to Schaefer Ambulance, its parents, subsidies, related companies, and each of their officers, directors, employees, agents, representatives, successors, and assigns;

The "Program" shall refer to the Clinical training in health science programs; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the following covenants, conditions and agreements, the parties hereto agree as follows:

#### **TERMS**

- Clinical Experience Rotation. Clinical Facility agrees to provide students of the Program
  who are specified by College with a clinical experience rotation ("Rotation"), in
  accordance with standards established by governmental agencies and recognized
  professional accrediting agencies, and subject to the terms and conditions of this
  Agreement.
- 2. Development of Curriculum. College shall be fully responsible for the development, planning, and administration of the program, including, without limitation, programming, administration, matriculation, promotion and graduation. College acknowledges and agrees that the Rotation is intended to meet certain educational performance objectives, and College shall provide a copy of such performance objectives to Clinical Facility on or before student placement. Clinical Facility shall be fully responsible for the availability and appropriateness of the learning environment in relation to the program's written objectives.
- 3. Exposure to Bloodbourne Pathogens. Program students and college faculty will comply with the final regulations issued by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration governing employee exposure to bloodbourne pathogens in the workplace under Section VI(b) of the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970, which regulations became effective March 6, 1992 (the "Regulations"), including but not limited to responsibility as the employer to provide all program students with (a) information and training about the hazards associated with blood and other potentially infectious materials, (b) information and training about the protective measures to be taken to minimize the risk of occupational exposure to bloodbourne pathogens, (c) training in the appropriate actions to take in an emergency involving exposure to blood and other potentially infectious materials, and (d) information as to the reasons the program student should participate in hepatitis B vaccination and post-exposure evaluation and follow-up. District's responsibility with respect to the Regulations also shall include the provision of the hepatitis B vaccination or documentation of declination in accordance with the Regulations.
- 4. <u>Applicable Procedure: Acceptance</u>. College agrees to provide Clinical Facility with a list of the name(s) of students who will be participating in a rotation.
- 5. Nondiscrimination. The parties agree not to discriminate in the selection, placement or evaluation of any student or faculty member because of race, creed, national origin, religion, sex, marital status, age, handicap, and/or medical condition. The Rancho Santiago Community College District complies with all Federal and state rules and regulations and does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, gender or disability. This holds true for all students who are interested in participating in educational programs and/or extracurricular school activities. Harassment of any employee/student with regard to race, color, national origin, gender or disability is

- strictly prohibited. Inquiries regarding compliance and/or grievance procedures may be directed to District's Title IX Officer and/or Section 504/ADA Coordinator.
- 6. <u>Academic Year</u>. The academic year consists of Fall, and Spring semesters, Summer session and Winter break intersession.
- 7. Rotation Schedule. The rotation schedule shall be determined by College and Clinical Facility and may be amended from time to time by agreement of the parties. The number of students in each rotation shall be limited to a number mutually agreed upon by both parties, not to exceed the number specified by the accrediting agency(s).
- 8. <u>Orientation</u>. Clinical Facility and College shall provide an orientation for assigned students participating in each rotation.
- 9. <u>Compliance with Clinical Facility Rules</u>. Clinical Facility shall make available all applicable governing instruments, policies and procedures, rules and regulations of Clinical Facility to each student participating in a rotation, and student shall comply with these rules.
  - In providing the students with the clinical rotation that is the subject of this Agreement, Clinical Facility shall comply with all applicable laws, rules, regulations, statutes, policies, procedures, and ordinances and shall be consistent with the professional standards of a health care agency.
- 10. <u>Confidentiality of Patient Records</u>. Students and faculty understand and agree that Clinical Facility's patient files are confidential.
- 11. <u>Clinical Coordinator (College)</u>. College agrees to designate a coordinator for each program. The coordinator, who may be an academic instructor, shall be responsible for all teaching activities.
- 12. <u>Clinical Advisor (Clinical Facility)</u>. Clinical Facility agrees to designate a clinical advisor or coordinator who shall provide input to the clinical performance and evaluation of student(s), be a resource person for College's faculty and students, and shall communicate with the clinical coordinator designated by College regarding the proposed curriculum and the performance of individual students and shall arrange formal orientation to the facility for the faculty and students.
- 13. Supervision of Students. The supervision and direction of students while on site at Clinical Facility shall be the responsibility of the Clinical Coordinator (College) or designee as guided by the instructional objectives. No direct, hands-on patient care shall be provided by participating students at Clinical Facility, except in accordance with all applicable laws, Clinical Facility and Medical Staff rules, regulations, policies and procedures. District recognizes the patients' rights to refuse care provided by a student at Clinical Facility.
- 14. Removal of Students. Clinical Facility retains the right to exclude any student at any time from any clinical area. Any student who is asked to leave by Clinical Facility shall do so promptly and without protest. Clinical Facility shall also have the right, at any time, to

request College to remove a student permanently from the rotation. Except as otherwise proved under any approachable policies, procedures, rules, regulations, and/or under any law, any such removal shall not require compliance with any notice, hearing or other procedural requirements.

