BACKGROUND:

The District is participating in a voluntary seismic upgrade program for the Johnson Campus Center and Bookstore ('U' Building) at Santa Ana College. This will require the preparation of required structural documents to complete the Design and Construction Phases of this project.

ANALYSIS:

In preparation and development of structural plans and prior to DSA review, Rodriguez Engineering will evaluate structural drawings, review current site specific soil reports, prepare structural drawings, and generate structural calculations. Once plan development has been completed the Engineering firm will submit, comment and reply to DSA plan review. In addition, during the construction phase Rodriguez Engineering will respond to Contractor request for information (RFI), review shop drawings, perform site observations and complete DSA closeout documentation.

In accordance with Mr. Ron Beeler's request, Rodriguez Engineering, Inc. (REI) presents this proposal for the structural engineering services associated with the above referenced project. The following is our understanding of the project scope, proposed scope of services, and proposed fee.

Understanding of Project Scope

As part of the voluntary seismic upgrade program, we were engage by the District to prepare "Schematic Phase" level structural documents. The schematic phase documents consisted of identification of the Bookstore structural and non-structural systems, potential structural deficiencies in the elements or systems, and method of seismic strengthening. - 1. Payment: Invoices are due and payable upon receipt of invoice. After thirty (30) days from date of issuance, unpaid portions of the invoice shall be accessed a penalty of one percent per month (1%/month). No deduction shall be made from Engineer's compensation on account of problems or losses for which Engineer's has not been held legally liable. Any payments not received within 30 days of statement date will be cause for cessation by Engineer of all work on the Project. In light of the obvious advantage of resolving question and disputes regarding Engineer's statement quickly and while recollections are fresh, client will notify Engineer of any questions or dissatisfactions regarding any statement within 30 days of the statement date; and if Client falls to give Engineer such notice, the Client will the have waived its right to dispute the accuracy and appropriateness of the statement and the statement will be binding upon client.
- Rate Schedule and Reimbursable Expenses: For purposes of hourly services, extra work or termination of services, the following fee schedule shall apply:

Principal \$195/hour Drafter \$95/hour Senior Engineer \$165/hour Clerical \$65/hour Project Engineer \$135/hour

Reimbursable Expenses: Cost plus 15% markup.

- 3. Standard of Care: Service provided by the Engineer under this agreement will be performed in a manner consistent with that degree of care and skill ordinarily exercised by members of the same profession currently practicing under similar circumstances. Further, Engineer shall not be responsible for matters other than its own professional services; and in particular, without limitation Engineer shall not be responsible for delays beyond its reasonable control, for inaccurate information provided to it by Client or other reasonably reliable sources, for site conditions of which it is not informed, for any failure to investigate or detect hazardous materials or toxics wastes, for constructions procedures or safety precautions, for implementing Client's lawful design decisions or instructions for the actions or inactions of governmental agencies, or for any failures of materials of contractors.
- 4. Opinion of Probable Construction Costs: Since Engineer has no control over the cost of labor, materials or equipment, or over any contractor's method of determining prices or over competitive bidding or market conditions, Engineer's opinions of probable construction cost concerning the project are based solely upon his informed judgment; and if Client wishes greater assurances as to construction costs, then Client shall employ an independent cost estimator.
- 5. Site Observation: Engineer will have no site observation responsibilities and no responsibility for the Contractor's performance, and Client shall indemnify Engineer to the fullest extent allowed by law concerning any loss and or/ claim which may arise out of the Contractor's performance.
- 6. Submittal Review: Appropriate contractor submittals formally submitted to Engineer will be reviewed with reasonable promptness (usually within 10 working days) for only conformance with design concept and compliance with the Construction Documents, and not for quantities, constructability or matters within the assumed expertise of the submitting Contractor.
- 7. Risk Allocations: Client and Engineer have discussed their risks, rewards and benefits of the Project and the Engineer's total fee for services. The risks have been allocated such that the client agrees that to the fullest extent permitted by law, Engineer total liability to client for any and all injuries, claims, losses, expenses, damages, or claim expenses arising out of this Agreement from any causes shall not exceed the Engineer's total fee for the

services rendered on the project. Such causes include, but are not limited to, Engineer's negligence, errors, omissions, strict liability, breach of contract or breach of warranty.

