In accordance with your authorization, we are providing geotechnical observation and testing services during construction of the Athletics and Aquatics Complex project. Our work is being performed in general accordance with the scope of services outlined in our referenced proposal dated April 9, 2010, and Purchase Order No. 10-P0014720 dated May 28, 2010. A review of our project status indicates that we have exceeded 75 percent of our budget on the project and that we will exceed the allocated budget to complete the project. This letter provides an updated budget status for the project and our estimated fee to complete the project.

Based on our review of the project status, we estimate that approximately 50 percent of the work requiring geotechnical observation and testing has been completed. Due to project delays driven by a combination of factors, which include the multi-prime construction schedule as well as tests required by the DSA Inspector and DSA Field Representatives, it is now indicated that the actual tests and inspections that are required to complete the project will require additional compensation in the amount of \$255,684.00 as noted in the attached proposal from Reliant Testing Engineers, dated March 15, 2011. The new contract total for this project is \$383,256.00.

The ballots will be opened and counted by three tellers appointed by the CCCT President and the results announced at the CCCT Annual Conference.