- 15. Patient Care. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as conferring any right or duty upon College, its students or faculty members, to control or direct patient care or operations at Clinical Facility. Clinical Facility shall maintain sole responsibility and accountability for patient care and shall provide adequate staffing in number and competency to ensure safe and continuous health care during the term of this Agreement.
- Instructor (College), he/she shall be responsible for student(s) evaluation. Unless otherwise mutually agreed between the Clinical Coordinator (College) and the Clinical Advisor (Clinical Facility), Clinical Facility may be responsible for submitting input to the Clinical Coordinator evaluating and appropriately documenting the performance of each student in the clinical rotation. The appropriate forms shall be provided by the Clinical Coordinator. Nothing herein shall be construed as a guarantee by or obligation of Clinical Facility regarding the performance of any student during the rotation. College shall keep records on the progress and evaluation of each student's clinical experience during a rotation for a period of three (3) years following the end of the specific rotation in which the student is involved.
- 17. Ongoing Communication. College has the privilege of regularly scheduled meetings with Clinical Facility staff, including both selected unit personnel and administrative level representatives for the purpose of interpreting, discussing, and evaluating College's health care programs at a mutually agreed upon time.
- 18. <u>Materials</u>. College agrees to provide students with all educational material required during the clinical program.
- 19. <u>Medical Library</u>. Clinical Facility agrees to provide students with access to the Medical Library, if applicable, during its normal business hours.
- 20. No Payments or Other Remuneration. College agrees that no fees or monetary payments of any kind shall be exchanged between Clinical Facility, its agents and employees, and College, its agents, employees and students under the terms of this Agreement. Further, neither College, its staff members, nor other representatives, shall attempt to bill or collect from any patient or from any other source fees for services provided to patients by said student.

The only exception shall be when Clinical Facility and College mutually agree to pay a Clinical Advisor a stipend for duties directly related to College's program.

21. No Right to Employment. The parties agree that the students of College shall not be considered employees, agents or volunteers of Clinical Facility, nor shall any student be entitled to any right, compensation, or other benefits normally afforded to employees of Clinical Facility, including but not limited to, Social Security, unemployment and workers' compensation insurance.

- 22. <u>Insurance Carried by the District</u>. District shall assure coverage of professional liability insurance for each student participating in the Rotation of not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and three million dollars (\$3,000,000) in the aggregate, and said policy shall remain in full force and effect during the term hereof. District shall provide workers' compensation coverage for students participating in the rotation. These coverage's are in effect while the student is on-site at Clinical Facility.
- 23. Insurance Carried by Clinical Facility. Clinical Facility shall secure and maintain comprehensive general liability insurance covering personal injury, property damage, and general liability claims in the amount of at least one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and three million dollars (\$3,000,000) in the aggregate with coverage for incidental contracts. A certificate of insurance must be provided that includes thirty (30) days notice of cancellation, modification, or reduction in said insurance. Clinical Facility shall deliver certificate(s) of insurance under Clinical Facility's comprehensive general liability insurance policy on or before the date of execution of this agreement. Upon request, District shall be provided a copy of said policy. Clinical Facility shall carry professional liability insurance for itself and each of its employee(s), partners, and/or representatives providing professional services at Clinical Facility, except for District's students and College faculty, in the amount of at least one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and three million dollars (\$3,000,000) in the aggregate. Clinical Facility shall provide District with thirty (30) days written notice prior to cancellation, or reduction in said insurance. Upon request, District shall be provided a copy of said policy.

Clinical Facility shall provide workers' compensation coverage for each of its employees.

24. Student Health Records. Any student participating in a rotation shall, at the request of Clinical Facility, provide a current statement from his or her physician that the student is in good health and capable of participating in the rotation. Clinical Facility, upon request, may require that any student returning from an extended absence caused by illness or injury submit to a physical examination or present a statement from a physician indicating that the student is capable of resuming clinical activities. Any such physical examination shall be the financial responsibility of the student.

Any student participating in a rotation shall provide verification of annual T.B. screening, immune status for mumps, rubeola, rubella, and chicken pox, hepatitis B (or signed waiver for hepatitis B).