- 8. Indemnification: Engineer will endeavor to stand behind its services by maintaining appropriate liability insurance, and by defending and indemnifying client and client's employees to the full extent of this insurance from and against any and all claims and/or liability arising out of Engineer's active negligence or willful misconduct in the performances of the services called for by this Agreement. Conversely, in light of the limited nature of Engineer's involvement with the project's overall planning and execution and of the disparity between Engineer's fee and the potential liability for problems or alleged problems with the Project, should Engineer be subjected to claims and/or become embroiled in litigation concerning the project but not arising out of Engineer active negligence or willful misconduct, then client will to the fullest extent allowed by law defend and indemnify Engineer and Engineer's principals, employees and subconsultants from and against such claims and liability even if they are involve allegations of design defects within the meaning of California Civil Section 2782.
- 9. Termination: Because of the importance of a good working relationship between Client and Engineer, it is hereby agreed that either party may terminate this agreement upon written notice to the other party provided only that this notice is given in a good faith belief that said working relationship is less than satisfactory. Further, Engineer may suspend its performance under this Agreement and/or terminate this Agreement and its related obligations to Client with no liability for so doing at anytime if Client allows an invoice to become delinquent pursuant to the compensation provisions of this agreement. Upon the termination of this agreement by either party, the client shall pay the Engineer for service preformed and reimbursable cost incurred at rates and for items determined by the applicable terms of this Agreement.
- 10. Ownership of Documents: The Documents prepared by Engineer pursuant to this agreement shall become the property of Client upon the Project, and from that date on Engineer shall have neither rights nor obligations concerning these documents. However, should these documents be used on other projects, or on extensions or modifications of the Project, then the Client shall indemnity Engineer to the fullest extent allowed by the law against all claims made against the Engineer or arise from or related to such use and for all legal expenses including actual attorney's fees in connection with such claims.
- 11. Breach Procedure: If at any time either party should feel that the other has materially breached this agreement, then it shall notify that party in writing setting forth clearly what must be done to cure that breach; and thereafter the party so notified shall have 14 calendar days to take the prescribed action.
- 12. Miscellaneous: In the event that litigation and/or disputes develop between Engineer and Client concerning or arising out of this Agreement, then the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover from the other reasonable attorney's fees and litigation costs. This Agreement shall be binding upon and insure to the benefits of the parties hereto and their respective partners, joint ventures, heirs, estates, personal representative, successors, and assigns. This Agreement shall be interpreted and enforced under and pursuant to the laws of the State of California. In the event that any provision of this agreement shall be invalid or unenforceable, then the remaining provisions shall be valid and binding on the parties. In the event that this agreement is for any reason terminated, its indemnity provisions shall remain in full force and effect; and in the event that any indemnification herein, called for shall be prohibited by law, then the subject indemnification prevision shall not be void, but rather shall be interpreted as requiring indemnification only to the fullest extent allowed by law.

During the course of normal construction certain changes to the scope of work for this project were required. The specific changes, reasons for the changes and cost impacts are noted in the attached Change Order #7.

Change Order #7 increases the contract by \$18,434. The revised contract amount is \$1,973,057. In light of the obvious advantage of resolving question and disputes regarding Engineer's statement quickly and while recollections are fresh, client will notify Engineer of any questions or dissatisfactions regarding any statement within 30 days of the statement date; and if Client fails to give Engineer such notice, the Client will the have waived its right to dispute the accuracy and appropriateness of the statement and the statement will be binding upon client.
- 2. Rate Schedule and Reimbursable Expenses: For purposes of hourly services, extra work or termination of services, the following fee schedule shall apply:

Principal \$195/hour Drafter \$95/hour Senior Engineer \$165/hour Clerical \$65/hour Project Engineer \$135/hour

Reimbursable Expenses: Cost plus 15% markup.