- 10. <u>Confidentiality of Patient Records</u>. Students and faculty understand and agree that Clinical Facility's patient files are confidential.
- 11. <u>Clinical Coordinator (College</u>). College agrees to designate a coordinator for each program. The coordinator, who may be an academic instructor, shall be responsible for all teaching activities.
- 12. Clinical Advisor (Clinical Facility). Clinical Facility agrees to designate a clinical advisor or coordinator who shall provide input to the clinical performance and evaluation of student(s), be a resource person for College's faculty and students, and shall communicate with the clinical coordinator designated by College regarding the proposed curriculum and the performance of individual students and shall arrange formal orientation to the facility for the faculty and students.
- 13. <u>Supervision of Students</u>. The supervision and direction of students while on site at Clinical Facility shall be the responsibility of the Clinical Coordinator (College) or designee as guided by the instructional objectives. No direct, hands-on patient care shall be provided by participating students at Clinical Facility, except in accordance with all applicable laws, Clinical Facility and Medical Staff rules, regulations, policies and procedures. District recognizes the patients' rights to refuse care provided by a student at Clinical Facility.

Nothing herein shall be construed as a guarantee by or obligation of Clinical Facility regarding the performance of any student during the rotation. College shall keep records on the progress and evaluation of each student's clinical experience during a rotation for a period of three (3) years following the end of the specific rotation in which the student is involved.
- 17. Ongoing Communication. College has the privilege of regularly scheduled meetings with Clinical Facility staff, including both selected unit personnel and administrative level representatives for the purpose of interpreting, discussing, and evaluating College's health care programs at a mutually agreed upon time.
- 18. <u>Materials</u>. College agrees to provide students with all educational material required during the clinical program.
- 19. Medical Library. Clinical Facility agrees to provide students with access to the Medical Library, if applicable, during its normal business hours.
- 20. No Payments or Other Remuneration. College agrees that no fees or monetary payments of any kind shall be exchanged between Clinical Facility, its agents and employees, and College, its agents, employees and students under the terms of this Agreement. Further, neither College, its staff members, nor other representatives, shall attempt to bill or collect from any patient or from any other source fees for services provided to patients by said student.

If requested by Clinical Facility, College will provide Clinical Facility with verification that the Program is duly licensed, duly accredited and/or certified, as applicable, by appropriate agencies. District covenants and agrees that at all times during the term hereof it shall retain such licensure, accreditation and/or certification, and its Program and faculty members shall continue to meet any and all federal, state and local requirements.
- 28. <u>Indemnification</u>. All parties to this Agreement shall agree to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the other party, its officers, agents, employees, and volunteers, from and against all loss, cost, and expense arising out of any liability or claim of liability, sustained or claimed to have been sustained, arising out of the activities, or the performance or non-performance of obligations under this Agreement, of the indemnifying party, or those of any of its officers, agents, employees, or volunteers. The provisions of this Article do not apply to any damage or losses caused solely by the negligence or intentional acts of the non-indemnifying party or any of its agents or employees.
- 29. Governing Law. This Agreement shall be governed by and constructed in accordance with the laws of the State of California.
- 30. <u>Assignment</u>. Neither party hereto may assign this Agreement or delegate its duties hereunder without the prior written consent of the other party which can and may be withheld by either party in its sole and absolute discretion.
- 31. Effective Date Termination. This Agreement shall become effective on September 16, 2010 and shall remain in effect until September 15, 2015, unless sooner terminated by either party in accordance with this section. Either party may terminate this Agreement without cause by giving ninety (90) days prior written notice to the other party of its intention to terminate. In the event a rotation is in progress, any written notice to terminate with or without cause shall become effective at the expiration of the rotation. Notwithstanding the foregoing, in the event the Program is discontinued by College during its Term, this Agreement shall immediately terminate without further action by the parties hereto.

This Agreement shall become effective on September 16, 2010 and shall remain in effect until September 15, 2015, unless sooner terminated by either party in accordance with this section. Either party may terminate this Agreement without cause by giving ninety (90) days prior written notice to the other party of its intention to terminate. In the event a rotation is in progress, any written notice to terminate with or without cause shall become effective at the expiration of the rotation. Notwithstanding the foregoing, in the event the Program is discontinued by College during its Term, this Agreement shall immediately terminate without further action by the parties hereto.
- 32. Notices. Any notices to be given hereunder by either party to the other may be effectuated only in writing and delivered either by personal deliver, or by U. S. mail. Mailed notices shall be addressed to the persons at the addresses set forth below, but each party may change the address by written notice in accordance with this paragraph. Notices delivered personally will be deemed communicated as of actual receipt; mailed notices will be deemed communicated as of ten (10) days after mailing.

# **BACKGROUND**

In past years SAC and SCC have had collaborative programs with local universities that offered qualified graduate students an opportunity to learn about careers as community college faculty through a supervised internship program, originally funded through a state grant. That grant has expired, but the value and success of the program has led the colleges to seek new means of partnering and funding the graduate student internship program. UC Irvine is funding efforts to continue the program, of the last two years, and the university has selected our district as the partner. This year we anticipate 6-8 graduate student interns to participate, matched with our faculty, who serve as mentors.

### **ANALYSIS**

The graduate student internship program has been very successful, and RSCCD faculty who have served as mentors, advocate for the program's continuance. UCI will pay all costs through this agreement. This agreement has been reviewed and approved by college staff.

# COLLABORATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN RANCHO SANTIAGO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT AND

#### THE REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA

This agreement ("Agreement") is entered into this 1st day of July, 2010 by and between THE REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, on behalf of its Irvine campus ("University") and Rancho Santiago Community College District ("Collaborator"), "University and "Collaborator" will collectively be referred to as the Parties and agree as follows:

#### SCOPE OF PROGRAM

The scope of program that is subject to this agreement is attached hereto as Exhibit A, and entitled "UCI/Santa Ana & Santiago Canyon College Joint Graduate Student/Faculty Internship Program" ("Program"). The Dean of UCI's Graduate Division will be the University's Program Director and shall be responsible for the direction of all efforts hereunder in accordance with applicable *University* policies. Sharon Whelan, Dean of Humanities and Social Sciences at Santa Ana College shall be responsible for the direction of all effort at Collaborator's institution.

#### 2. PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE

The period of performance of this Agreement will be three years from July 22, 2010 through June 30, 2013 unless extended by mutual written agreement.

#### TOTAL ESTIMATED COST

The total cost to the *University* for Performance of this Agreement will not exceed \$37,500, based on an annual budget of \$12,500 per year, and shall be determined in accordance with the budget, attached hereto as **Exhibit B**. If at any time *Collaborator* has reason to believe that the cost of the program will be greater than estimated, *Collaborator* shall notify *University* in writing to that effect, giving a revised budget of the cost to complete the Program. *University* will not be obligated to reimburse *Collaborator* for the costs incurred in excess of the amount referenced above unless and until *University* has notified *Collaborator* in writing that additional funds will be provided.

#### 4. PAYMENT AND BILLING

The *University* shall make payment to the *Collaborator* upon receipt of the *Collaborator*'s properly completed invoice. The *University* will not be obligated to pay any invoice where total payments would result in a cumulative payment in excess of the limitations imposed by Article 3. *Collaborator* shall submit an invoice as follows:

Prior to May 31 of each year this agreement is in force, *Collaborator* shall submit to *University* a report of all expenditures incurred under this agreement. Report shall include funds received to date, expenditures to date, anticipated expenditures for the remaining months of the agreement, and remaining balance, if any. *University* will consider expenditures during budget negotiations for subsequent support under this agreement.

Collaborator shall also submit to *University* a comprehensive final financial report within ninety (90) days of termination of the program. Report shall include funds received to date, expenditures to date, and remaining balance, if any.

#### 5. ADVERTISING AND PUBLICITY

Neither the *University* nor the *Collaborator* shall use the name of the other, either expressly or by implication, in any advertisement, press release or publicity without the expressed written approval of the other party to this agreement.

#### 6. INDEMNIFICATION

Collaborator agrees to defend, indemnify and hold University, its officers, employees and agents, harmless from and against any and all liability, loss, expense, attorneys' fees, or claims for injury or damages arising out of the performance of this Agreement but only in proportion to and to the extent such liability, loss, expense, attorneys' fees, or claims for injury or damages are caused by or result from the negligent or intentional acts or omissions of Collaborator, its officers, agents, or employees.

University agrees to defend, indemnify and hold Collaborator, its officers, employees and agents, harmless from and against any and all liability, loss, expense, attorneys' fees, or claims for injury or damages arising out of the performance of this Agreement but only in proportion to and to the extent such liability, loss, expense, attorneys' fees, or claims for injury or damages are caused by or result from the negligent or intentional acts or omissions of University, its officers, agents, or employees.

University understands and agrees that University and all University's employees, interns, agents, representatives, and assignees are not employees of the Collaborator and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided to employees of the Collaborator or to which Collaborator's employees are usually entitled including, but not limited to, state employment compensation or workmen's compensation.

University shall reimburse Collaborator for all costs incurred by it for the Program through the date of termination. However, University will not be liable for any costs that cumulatively exceed the amount referenced in Article 3.