- 3. Standard of Care: Service provided by the Engineer under this agreement will be performed in a manner consistent with that degree of care and skill ordinarily exercised by members of the same profession currently practicing under similar circumstances. Submittal Review: Appropriate contractor submittals formally submitted to Engineer will be reviewed with reasonable promptness (usually within 10 working days) for only conformance with design concept and compliance with the Construction Documents, and not for quantities, constructability or matters within the assumed expertise of the submitting Contractor.
- 7. Risk Allocations: Client and Engineer have discussed their risks, rewards and benefits of the Project and the Engineer's total fee for services. The risks have been allocated such that the client agrees that to the fullest extent permitted by law, Engineer total liability to client for any and all injuries, claims, losses, expenses, damages, or claim expenses arising out of this Agreement from any causes shall not exceed the Engineer's total fee for the

services rendered on the project. Such causes include, but are not limited to, Engineer's negligence, errors, omissions, strict liability, breach of contract or breach of warranty.

- 8. Indemnification: Engineer will endeavor to stand behind its services by maintaining appropriate liability insurance, and by defending and indemnifying client and client's employees to the full extent of this insurance from and against any and all claims and/or liability arising out of Engineer's active negligence or willful misconduct in the performances of the services called for by this Agreement. Conversely, in light of the limited nature of Engineer's involvement with the project's overall planning and execution and of the disparity between Engineer's fee and the potential liability for problems or alleged problems with the Project, should Engineer be subjected to claims and/or become embroiled in litigation concerning the project but not arising out of Engineer active negligence or willful misconduct, then client will to the fullest extent allowed by law defend and indemnify Engineer and Engineer's principals, employees and subconsultants from and against such claims and liability even if they are involve allegations of design defects within the meaning of California Civil Section 2782.
- 9. Termination: Because of the importance of a good working relationship between Client and Engineer, it is hereby agreed that either party may terminate this agreement upon written notice to the other party provided only that this notice is given in a good faith belief that said working relationship is less than satisfactory. Further, Engineer may suspend its performance under this Agreement and/or terminate this Agreement and its related obligations to Client with no liability for so doing at anytime if Client allows an invoice to become delinquent pursuant to the compensation provisions of this agreement. Upon the termination of this agreement by either party, the client shall pay the Engineer for service preformed and reimbursable cost incurred at rates and for items determined by the applicable terms of this Agreement.
- 10. Ownership of Documents: The Documents prepared by Engineer pursuant to this agreement shall become the property of Client upon the Project, and from that date on Engineer shall have neither rights nor obligations concerning these documents. However, should these documents be used on other projects, or on extensions or modifications of the Project, then the Client shall indemnity Engineer to the fullest extent allowed by the law against all claims made against the Engineer or arise from or related to such use and for all legal expenses including actual attorney's fees in connection with such claims.
- 11. Breach Procedure: If at any time either party should feel that the other has materially breached this agreement, then it shall notify that party in writing setting forth clearly what must be done to cure that breach; and thereafter the party so notified shall have 14 calendar days to take the prescribed action.
- 12. Miscellaneous: In the event that litigation and/or disputes develop between Engineer and Client concerning or arising out of this Agreement, then the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover from the other reasonable attorney's fees and litigation costs. This Agreement shall be binding upon and insure to the benefits of the parties hereto and their respective partners, joint ventures, heirs, estates, personal representative, successors, and assigns. This Agreement shall be interpreted and enforced under and pursuant to the laws of the State of California. In the event that any provision of this agreement shall be invalid or unenforceable, then the remaining provisions shall be valid and binding on the parties. In the event that this agreement is for any reason terminated, its indemnity provisions shall remain in full force and effect; and in the event that any indemnification herein called for shall be prohibited by law, then the subject indemnification prevision shall not be void, but rather shall be interpreted as requiring indemnification only to the fullest extent allowed by law.