### 2010-2013 GOALS AND CONTRACT

The purpose of this internship to provide interns with the opportunity to learn about faculty life, governance, and teaching at a community college by partnering with a California Community College faculty member. The partner's role is to provide guidance, support, and information that will help the intern to better assess her or his interest in and suitability for a position at a community college. Together, the faculty partner and student intern have the opportunity to exchange information and expertise from their respective experiences that will hopefully enhance the professional lives of both parties.

# **Specific Outcomes:**

As demonstrated through practice teaching, mock interviews, and presentations in US 390C, interns will...

- demonstrate their knowledge and understanding of the host institution's student demographics, admissions guidelines, and faculty demographics.
- demonstrate an understanding of the specific needs of the host institution's students.
   demonstrate an understanding of the history and political make-up of the California
   Community Colleges as well as the host institution.
- demonstrate an understanding of the host institution's organizational structure.
- be able to successfully register with the California Community College Registry
- practice effective interviewing, observation, and facilitative feedback skills.
- successfully negotiate time commitments, responsibilities, and duties with the partner.
- successfully communicate with and resolve conflicts with the program facilitators as needed.
- demonstrate an understanding of successful job search, interview, and negotiation skills for employment at a community college,
- demonstrate an understanding of the time commitments and responsibilities of a community college faculty member.
- effectively teach a lesson or lessons in a community college classroom.
- successfully integrate her or his experiences at the community college into a coherent Statement of Teaching Philosophy, if applicable.

During the internship period, the intern will have the opportunity to participate in a variety of opportunities to learn faculty life, governance, and teaching at a community college:

# Types of Experiences/Activities:

Faculty Interview: The intern will meet with the faculty partner(s) so they can get to know one another. The intern may interview the faculty member about his or her educational and professional background, as well as the faculty member's history at the host institution. The internship will also canvas the member to learn about his or her assessment of being a faculty 4.10 (5)

member at a community college, and get an overview of the types of responsibilities the faculty member has (i.e., teaching, advising, committee work, service, grants, research, etc.).

<u>Divisional Dean Interview:</u> Ideally, the intern should meet with a Division dean to learn about hiring practices and faculty life at the community colleges.

<u>Department and/or Divisional Curriculum Meeting</u>: Ideally, the intern should have the opportunity to sit in on a department faculty meeting, preferably one dealing with curriculum, assessment, &/ or hiring.

<u>Senate Meeting</u>: Ideally, to gain a better understanding of the service role faculty play and community college governance, the intern should have the opportunity to sit in with the mentor on at least one Senate committee meeting.

Classroom Observation: In preparation for teaching, the intern should have the opportunity to observe multiple classes (number to be determined between the mentor and intern), preferably ones on a topic the intern might teach in the future. The intern should meet with the faculty member before the observations to determine the learning goals and to determine whether the faculty member would like any feedback based on the intern's observations. After the observations, the intern and mentor should meet to discuss how the class went and how the intern might teach the classes in the future.

Teaching: The intern should have the opportunity to teach at least two class sessions. The intern should meet ahead of time with the mentor to discuss the learning goals and teaching methods, The mentor should observe the class and give the intern feedback.

<u>Feedback:</u> In addition to informal feedback, at the end of fall and winter/spring internships, the faculty partner will provide written feedback to program and intern. (It is assumed that if there are any problems with the internship these will be brought to the program facilitators' attention, as well as the intern's, long before it is time to complete the end-of-internship feedback.) The intern will also complete an end-of-internship written evaluation at the end of fall and spring.

Attached please find the Treasurer's Management Report for the County of Orange for the month ended June 30, 2010. The information provided herein, including all charts, tables, graphs and numerical representations, is provided to readers solely as a general overview of the economic and market conditions which the Treasurer utilizes in making investment decisions. In addition, a complete version of this report is also available for download at our website www.ttc.ocgov.com.

# CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER'S REPORT

In order to assist you in reading this report, please note that the current balances reflect the investments recorded in the portfolios for each particular fund for the period ending June 30, 2010. Each money market fund has an average maturity of less than sixty days, with a net asset value (NAV) falling within the range of \$0.9950 and \$1.0050. The Extended Fund shall have a duration not to exceed a leading 1-3 Year index +25%. All investments are marked to the market at the end of the reporting period due to the narrow valuation range prescribed by the Pools' Investment Policy Statement.

The reports reflect the par value (face value), the cost and market value (the price of each security at the close of the market on the last trading day of the month). Market values are derived from the Bloomberg Professional Service, a premier provider of instant access to real-time and historical financial data. The difference between the market value and book value is the unrealized gain or (loss). The Detail Transaction Report Section is provided in compliance with California Government Code Section 53607, which requires that the Treasurer file such a report with the Board of Supervisors, from whom his investment authority has been delegated.

# APPORTIONMENT OF COMMINGLED POOL INTEREST EARNINGS

We have prepared a forecast for the timing of the County Investment Pool's May 2010 and June 2010 interest apportionments. We anticipate posting the May 2010 and June 2010 interest apportionments to participants' cash accounts in the County general ledger by approximately August 11 and August 23, 2010 respectively.

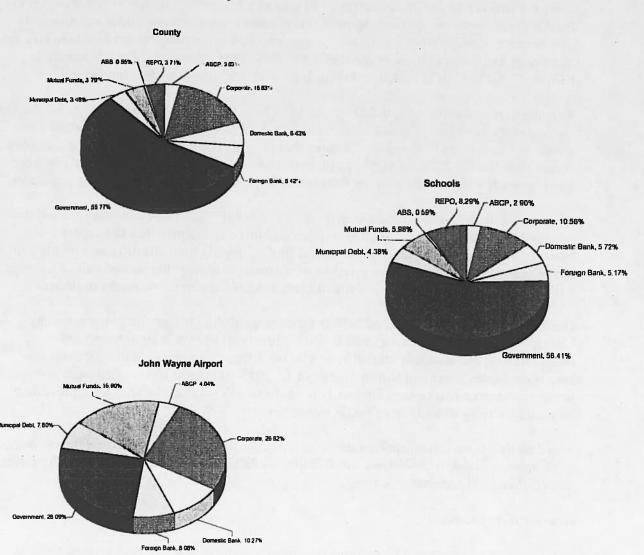

#### MARKET OBSERVATIONS

The bond market continues to focus on Europe as well as the oil spill in the Gulf of Mexico. As if this is not enough to worry about, fresh concerns have been raised about deflation and a possible double dip recession in the United States. Our take on this is that the probability of either is remote.

In direct contrast to news articles in the popular press, there are very few elements of the economy that are actually contracting. The majority are expanding, however not as quickly as market participants would like! Manufacturing employment is rising and the consumer is continuing to emerge from hibernation. Consumers are not willing, or are unable to take on more debt, but they continue to spend and pay down debt simultaneously. "What about housing," you say? It is no longer falling apart and is adding to bottom line growth.

The month over month, core inflation rates have been picking up for several months. As with the rest of the economy, the rate of increase is considerably below what the inflation crowd would like to see. Still, this does not mean that the only other alternative is deflation. Slow, steady growth of 2-2.5% for a few quarters won't bring down the unemployment rate very quickly, but it will provide a strong foundation for continuation of the economic expansion.

In our opinion, the most pressing concern is how does all the liquidity sloshing around the system get into the hands of small businesses and those consumers with the capacity to borrow? There are two main impediments to this, extremely high due diligence on the part of lenders and stagnant demand for a variety of reasons. It appears the second half of the year will be a tough slog but we are not anticipating a double-dip in the economy or deflation.

Our forecast for the remainder of 2010 is for continued sluggish growth in the economy. Unemployment will remain elevated at current levels and diminishing government intervention in the economy should keep a lid on inflation. Because of this we anticipate longer term rates to remain within a range of +/- .50% of current levels. Although our opinion is short term rates will remain low, we believe there will continue to be upward pressure on rates and are leery of locking in longer maturities.

Based on the above observations, our office will continue to take advantage of moves in the marketplace to selectively extend our duration, while investing in securities that will protect us from higher short-term interest rates.

#### **Interest Rate Forecast**

The Treasurer's Investment Committee is currently estimating an average interest yield of 1.35% for 2009-2010. For the fiscal year 2010-2011, we are estimating an average interest yield of 1.20%.