BACKGROUND

With the support of the Technology Advisory Group (TAG), the district office is preparing to upgrade the current wireless network to meet the academic and business needs of the entire district. An assessment of the current needs is required in order to properly design the wireless network. This project will be done in phases. Information Technology Services (ITS) will address the needs of Santa Ana College first and use the experience as a standard to upgrade the wireless technology at the other locations.

ANALYSIS

The wireless network upgrade project includes four tasks, the first being an assessment of our technology by touring a selected number of Santa Ana College buildings to review cable infrastructure, pathways, and spaces to understand and verify the physical layer of our network. Task two will be to understand the use of the wireless network and define the types of network traffic that will be required. Based on this information, task three is for PlanNet to develop a specification document for vendor response. ITS will work with existing negotiated contracts (CMAS or WSCA) to select a pool of vendors. Finally, PlanNet will assist ITS in evaluating the vendor responses and budgetary quotes.

Project implementation is scheduled for the summer, 2011 for Santa Ana College.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve the consulting agreement from Plan Net Consulting in the amount of \$37,500 as presented.

Dear Sylvia:

PlanNet Consulting is pleased to submit this revised proposal to provide additional technology consulting services for the District. This proposal is based on our understanding of our previous work with the District and recent conversations between your team and PlanNet. We very much appreciate the opportunity to provide this proposal to you.

PROJECT BACKGROUND

Our proposal and understanding of the required Scope of Services are based on the following information and assumptions:

- The District has determined the need to provide wireless networking (802.11) for the academic and administrative areas of Santa Ana College This includes coverage for approximately 24 buildings as well as outdoor areas.
- We understand that the District had recently upgraded its wired network prior to the IP
 Telephony implementation. Standard PoE should be readily available.
- Many of the buildings consist of older construction such as 'poured in place' concrete with limited and impacted communications conduit. These limitations could impact the cost and time to deploy the cabling infrastructure needed to support the wireless access points.
- Although the District has a Cisco standard for the wired network, the wireless network will be open to other suppliers.
- The District has expressed interest in utilizing a recognized pre-negotiated contract (i.e. CMAS, WSCA) for procurement.
- The District wishes to have the requirements definition and RFP phase of the project completed in 2010. Solution implementation is slated for late 2010 or early 2011.

SCOPE OF WORK

PlanNet Consulting proposes to provide the following services:

Task I - Project Initiation and Technology Assessment

- Prepare for and conduct project kick-off. Document project guidelines, confirm deliverables, identify resources, clarify expectations, articulate communications processes for the project, and develop milestones. Kick-off meeting to be immediately followed by our discovery/information work effort with College and District stakeholders such as IT staff, academic representatives and other administrators.
- Tour a selected number of College buildings (under direction of project team/campus IT).
 We will review current structured cable infrastructure, pathways and spaces to understand/verify the horizontal physical layer implemented in these buildings.
- Discuss uses of the wireless infrastructure for academic and administrative users. This
 will include data applications as well as potential voice, video and location services
 applications.
- Discuss methods for providing guest wireless access, captive portal and best practices for managing shared bandwidth for academic, administrative and guest users.
- Based on the uses defined above, investigate technical aspects such as bandwidth, simultaneous usage, control, required reliability and security.
- Discuss alternatives/approaches which the campus may have already considered to provide wireless such as:
 - o Physical RF survey of sample buildings
 - o Predictive RF survey of sample buildings
 - Type of 802.11 to deploy (i.e. a/g/n the District has expressed a desire for 'n')
 - o Physical security considerations (protecting the AP's)
 - o Pathway issues (including aesthetics of surface mount raceway)

Task II – Requirements Definition Report including Rough Order of Magnitude (ROM) Budgets

Based on the assessment performed in Task I, PlanNet will develop a high level recommendations report including budgetary ROM capital expense costs associated with up to three viable options. These cost elements will include:

- Cost of wireless electronics (AP's + controllers)
- Estimates of linear feet/installation costs for cable conveyance (raceway, tray, conduits, etc)
- Professional services
 - o Surveys
 - o Installation

Please note, we are not planning on providing drawings as part of our deliverable. We may include sketches to help illustrate key elements in the report,

Task III - Specifications

- Based on our understanding of the District's request to use a pre-negotiated contract (i.e. CMAS, WSCA) for networking products, PlanNet will develop a specification that can be responded to by market leaders. This will not be a 'Cisco only' wireless networking solution. For this task PlanNet will:
 - o Develop a biddable specification that will be bid to two leading suppliers of wireless solutions
 - o Develop a scope of work for professional services including:
 - Survey requirements
 - Installation requirements
 - Testing requirements
 - Develop alternatives (add alternates) that may be beneficial to the District and Colleges
 - o Develop pricing sheets to facilitate easy comparisons

Task IV - RFP evaluation, recommendation and contract negotiations

- By use of a pre-negotiated contract, the District will limit the number of responses to two. PlanNet will review and evaluate the 2 vendor responses.
- Participate in one initial proposal review meeting with Rancho Santiago Community College District.
- Work with vendors to gather necessary clarifications and elaborations; normalize quotations and configurations/designs as much as practically possible to enable "applesto-apples" comparisons.
- Prepare functional and technical comparisons against pre-determined criteria. Evaluation criteria will include:
 - Vendor's distribution network
 - o Ability to service and support all of RSCCD locations
 - o Financial strength
 - Ease of doing business and flexibility

The analysis will provide substantive detail and the justification for each vendor rating against each criterion.

- Prepare TCO cost analysis. We will first ensure all submitted costs are as near "apples
 to apples" as possible. We will compare the one-time costs of each solution (including
 tax and shipping if necessary) to indicate capital costs. We will gather and assess
 recurring cost information from vendors and from Rancho Santiago Community College
 District to develop an operating cost model for incorporation into a 5- or 7-year TCO
 analysis.
- Conduct evaluation, rating and selection meetings with Rancho Santiago Community College District. In these sessions (we expect 2-3 sessions based on past experience), we will use the functional and financial comparison documents in concert with the weighting/rating worksheet to score each vendor's solution against the criteria the team previously established. This provides a systematic way to capture the group's consensus opinions. This methodology can be applied in two ways:
- Prepare summary recommendation memo that describes project process, alternatives, vendor selection, cost analysis, major milestones for implementation and risks.

- Submit draft of recommendation memo to Rancho Santiago Community College District for review and comment.
- Finalize recommendation memo.
- Prepare and deliver presentation of recommendation memo to management team.
- Review Master Service Agreement of selected vendor and develop a list of issues and questions. The focus of this review is on the business and technical issues we are qualified to evaluate. PlanNet will not review the document from a legal perspective.
- Participate in two sessions/conference calls with the selected vendor focused on developing a final Statement of Work (SOW). This effort will include completion of the final system design (the exact location and quantity of access points won't be known at this point so a range will be used), clarifying the professional services to be performed by the selected vendor and assessing the vendor's preliminary implementation plan.
- Review contract addenda, particularly the selected vendor's SOW.
- Participate in 2-3 contract negotiation sessions with representatives of the selected vendor.
- Recommend acceptance of contract terms and addenda.

ASSUMPTIONS

Our proposal is based on the following assumptions:

- 1. The District's existing cabling standards are the basis of the design used for this project
- 2. Our scope of work will start in August 2010 and conclude within 150 days
- 3. Our fees do not include project management for the implementation
- 4. PlanNet will NOT be developing an acceptable use policy (AUP)

PROFESSIONAL FEES

PlanNet will conduct this project on a fixed fee basis of \$37,500.

The cost is approximately \$15,000 per year the first year and \$12,800 annually thereafter.