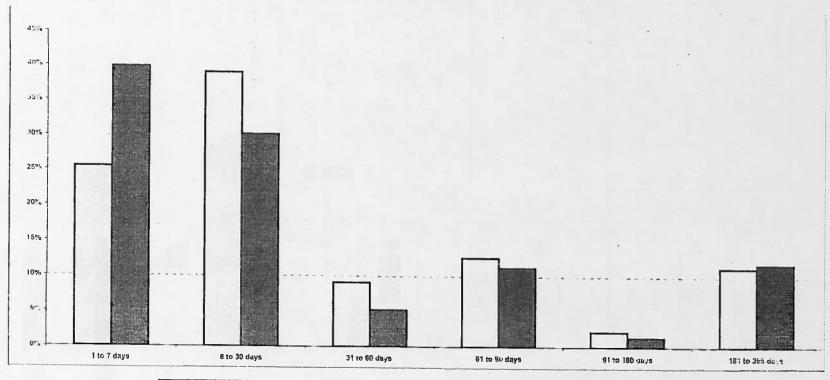

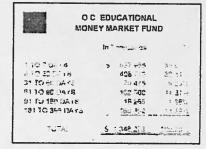

June 30, 2010



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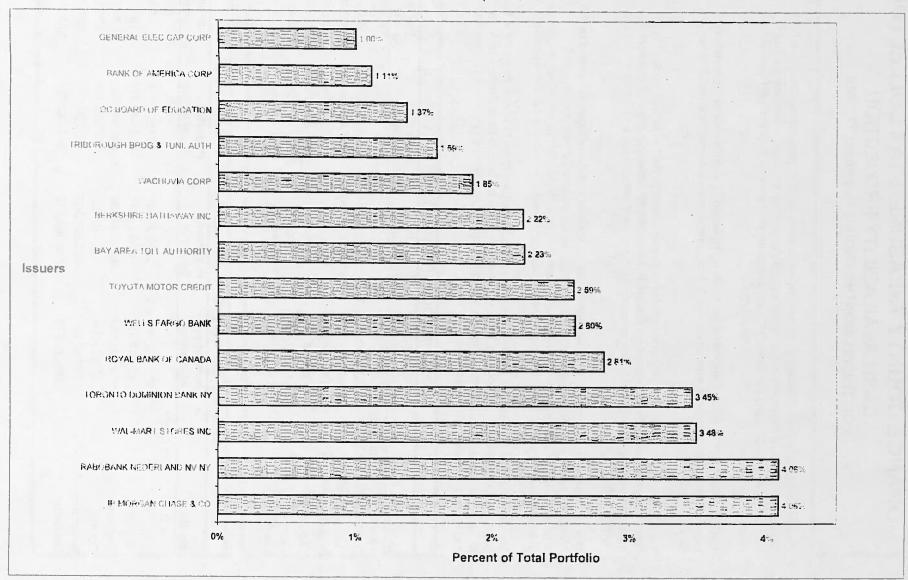

## ORANGE COUNTY TREASURER-TAX COLLECTOR CASH AVAILABILITY PROJECTION

FOR THE SIX MONTHS ENDING December 31, 2010

Government Code Section 53646 (b) (3), effective on January 1, 1996, requires the Treasurer-Tax Collector to include a statement in the investment report, denoting the ability of the Orange County Investment Pool (OCIP) and the Orange County Educational Investment Pool (OCEIP) to meet their expenditure requirements for the next six months.

The OCIP and OCEIP consist of funds in the treasury deposited by various entities required to do so by statute, as well as those entities voluntarily depositing monies in accordance with Government Code Section 53684.

The Treasurer-Tax Collector is required to disburse monies placed in the treasury as directed by the Auditor-Controller and the Department of Education, except for the making of legal investments, to the extent funds are transferred to one or more clearing funds in accordance with Government Code Section 29808.

The Treasurer-Tax Collector, in his projection of cash availability to disburse funds as directed by the Auditor-Controller and the Department of Education, is relying exclusively on historical activity involving deposits and disbursements and future cash flow projections. No representation is made as to an individual depositor's ability to meet their anticipated expenditures with anticipated revenues.

The Cash Availability Projection for the six months ending December, 2010, indicates the ability of the pools to meet projected cash flow requirements. However, there will usually be differences between projected and actual results because events and circumstances frequently do not occur as expected and those differences may be material.

### **BACKGROUND**

On July 21, 2008, the Board of Trustees approved the use of the Capistrano Unified School District (CUSD) Bid #0708-05 for the purchase of floor covering products through June 30, 2010. On May 11, 2010, the CUSD Board of Education approved the contract extension for one year beginning July 1, 2010 through June 30, 2011 and name change on June 29, 2010 from Collins & Aikman Flooring, Inc. to Tandus Flooring, Inc. In order to continue utilizing this contract, Board approval on the extension and name change is required.

### **ANALYSIS**

This is a cooperative contract that allows school districts in California to purchase floor covering products under the same terms and conditions excluding the installation portion. Since the high quality floor covering products are consistent with the District's standards, the terms and conditions remain the same as the original agreement, and there are no price increases for the 2010/2011 time period, it is in the best interest of the District to continue using this contract. All potential projects are to be included, regardless of funding source (i.e. state funding, special grants, district resources, local bonds, etc.). The Chancellor's Office has granted the District an extension to submit the Five Year Plan and IPP's/FPP's by September 1, 2010.

Each year the District has an opportunity to update its Five Year Construction Plan.

#### **ANALYSIS**

The District is resubmitting projects for State funding in its Five Year Construction Plan. A detailed list is attached showing the project location, estimated date of completion (occupancy) and potential source of funding.

In addition, the District is resubmitting a Final Project Proposal (FPP) for the state funding consideration of Russell Hall (Priority #10 at Santa Ana College. The District is also resubmitting a Final Project Proposal for state funding of the Student Services Center (Priority #11 at Santiago Canyon College.

For state funding consideration in 2013-14, the District is submitting Initial Project Proposals (IPP's) for the Fine and Performing Arts Complex Replacement at Santa Ana College and the Renovation of Building D at Santiago Canyon College.

# GRANT SUB-AGREEMENT BETWEEN RANCHO SANTIAGO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT AND CENTRAL COUNTY REGIONAL OCCUPATIONAL PROGRAM

This Agreement (hereinafter "Agreement") is entered into between Rancho Santiago Community College District (hereinafter "RSCCD") and the Central County Regional Occupational Program (hereinafter "CCROP").

WHEREAS, RSCCD was awarded a "Career Technical Education Pathways Initiative – Workforce Innovation Partnership" grant, (hereinafter "Grant"), Grant #09-142-870, from the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office, Economic and Workforce Development Career Technical Education Division, to implement the "DREAM (Design, Rapid Technologies, Engineering, Art and Manufacturing) Project" (hereinafter "Project") to introduce students to STEM careers in the Manufacturing and Product Development Sector, and to develop a sequenced pathway leading to GIS Certification for 7<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> graders.

WHEREAS, CCROP has agreed to participate in the purpose of this Grant, and

WHEREAS, RSCCD has the right to enter into agreements with outside entities for various services with the approval of the Board of Trustees,

NOW, THEREFORE the RSCCD and CCROP do covenant and agree as follows:

#### ARTICLE I

- 1. <u>Statement of Work</u> CCROP will implement the Project as described in the Grant proposal (*Exhibit A*).
- 2. Period of Performance
  The period of performance for this Agreement shall be from May 1, 2010 through January 31, 2012.
- 3. Total Cost
  The total cost to RSCCD for the performance of this Agreement shall not exceed \$144,231, of which \$138,684 consists of direct costs and \$5,547 consists of indirect costs of 4%, to be paid in accordance with the terms set forth in Article I.5. CCROP agrees to provide matching funds in the amount of \$15,000 and to submit documentation of that match to RSCCD.
- 4. Reporting CCROP is responsible for completion and submission of the Quarterly Year-To-Date Expenditure Reports, Quarterly Progress Reports, according to the following schedule: October 31, January 31, April 30, and July 31<sup>st</sup>. The Final Expenditure and Narrative Summary Reports are due February 29, 2012.

#### 5. Payment

#### 6. Amendments to Project Activities or the Budget

An amendment of this Agreement is required when CCROP wants to make changes that would affect the outcomes of the Project, the total dollar amount of the Grant, and/or that would add or delete budget categories. The request must be submitted to RSCCD prior to making the desired alteration in the performance or expenditures of the Project. Requests for amendments should be received no later than 75 days before the end of the performance period.

#### 7. Record Keeping

CCROP agrees to maintain such records for possible audit for a minimum of three (3) years after final payment or until any audit findings have been resolved, unless a longer period of records retention is stipulated.

#### 8. Audit

CCROP agrees that RSCCD, the Chancellor's Office, the Bureau of State Audits, any other appropriate state or federal oversight agency, or their designated representative(s), shall have the right to review and to copy any records and supporting documentation pertaining to the performance of this Agreement. CCROP agrees to allow the auditor(s) access to such records during normal business hours and to allow interviews of any employees who might reasonably have information related to such records. Further, CCROP agrees to include a similar right of RSCCD, the Chancellor's Office, the Bureau of State Audits, any other appropriate state or federal oversight agency, or their designated representative(s) to audit records and interview staff in any subcontract related to performance of this Agreement.

#### 9. Mutual Indemnification

Both parties to this Agreement shall agree to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the other party, its officers, agents, employees, and volunteers, from and against all loss, cost, and expense arising out of any liability or claim of liability, sustained or claimed to have been sustained, arising out of activities, or the performance or nonperformance of obligations under this Agreement, of the indemnifying party, or those of any of its officers, agents, employees, or volunteers. The provisions of this Article do not apply to any damage or losses caused solely by the negligence of the non-indemnifying party or any of its agents or employees.

#### 10. Subcontracts

Based on the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office Legal Terms and Conditions, Article II.11, CCROP is prohibited from creating any third or subsequent tier subcontracts without written approval by RSCCD. The approval process is as follows:

In February 2009, RSCCD was awarded the Career Technical Education (CTE) Community Collaborative- Workforce Innovation Partnership Grant, from the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office.
